**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets dropped both games of a doubleheader to the Braves yesterday...New York has dropped three straight and 10 of their last 12 games...The Mets continue a 10-day, 10-game homestand (2-4) against the Cubs (2-1), Braves (0-3) and Pirates (three games).

**PROGRAMMING NOTE:** As a reminder, today's contest against the Braves has been moved to a 7:10 p.m. start and will be broadcast nationally on ESPN.

**PUT AWAY THE BROOMS:** The Mets are looking to avoid their seventh sweep of the season...The Mets were last swept by the Braves in a four game series from May 20-22, 2008 in Atlanta...The Braves have never swept the Mets in a four game series in New York.

**SENGA GENISIS:** Kodai Senga is slated to make his 22nd start of the season tonight...He is 8-6 with a 3.24 ERA (42 ER/116.2 IP) with 57 walks and 142 strikeouts this season...His 142 strikeouts through 21 career starts is the third-most in franchise history...Only Dwight Gooden (165) and Matt Harvey (154) have struck out more...His 142 punchouts are the fourth-most by a Japanese born player through 21 career starts...He trails Hideo Nomo (188), Yu Darvish (154) and Masahiro Tanaka (147).

**KAMPAI KODAI:** In 11 starts at Citi Field this year, Senga has posted a 4-2 record with a 2.45 ERA (17 ER/62.1 IP) with 29 walks and 77 strikeouts...His 2.45 ERA at home ranks fifth in the majors and fourth in the Senior Circuit.

**SEVENTH HEAVEN:** According to Sportsradar, Kodai Senga is just the seventh rookie in Mets history to make at least 20 starts with a 3.25 ERA or lower...He joins Tom Seaver, Jerry Koosman, JonMatlack, Dwight Gooden, Jacob deGrom and Noah Syndergaard.

**JEFF McHITS:** Jeff McNeil is on a six-game hitting streak, batting .318 (7-22) with five runs, one double, one home run, one RBI, two walks with a .400 OBP and a .500 SLG...In 21 games since July 21, Jeff McNeil is batting .296 (24-81) with 13 runs, three doubles, one triple, two home runs, 10 RBI, five walks with a .367 OBP and a .432 SLG...In 27 games (114 plate appearances) following the All-Star break, McNeil has struck out seven times...He is batting .345 (124-359) in 99 games against NL East foes since the start of 2022...He is hitting .358 (34-95) against the Braves in that span.

**THE EAST IS A BEAST:** The Mets are 16-17 against the NL East this season...The team has posted a 4.62 ERA against their division, while hitting .238/.325/.386.

**SEVENTH HEAVEN:** Francisco Lindor has safely hit in 11 of his last 13 games, batting .375 (18-48) with 11 runs, three doubles, three home runs, seven RBI, six walks, with a .455 OBP, a .625 SLG and a 1.080 OPS.

**LINSANITY:** Over his last 45 games, Lindor is batting .297 (49-165) with 34 runs, eight doubles, two triples, 10 home runs, 25 RBI, 25 walks, 13 steals with a .392 OBP, a .552 SLG and a .943 OPS...Lindor has stolen 19 bases in 115 games this season, exceeding his total from 2022 (16 steals in 161 games)...His career-best is 25 steals 158 games in 2018.

**FOR PETE'S SAKE:** Pete Alonso became the first Met to record four seasons with 35 or more home runs...He is third in the majors and second in the Senior Circuit with 35 home runs...He is fifth in the majors and third in the NL with 87 RBI.

**BRAVES-METS NOTES:** The Mets have lost six straight to Atlanta...The team has dropped 11 of their last 12 to the Braves...New York went 6-3 against the Braves at Citi Field last year.

**SLIPPERY PETE:** Alonso is hitting .304 (24-79) with 14 extra-base hits, 25 RBI, 14 runs, 10 walks and a 1.119 OPS in his last 22 games...He was hitting .132 (12-91) with seven extra-base hits and a .549 OPS over his previous 25 games (since his return from the IL on June 18).

**IN THE CITI:** The Mets are in a stretch where 19 of 25 games are at home...New York is 2-4 in that span...The Mets are 28-27 at home this season...The team's 55 games at home are tied for the fewest in the majors.

**HERE'S THE CATCH:** Francisco Alvarez has hit 21 home runs this season... He joins Pete Alonso (53, 2019) and Darryl Strawberry (26, 1983) as the only Mets rookies to have 20 or more home runs in a season...Alvarez leads all major league catchers with 19 home runs playing that position and is second behind Arizona's Corbin Carroll for the rookie lead in homers.

**IF YOU START ME UP:** The Mets are 34-10 when the starting pitcher throws at least 6.0 innings...New York has gone 14-1 when its starter pitches 7.0+ innings and are a perfect 5-0 when the starter completes 8.0 innings.

**STEAL MY SUNSHINE:** New York has recorded 84 steals in 93 attempts...The team's 90.4 percent success rate is the best in the majors...The Mets had a franchise-record run of 35 consecutive stolen bases without being caught from May 14-June 29...Overall, New York has been successful in 57 of their last 61 stolen base attempts.

**THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY:** On this day in 2010, R.A. Dickey tossed a one-hitter, allowing only a single in the sixth inning as the Mets defeated the Phillies, 1-0 at Citi Field...Dickey finished the game allowing one hit, one walk and struck out 7 as he improved to 8-5 with a 2.43 ERA...Carlos Beltrán provided the offense with an RBI double in the bottom of the sixth inning...The knuckleballer finished the 2010 campaign going 11-9 with a 2.84 ERA, striking out 104 in 174.1 innings.

**DOWN ON THE FARM:** The Rumble Ponies defeated the Somerset Patriots, 4-0, yesterday...RHP Christian Scott tossed 6.1 innings allowing only one hit, while striking out five...He improved to 4-3 with a 2.67 ERA (17 ER/57.1 IP) at Double-A, allowing only eight walks and striking out 69 batters...Overall in 17 games this year across three levels, Scott has posted a 5-4 record with a 2.71 ERA (25 ER/83.0 IP) with 12 walks and 99 strikeouts...INF Jeremiah Jackson connected for his second home run with Binghamton and his 17th in the minor leagues this year.

### SENGA NEWS & NOTES

**HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR:** On July 8, Major League Baseball announced that Kodai Senga was added to the National League All-Star team, which took place on July 11 at T-Mobile Park in Seattle...Senga joined Pete Alonso (2019), Dwight Gooden (1984), Jerry Koosman (1968) and Tom Seaver as the only Mets rookies selected to an All-Star Game...He is the eighth Japanese-Born rookie ever to be selected to an All-Star Game joining Masahiro Tanaka (2014), Yu Darvish (2012), Kosuke Fukudome (2008), Hideki Okajima (2007), Hideki Matsui (2003), Ichiro Suzuki (2001) and Hideo Nomo (1995).

**SENGA GENESIS:** Has recorded 142 strikeouts through his first 21 career major league games, the third-most by a Mets pitcher in franchise history...Only Dwight Gooden (165), and Matt Harvey (154) have recorded more in their first 21 career starts...His 142 strikeouts are the fourth-most by a Japanese born pitcher through 21 career games...He trails only Hideo Nomo (194), Yu Darvish (154) and Masahiro Tanaka (147).

**KODAI THE FRIENDLY GHOST:** Senga's eight wins are tied for the second-most among all major league rookies this season and his 142 strikeouts are the most by any rookie...Among rookies with 50.0 or more innings pitched, Senga is third in the majors and second in the NL with a 10.95 SO/9 rate and seventh in the majors in opponent's average (.218).

**PUTTING THE K IN FORK:** Senga's "ghost fork" has accounted for 76 of his 142 strikeouts through 21 starts...The pitch has a 58.9 percent whiff rate and a 28.0 percent putaway rate...Opponents have managed just 16 hits in 115 at-bats ending with the forkball, a .139 batting average.

**SHUT 'EM OUT:** On May 30 against the Phillies, Senga became the 10th rookie in franchise history to throw 7.0 or more innings, while one hit or less and was the first Met since Steven Matz did so on August 14, 2016...Joins Jonathon Niese, who tossed a complete game shutout on June 10, 2010, as the only Mets rookie to accomplish the feat without allowing a walk.

**ALL I DO IS WIN:** Senga became the only Japanese-born pitchers to start their career 3-0 and is the fourth player in franchise history to earn the win in their first two career major league starts, joining Steven Matz, Mike Pelfrey and Gary Gentry...Additionally, he joins Kazuhisa Ishii, Hideki Irabu and Koji Uehara as the only Japanese-born pitchers to win each of their first two career major league starts...Senga fell just shy of becoming the second Mets starting pitcher ever to begin his career 4-0, a record held by Steven Matz.

**MLB DEBUT NOTES:** Senga became the 64th pitcher whose major league debut came in a start for the Mets...New York has had one pitcher make his MLB debut as a starter in each of the previous three seasons: José Butto in 2022, Tylor Megill in 2021 and David Peterson in 2020 (the Mets won each of those three games)...Senga allowed one run over 5.1 innings on three hits, three walks and eight strikeouts in his major league debut...His eight strikeouts were tied for the fourth-most by a Japanese-born pitcher in their major league debut and tied for the third-most by a Mets pitcher in their major league debut.

**METS-JAPAN CONNECTION:** Senga is the 14th Japanese-born player to appear in at least one game for the Mets, the most by any major league team...Prior to Senga, the last Japanese-born player to appear in a game for the Mets was OF Norichika Aoki in 2017.

**NPB CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:** Prior to joining the Mets, Senga spent 11 seasons in Japan's NPB with the Fukuoka Softbank Hawks...During his NPB career he posted a 87-44 record with a 2.59 ERA (313 ER/1,089.0 IP) and 1,252 strikeouts (10.3 K/9.0)...He was also a three-time NPB All-Star (2013, 2017 and 2019), a two-time Pacific League Best Nine Award winner (2019 and 2020) and a two-time Mitsui Golden Glove Award winner (2019 and 2020).

**INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION:** Senga appeared in four games in the 2017 World Baseball Classic for Team Japan...He posted a 0.82 ERA, throwing 11.0 innings and allowing one run on seven hits with 16 strikeouts and one walk...He also pitched in two games during the Tokyo Summer Olympics, throwing a total of 3.0 scoreless innings as Japan won the gold medal on its home turf.

### TOMORROW'S STARTER: CARLOS CARRASCO (3-6, 6.42)

**LAST TIME OUT:** Threw 5.0 innings against the Chicago Cubs at Citi Field on August 8, 2023...Allowed two earned runs on three hits and only allowed two walks while striking out five batters in a 3-2 Mets loss.

**ON A TREASURE HUNT:** Carrasco will face Pittsburgh for the second time this season and for the sixth time in his career...In his last start against the Pirates on July 11 at PNC Park, he suffered the loss after tossing 4.2 innings, allowing two earned runs on six hits and three walks while fanning one batter...Throughout his career against Pittsburgh, Carrasco has pitched to a 2.96 ERA (9 ER/27.1 IP) and holds a 2-1 record.
