METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell Royals, 9-2, yesterday in Kansas City...New York has lost three straight and four of its last five games...The Mets continue a six-game road trip (0-3) to Kansas City (0-3) and Baltimore (three games).

GET WELL SOON: Today, outfielder Tim Locastro begins a rehab assignment with the Florida Complex League Mets...Locastro is on the 60-Day IL recovering from a sprained thumb.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY!: Happy Birthday to Cleon Jones who turns 81 years young today...Jones played 12 seasons with the Mets...He batted .281/.339/.404 with 93 home runs and 524 RBI...He placed fourth in Rookie of the Year voting in 1966 and was an All-Star in 1969...In 137 games that season, Jones batted .340/.422/.482 with 25 doubles, four triples, 12 home runs and 75 RBI...He was inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame in 1991 and still ranks among the team's leaders in hits (1,188), runs (563) and games played (1,201).

WE'RE BUILDING SOMETHING, HERE, DETECTIVE: David Peterson is set to make his 12th start of the season...Since July 14, he has worked exclusively from the bullpen, appearing in six games and going 1-0 with a 2.25 ERA (2 ER/8.0 IP) with three walks and eight strikeouts...In 12 games (eight starts) at night this year, Peterson is 2-5 with a 4.60 ERA (23 ER/45.0 IP) with 16 walks and 46 strikeouts...Tonight will make his second appearance against the Orioles...He is 1-1 with a 5.40 ERA (4 ER/6.2 IP) with three walks and five punchouts in his previous appearances against the club.

CHARMED: Buck Showalter returns to Baltimore as an opposing manager tonight... Showalter managed the Orioles from 2010-18, going 669-684 in that span...He was named Manager of the Year in 2014, guiding the Birds to a 96-66 record and ending the club's 15-year playoff drought...In 22 seasons as a manager, Showalter has compiled a 1,702-1,635 record...He places 19th on the all-time managerial wins list.

THE CITY THAT READS: Brandon Nimmo has appeared in three games at Oriole Park at Camden Yards...He is a 9-12 lifetime hitter with five runs, two doubles, two triples, three RBI and a walk...Starling Marte has batted .455 (5-11) in three career contests at the yard with one run, three RBI and two walks.

BIRDS AREN'T REAL: Pete Alonso has gone 11-30 (.367) with two doubles, five home runs, nine RBI, 11 runs scored in eight career games against the Orioles...Is on a five-game hitting streak against Baltimore, going 10-19 (.526) with two doubles, four home runs, seven RBI, nine runs scored and a 1.835 OPS...Has three homers, six RBI, five runs scored and a 2.222 OPS in his last two games against the O's.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Alonso is third in the majors and second in the Senior Circuit with 31 home runs...He is third in the NL and sixth in the majors with 77 RBI...He is hitting .333 (17-51) with eight extra-base hits, 15 RBI, nine runs and a 1.081 OPS in his last 13 games...He was hitting .132 (12-91) with seven extra-base hits and a .549 OPS over his previous 25 games (since his return from the IL on June 18-19).

DOWN ON THE FARM: Last night, RHP Tyler Stuart made the start for the Ruble Ponies and earned the win, allowing three hits with three walks and struck out five over 7.0 scoreless innings...He moved to 2-0 with a 2.16 ERA (6 ER/25.0 IP) with six walks and 15 strikeouts in four starts at Double-A...Across 18 starts between Brooklyn and Binghamton, Stuart is 6-0 with a 1.70 ERA (19 ER/100.2 IP) with 29 walks and 99 strikeouts...His 1.70 ERA leads all of minor league baseball...The Kankakee, IL native was selected in the sixth round of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Southern Mississippi...He slots in as the 16th-best prospect in the organization according to MLB Pipeline.

WELCOME TO THE ORG.: OF Ryan Clifford made his Mets organizational debut last night with the Brooklyn Cyclones...He homered in his first at-bat in the system, finishing 2-3 with two runs, one home run, two RBI and two walks...The left-handed hitter is batting .294/.404/.531 in 84 games in the minor leagues this year...Clifford was acquired along with OF Drew Gilbert from the Houston Astros in exchange for RHP Justin Verlander...He is the sixth-best prospect in the system according to MLB Pipeline.

O'S-METS NOTES: The Mets have won four of their last five games against the Orioles...From June 11, 2010-August 18, 2015, the Mets took nine straight from Baltimore.

HERE'S THE CATCH: Francisco Alvarez has hit 21 home runs this season...He joins Pete Alonso (53, 2019) and Darryl Strawberry (26, 1983) as the only Mets rookies to have 20 or more home runs in a season...Alvarez leads all major league catchers with 19 home runs playing that position and is tied with Arizona's Corbin Carroll for the rookie lead in homers...In 21 games last month, Alvarez batting .284 (21-74) with 16 runs, nine home runs, 18 RBI, six walks with a .354 OBP and a .649 SLG...He was fourth in the NL with nine home runs in July.

IF YOU START ME UP: The Mets are 32-9 when the starting pitcher throws at least 6.0 innings...New York has gone 14-1 when its starter pitches 7.0+ innings and are a perfect 5-0 when the starter completes 8.0 innings.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are 24-35 on the road this year...They have posted a 4.83 ERA in away games...This compares to a 3.84 mark at home...New York has played 58 games on the road this year...That is the second-most in the majors...Only the Phillies have played more road games with 61.

LINSANITY: Francisco Lindor has homered three times in the last five games... He ranks 14th in the majors with a 14.7 fWAR...That is eighth-best in the National League...Over the last 38 games, Lindor is batting .279 (39-140) with 29 runs, six doubles, two triples, 10 home runs, 23 RBI, 22 walks, 11 steals with a .380 OBP, a .564 SLG and a .944 OPS...Lindor has stolen 17 bases in 107 games this season, exceeding his total from 2022 (16 steals in 161 games)...His career-best is 25 steals 158 games in 2018...The shortstop ranks third in the majors with a 94.4% success rate in steals...He has gone 17 out of 18 in stolen base attempts in 2023.

DOING THE SPLITS: Brandon Nimmo is batting .286 (63-220) with 30 runs, nine doubles, three triples, six home runs, 29 RBI, 30 walks, a .374 OBP and a .436 SLG on the road this season...This compares to a .218/.327/.425 slashline with 18 extrabase hits at home...Francisco Lindor is a .252 (58-230) with 41 runs, 15 doubles, two triples, 13 home runs, 45 RBI, 23 walks, a .330 OBP, a .504 SLG and an .834 OPS on the road in 2023...He is slashing .211/.314/.411 with 17 extra-base hits at Citi Field this year.

THEY'RE OUT OF MY LEAGUE: The Mets are in a stretch of 14 of 18 games against American League opponents...They are 4-7 in that span...The new schedule format has New York playing a total of 43 Interleague games in 2023, more than double their previous high for a single season (20)...The Mets are 14-17 against the American League this year...Overall, New York owns a 249-244 record in Interleague play... The team's .507 winning percentage is the second-best among National League clubs.

STEAL MY SUNSHINE: New York has recorded 79 steals in 87 attempts...The team's 90.8 percent success rate is the best in the majors...The Mets had a franchise-record run of 35 consecutive stolen bases without being caught from May 14-June 29... Overall, New York has been successful in 53 of their last 55 stolen base attempts.

THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY: On this day in 1985, Dwight Gooden tossed a complete game in a 4-1 victory over the Cubs...Gooden allowed one unearned run on five hits with three walks and struck out six...He moved to 19-5 with a 1.57 ERA (33 Er/188.2 IP) with 50 walks and 179 strikeouts through 24 starts...Keith Hernandez singled to bring home one in the third, and was followed by a two-RBI double by Gary Garter...Gooden won the Cy Young that season, finishing with a 24-4 record, a 1.53 ERA (47 ER/276.2 IP) with 69 walks and 268 strikeouts.

LAST TIME OUT: Threw 2.0 innings of relief and allowed one unearned run on one hit and struck out two batters for the Mets in their 5-2 win at Citi Field against

Washington on July 30.

GOOD MORNING BALTIMORE: Tonight, Peterson will face the Orioles for the third time of his career and the first time this season...He has made one start and one relief appearance in his career against Baltimore...He's posted a 5.40 ERA (4 ER/6.2 IP) in those outings...This will be Peterson's third time facing the Orioles on the road...This season, Peterson is 1-5 in road games.

MAKIN' IT MAJOR: Since returning to the majors on June 27 after a stint with Syracuse (AAA), Peterson has pitched to a 2-1 record with a 2.31 ERA (6 ER/23.1 IP) in nine games, three of which were starts...His last start came against the San Diego Padres at Petco Park on July 8, during which he suffered the loss after allowing three earned runs on five hits and two walks while also tallying seven strikeouts...Since July 14, Peterson has pitched to a 2.25 ERA (2 ER/8.0 IP) over six relief appearances...Did not allow a homer in any of those outings.

A MINUTE IN THE MINORS: Peterson was optioned to Triple-A Syracuse on April 29, was recalled on May 9, then optioned again on May 16...In his first start with Syracuse following his May 16 option, he dealt 8.0 shutout innings, allowed just two hits and struck out nine...For his effort, he as named International League Pitcher of the Week...All told, he has made seven starts for the Syracuse Mets this season...Has a 1-2 record with a 4.86 ERA (20 ER/37.0 IP).

NO PLACE LIKE NEW YORK: This season, Peterson has pitched to a 2.67 ERA (8 ER/27.0 IP) in eight home outings (four starts)...Over nine road outings (seven starts) this season, the southpaw has pitched to an 8.41 ERA (33 ER/35.1 IP).

LETHAL LEFTY: Peterson has limited lefties to a .246 (62-252) average in his career...He whiffed 32 of the 96 left-handed batters he faced last year, a 33 percent strikeout rate that ranked fourth among all left-handed pitchers to face a minimum of 90 LHB in 2022.

SLIP 'N' SLIDE: Peterson held batters to a .175 (24-137) average with his slider last season and 78 of his 126 strikeouts came on the pitch...His 52.0 slider-strikeout percentage was the second-highest in MLB (min. 150 PA) behind only teammate Edwin Díaz (54.7) and his 47.9 whiff percentage with the pitch was the third-highest in the majors behind only Díaz (54.7) and Seattle's Andres Muñoz (50.8).

STRIKE 'EM OUT, STRIKE 'EM OUT: Peterson struck out at least five batters in 11 straight starts from June 20-September 9 last season, the second-longest streak by a left-handed starter last season...It was the sixth-longest streak by a Mets left-handed starter in franchise history...Peterson had 82 strikeouts across 58.2 innings during that span (13 G/11 GS) good for a 12.58 K/9 ratio.

2022 RECAP: Set career-high marks in wins (seven), games (28), starts (19), innings (105.2), and strikeouts (126) last season...Went 7-5 with a 3.83 ERA for New York...Appeared mostly as a starter until mid-September...His final five appearances of the season came out of the bullpen...Went 6-5 with a 3.86 ERA (39 ER/91.0 IP) as a starter...In nine relief appearances, Peterson went 1-0 with a 3.68 ERA (6 ER/14.2 IP).
