THE CHIPPER JONES TRAIL: The St. Louis Cardinals continue a seven-game road trip through New York (Apr. 17-20) and Atlanta (Apr. 21-23) into the Easter holiday weekend, arguably two cities Braves' Hall of Famer Chipper Jones loved to play. The Cardinals play the third game of a four-game series with the National League East Division leaders, the New York Mets. The Cardinals lost 5-4 last night on a walk-off home run by Francisco Lindor to lead off the 9th inning. The Mets will visit Busch Stadium in two weeks (May 2-4) for three games to conclude the season series. New York has won the last six straight games between the two clubs dating back to April 28, 2024. The Cardinals last lost seven straight to the Mets Aug. 22, 2006-June 25, 2007. Their longest losing streak to the Mets was eight games in 1986.

WELCOME BACK, WAINO!: Today's game will be broadcast nationally on FOX with **Jason Benetti** and former Cardinals pitcher **Adam Wainwright** on the call. Wainwright pitched 478 games in his Cardinals career going 200-128 and closed out each series of the 2006 World Championship run including the NLCS against the Mets.

SHOW-ME...SOMETHING: This week, the state of Missouri sent its two teams to the Big Apple, but have yet to record a win as the Kansas City Royals were swept in a three-game series by the New York Yankees Monday through Wednesday, while the Cardinals have started this series 0-2 to the New York Mets.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: St. Louis has struggled out of the gate on the road this season. The barnstorming Cardinals are 1-7 and have lost three straight games. Both of their road trips have begun the same with a four-run loss in their first game followed by a walk-off loss. It's the 11th time in franchise history the Cardinals have started 1-7 on the road and first since 1997. The 1997 season was also the last time the Cardinals lost via walk-off in each of their first three series. St. Louis has been out-scored 58-36 through their first eight road games with their lone win at Pittsburgh on April 8, in which they defeated the Pirates and 2024 Rookie of the Year **Paul Skenes**, 5-3.

SIX IS A SERIOUS NUMBER: Over their first 19 games, the Cardinals have rapped out six or more hits in 19-of-20 games, the most of any team in the Major Leagues.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY ERNDOG!: St. Louis Cardinals Director of Team Travel Ernie Moore is celebrating his birthday today. The "ErnDog" has held positions as a Minor League and Major League clubhouse manager, before moving into his current position. Moore, an avid Univ. of Arkansas and Manchester City fan, takes care of logistics for every home and road game. He shares a birthday with actress Kate Hudson, actor James Franco, singer Ashley Judd, tennis star Maria Sharapova, baseball players Jackson Merrill, Joe Mauer, Jose Cruz, Frank Viola and Cardinals' Hall of Famer Whitey Kurowski.

STRIKING: Cardinals batters have struck out 26 times over the first two games of their series, the most since Sept. 3-4, 2024 at Milwaukee, in a series which the 'Birds won both of those games against the Brew Crew. St. Louis entered this weekend with 5.12 strikeouts/plate appearance, 3rd-lowest in the National League. Prior to last night, the Cardinals hadn't struck out 15 times or more since May 19, 2024 vs. Boston.

DONNY, YOU'RE OUT OF YOUR ELEMENT: Brendan Donovan hit a single in the 2nd inning last night, continuing his career-high 14-game hitting streak. The streak is currently the longest active in Major League Baseball; tied for the 2nd-longest this season in MLB behind **Jacob Wilson** (15). Against the Mets, Donovan has ran his streak to 12 games and nine straight at Citi Field. **Matty Alou** holds the Cardinals record with a 22-game streak vs. the Mets from 1971-73.

WINN STARTS REHAB ASSIGNMENT: Injured shortstop Masyn Winn began his injury rehabilitation assignment with Memphis (AAA) last night and was 0-for-3 with four assists defensively at shortstop. Winn was placed on the 10-day Injured List with lower back spasms on April 12. St. Louis is 3-4 in his absence and he would be eligible to return to the active roster on Tuesday in Atlanta. Cardinals who have played shortstop (Brendan Donovan & Thomas Saggese) have batted .423 (11-26) with four doubles and three RBI in his absence.

NEW YORK CONNECTIONS

Steven Matz was originally selected by the Mets in the 2nd round of the 2009 MLB Draft out of Ward Melville High School in East Setauket, NY and pitched parts of his first six seasons (2015-20) in New York...was born in Stony Brook, NY.

Brendan Donovan (April 25, 2022 at Busch III), and Masyn Winn (Aug. 18, 2023 at Busch III) made MLB debuts against the Mets.

Ryne Stanek was born in St. Louis

Phil Maton was traded to the Mets last season (July 9, 2024) and pitched in 31 games.

Cardinals Hall of Famer **José Oquendo** played the first two seasons MLB career with the Mets...traded by New York with **Mark Davis** to St. Louis for **John Young** and **Angel Salazar** (April 2, 1985).

Mets Pitching Coach **Jeremy Hefner** pitched his final professional season (2016) in the Cardinals minor league organization.

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Matt Morris** was born in Middletown, NY...graduated from Valley Central High School in Montgomery, NY...played college baseball at Seton Hall University.

Mets Clubhouse Operations Coordinator **Scott Keltner** previously worked in the Cardinals organization in the Busch Stadium (2016-21) and AutoZone Park (2014-15) visiting clubhouses.

Cardinals Hall of Famer & Mets broadcaster **Keith Hernandez** was selected by the Cardinals in the
42nd round of the 1971 MLB Draft...played 10
seasons in St. Louis (1974-83)...won the 1979 NL
MVP Award...named to two National League AllStar teams and won six Gold Gloves.

FanDuel broadcaster **Mark Sweeney** was traded to the Mets with **Jeromy Burnitz**, **Lou Collier**, **Jeff D'Amico**, and cash (January 21, 2002)...attended Spring Training with New York before released (March 13, 2002).

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Jason Isringhausen** was selected by the Mets in the 44th round of the 1991 MLB Draft...pitched parts of four seasons in New York (1995-97, 1999, 2011).

Hall of Fame Manager **Joe Torre** played for and managed both the Cardinals (1969-74 & 1990-95) and Mets (1975-77 & 1977-81).

Mets VP of Amateur Scouting **Kris Gross** was a Cardinals amateur scout for three seasons (2010-12).

Cardinals broadcaster **Ricky Horton** was born in nearby Poughkeepsie, N.Y...graduated from F.D. Roosevelt High School in Hyde Park.

Cardinals reporter **Jim Hayes** was born in New York City and raised in nearby Nyack, NY...graduated from SUNY-Geneseo.

Tylor Megill's older brother, **Trevor Megill**, was selected by St. Louis in the 3rd round of the 2014 MLB Draft, but did not sign.

Cardinals Special Advisor **Gary LaRocque** previously served as Scouting Dir., AGM & VP/ Player Dev. and Scouting with the Mets from (1998-2005)...appointed VP of Pro Scouting in 2006.

The Mets made their National League debut in St. Louis on April 11, 1962, losing to the Cardinals at Busch Stadium I on Opening Day, 11-4...The day prior before the season opener was rained out, a dozen Mets players were trapped in the Chase Park Plaza elevator for about an hour.

TODAY'S GAME:

- Left-hander is making his 4th start of the season (28th career) as he faces the Mets for the 4th time in his career, but for just his 2nd start.
- Today's start is just his 2nd at Citi Field; took a ND here on 6/18/23 in Cardinals 8-7 win on a Nolan Arenado 9th inning home run.
- Has worked 6.0 inning or more in each of his 1st three starts, holding the opposition to a 0.98 WHIP in 18.1 IP.
- Allowed just one hit to a left-handed batter (1-for-15, .067 BA) to begin the season and holds a career Opponent BA of .208 vs. LH batters.
- Is 1-6, 8.01 ERA in 14 career road starts, with lone win coming on 8/10/23 at Tampa Bay.
- Has issued just one walk and owns the majors top walks/9 IP ratio (0.49) among qualifying pitchers.
- In his 1st road start of the 2025 season, logged a season high 6.1 IP and 89 pitches in brisk conditions in 4/9 start at PIT, retiring 12 of his last 17 batters faced after allowing 3 runs in the 2nd inning
- Is 5-4 career in 12 career starts at Busch Stadium and has a 3.72 ERA; Libby won each of this 1st three career starts at Busch Stadium, but has only two wins, four losses and four no-decisions in his last 10 starts at home.
- Is a career 6-10 with a 5.57 ERA in 27 career starts opposed to 3-3 with a 3.89 ERA in 67 relief appearances.

LAST TIME OUT: Blanked the Phillies on just 3 hits over his 6.0 IP (88 pitches) last Sun. (4/13) at Busch Stadium and was credited with his 1st win of 2025 (7-0).

2025/CAREER NOTES:

- Pitched 6.0 innings allowing three runs for a quality start in his first start of the 2025 season vs. LAA (4/1); surrendered all his runs in the 3rd inning vs. LAA after retiring the first eight batters of the game.
- Spent the entire 2024 season on the Major League roster, his first season on the Opening Day roster and first full season in the majors.
- Appeared in a career-high 60 games in 2024 making six starts.
- Set Major League career-highs in innings pitched (86.1), strikeouts (76), and tied with three wins in 2024.
- Made 12 relief appearances to begin the 2024 season before his first spot start vs. CWS (5/5/24) tossing 3.2 innings, allowing one run, in a game the Cardinals lost 5-1.
- Pitched a season-high 6.0 scoreless innings of two-hit ball in a start vs. ATL (6/26-Game 2), striking out a career-high eight batters in a 4-1 win.
- He was notified that he was starting on the day of game in two of his starts: at MIA (6/19) and vs. ATL (6/26-Game 2).
- Led the Cardinals and ranked 7th in the N.L. with 25 appearances after the trade deadline (8/1/24).
- Went nine consecutive appearances (4/4-5/5) without allowing a hit against a left-handed batter (0-for-19, one walk).
- Ranked T-2nd among Cardinals relievers with John King with 33 inherited runners in 2024, trailing only JoJo Romero (34).
- Graduated from Mountain Ridge High School in Glendale, Arizona.
- Was a childhood teammate and friend of Cardinals infielder Nolan Gorman; both Liberatore and Gorman played in the American Youth Baseball Hall of Fame tournament at Cooperstown Dreams Park in 2012 and on the same World Cup team in 2017, winning the Gold Medal in Canada.
- Ranked by Baseball America as the No. 2 overall player in the 2018 Major League Baseball Draft.
- Selected by the Tampa Bay Rays in the first round (16th overall) of the 2018 MLB Draft, making him the highest drafted high school player in Rays franchise history.
- Acquired by the Cardinals from the Tampa Bay Rays with C Edgardo Rodriguez and Rays Compensation draft pick B (RHP Tink Hence) in exchange for OF José Martínez, OF Randy Arozarena and Cardinals Compensation draft pick A (INF Alika Williams), January 9, 2020.

LIBERATORE vs. METS:

- Making his 2nd career start (4th app.) vs. the Mets, two of which have come here at Citi Field.
- His lone prior start at Citi Field and against the Mets was in a no-decision on 6/18/23 in Cardinals 8-7 win on a Nolan Arenado 9th inning home run.
- Is 0-1, 7.00 ERA career against the Mets, losing in relief on a three-run walk-off HR by Mark Vientos in the 11th inning on 4/28/24
- Blanked the Mets over 2.0 IP in relief on 8/5/24 at Busch Stadium, setting his career high for strikeouts (4) in relief.
- Is 2-1 career vs. NL East clubs in 21 games/7 starts.
