TOP GUNN: Gunnar Henderson had his career-best 36 -game on-base streak since May 22 snapped on Sunday against Texas...The stretch was the longest by an O's batter since Nick Markakis' 38 -game
streak from July 5 to August 182009 ..It was the second-longest on-base streak in MLB this season streak from July 5 to August 18, 2009...It was the second-longest on-base streak in MLB this season behind New York-AL's Aaron Judge's 37 -gamer from May 2 to June 12...For Henderson, 35 of those came
as the starting shortstop, the longest such streak in team history ahead of a 30-gamer by Cal Ripken Jr. from June 26 to July 28, 1986.

LAST TIME OUT: Picked up the win on June 27 vs. Texas after allowing one run on a season-high-tying nine hits ( 1 HR ) with five strikeouts in 7.0 innings; has not issued a walk in consecutive starts for the second time this season. Burnes' six games of $7.0+$ IP are tied for the sixth-most in MLB...Marked his first career outing against the Rangers; has now faced every team in MLB.

AGAINST THE MARINERS: Slated to make his third career start and second of the season against Seattle...Owns a $2-0$ record with a 1.59 ERA (2 ER/11.1 IP) across his two prior outings...Earned the win in his last start against the Mariners on May 19 at Oriole Park after allowing one unearned run on six hits and one walk with a season-high-tying 11 strikeouts.

AGAINST THE AL WEST: Will be making his $10^{\text {th }}$ career appearance (ninth start) and sixth of the campaign against the AL West...Has made a start against every team in the division at least once this year; has gone 3-1 with a 1.97 ERA (7ER/32.0 IP) against the AL West this season...Opponents are slashing .207/.231/.379 (24-for-116) off Burnes in 2024...Is 5-2 with a 2.74 ERA (15 ER/49.1 IP) in his first nine career games (eight starts) against the division.

HIGH OUALITY: Burnes tossed a career-high 10 consecutive quality starts from April 26 to June 16, the longest streak in the majors this year and the longest stretch by an Oriole since Jeremy Guthrie (10, 5/8-6/26/07)...Burnes' 13 quality starts on the season are tied for fourth in MLB and his 53 quality outings since the start of 2022 rank third.

NEW BEGINNINGS: Burnes began his Orioles career with 15 straight starts of at least 5.0 innings and three-or-fewer runs allowed...The 15 consecutive outings was the longest such streak to begin a pitcher's career with the Orioles alltime.

EARLY STRUGGLES: After allowing five first-inning runs across his first six starts to open the season, Burnes has not allowed one since his outing on April 26 vs. Oakland...Four of those first inning runs have come via solo home runs.

RING 'EM UP: Burnes is one of six pitchers with 200+ strikeouts in each of the last three seasons (2021-23), along with Dylan Cease, Gerrit Cole, Kevin Gausman, Aaron Nola, and Spencer Strider... His 765 strikeouts from 2020-23 were the most in the NL and second-most in MLB behind Gerrit Cole (816)...He is one away from 100 on the season and 31 away from 1,000 for his career.

INNINGS EATER: The 669.1 innings consumed by Burnes since the start of 2021 rank third in MLB behind Philadelphia's Zack Wheeler (670.0) and Aaron Nola (687.0 IP)...Last season, he tossed 193.2 innings, which would have been the most by an Oriole since Chris Tillman threw 207.1 innings in 2014.

2023 HIGHLIGHTS: Burnes' 2023 campaign was highlighted by his third consecutive All-Star Game appearance...Burnes made his second straight Opening Day start for the Brewers...On July 25, he became the sixth pitcher in Brewers franchise history to notch 800 career strikeouts... He pitched to a 5-3 record with a 2.72 ERA (30 ER/99.1 IP) across his final 16 starts of the season.

POSTSEASON EXPERIENCE: Burnes' NL Wild Card Series start on October 3, 2023 against the Diamondbacks marked his eighth Postseason appearance (2 GS)...In those games, he has posted a 2.84 ERA (6 ER/19.0 IP) with 11 hits, six GS)...In those games, he
