## Chicago White Sox (39-35) at Detroit Tigers (31-44)

**WHOA NELLY:** Matt Vierling's two-run homer and Kerry Carpenter's two-run double powered the Detroit Tigers to the 4-3 win last night in the series opener of their three-game set vs. the Chicago White Sox, the start of a season-long 10-day, 10-game, three-team homestand that continues next week with visits from the New York Yankees (three games) and the Houston Astros (four games).

- Last night marked the start of a 14-games-in-14-days stretch for the Tigers through July 2, their longest scheduled run of games without a day off this season ... this homestand also marks the end of a stretch in which the Tigers will play 16 of 21 games at home from June 5-28
- The Tigers are 9-6 in June, the second-best record in the American League this month.

**TWO-OUT MAGIC:** Dillon Dingler leads the majors with 31 two-out RBI this season, two more than his next closest competitor (Cody Bellinger, 29) ... with several weeks to go, Dingler is already one of only four Tigers in the last 50 years to exceed 30 two-RBI prior to the All-Star Break, joining Miguel Cabrera (37, 2013), Prince Fielder (34, 2013) and Mickey Tettleton (34, 1993).

**WHERE'S THE CATCH?:** Dillon Dingler is tied for ninth in all of baseball with a 3.3 fWAR this year ... he is tied for the fifth-best fWAR among all big league position players and leads all major league catchers ... the next closest catcher on the A.L. All-Star ballot is the Athletics' Shea Langeliers, who plays on the moon and is light years behind Dillon at a 2.4 fWAR.

- Metrics show Dingler has received 138.76 called strikes looking above expected called strikes, by far the best number in the majors (Toronto's Brandon Valenzuela, who ironically is not on the All-Star Ballot like his soon-to-be-mentioned teammate, is next best at 93.24).
- Despite the aforementioned data, Dingler ranked fourth in MLB's recent All-Star fan ballot update behind Shea Langeliers (OK maybe), Toronto's Alejandro Kirk, who has literally played a whopping 10 games this season, and Baltimore's Adley Rutschman, who is in an actual 50-50 timeshare at the position with his 21-year-old teammate.

**CLOSING IN:** A.J. Hinch last night picked up career win number 995, tying Terry Collins and Bill Virdon for 68th-place on the all-time managerial win list ... Hinch is five wins shy of becoming the 68th manager in major league history to reach 1,000 career victories, also tying Charlie Manuel.

**GO GREENE:** Riley Greene is batting .313 (68-for-217) with 12 doubles, eight homers, 27 RBI, a .403 on-base, a .479 slugging and an .882 OPS in his last 61 games over the past 10 weeks starting April 11 ... he ranks third in the A.L. in batting average and in on-base percentage in this span ... Greene ranks fifth in All-Star fan voting, which would advance him to the second round.

**SHORT SQUEEZE:** Kevin McGonigle (4.1 bWAR) and Bobby Witt Jr (4.3 bWAR) are the only two shortstops on the American League All-Star ballot with a bWAR greater than 2.5, making them the clear-cut favorites for the A.L. All-Star team this season ... Witt Jr. is second in all of baseball in bWAR while McGonigle is just behind at third-best in the majors.

- Despite the aforementioned data, McGonigle ranked third in MLB's recent All-Star fan ballot update behind Bobby Witt Jr (OK fine) and Toronto's Andres Gimenez and his electric 0.4 bWAR, which makes him tied for the 222nd-best position player in baseball.

**THAT'S A FIRST:** Last time out, Troy Melton picked up the win after allowing exactly four runs on four solo home runs on June 9 vs. the Twins ... Melton became the first pitcher in Tigers history to earn the win after allowing exactly four runs on four homers, the first to earn the win despite allowing four homers since Matthew Boyd on August 31, 2019 vs. Minnesota (5 R, 4 HR, 10-7 win).

**START ME UP:** Tigers starting pitchers have allowed four runs or less in 23-straight starts beginning May 24, the longest active streak in the majors and well ahead of next closest Tampa Bay and its cute 13-game run ... it's Detroit's longest such streak since May 16-June 13, 2025 (27 games).

**JUNE SLUG:** The Tigers offense is third in the majors with a .507 slugging percentage and ranks second in the A.L. with an .824 OPS in June ... the Tigers also are tied for third in the A.L. with an average of 5.47 runs scored per game this calendar month.

- With 33 home runs in 15 games in June, the Tigers have already blasted their way past their 32 homers in 27 games in April and their 18 homers in 28 games in May ... the Tigers have scored 82 runs in 15 games this month, one more than their 28-game total of 81 runs scored in May.

**IT'S BEEN A GRIND:** Through their first 26 games, the Tigers went 14-12 and woke up on April 24 with a share of first place in the A.L. Central ... in their 49 games since, the Tigers have gone 17-32 to drop their record to 30-44 and tied for fourth place in the division ... Detroit's 17-32 (.347) record in the last eight weeks starting April 24 is the lowest winning percentage in baseball in this span.

- Despite going 9-6 to start the month of June, the Tigers have lost 19 of their last 30 games, 22 of their last 34 games and 27 of their last 40 games starting May 4.

**AND FINALLY:** Spencer Torkelson is tied with Atlanta's Matt Olson for third in baseball by seeing an average of 4.33 pitches per plate appearance ... the last Tigers to see more pitches per plate appearance over the course of a season?: Mickey Tettleton (4.44) and Tony Phillips (4.35) in 1994.

- Scratched from his last start against Houston with back tightness...looking for his fourth win in his fifth start of the year and second against the White Sox...tossed 7.0 innings of one-run ball back on May 29 against the White Sox, but got a no-decision.
- Earned his third win in four starts this year despite allowing four solo home runs over his 5.0 innings pitched...became the first pitcher in Tigers history to earn the win after allowing exactly four runs on four homers, the first to earn the win despite allowing four homers since Matthew Boyd on August 31, 2019, vs. Minnesota.
- Turned in the best start of his young major league career on June 3 against Tampa Bay, as he picked up his second win of the season, limiting the Rays to two runs on four hits and two walks in a career-best 8.0 innings pitched, the longest start by a Tigers pitcher this season...Melton retired his final 17 batters faced and at one point threw 22-consecutive strikes between the fifth and eighth innings.
- Allowed one run on six hits and a walk while striking out one over 7.0 innings on May 29 against Chicago-AL, his second straight outing of surrendering just one run to begin his season.
- Started the 2026 season on the 60-day injured list with right elbow inflammation...activated on May 24 and pitched that night, allowing just one earned run on two hits and three walks while striking out three over 5.2 innings.
- Made his Major League debut on July 23, 2025, against Pittsburgh...earned his first big league win on July 28 last year against Arizona in his first home start, tossing seven scoreless innings, allowing just five hits while also striking out five.
- Selected by Detroit in the fourth round (117th overall) of the 2022 MLB Draft out of San Diego State University.

- Was an emergency starter on June 15 against Houston, allowing just one earned run on two hits and two walks while striking out five over 2.2 innings pitched.
- Blew back-to-back save opportunities on May 29 and May 31 against Chicago-AL...allowed three earned runs on five hits over 1.1 innings between the two outings.
- Tossed 3.0 perfect innings and earned the win on May 27 against Los Angeles-AL...continued a stretch of 14.0 consecutive innings over five games dating back to May 13 in which he has not allowed an earned run...has allowed just five hits and four walks compared to 16 strikeouts over this span.
- Earned a six-out save on May 24 against Baltimore, striking out four over his two scoreless frames.
- Made the third big league start of his career on May 20 against Cleveland, his first since Aug. 7, 2021, with the Texas Rangers against the Athletics...tossed 4.2 scoreless frames, allowing just two hits and two walks while striking out a career-high seven batters.
- Threw 4.0 scoreless innings on May 15 against Toronto, allowing just one hit while striking out one...was called upon for long relief after the original Tigers bulk pitcher left the game early with an injury.
- Earned his first win of the season and second of his major league career on April 30 against Atlanta, tossing 2.0 scoreless frames...allowed one hit and one walk while striking out two, keeping Detroit within a run before they took the lead late.
- Earned his first career major league save with 3.1 scoreless innings, allowing two walks while striking out two in a victory over the Marlins on April 11.
- Signed with Detroit on a one-year major league contract with a club option for the 2027 season on Dec. 16, 2025.
- Spent each of the previous two seasons with the SSG Langers of the KBO League...went 12-7 with a 2.25 ERA (43 ER/171.2 IP) in 30 starts for SSG last season, recording 245 strikeouts in his 171.2 innings pitched, an average of 12.8 strikeouts per nine innings.
- In his two seasons with SSG, went 23-10 with a 2.91 ERA (93 ER/287.1 IP) in 54 appearances (53 starts)...released by Detroit after nine appearances with Triple-A Toledo in 2024 prior to signing with the Langers.
- Has spent parts of five seasons with the Philadelphia Phillies (2017-19), Chicago White Sox (2020) and Texas Rangers (2021) prior to joining the Tigers this year...also pitched with Hiroshima in the NPB for the 2022-23 campaigns.

- Has not allowed a run since May 18, surrendering just one hit over his last 8.2 frames...has struck out eight batters compared to just one walk dating back to May 21.
- In his first game since May 22, tossed 4.0 perfect innings on June 2 against Tampa Bay to earn his first Major League save...struck out four of the 11 batters he faced.
- Earned the win on Sunday Night Baseball on May 10 against Kansas City, delivering a perfect 2.1 innings with a strikeout.
- Optioned to Triple-A Toledo on April 22...recalled on April 29 after making one relief appearance with the Mud Hens...allowed one hit and one walk while striking out two over 2.0 innings in the outing.
- Earned the first Major League win of his career with a scoreless inning (one hit, two strikeouts) in his first appearance of the year on March 27 against San Diego.
- Posted a 2-0 record in the World Baseball Classic, helping Team Venezuela to a gold medal...struck out 11 batters with a 1.23 ERA (1 ER/7.1 IP) in the tournament.
- Had his contract selected by the Tigers on March 10, 2026, in the midst of the World Baseball Classic.

- Became just the 14th player in franchise history to record 100 career doubles before turning 26 years old with his 100th double on April 16 against the Royals...his 101st double came in his next at-bat and tied the game in the bottom of the ninth inning in an eventual walk-off victory.

- Drove in four runs on June 13 last year against Cincinnati, giving him 201 career RBI...at 24-years-old, Greene is the first Tiger to reach 200 career RBI before the age of 25 since Travis Fryman did so in 1992 at 23 years old.

- Reached base safely in 27 consecutive starts spanning exactly one month, from March 30-April 30...he is the first Tigers rookie to do so since outfielder Dick Wakefield reached in 29 straight starts back in 1943 (thanks to Elias)...the last 21-year-old or younger Tiger prior to reach base safely in 27-or-more starts in a row was Al Kaline, who reached in 34-straight starts nearly 70 years ago from July 26-Aug. 28, 1956.

- Ripped the first pitch he ever saw in the big leagues into right field for a two-run double, instantly becoming only the sixth Tiger since the RBI became a stat in 1920 to record two RBI in his major league debut, the first since Isaac Paredes on Aug. 17, 2020...is the second of the six to accomplish this feat on Opening Day, joining Paredes, JaCoby Jones (Aug. 30, 2016), Rob Richie (Aug. 19, 1989), Jake Wood (Opening Day April 11, 1961), Hank Riebe (Aug. 26, 1942) and Sammy Hale (April 20, 1920) in turning this trick.
- Became the first Tiger ever with two doubles in his major league debut on Opening Day and the second in the history of the franchise with two doubles in his major league debut on any day, joining Hank Riebe on Aug. 26, 1942.
- McGonigle is the second player in franchise history to collect four hits in his major league debut, joining Billy Bean (April 25, 1987).
- At 21 years, 220 days old on Opening Day, he became the second-youngest player in the history of the Tigers franchise to make his major league debut in the starting lineup on Opening Day and the youngest in 112 years since starting first baseman George Burns made his major league debut on Opening Day April 14, 1914...thanks to Elias.
