AT A GLANCE: The Yankees continue their six-game road trip today with the final game of a three-game set at Toronto (0-2 thus far)...will also play a three-game set at Baltimore (Tues.-Thurs.)...went 5-4 on their recent nine-game homestand after going 1-2 vs. St. Louis, 2-1 vs. Atlanta and 2-1 vs. Seattle.

- **Their 68-55 (.553) record is the second-best in the American League and the sixth-best in the Majors**, trailing only Milwaukee (76-48, .613), Tampa Bay (74-48, .607), Los Angeles-NL (74-50, .597), Atlanta (73-50, .593) and Chicago-NL (72-52, .581).
- Have lost three straight games for the first time since losing seven straight games from 6/25-7/1...are 14-11 in their last 25 games (since 7/19) and 18-13 in their last 31 games (since 7/9).
- Each of the Yankees' last four wins, 11 of the Yankees' last 18 wins (since 7/9), 13 of their last 22 wins (since 6/23) and 19 of their last 33 wins (since 5/31) have been comeback wins.
- **Despite their current series loss, have won three of their last five series (since 7/31) and have won or split eight of their last 11 series since 7/6 (are 6-3-2 in those series).**
- Have had 21 of their last 30 games decided by 2R-or-fewer (since 7/10), going 13-8 in those games...are 33-28 (.541) in games decided by 2R-or-fewer this season.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees fell to the Blue Jays, 4-1, on Saturday at Rogers Centre...**RHP Cam Schlichter** (5.1IP, 4H, 1R/ER, 3BB, 7K, 0HR) allowed only 1R/ER over 5.1IP in a no-decision...**SS George Lombard Jr.** (1-for-2, 1RBI, 1BB) reached base twice and drove in the Yankees' only run with a go-ahead RBI single in the second inning...**1B Luis García Jr.** (1-for-4), **RF Spencer Jones** (1-for-3, 1R, 1SB) and **C Austin Wells** (1-for-3) were the only other Yankees to pick up hits...**LHP Brent Headrick** (1.0IP, 3H, 1R/ER, 1K) suffered his second loss of the season after allowing 1R/ER in 1.0IP...**Yankees relievers** allowed 3R/ER in 2.2 innings of relief.

WEATHERS REPORT: LHP Ryan Weathers will make his 24th start of the season in today's series finale at Toronto...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in eight of his last 10 starts (since 6/18), posting a 2.75 ERA (52.1IP, 16ER) with 55K during that span.

- Has gone undefeated in each of his last six starts (since 7/10), going 2-0 with a 2.10 ERA (34.1IP, 8ER) over that span...has allowed 1R-or-fewer in five of his last six starts...the Yankees are 5-1 in those starts.
- **Has allowed 1R-or-fewer in each of his last four starts (since 7/25), going 2-0 with a 0.74 ERA (24.1IP, 2ER) during that stretch.**

AUSTIN POWERS: C Austin Wells is batting .333/.412/.567 (10-for-30) with 3R, 4 doubles, 1HR, 3RBI, 3BB, 1HP and 1SB over his last 14 games (since 7/30).

- Is hitting .304/.396/.522 (14-for-46) with 6R, 4 doubles, 2HR, 4RBI, 5BB, 2HP and 1SB over his last 20 games (since 7/20).
- Has posted a .907 OPS over his last 26 games (since 7/9).
- Eight of his last 17H since 7/9 have been XBH (4 doubles, 4HR).
- **His 2.92 catcher's ERA is the best in the Majors.**
- According to Baseball Savant, is tied for fourth in the Majors in catcher framing runs (five), tied for fifth in blocks above average (six) and tied for ninth in shadow strike pct. (49.1%)...is tied for sixth in the Majors in DRS among catchers (eight - FanGraphs).

McMAHON OF THE HOUR: INF Ryan McMahon has hit .429/.438/.929 (6-for-14) with 1 double, 2HR and 1BB in his career vs. Toronto's RHP Dylan Cease.

- Is hitting .286/.366/.429 (10-for-35) with 4R, 2 doubles, 1HR, 5RBI, 5BB and 1SF over his last 12 games (since 8/2).

NEW KID ON THE BLOCK: INF Luis García Jr. has hit .278/.308/.543 (110-for-396) with 51R, 23 doubles, 5 triples, 24HR, 78RBI, 18BB and 4SB in 114 games this season...ranks fourth in the Majors in slugging percentage (.543), is tied for fourth in multi-HR games (four) and tied for eighth in RBI (78)...over his last 80 games (since 5/9), has batted .295/.328/.622 (85-for-288) with 37R, 17 doubles, 4 triples, 23HR, 62RBI, 14BB and 25B...during that stretch, leads the Majors in RBI and SLG, is tied for second in XBH (44), is tied for fourth in home runs and fifth in OPS (.949).

- Has batted .293/.322/.579 (98-for-335) with 23 doubles, 5 triples, 21HR and 15BB vs. right-handed pitchers this season.

ROAD WARRIORS: The Yankees are 37-28 (.569) on the road this year, the second-best record in the AL and the fifth-best in the Majors...are 23-15 in their last 38 games on the road (since 5/25).

FOR STARTERS: **Yankees starting pitchers have allowed 2R-or-fewer in 14 of their last 17 starts (since 7/28), including 1R-or-fewer in 12 of those starts, posting a 2.03 ERA (97.2IP, 22ER) during that span.**...have allowed 2R-or-fewer in 17 of their last 22 starts and 1R-or-fewer in 15 of those starts (since 7/22-G2), posting a 2.37 ERA (121.2IP, 32ER) with 140K during that span.

- **Have allowed 3R-or-fewer in 96 starts this season, their most such starts through their first 123 games of a season in franchise history** (previous: 95GS in 2021 and 2022)...have allowed 2R-or-fewer in 72 games this season, their second-most starts through their first 123 games of a season in franchise history, trailing only their 76 starts in 2022.
- Have allowed 3R-or-fewer in 28 of their last 32 starts (since 7/8), including 2R-or-fewer in 23 of those starts, posting a 2.78 ERA (171.2IP, 53ER) during that span.
- **Rank second in the Majors this season in ERA (3.40, second in AL)**, third in strikeouts (690, first in AL), strikeout rate (25.3%, first in AL), K/9.0IP (9.39, first in AL), opponents' BA (.226, first in AL) and opponents' OPS (.664, second in AL), fourth in opponents' SLG (.373, third in AL), fifth in HR/9.0IP (1.05, third in AL) and opponents' OBP (.291, third in AL), sixth in K/BB (3.30, third in AL) and WHIP (1.16, fourth in AL), and ninth in BB/9.0IP (2.85, fifth in AL).

PITCH PERFECT: **Yankees pitchers have posted a Major League-best 3.28 ERA (1,097.2IP, 400ER) this season** (next: Boston-3.48)...have allowed 3R-or-fewer in 14 of their last 22 games (since 7/22-G2), including 2R-or-fewer in 12 of those games, posting a 2.66 ERA (200.0IP, 59ER) during that stretch.

- Have allowed 3R-or-fewer in 19 of their last 30 games (since 7/10), posting a 2.84 ERA (273.0IP, 86ER) with 298K during that span.
- Their 463R allowed this season are their second-fewest through their first 123 games of season in the last 46 162-game seasons (since 1979), trailing only their 431R allowed in 2022 (excludes the 60-game season in 2020 and the strike-shortened 1981 season).

NEW YORK 'PEN STATION: **Yankees relievers have posted a Major League-best 2.59 ERA (236.2IP, 68ER) over their last 63 games (since 6/3)**, holding opponents to a .202 (173-for-855) BA during that stretch.

- **Own the second-best bullpen ERA in the Majors this season (3.09, second in AL)**...also rank second in the Majors this season in inherited runners scored percentage (21.8%, first in AL), third in opponents' OPS (.654, second in AL), fourth in opponents' BA (.223, first in AL), opponents' SLG (.350, second in AL), opponents' OBP (.303, third in AL) and WHIP (1.21, third in AL), fifth in HR/9.0IP (0.93, second in AL) and 10th in K/BB (2.47, fifth in AL).

GOOD SCHLITT: RHP Cam Schlichter allowed only 1R/ER over 5.1IP in a no-decision on Saturday at Toronto (4H, 3BB, 7K, 0HR)...has gone 10-6 with a 2.19 ERA (152.0IP, 37ER) and 189K in 26 starts this season, holding opponents to a .196/.249/.321 (109-for-555) slash line...**has allowed 1ER-or-fewer in a Major League-best 18 starts this season, including 16 of his last 22 starts (since 4/17)...his 18 starts of 1ER-or-fewer this season are tied with Spud Chandler (18GS in 1943 and 1946) and Whitey Ford (18GS in 1963) for the fourth-most by a Yankees pitcher in a single season (since ERA became an official stat in 1913)**, trailing only Ron Guidry (21GS in 1978), Ford (20GS in 1964) and Fritz Peterson (19GS in 1969).

GEORGE OF THE CONCRETE JUNGLE: INF George Lombard Jr. reached base twice and drove in the Yankees' only run on Saturday at Toronto with a go-ahead RBI single in the second inning...has hit safely in seven of his first 10 career games, batting .265/.342/.441 (9-for-34) with 6R, 2HR, 3RBI and 4BB.

KEEPING UP WITH THE JONESES: OF Spencer Jones has hit safely in three of his last four games (since 8/12) and has reached base safely in six of his last seven games (since 8/8), batting .273/.385/.500 (6-for-22) with 3R, 3 doubles, 1 triple, 5RBI, 3BB, 1HP and 3SB in that seven-game span.

MERRY GRISHMAS: OF Trent Grisham has reached base safely in each of his last seven games (since 8/8), batting .393/.414/.964 (11-for-28) with 6R, 4 doubles, 4HR, 8RBI and 1BB in that span.

- 10 of his last 14 hits have been XBH (5 doubles, 5HR).
- Has hit 4HR in his last six games (since 8/9) and 5HR in his last 11 games (since 8/3).

- #17 AARON BOONE—ManagerCareer Managerial Record: 765-552 (7th-most wins by a Yankees Manager, next: Joe Girardi, 910)
- Enters his ninth season at the helm for the Yankees (2018-26)...in 2025, guided the Yankees to the postseason after posting a 94-68 (.580) record, tied for the best record in the American League and tied for the third-best record in the Majors...marked the Yankees’ seventh postseason appearance under his helm...served as the American League Manager for the 2025 All-Star Game in Atlanta...became the 10th Manager in franchise history (33rd time) to manage the All-Star Game.
 - Is one of two Managers in Major League history to reach the postseason in seven of his first eight seasons as Manager (credit: *Elias* - min. 2G as manager per season), joining Dave Roberts (first 10 seasons with the Dodgers)...was the third manager to make the playoffs in seven of his first eight seasons with the Yankees, joining Joe Torre (each of first 12) and Casey Stengel (nine of his first 10).
 - Earned his 750th career managerial win on 7/11/26 at Washington, becoming only the seventh Manager in Yankees history to accomplish the feat, joining Joe McCarthy (1,460-867-21), Joe Torre (1,173-767-2), Casey Stengel (1,149-696-6), Miller Huggins (1,067-719-10), Ralph Houk (944-806-7) and Joe Girardi (910-710).
 - Was signed to a two-year contract extension through the 2027 season on 2/20/25...was re-signed by the Yankees on 10/19/21, to a three-year contract through the 2024 season with a club option for 2025...the Yankees exercised his 2025 club option on 11/8/24...was named the 33rd Manager in club history on 12/4/17.
 - Has 50 career managerial ejections (four in 2026; seven in 2025; six in 2024; seven in 2023; nine in 2022; six in 2021; two in 2020; five in 2019; four in 2018).

- #72 JOSÉ CABALLERO—INF/OFCurrent/Season-High Hitting Streak: 0G/7G
- According to FanGraphs and Sports Info Solutions, ranks second among Major League shortstops in DRS (nine).
 - Is tied for sixth in the Majors in stolen bases (29, tied for fourth in AL).
 - Has appeared defensively this season at SS (64G/61GS), 3B (17G/10GS), 2B (15G/8GS), LF (9G/6GS), RF (9G/6GS) and CF (2G/1GS).
 - Has hit .304/.407/.609 (7-for-23) with 2R, 1 double, 2HR, 4RBI, 4BB and 6SB over his last nine games with a PA (since 7/29).
 - Has hit a career-high 12HR in 102 games this year after hitting 5HR in 126 games in 2025.
 - Entered Saturday's game vs. Toronto as a PR (Wells) in the eighth inning (did not bat)...did not play on Friday at Toronto.
 - Was 0-for-2 with 1BB and 1SB on Thursday vs. Seattle.
 - With his 29SB this season, has recorded at least 20SB in a single season for the fourth time in his career (26SB in 2023, 44SB in 2024 and 49SB in 2025).
 - Is one of five active players to record at least 20SB in each of their first four Major League seasons, joining Andrew McCutchen (first five: 2009-13), Bobby Witt Jr. (first five: 2022-26), Julio Rodríguez (first four: 2022-25) and Elly De La Cruz (first four (2023-26).
 - Since 2023, his 148 stolen bases are the third-most in the Majors, trailing only Cincinnati's Elly De La Cruz (160) and Kansas City's Bobby Witt Jr. (150).

- #13 JAZZ CHISHOLM JR.—INFCurrent/Season-High Hitting Streak: 0G/5G
- Ranks fourth in the Majors in stolen bases (31, third in AL)...has recorded at least 30SB in a single season for the third consecutive year (also 40SB in 2024 and 31SB in 2025)...is one of two Major League players to record at least 30SB in each of the last three seasons (also Bobby Witt Jr.)...is also the first Yankee in the last 15 years (since 2012) to record 30SB in consecutive seasons (first since Brett Gardner from 2010-11).
 - Is one of three Yankees (fourth time) in the last 24 years (since 2003) and one of five Yankees (seventh time) in the last 37 years (since 1990) to record at least 31SB through the first 123 games of a season, joining Jacoby Ellsbury (32SB in 2014), Brett Gardner (36SB in 2011 and 35SB in 2010), Alfonso Soriano (34SB in 2002 and 2001) and Chuck Knoblauch (31SB in 2001).
 - Is only the fourth Yankee in franchise history to hit at least 15HR and record at least 30SB in back-to-back seasons, joining Alfonso Soriano (three straight seasons from 2001-03), Roberto Kelly (two straight seasons from 1990-91) and Rickey Henderson (three straight seasons from 1985-87).
 - Ranks fourth among Major League second basemen in Outs Above Average (10 - FanGraphs).
 - 11 of his 17HR this season have either tied the game (two) or given the Yankees the lead (nine).
 - Has reached base multiple times in three of his last six games (since 8/9).
 - Was 0-for-3 on Saturday at Toronto...went 1-for-4 on Friday at Toronto.
 - Was 0-for-4 on Thursday vs. Seattle...drew a bases-loaded walk in the seventh inning on Wednesday vs. Seattle (1-for-3, 1R, 1RBI, 1BB)...reached base twice on Tuesday vs. Seattle (1-for-3, 1R, 1BB, 1SB).
 - Has recorded at least 20SB in a season for the fifth time in his career (also 23SB in 2021, 22SB in 2023, 40SB in 2024 and 31SB in 2025)...is one of only five players in the Majors to record at least five 20SB seasons since 2021, joining José Ramírez (six), Randy Arozarena (six), Bobby Witt Jr. (five) and Nico Hoerner (five).

- #48 PAUL GOLDSCHMIDT—INFCurrent/Season-High Hitting Streak: 1G/10G
- Has hit .310/.403/.589 (40-for-129) with 7 doubles, 1 triple, 9HR, 17BB and 3HP vs. left-handed pitching this season...ranks sixth in the Majors in OPS (.992, third in AL), eighth in SLG (fourth in AL), and is tied for 10th in extra-base hits (17, tied for third in AL).
 - Has not played the last six games.
 - Seven of his 16HR this year have come in the first inning...10 of his 16HR have given the Yankees the lead...his 16HR in 87 games this year have surpassed his 2025 season total (10HR in 146 games).
 - In 27 games batting leadoff in the starting lineup this season, has batted .282/.378/.544 (29-for-103) with 15R, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 7HR, 16RBI, 15BB and 1HP.
 - As a Yankee (since 2025), has batted .324/.407/.579 (90-for-278) with 21 doubles, 1 triple, 16HR, 34BB/6IBB and 5HP vs. left-handed pitchers...ranks third in the Majors in OPS (.986, third in AL), fourth in SLG (fourth in AL), and seventh in extra-base hits (38, first in AL), BA (fourth in AL) and OBP (sixth in AL).
 - As a Yankee (since 2025), has hit .286/.379/.400 (50-for-175) with 8 doubles, 4HR, 61RBI, 25BB/6IBB, 3HP and 3SF with RISP.
 - Since his first full Major League season in 2012, leads the Majors in go-ahead RBI (330), ranks second in games played (2,113), RBI (1,250), runs scored (1,289), total bases (3,892), times on base (3,371), doubles (479) and XBH (883), third in game-winning RBI (148) and hits (2,225), fourth in walks (1,090), sixth in HR (380), ninth in OBP (.376) and 10th in WAR among position players (58.1, FanGraphs).
 - His 388 career home runs are tied with Bryce Harper for the fourth-most among active players, trailing only Giancarlo Stanton (456HR), Mike Trout (424HR) and Manny Machado (392HR).

- #26 LUIS GARCÍA JR.—INFCurrent/Season-High Hitting Streak: 1G/6G
- Was acquired by the Yankees from the Washington Nationals in exchange for RHPs Jake Bird, Yovanny Cruz, Jack Cebert and Ben Grable on 8/2.
 - Ranks fourth in the Majors in slugging percentage (.543), is tied for fourth in multi-HR games (four) and tied for eighth in RBI (78).
 - Four of his 9H as a Yankee have gone for extra bases (3 doubles, 1HR).
