

MIAMI MARLINS (24-39) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (26-40) June 9, 2025 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 6:40 EDT - Game #67/Home #36 RHP Eury Pérez (2025 Debut) vs. RHP Mike Burrows (1-1, 5.27 ERA)

THE PIRATES: have won four of the first six games on this nine-game homestand (1-2 vs. Houston, 3-0 vs. Philadelphia)...Will head to Chicago-NL (June 12-15) and Detroit (June 17-19) for a seven-game trip following this series vs. Miami...Have gone 14-14 since Don Kelly took over as manager on May 8...Are looking to win four straight games for the first time since last season from September 8-11...Have played in 14 one-run games (8-6 record) since Kelly became the manager.

BEASTS OF THE EAST: Pittsburgh has gone 19-8 against the National League East at PNC Park since the start of the 2024 season (6-0-2 in eight series)...The Pirates' last series loss here against the NL East was vs. Miami from September 29-October 1, 2023.

SWEEP DREAMS: Pittsburgh swept Philadelphia in a three-game series this weekend, its first sweep this season and first since sweeping Miami last season from September 9-11 here at PNC Park...The Pirates have not swept back-to-back series since April 17-19, 2023 at Colorado (three games) and April 20-23, 2023 vs. Cincinnati (four games), as part of a seven-game winning streak.

WHAT A RELIEF: Braxton Ashcraft picked up his first Major League win on Sunday vs. Philadelphia, a day after Isaac Mattson earned his first big-league victory on Saturday vs. Philadelphia...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Mattson and Ashcraft are only the second pair of Pittsburgh relievers since at least 1893 to each earn their first Major League win in consecutive team games...The only other pair of Pirates relief pitchers to do that were Rick White and Ravelo Manzanillo from April 15-16, 1994 vs. Los Angeles (NL).

POTENT PITCHERS: Pirates pitchers allowed six runs in their three-game sweep of Philadelphia this weekend, their fewest in a series sweep since allowing only four runs from August 28-30, 2023 at Kansas City...Pittsburgh's 3.20 staff ERA (247.2ip/88er) since Don Kelly took over as manager on May 8 is the fifth-lowest among all Major League teams (San Francisco, 2.56, ranks first).

<u>CUTCH 22(00)</u>: Andrew McCutchen recorded the 2200th hit of his career with his first-inning single, while also delivering the game-winning hit with his eighth-inning single that brought home Oneil Cruz, on Sunday vs. Philadelphia...His 2201 hits are third-most among all active Major League players, trailing only Los Angeles (NL)'s Freddie Freeman (2337) and Houston's Jose Altuve (2296)...It marked McCutchen's first game-winning RBI in the eighth inning or later since last September 2 at Chicago (NL).

STELLAR SKENES: Paul Skenes allowed one unearned run on two hits and one walk (seven strikeouts) in 7.2 innings on Sunday vs. Philadelphia...It was his third start of 7.2-plus innings, one/zero runs allowed and seven-plus strikeouts (also May 18 at Philadelphia and June 3 vs. Houston)...He's the first Pirates pitcher to do that in back-to-back starts since Francisco Cordova from August 1-7, 1999...The three-such starts this season are the most by a Pittsburgh pitcher in a single season since Gerrit Cole (also three) in 2015, as well as the most by any Major Leaguer in 2025 (Boston's Garrett Crochet and Houston's Framber Valdez each have two).

<u>CRUZ CONTROL</u>: Oneil Cruz walked, stole his league-leading 23rd base and scored the game-winning run in the eighth inning on Sunday vs. Philadelphia...Cruz' 37 walks are tied for the ninth-most in the National League, while his 15.1-percent walk rate is the ninth-highest in all of Major League Baseball...Across his last 16 games (since

May 21 vs. Cincinnati), Cruz has nine extra-base hits (four doubles, a triple and four home runs), 10 RBI, nine walks, five stolen bases and 12 runs scored.

RELIABLE ROTATION: Pittsburgh's 10 starts of 7.0-plus innings and one or zero runs allowed this season are the most among all Major League staffs (Kansas City and New York-AL, nine, are tied for second)...The Pirates' 3.58 ERA from their starting rotation this season ranks fourth in the National League (seventh in MLB)...Their 31 quality starts are tied with San Francisco for fourthmost in MLB, behind Philadelphia (34), Tampa Bay (34) and Kansas City (33).

BUCS ON THE BASES: Pittsburgh's 62 stolen bases this season are the fifthmost in all of Major League Baseball, behind Tampa Bay (90), Milwaukee (85), Chicago-NL (82) and Seattle (63)...The Pirates stole 15 bases in their seasonopening series at loanDepot park, tied for fifth-most in a series in club history.

LAST TIME OUT: Burrows earned his first win as a starter in the Major Leagues, pitching a career-high 5.1 innings while striking out a career-best six batters en route to a 3-0 win on Wednesday vs. Houston...It was tied for the second-longest outing of his professional career (also July 7, 2021 for High-A Greensboro vs. Asheville), trailing only an outing of 7.0 scoreless innings for Double-A Altoona on May 26, 2022 at Harrisburg...He became one of just 10 Pirates rookies (11 instances) since at least 1901 to pitch 5.1-plus scoreless innings with six-plus strikeouts while issuing zero walks in an outing...Opponents are hitting .091 (1-for-11) against his slider (thrown 45 times).

IN THE SHOW: Burrows will make his fourth start of the season with Pittsburgh tonight...He lost an 8-5 decision in his season debut on May 22 vs. Milwaukee, while also allowing five runs (four earned) on May 27 at Arizona, having a no-decision in the team's 9-6 win...He also tossed 5.1 scoreless innings on Wednesday vs. Houston.

DEBUT DAY: Burrows made his MLB debut in relief of Paul Skenes last season on September 28 at Yankee Stadium...In that game, he earned the win, allowing two runs (one earned) on two hits, three walks, two strikeouts and one home run in 3.1 innings...He was recalled from Triple-A Indianapolis this April 24, but did not pitch before being optioned back to Triple-A after the team's April 25 victory in Los Angeles.

DOWN ON THE FARM: Burrows went 2-1 with a 2.51 ERA (32.1ip/9er) and 41 strikeouts over eight appearances (seven starts) at Triple-A Indianapolis...In his start on May 11 vs. Columbus, he struck out a career-high 11 batters in 4.2 scoreless innings...At the time of his promotion to Pittsburgh on May 21, he ranked second in the International League with a 1.02 ERA, 28 strikeouts and a 0.85 WHIP, as well as third with a .175 batting average against, in the month of May (four games/three starts).

TALK OF THE TOWN: Burrows is currently rated as the Pirates' No. 13 prospect, according to Baseball America (No. 15, according to MLB Pipeline)...Burrows has been a top-30 prospect for Pittsburgh, per Baseball America, in every preseason since 2020.

WHERE I'M FROM: Burrows is a native of Waterford, Connecticut, roughly two hours from Yankee Stadium, where he made his Major League debut last September 28.

THE LONG ROAD BACK: Burrows began the 2023 season at Triple-A Indianapolis and made two starts for the Indians, but left his start on April 8 at Louisville with a right forearm injury...He was placed on the injured list on April 11 before undergoing "Tommy John" surgery on April 26, which forced him to miss the remainder of the season...He began the 2024 season on the injured list while recovering before beginning his rehab assignment with the Florida Complex League Pirates in mid-June...He made two starts there, as well as four starts at Low-A Bradenton before heading back to Indianapolis in late July, where he made 10 appearances (nine starts).

LOOKING TO THE FUTURE: Burrows represented Pittsburgh at the 2022 All-Star Futures Game at Dodger Stadium...He pitched a scoreless fifth inning in the National League's 6-4, seven-inning win, allowing a hit and a walk (one strikeout)...He was the first Connecticut native to be selected to the game since George Springer (2013).
