RAY REPORT—The Rays continue their final homestand of the season against the Red
Sox (2-1) and Blue Jays (3 to play) with tonight's series openerhave not won or lost more
than three consecutive games since being swept by Baltimore from June 7-10, going 44-
43 since that seriesare 21-26 since the July 30 trade deadline and 27-30 since the All-
Star breakincluding off days, this marks their 93rd consecutive day occupying fourth
place in the AL Eastare 5.0 games behind the Twins for the AL's third and final Wild

The Rays recorded the 14th one-hit shutout in franchise history and first since April 9, 2023 vs. OAK in last night's 2-0 win over the Red Sox...it marked their 11th shutout in this season, tied for sixth most in the AL, and signaled their first time in club history allowing one hit or fewer with 10+ strikeouts (11) and no walks. The Rays have recorded an MLB-most 13 wins when scoring two runs or fewer, second most in club history behind 2014 (14)...they have scored two runs or fewer 63 times overall, second most in the majors behind the White Sox (69) and second most in team history behind the inaugural 1998 campaign (71)...Tampa Bay has been held to the mark in four of five and seven of its last 11 games.

The Rays 3.21 ERA since the All-Star break ranks third in MLB behind the Tigers (3.06) and Astros (3.12)...they have an active 10.0 scoreless inning streak and have yielded only 3 ER across their last 25.0 innings (1.08 ERA).

Tampa Bay is 2-1-2 in its last five series on the heels of a 1-6-1 stretch from Aug. 6-Sept. 1...the club is seeking a third consecutive series-opening victory for the first time since winning four straight from June 21-July 2...the Rays are still 3-11 in their last 14 series openers, going 2-4 at home in that timeframe.

This marks the Rays first series against an opponent that entered with a sub-500 record since Aug. 19-22 vs. OAK, snapping a streak of eight consecutive sets against .500+ teams.

UNTOUCHABLE—Kevin Kelly (20.1IP) and Zack Littell (20.0IP) own two of the three longest active scoreless inning streaks in the majors...according to STATS LLC, it marks the third time in franchise history two Rays have had concurrent scoreless streaks of 20.0+ innings...the last instance involved Pete Fairbanks (29.2) and Yonny Chirinos (21.2) on April 29, 2023, when Chirinos extended his streak beyond the 20-inning mark, but saw it snapped in the same game vs. the White Sox...the other occurrence came on Aug. 7, 2012, when Fernando Rodney (22.0) and J.P. Howell (20.0) had active streaks...excluding streaks that began last season, there has been only one other instance in MLB this season, involving SD Yu Darvish (25.0) and SD Robert Suarez (20.0) through May 23.

Kelly's streak is tied for the longest of his career (also May 14–July 15 [G2], 2023)... he has not permitted an earned run in 22 straight outings, longest active streak in the majors and tied for the fourth-longest run in franchise history.

PITCH PERFECT—Rays pitching has yielded three runs or fewer in 11 of their last 13 games since Sept. 6, ranking fifth in the majors with a 2.50 ERA (111.2IP, 31ER) in that span...excluding games on Sept. 10 at PHI (8) and Sept. 14 at CLE (6) in which they yielded a combined 14 ER, the Rays have turned in a 1.60 ERA (95.2IP, 17ER) in the other 11 games across that timeframe...they have allowed three runs or fewer in 33 games since the All-Star break, second most in the AL behind the Tigers (35) and fourth most in MLB.

Tampa Bay's rotation has permitted two runs or fewer in eight straight and 12 of their last 13 starts...it marks their second-longest streak of the season behind June 23–July 3 (9G)...Rays starters own a 1.39 ERA (32.1IP, 5ER) in their last five games, holding opponents to a .118/149/227 (13-for-110) line with 38 strikeouts and four walks.

The bullpen's 2.80 ERA (235.0IP, 73ER) since the Midsummer Classic ranks third in the majors behind the Guardians (2.67) and Angels (2.72).

RACE TO THE FINISH—The Rays need to go at least 6-3 over their final nine games to finish with a .500 or better record for a seventh consecutive season...they were last under the mark in 2017 (80-82)...it would surpass 2008-2013 (6) for the longest streak in franchise history...the Rays are one of four teams to post a .500+ record each season from 2018-23, joining the Braves, Dodgers and Yankees...Tampa Bay needs to win at least two of three games this series to post its eighth consecutive winning season at home...its last losing record at Tropicana Field came in 2016 (36-45)...the Rays, Brewers, Dodgers and Yankees are the only clubs to finish above .500 at home in each of the last seven seasons since 2017.

Since becoming the Rays in 2008, the club has finished with a winning record in 12 of 16 seasons...only the Yankees (16) and Dodgers (15) have more such campaigns in that timeframe (excl. 2024).

CLOSE SHAVES—The Rays are an MLB-best 50-32 (.610) in games decided by two runs or fewer...their 82 such games are tied with the Brewers for the most in the majors and are sixth most in a season in club history...their 26-20 (.565) mark in one-run games ranks fourth in the AL, while the 26 victories are tied for second behind the Tigers (28).

Of the Rays 18 games in September, 12 have been decided by two runs or fewer, including six of eight home contests...their 33 such games since the All-Star break are tied with the Athletics for the most in the majors.

RAYS AND JAYS—The Rays and Blue Jays meet for their fourth and final set, concluding a 13-game season series...this marks Toronto's first visit to Tropicana Field since the clubs split a season-opening four-game series from March 28-31...the Rays need to win just one of the next three games to claim a seventh straight season series win over the Jays since dating back to 2018...it would surpass 2008-13 (6) for the longest streak over Toronto in franchise history...the Rays are 8-4 in their last 12 and 13-8 in their previous 21 games against the Jays.

Tampa Bay has homered in nine of 10 games vs. Toronto this season and 21 of 23 meetings since the start of 2023...the club has homered in seven straight home games vs. the Jays, tied for the third-longest streak in franchise history behind runs in 2015-16 (12G) and 1998-99 (8G).

Yandy Diaz (10-for-25/.400) and Brandon Lowe (8-for-22/.364) are batting a combined .383 (18-for-47) vs. Toronto this season...the rest of the Rays lineup has hit .215 (62-for-288)...in his last game against them on July 25 at Rogers Centre, Lowe tied the Rays single-game record (5x) by reaching base six times via hit, walk or hit-by-pitch (4-for-4, 2 2B, HR, 3RBI, 2BB).

DOWN ON THE FARM—Double-A Montgomery suffered a 5-1 defeat to Biloxi (MIL) in Game 2 of the Southern Division Finals last night, evening the best-of-three series at 1-1...LF Matthew Etzel drove in the lone run with an RBI-single in the 8th inning... the series concludes at 7:35 p.m. ET tonight at Montgomery Riverwalk Stadium...RHP Duncan Davitt will make his first career postseason start as the Biscuits look to advance to the Southern League Championship Series for the first time since 2021...Montgomery is seeking its first championship since winning back-to-back titles from 2006-07.

High-A Bowling Green claimed its fourth South Atlantic League title in the last six seasons on Wednesday...since 2000, the Rays organization has earned 19 full-season minor league championships, the most in baseball, outpacing the Guardians (16), according to Baseball America.

ON THE AIR—Shane McClanahan is scheduled to join Dewayne Staats and Brian Anderson in the Bally Sports Sun broadcast booth during the 3rd inning of tonight's game...the left-hander has spent the season on the 60-day IL while recovering from Aug. 21, 2023 Tommy John surgery.

TONIGHT'S START-Alexander takes the ball for the 22nd time this season (8th start) and 12th at home (3rd start)...marks his first start since Aug. 23 at LAD and his first at Tropicana Field since May 12 vs. NYY... has served as a bulk reliever pitching directly behind an opener 11 times this season...was recalled from Triple-A Durham on Aug. 17 to begin his third stint with the Rays (Opening Day–May 31; July 23–Aug. 11).

LAST TIME OUT— Followed RHP Drew Rasmussen (2.0IP, 1H, 0R, 2SO) and took the loss on Sept. 14 at Cleveland after working 5.0 innings, allowing four runs on four hits and two walks with two strikeouts... marked his longest outing since Aug. 18 vs. Arizona (5.2IP)...intentionally walked José Ramírez with runners on 2nd and 3rd in the 6th inning, marking only the second intentional walk of his career (also June 25, 2022 at AZ - Christian Walker).

BIRDS FLY SOUTH—He is set to face Toronto for the fourth time this season (2nd start), having gone 2-0 with a 4.70 ERA (15.1IP, 8ER) and 12 strikeouts against two walks thus far...in his lone outing at Tropicana Field on March 31, threw 5.0 innings in a bulk relief role behind opener Shawn Armstrong, allowing five runs on six hits, two walks and two home runs (Davis Schneider/Justin Turner) with four strikeouts...his two career wins against Toronto are tied for his most against any opponent along with Baltimore, Cleveland, Kansas City and Minnesota.

NEARLY PERFECT-On May 17 at Toronto, Alexander carried a perfect game into the 8th inning, retiring 22 consecutive Blue Jays before Danny Jansen's bloop single...the 7.1 IP effort marked the second-longest individual perfect game bid in Rays history behind Drew Rasmussen, who sat down 24 BF (8.0IP) on Aug. 14, 2022 vs. BAL before allowing a Jorge Mateo double on the first pitch of the 9th inning.

The 22 consecutive batters retired tied Matt Garza for the second

most at any point in a game in Rays history behind Rasmussen... Garza turned the trick during his no-hitter on July 26, 2010 vs. DET, the only no-no in Rays history.

SWINGMAN—Of his 141 career appearances, 50 have come as a starter (35.5%) while 91 have come in relief (65.3%)...since 2020, his 52 relief appearances of 2.0+ IP are third most in MLB behind CIN **Brent Suter** and TOR **Ryan Yarbrough** (both 56)...this season, he is 1-2 with a 5.20 ERA (36.1IP, 21ER) in seven starts and 5-3 with a 5.81 ERA (62.0IP, 40ER) in 14 appearances out of the bullpen.

Is 12-6 with a 4.49 ERA (204.1IP, 102ER) in his 91 career

appearances compared to 5-22 with a 4.78 ERA (235.1IP, 152ER) in his 50 starts.

He has made five relief appearance of 5.0+ innings this season, tied for the MLB lead with DET Brant Hurter...the five outings are tied with Austin Pruitt (2018) for third most in a single season in franchise history, trailing Ryan Yarbrough (11, 2018) and Yonny Chirinos (8, 2018).

HOMER (UN)HAPPY—Alexander has yielded 23 HR, most by a Ray through his first 20 appearances with the club since Doug Waechter (24) from 2003-04...min 75.0 IP, his 2.11 home runs per 9.0 IP is fourth highest in the majors behind MIA Roddery Muñoz (2.83), PHI Taijuan Walker (2.63) and CLE Triston McKenzie (2.26).

In his last outing, however, Alexander ended a career-high-tying give auting strenking which he allowed 14 HP in each care.

MIX AND MATCH-Alexander primarily deploys his four-seamer and cutter against right-handed hitters, holding them to a .253 (43-for-170) clip...against his four other offerings (changeup, sinker, slider sweeper), righties have found greater success, posting a .300 (33-for-110) AVG.

Against lefties, his sweeper as been the most effective offering, holding them to a .182 (8-for-44) mark compared to .323 (20-for-62)

off his other five pitches.

ODDS AND ENDS—Nine-hole hitters are a combined 17-for-46 (.370) against him with a 1.005 OPS...this, compared to a .191 (9-for-47) average and .668 OPS against opposing leadoff hitters...min. 400 BF, Alexander's 68.7 pct. first pitch strike rate ranks 3rd in the AL/7th in MLB...owns a career 3.93 ERA (100.2IP, 44ER) in September, his second lowest in any month behind June (2.58 - 38.1IP, 11ER).
