THIS DATE IN ORIOLES HISTORY
On this date in 1985, **1B Eddie Murray** hit three home runs at California and tied **Jim Gentile's** 24-year-old club record with nine RBI in a game...The Orioles notched seven homers in the game as **CF John Shelby**, **3B Floyd Rayford**, **LF Gary Roenicke**, and **C Rick Dempsey** all went deep in the 17-3 win.

ABOUT LAST NIGHT: The O's opened their seven-game road trip with a 4-2 loss at Tampa Bay on Tuesday night, their first road loss since Opening Day (July 24 at Boston) to snap an eight-game road winning streak...It marked the Orioles longest road winning streak since May 1-19, 2012 (nine games).

👉 **Tommy Milone** tossed 5.1 innings and allowed just two earned runs on four hits...He allowed his first walk since allowing three in his first outing on Opening Day...His first-inning walk to **Brandon Lowe** snapped a career-best streak of 21 innings without a free pass.

👉 **Renato Núñez** homered for the first time in 14 games after hitting five home runs in his first 13 games of the season.

👉 **Ryan Mountcastle** went 1-for-3 and notched his first career RBI.

ROAD WARRIORS: At 8-2 (.800), the Orioles own the best road record in the majors...Tuesday's loss at Tampa Bay was the O's first loss on the road since Opening Day at Boston...O's hitters lead the AL and rank second in the majors with a .292 team batting average on the road, trailing only Washington's .304 road batting average...The Orioles also lead the AL and rank second in the majors with a .834 team OPS on the road (Washington, .882)...Orioles pitchers own a 4.04 ERA (40 ER/89.0 IP) in nine games on the road this season to rank fourth in the AL and seventh in the majors...Top road records in the majors:

THAT HANSER IS SO HOT RIGHT NOW: Since the start of the 2019 season, **INF Hanser Alberto** leads the majors with 96 hits off of left-handed pitching...In that time, he also leads the majors with a .395 (96-for-243) average against lefties...This season, Alberto ranks eighth in the AL with a .311 (37-for-119) average against all pitchers...Alberto is tied for first in the majors with 12 doubles...His 13 multi-hit games this season are tied for first AL and are tied for second-most in the majors.

I SAN-TAN-DARE YOU: OF Anthony Santander went 0-for-4 on Tuesday at Tampa Bay...His 0-for-4 night snapped his current hitting streak at 18 games to mark a career high, passing his 12-game stretch from August 25-September 7, 2019...Santander hit .329 (25-for-76) with eight home runs, eight doubles, a triple, and 20 RBI during the 18-game stretch since Game 2 on August 5...It was the longest hitting streak by an Oriole since **Nick Markakis'** 18-game hitting streak from April 21-May 11, 2014.

👉 Santander's 10 home runs on the season lead the Orioles, are tied for fourth in the AL, and are tied for sixth in the majors...He is tied for second in the AL and is tied for third in the majors with 27 RBI this season...22 of his 33 hits have been for extra-bases (11 doubles, one triple, 10 home runs) and leads the majors with 22 extra-base hits.

CATCH THIS: The O's catching corps of **Pedro Severino**, **Chance Sisco**, and **Bryan Holaday** ranks among league leaders in many offensive categories...Severino ranks third in the AL with a .333 (27-for-81) overall batting average...O's catchers ranks (while catching):

IF YOU AIN'T FIRST, YOU'RE LAST: The Orioles have been one of the more successful teams in baseball when swinging at the first pitch...They rank first in the majors in batting average (.432), rank second in OPS (1.209), are tied for first in extra-base hits (22), lead the AL and are tied for first in the majors in doubles (13), and lead the AL and rank fourth in the majors in hits (47) as a team on the first pitch.

👉 **OF Anthony Santander** leads the Orioles with eight hits on the first pitch...He is tied for fifth-most in the majors and is tied for second in the AL...**Hanser Alberto** and **Renato Núñez** are tied for 11th in the AL with six hits each on the first pitch of an at-bat.

👉 Santander is tied for second in the majors with five extra-base hits on the first pitch, while **C Pedro Severino** is tied for sixth in the majors with four extra-base hits on the first pitch.

ALL ABOUT THAT (ON) BASE: The O's rank third in the AL with a .772 team OPS (on-base percentage plus slugging percentage)...**C Pedro Severino** (.981) leads the team and ranks ninth in the AL, while **OF Anthony Santander** (.961) ranks 11th in the AL in OPS among qualifying hitters.

POSTSEASON PLUS: Major League Baseball and the MLBPA jointly announced that the 2020 Postseason will expand to 16 teams, beginning with eight best-of-three Wild Card Series preceding the Division Series...The higher seeds in the Wild Card Series will host all three games.

INJURED LIST: Seven players are on the Injured List...**INF Chris Davis** (left knee patellar tendinitis), **RHP Hunter Harvey** (right forearm strain), **OF Austin Hays** (non-displaced rib fracture), and **INF José Iglesias** (left quadriceps strain; retroactive to 8/16) are on the 10-day Injured List...**LHP Wade LeBlanc** (left elbow stress reaction), **INF/OF Trey Mancini** (colorectal cancer recovery/treatment), and **INF Richie Martin** (right wrist fracture) are on the 60-day IL.

THE SKIPPER: **Brandon Hyde** was named the 20th manager in O's history on December 14, 2018...He began his first Major League managerial role following 16 professional seasons in the coaching ranks and four as a player...Most recently, Hyde served as bench coach for the Chicago Cubs in 2018, his second season in that role (also 2014)...Hyde spent three seasons as the Cubs first base coach from 2015-17, and previously served as Chicago's Director of Player Development from August 2012-2013, after joining the Cubs in December of 2011 as their Minor League Field Coordinator...Prior to joining the Cubs, Hyde spent nine seasons in the Marlins organization.

LAST START: Started on 8/20 vs. BOS and was charged with his third loss of the season after allowing three runs on seven hits, one home run, and one walk with four strikeouts through 3.2 innings of work...His seven hits allowed set a season high, while the 3.2 innings matched his shortest start of the year (previous: 8/9 at WSH)...He has now allowed six home runs through his first five starts of the season.

AGAINST TAMPA BAY: Has made four outings (three starts) against the Rays in his career, pitching to a 0-1 record with a 5.00 ERA (10 ER/18.0 IP) and 15 strikeouts...All of his career appearances against the Rays came in the 2019 season, with his most recent start on 9/2/19 at TB in which he tossed 7.0 innings, allowing four runs on five hits, one home run, with one walk and five strikeouts...Through his four games against Tampa Bay, he has surrendered four home runs, and two of those have come off the bat of Rays outfielder Austin Meadows.

FACING THE AL EAST: In 15 career appearances (12 starts) against AL East opponents, Wojciechowski owns a 2-7 record and a 4.90 ERA (35 ER/64.1 IP) with 25 walks and 68 strikeouts...His 4.90 ERA is his lowest against any of the six divisions...AL East opponents are batting .233 against Wojciechowski in his career, which is also his best mark among the divisions.

BUMPY ROADS: This will be his second road start of the season, after tossing 3.2 scoreless innings on three hits and two walks with four strikeouts on 8/9 at WSH...Made eight starts on the road last season, going 3-4 with a 4.60 ERA (22 ER/43.0 IP)...Has gone 4-5 with a 6.52 ERA (57 ER/78.2 IP) and a 1.48 WHIP in 25 career road games (14 starts), compared to 5-10 with a 4.99 ERA (58 ER/104.2 IP) in 27 career home games (18 starts)...In career road games, opponents have hit .290 (92-for-317) against Wojciechowski, compared to .257 (105-for-408) at home...Tonight's contest will mark his third career start at Tropicana Field, where he has currently gone 0-1 with a 5.84 ERA (8 ER/12.1 IP).

THE TERRIBLE THREE: In 2019, the top three batters in the lineup averaged .336 (41-for-122) with 20 extra-base-hits (10 doubles, two triples, eight home runs), 19 RBI, and 11 walks while striking out 11 batters against Wojciechowski, compared to the four through nine-hole hitters, who averaged just .194 (39-for-201) with 18 extra-base-hits (seven doubles, two triples, nine home runs), and 17 walks while striking out 54...Held the heart of the order to a .252 (30-for-119) clip last season.

A LOT OF PUNCHOUTS: Wojciechowski struck out 54 batters in his first nine starts last season (7/2/19-8/17/19)...According to STATS LLC., his 54 strikeouts ranked as the fifth-most in Orioles history (since 1954) among a pitcher's first nine starts of the season...Gene Brabender - 55 (7/4/66-8/30/67), Kevin Brown - 57 (4/29/95-6/12/95), Jack Harshman - 58 (4/22/58-6/7/58), and Hoyt Wilhelm - 60 (8/31/58-5/9/59) all rank ahead of him.

OUT OF THE BULLPEN: Has made 20 career appearances in relief, and owns a 2-0 record with a 3.38 ERA (12 ER/32.0 IP) and an opponent average of .200 (23-for-115) with 13 walks and 33 strikeouts...In nine relief outings at home, he has surrendered just one run in 20.2 innings pitched (0.44 ERA) while surrendering seven hits and six walks with 23 strikeouts in 75 batters faced.

Means will make his fifth start of the season...Was dealt his second loss of the season in his last start on 8/21 vs. BOS after allowing three runs on four hits, two home runs, with two strikeouts over 3.0 innings of work...In three of his four starts this season, he has pitched 3.0 innings-or-less while allowing three runs-or-more...Owns a 2-1 record and 3.68 ERA (9 ER/22.0 IP) with 20 strikeouts in four career outings (three starts) against Tampa Bay...His last start against the Rays came at home on 8/24/19 when he tossed 7.0 innings and allowed just one run on five hits, one home run, with seven strikeouts.
