FIRST PLACE, NL EAST, 3.5 GA



METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Braves, 9-6, last night...The Mets have won nine of their last 11 games and 13 of their last 18...This Mets are in a stretch of 27 games in 26 days (6-2), a span that includes two doubleheaders (August 6 vs. Atlanta and August 20 at Philadelphia) and one scheduled off day (August 11)...The Mets are 51-11 when scoring first this season...New York is 24-6-3 in 33 series this year...The Mets continue an 11-game homestand (1-1), their longest of the year, against the Braves (1-1), Reds (three games) and Phillies (three games).

D. PETERSON: LHP David Peterson is set to start game one today...Peterson is 5-2 with a 3.54 ERA (29 earned runs/73.2 innings) with 35 walks and 86 strikeouts in 17 games (13 starts) this year...He is 4-2 with a 3.43 ERA (25 earned runs/65.2 innings) with 30 walks and 78 punchouts in those 13 starts...Over his last six starts, he is 2-1 with a 2.78 ERA (10 earned runs/32.1 innings) with 13 walks and 49 strikeouts.

PETEY PUNCHOUTS: Peterson has struck out seven or more batters in each of his last six starts after doing so five times in his first 31 career starts...He has 51 strikeouts in 33.2 innings since June 20 in eight games (six starts)...That 13.63 K/9 ratio leads the NL and ranks third in the majors in that span (min. 30.0 IP) behind only Shohei Ohtani (15.11) and Cristian Javier (13.97).

LET'S PLAY TWO: New York is set to play its seventh doubleheader of the season today...It's the second doubleheader against the Braves this year...The Mets swept a twinbill on May 3 in New York, winning game one 5-4 and game two by a score of 3-0...The team's six doubleheaders so far are tied for third in the majors...It will be the club's 21st double dip since 2021, more than any other team in the majors...The Mets have earned at least a split in all 21 of their twinbills over the last two years...Elias notes the team's streak of 21 consecutive doubleheaders without being swept is the longest in Mets history...New York has swept four of their last seven doubleheaders, including three DH sweeps this season...The last time the Mets were swept in a doubleheader was September 26, 2020 at Washington.

I GET KNOCKED DOWN, BUT I GET UP AGAIN: The Mets are 29-9 (.757) following a loss this year...The .763 winning percentage is the best in the majors.

GIVE ME A BREAK: The Mets are 9-4 in the second-half...The team's nine wins are tied for the third-most in the majors...The team is batting .296/.359/.503 following the All-Star break...They lead the majors in average and are second in OBP and SLG following the All-Star Game...The Mets are outscoring opponents 67-49 following the break.

A BUCK 20: Buck Showalter has 1,618 career wins as a manager, one win shy of tying Ralph Houk for 20th place on the all-time list.

EIGHT IS GREAT: Jeff McNeil is on an eight-game hitting streak, batting .429 (15-35) with six runs, five doubles, two home runs, five RBI with a .444 OBP and a .743 SLG in that span...He has recorded five multi-hit games in that span...McNeil has recorded 106 doubles in his career, which times him with Curtis Granderson for 28th in franchise history...Next up is Tommie Agee with 107 doubles.

DAY MAN: New York is 27-15 in day games this season...The team's .643 winning percentage in the sunlight is the third-best in the majors and the second-best in the National League...The Mets have posted a 3.04 ERA with 105 walks and 402 strikeouts in the daytime...Their 3.04 ERA in the daytime is third in the majors and second in the NL, while their 402 punchouts are fourth in the majors and the second-most in the Senior Circuit.

BACK AND BETTER THAN EVER: Since returning from the IL, Max Scherzer has gone 2-1 with a 1.62 ERA (7 ER/39.0 IP) in six starts...Scherzer made five starts in July after being activated from the IL on July 5...He went 1-1 with a 1.39 ERA (5 ER/32.1 IP) while striking out 45 and walking just four, making him one of just eight pitchers ever with a sub-1.50 ERA, at least 45 strikeouts and fewer than five walks in a calendar month...His 1.39 ERA in July ranked seventh in the majors, while his 45 punchouts were tied for third...His 11.25 K/BB ratio was the best in MLB last month.

CLIMBING THE LEADERBOARD: Scherzer entered the 2022 season as the active leader in strikeouts...He has since been passed by Justin Verlander, who has moved up to 14th on the all-time list...Scherzer currently ranks 15th on MLB's all-time strikeout list, having passed Curt Schilling (3,116) and Bob Gibson (3,117) on July 22...Scherzer is still within striking distance of a few pitchers above him this season...He is 25 behind Pedro Martinez...He currently trails Verlander by 11 strikeouts...See below for a chart of the No. 10-19 strikeout pitchers of all-time:

AW SNAP: The Mets streak of consecutive games in which they've scored at least four runs ended at 25 yesterday...It was tied with the longest such streak in franchise history and the longest single-season streak...The Mets are 35-2 since May 27 when scoring at least four times...Overall, New York is 57-6 when scoring at least four runs in a game this year...The team's 57 wins when scoring at least four runs is tied for second in the majors...Their .905 winning percentage when scoring four or more runs is the best in the majors.

BRAVES-METS NOTES: Starting with this series, the Mets will play the Braves nine times over the next two weeks.

THE ROAD TO 100: Díaz has struck out 87 batters in 43 games this season...He is seeking to become the seventh reliever in franchise history to strike out 100 batters in a season...The last player to do that was Seth Lugo in 2019...His career-high best is 124 strikeouts in 73 games in 2018...His record with the Mets is 99 strikeouts in 66 games in 2019.

LET'S GO STREAKING!: Edwin Díaz has not allowed a run in his last 16 outings dating back to June 22, covering 16.1 innings, establishing a new career-high scoreless streak...33 of Díaz last 45 outs have been recorded via the strikeout...He was won back-to-back NL Reliever of the Month awards and since the start of June, Díaz has posted a 0.39 ERA (one earned runs/23.0 innings) with 11 hits, two walks and 49 strikeouts...He has converted all 13 saves in that period.

BRING OUT THE TRUMPETS: Díaz leads the major leagues among relievers with 87 strikeouts...That is 21 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...He has struck out 52.1% of batters faced (87/167), the highest strikeout rate by a relief pitcher through 43 appearances of a season in MLB history...His 17.93 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...No other reliever has a K/9 rate over 16.00...Overall, he is 2-1 with 24 saves, a 1.44 ERA (seven earned runs/43.2 innings), allowing 27 hits and 12 walks...The Mets are 38-5 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

ALL THAT POWER: The Mets have hit 10 home runs in their last five games and 19 in their last 11 games...The team has homered in 10 of their last 11 games...The Mets are 53-18 when hitting a home run this year...They are 25-5 when hitting multiple home runs in a game in 2022.

30 FOR 20: Pete Alonso has hit 29 home runs this season...He is seeking to become the fifth player in Mets history to record multiple seasons with 30 or more home runs...Mike Piazza is the franchise leader, recording four such seasons...Howard Johnson, Darryl Strawberry and Dave Kingman have all recorded three seasons with at least 30 or more home runs...Alonso ranks seventh in team history with 135 home runs.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: In 13 games since the All-Star break, Pete Alonso is batting .375 (18-48) with 12 runs, five doubles, five home runs, 13 RBI, eight walks with a .474 OBP and a .792 SLG...Alonso ranks second in the majors and tops the NL with 91 RBI...He is tied for fourth in the majors and tied for second in the NL with 29 home runs...Alonso is seventh in the majors and third in the NL with a .551 SLG.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are in a stretch of 11 straight games against the NL East and 17 of their next 20 games vs. their division...The Mets are 6-2 during the stretch...Overall, the Mets are 34-14 against the East this year...Their .708 division winning percentage is the best in baseball...They have not lost a series in the division all season long...According to ESPN Stats & Info, New York has either won or tied each of their 14 series this season against the East...That is the third-longest streak by a team to start a season since the MLB implemented divisions in 1969...It's the longest since the Braves went 16 straight to start the 1999 season...Since May 27, the team has gone 21-7 in the division...Overall, the Mets have posted a 3.17 ERA against the East, while hitting .262/.339/.427...The Mets have outscored their divisional opponents 246-159.

CITI SLICKERS: The Mets have played 50 games at Citi Field this year, which is tied for the third-fewest in the majors and the second-fewest in the National League...By comparison, the Braves have played 59 home games, the most in the majors...The Mets are 32-18 at home...They are fourth in the majors and second in the National League with a .640 winning percentage at home...The Mets have posted a 3.40 ERA with 148 walks and 477 strikeouts at Citi Field...The Mets own the third-best home ERA in the NL.

LINDOR CITY OVER HERE: Francisco Lindor is on a 12-game on-base streak...Since July 23, he is batting .400 (18-45) with 11 runs, four doubles, three home runs, eight RBI, eight walks with a .491 OBP and a .689 SLG...In 30 games since the start of July, Lindor is batting .314/.396/.551 with 20 runs, five doubles, a triple, seven home runs, 18 RBI, 15 walks and a .953 OPS...He ranks third in the majors with 21 go-ahead RBI behind teammate Pete Alonso (26)...He ranks 13th in the majors and eighth in the National League with a 4.3 fWAR.

20/20 VISION: Francisco Lindor has recorded 74 RBI in 105 games this season (72 as a shortstop)...That is the second-most RBI by a shortstop in Mets history...José Reyes owns the record, recording 81 RBI in 153 games in 2006...He has hit 19 home runs this season (18 as a shortstop)...Asdrúbal Cabrera set the franchise record with 22 home runs as a shortstop in 2016...He is seeking to become the first shortstop in Mets history to record 20 home runs in multiple seasons...Lindor blasted 20 home runs in 2021...Lindor has recorded 107 hits this season, surpassing his total from 2021 (104)...Francisco Lindor is sixth in the majors and fourth in the NL with 74 RBI...The Mets are the only team in the majors with two players with 70 or more RBI this season.

PETERSON NEWS & NOTES

A MINUTE IN THE MINORS: His last start came for the Syracuse Mets on July 31...Threw 4.1 innings allowing one run on four hits...Peterson threw 71 pitches and struck out seven batters while walking only two.

LAST TIME OUT: Peterson made a relief appearance for the Mets on July 27 in the Subway Series...He walked Anthony Rizzo before giving up a two-run home run to Gleyber Torres, which tied the game at two...He struck out one batter and threw only eight pitches before exiting...In his last start for the Mets on July 17, Peterson took the mound at Wrigley Field going 5.0 innings...He allowed one unearned run with three walks and eight strikeouts.

JUST PEACHY: Peterson will face the Braves for the seventh time in his career...He earned the loss in his last start against the Braves at Truist Park on July 12 after allowing two runs through 5.1 innings of the team's ultimate 4-1 loss...When facing Atlanta at home, Peterson owns a 3.27 ERA (four earned runs/11.0 innings) across two starts.

HOME BASE: In eight games, six starts, at home this season, Peterson has pitched to a 4.99 ERA (17 earned runs/30.2 innings)...He is 3-1 with 33 strikeouts and 15 walks at Citi Field...In his career, Peterson is 8-3 with a 3.92 ERA (35 earned runs/80.1 innings) through 18 games, 17 starts, at home with 79 strikeouts and 40 walks.

PUNCHOUT: In each of his last six starts, Peterson has struck out seven or more batters, which is a career-high...He has 51 strikeouts in 33.2 innings since June 20 in nine games (seven starts)...That 13.63 K/9 ratio leads the NL and ranks third in the majors in that span (min. 30.0 IP) behind only Shohei Ohtani (15.11) and Cristian Javier (13.97).

SWING AND A MISS: Peterson has generated at least 12 swings and misses in six straight starts, causing 91 total whiffs in that span...Before this stretch, he had just four starts in his career in which he made opposing hitters swing and miss a dozen or more times...The most swings and misses Peterson has generated in a start this year was 19 on June 20...His career-high is 23, which he accomplished on September 19, 2020.

UNCHARTED WATERS: With 73.2 major league innings under his belt in 2022, Peterson has set a career-high (previously, his most innings pitched in the majors was 66.2 in 2021)...In 2018 and 2019, Peterson logged over 100.0 innings pitched in the minors (128.0 IP in 2018 and 116.0 IP in 2019).

TO THE LEFT, TO THE LEFT: This season, Peterson has limited left-handed batters to a .180 (11-61) average...He owns the third-lowest opponents' average in the NL among left-handed pitchers (min. 60 LHB faced).

ELECTRIC SLIDE: This season, Peterson has held batters to .150 (15-100) average with his slider and 59 of his 86 strikeouts have come via the slider...Last season, opposing batters hit .299 (20-67) off the pitch...Peterson's 53.6 strikeout percentage on his slider is the third-highest in the majors (min. 50 PA) behind teammate Edwin Diaz (57.8)...His slider also ranks fifth in the majors with a 34.5 putaway percentage.

FOUR-HIT WONDER: The southpaw has allowed four hits or fewer in nine of his 13 starts and 13 of his 17 appearances overall this year...He has held the opposition to four hits or fewer in 31 of his 42 career games.

TAKIN' CARE OF BUSINESS: Peterson has allowed four earned runs or fewer in all 13 of his starts this season...In his career, he has allowed more than three earned runs just seven times in 37 career starts.

SCHERZER NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Threw a season-high 105 pitches en route to his seventh win of the season on August 1 at Nationals Park, his old stomping grounds...Threw 6.2 innings and allowed three runs (two earned) on six hits with two walks and five punchouts.

BACK AND BETTER THAN EVER: Since returning from the IL, Scherzer has gone 2-1 with a 1.62 ERA (7 earned runs/39.0 innings) in six starts...Scherzer made five starts in July after being activated from the IL on July 5...He went 1-1 with a 1.39 ERA (5 earned runs/32.1 innings) while striking out 45 and walking just four, making him one of just eight pitchers ever with a sub-1.50 ERA, at least 45 strikeouts and fewer than five walks in a calendar month...His 1.39 ERA in July ranked seventh in the majors, while his 45 punchouts were tied for third...His 11.25 K/BB ratio was the best in MLB last month.

DOUBLE THE FUN: Scherzer has 108 double-digit strikeout games in his career, tied for fourth all-time with Pedro Martinez...Roger Clemens (110) is next on the list...Nolan Ryan (215) and Randy Johnson (212) are the top two.

DIG DEEP: Opponents are 1-17 (.059) with RISP in his last three starts and 4-27 (.148) in six games since Scherzer came off the IL...Over the last two seasons, opponents are slashing .168/.236/.255 against Scherzer with runners in scoring position...That .491 OPS is the third-best mark in the majors (min. 125 batters faced with RISP) in that span...Scherzer allowed his first extra-base hit with runner(s) in scoring position this season on July 16 at Wrigley Field...Scherzer is one of 10 pitchers who has faced 50 or more batters in RISP situations and allowed just one XBH (or none)...George Kirby, Konnor Pilkington and Scherzer are the only starters who have faced 50+ batters in RISP situations with just one XBH allowed.

THREE MORE: Scherzer has 197 career wins, three away from joining an exclusive club of active pitchers with 200+ victories...Justin Verlander (241) and Zack Greinke (222) are the only active hurlers who have won more than 200 games in their career...He is 197-99 in his career...If he wins his next three decisions, he will reach 200 career wins before losing 100 games...Elias says there are only five pitchers in the modern era whose 200th career win came before their 100th loss: Pedro Martinez (200-84), Juan Marichal (200-97), Whitey Ford (200-79), Lefty Grove (200-83) and Grover Cleveland Alexander (200-96).

STRIKEOUTS ARE SEXY: Scherzer's 31.4 percent strikeout rate is the ninth-highest rate in the majors (min. 80.0 innings) this season...It's the highest ever by a Met in his first 14 starts for the team...Only Pedro Martinez (30.3 percent), has cracked 30 percent in addition to Scherzer...Scherzer recorded 79 punchouts in his first 10 starts, making him the only pitcher ever to whiff 75+ batters in his first 10 outings with three different franchises...He had 85 strikeouts in his first 10 starts with both the Nationals and Dodgers...Thanks to MLB's Sarah Langs.

HAPPY SCHERZDAY: Scherzer started his 38th birthday, July 27...He was the 30th pitcher to start on his birthday at 38 or older...He threw 7.0 shutout innings against the Yankees, making him the second pitcher ever to toss 7.0 or more scoreless frames on his birthday at 38 or older, joining Sad Sam Jones, who threw a shutout on his 42nd birthday in 1934...Scherzer lowered his ERA on his birthday to 0.82 ERA (3 ER/33.0 IP)...He has never allowed more than two runs in a start on his birthday.
