AT A GLANCE: The Yankees complete their nine-game homestand today with the final game of a three-game set vs. Seattle (2-0 thus far)...are 5-3 on the homestand after dropping two-of-three games vs. St. Louis, winning two-of-three games vs. Atlanta and winning their first two games against Seattle...following this homestand, will embark on a six-game road trip to Toronto (Fri.-Sun.) and Baltimore (8/18-20).

- **Their 68-52 (.567) record is the second-best in the American League and the sixth-best in the Majors**, trailing only Tampa Bay (74-46, .617), Milwaukee (74-47, .612), Atlanta (73-48, .603), Los Angeles-NL (73-48, .603) and Chicago-NL (71-50, .587).
- Have won four of their last five games (since 8/7) and five of their last seven games (since 8/4)...are 14-8 in their last 22 games (since 7/19) and 18-10 in their last 28 games (since 7/9).
- Wednesday marked the Yankees' 31st comeback win of the year...each of the Yankees' last four wins, 11 of the Yankees' last 18 wins (since 7/9), 13 of their last 22 wins (since 6/23) and 19 of their last 33 wins (since 5/31) have been comeback wins.
- **Including their current series, ave won or split eight of their last 10 series since 7/6 (are 6-2-2 in those series).**

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees clinched a series win with a come-from-behind 10-5 victory vs. the Mariners at Yankee Stadium...**RHP Will Warren** (4.0IP, 6H, 5R/ER, 4BB, 3K, 3HR) started and did not record a decision...**CF Trent Grisham** (3-for-5, 3R, 1 double, 2HR, 4RBI) drove in four runs after recording his ninth career multi-HR game...hit a solo HR in the fifth inning, a go-ahead RBI double in the seventh inning and a two-run HR in the eighth inning...**3B Ryan McMahon** (2-for-4, 1 double, 1RBI) hit an RBI double in the second inning...**RF Spencer Jones** (2-for-4, 2 doubles, 3RBI, 1HP, 1SB) reached base three times and recorded a career-high-tying 3RBI, hitting a two-run double in the third inning and a game-tying RBI double in the fifth inning...**DH Ben Rice** (2-for-4, 3R, 1 double, 1RBI, 1BB, 1SB) reached base three times and hit an RBI single in the seventh inning...**2B Jazz Chisholm Jr.** (1-for-3, 1R, 1RBI, 1BB) drew a bases-loaded walk in the seventh inning...**Yankees relievers** allowed only 3H over 5.0 scoreless innings...**LHP Tim Hill** (1.0IP, 1BB, 1K) tossed a scoreless inning of relief and stranded two inherited runners...**RHP Paul Blackburn** (1.2IP, 1BB) earned his fourth win of the year after tossing 1.2 scoreless innings...**LHP Brent Headrick** (1.0IP, 3K) struck out all 3BF...**RHP Yerry de los Santos** (1.0IP, 2H, 1K) tossed a scoreless ninth inning.

McMAHON OF THE HOUR: INF Ryan McMahon recorded two hits on Wednesday vs. Seattle, including an RBI double in the second inning...**is hitting .333/.406/.519 (9-for-27) with 4R, 2 doubles, 1HR, 5RBI, 4BB and 1SF over his last nine games (since 8/2).**

MERRY GRISHMAS: OF Trent Grisham drove in four of the Yankees' 10R on Wednesday vs. Seattle, hitting a solo HR in the fifth inning, a go-ahead RBI double in the seventh inning and a two-run HR in the eighth inning...**marked his ninth career multi-HR game, seventh as a Yankee and second of the season** (also 4/13 vs. Los Angeles-AL).

- His 4RBI on Wednesday were his second-most in a game this season (5RBI on 4/13 vs. Los Angeles-AL).
- Has recorded multiple hits in a career-high-tying three straight games since 8/9 (sixth time).
- Has recorded 7RBI over his last three games (since 8/9).
- **Is batting .471/.471/1.235 (8-for-17) with 5R, 4 doubles, 3HR and 7RBI over his last four games (since 8/8).**
- **Nine of his last 11 hits have been XBH (5 doubles, 4HR).**
- Has hit 3HR in his last 3G (since 8/9) and 4HR in his last 8G (since 8/3).

GEORGE OF THE CONCRETE JUNGLE: INF George Lombard Jr. has hit safely in six of his first seven career games, batting .320/.393/.560 (8-for-25) with 6R, 2HR, 2RBI and 3BB.

SEA-ING CLEARLY: Including their current series, the Yankees have won or split 17 of their last 19 series vs. the Mariners (since 8/22/16) and 20 of their last 23 series (since 6/10/14)...overall, are 42-17 in the last 59 matchups vs. the Mariners (since 8/23/16)...are 13-3 in their last 16 games vs. Seattle (since 5/22/24).

- Are 21-7 in their last 28 games vs. the Mariners at Yankee Stadium (since 8/26/17).

AUSTIN POWERS: C Austin Wells recorded his 100th career extra-base hit on Wednesday vs. Seattle...**has hit safely in each of his last six games (since 8/5), matching the second-longest hitting streak of his career...is batting .360/.429/.640 (9-for-25) with 3R, 4 doubles, 1HR, 3RBI, 2BB, 1HP and 1SB over his last 11G (since 7/30).**

- Is hitting .317/.404/.561 (13-for-41) with 6R, 4 doubles, 2HR, 4RBI, 4BB, 2HP and 1SB over his last 17 games (since 7/20).
- Has posted a .940 OPS over his last 23 games (since 7/9).
- Eight of his last 16H since 7/9 have been XBH (4 doubles, 4HR).
- **His 2.94 catcher's ERA is the best in the Majors.**

LAND OF THE FRIED: LHP Max Fried will make his 15th start of the season today vs. Seattle...**has gone 4-3 with a 2.88 ERA (81.1IP, 26ER) in 14 starts this season, holding opponents to a .192/.260/.246 (54-for-281) slash line this year...**has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 12 of his 14 starts, including 1R-or-fewer in seven of those starts...has not allowed a run in six of his starts, including four of his last nine starts (since 4/22).

- **Since being reinstated from the I.L., has posted a 1.83 ERA (19.2IP, 4ER) and 25K in four starts (since 7/22-G2)...has held opponents to a .169/.236/.215 (11-for-65) slash line during that stretch...the Yankees are 3-1 in those starts.**
- Has allowed only 1HR to 312BF this season, posting a 0.11 HR/9.0IP (1HR/81.1IP)...**is the only Yankees starting pitcher in the last 45 years (since 1982) and only the second in the last 93 years (since 1934) to allow one-or-zero home runs over his first 14 starts of a season** (also Dave Righetti in 1981).
- The Yankees are 6-3 in his last nine starts (since 4/22).
- Has gone 1-1 with a 1.13 ERA (24.0IP, 3ER) in 4GS vs. the Mariners.

KEEPING UP WITH THE JONESES: OF Spencer Jones reached base three times and recorded a career-high-tying 3RBI on Wednesday vs. Seattle (also 3RBI on 7/29 at Chicago-AL), hitting a two-run double in the third inning and a game-tying RBI double in the fifth inning...has recorded 10RBI over his last 13 games (since 7/29).

RICE RICE BABY: C/INF Ben Rice reached base three times and hit an RBI single in the seventh inning on Wednesday vs. Seattle...since 5/22, has hit .296/.397/.667 (16-for-54) with 1 double, 2 triples, 5HR, 28RBI and 9BB/2IBB with RISP during that span.

NEW YORK 'PEN STATION: Yankees relievers allowed only 3H over 5.0 scoreless innings on Wednesday vs. Seattle...have not allowed an ER in their last 11.1 innings (since 8/9)...**have posted a 2.53 ERA (228.0IP, 64ER) over their last 60 games (since 6/3),** holding opponents to a .200 (164-for-821) BA during that stretch...**is the second-best bullpen ERA in that span**, trailing only Houston (2.50).

- **Own the second-best bullpen ERA in the Majors this season (3.07, second in AL)...also rank third in the Majors this season in inherited runners scored percentage (22.5%, first in AL) and opponents' OPS (.652, second in AL), fourth in opponents' BA (.222, first in AL), opponents' SLG (.350, second in AL), opponents' OBP (.302, third in AL) and WHIP (1.21, third in AL), and fifth in HR/9.0IP (0.93, second in AL).**

PITCH PERFECT: Yankees pitchers have posted a Major League-best 3.30 ERA (1,072.2IP, 393ER) this season...have allowed 3R-or-fewer in 12 of their last 19 games (since 7/22-G2), including 2R-or-fewer in 11 of those games, posting a 2.67 ERA (175.0IP, 52ER) during that stretch.

FOR STARTERS: Yankees starting pitchers have allowed 2R-or-fewer in 11 of their last 14 starts (since 7/28), including 1R-or-fewer in 10 of those starts, posting a 2.10 ERA (81.1IP, 19ER) during that span...have allowed 2R-or-fewer in 14 of their last 19 starts and 1R-or-fewer in 13 of those starts (since 7/22-G2), posting a 2.48 ERA (105.1IP, 29ER) with 124K during that span.

- **Have allowed 3R-or-fewer in 93 starts this season, tied for their most such starts through their first 120 games of a season in franchise history** (also 93GS in 2022).
- Have allowed 3R-or-fewer in 25 of their last 29 starts (since 7/8), including 2R-or-fewer in 20 of those starts, posting a 2.90 ERA (155.1IP, 50ER) during that span.
- **Rank second in the Majors this season in ERA (3.45, second in AL).**

PEN PAL: LHP Brent Headrick struck out all 3BF on Wednesday vs. Seattle...**has not allowed a run in 35 of his last 39 games (since 5/19), going 3-0 with a 0.95 ERA (38.0IP, 4ER) and 50K over that span...**has stranded 19 of his 20 inherited runners over that span.

- Has gone 6-1 with a 1.47 ERA (61.1IP, 10ER) and 76K in 62 relief outings this season...**has not allowed a run in 52 of his 62 relief appearances, the most in the Majors this season and the most by a Yankees reliever through the club's first 120 games of a season in franchise history.**
- As a Yankee (since 2025), has not allowed a run in 65-of-79 games, going 6-1 with a 1.92 ERA (84.1IP, 18ER) and 106K.
- Has stranded 33 of his 37 inherited runners this season...his 10.8% inherited runners scored percentage ranks fifth among Major League relievers (third in AL).

ON A ROLL: RHP Paul Blackburn earned his fourth win of the year on Wednesday vs. Seattle after tossing 1.2 scoreless innings of relief (1BB)...**has not allowed an earned run in 21 of his last 23 appearances (one start) since 6/21, going 2-1 with one save and a 0.80 ERA (33.2IP, 3ER) and 29K during that stretch.**

- Has gone 4-2 with one save, a 1.90 ERA (66.1IP, 14ER) and 52K in 44 games (two starts) this season...has recorded at least four outs in 27 of his 42 relief appearances this season.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: LHP MAX FRIED (4-3, 2.88 ERA)

LHP Max Fried will make his 15th start of the season in today's series finale vs. the Mariners...the 32-year-old will pitch on extended five days' rest due to Monday's team off day...last started on Friday vs. Atlanta and did not record a decision after tossing 6.1 scoreless innings in the Yankees' 3-2 win in extra innings (3H, 2BB, 7K, 1BK)...in 14 starts this season, has gone 4-3 with a 2.88 ERA (81.1IP, 26ER)...missed 57 games on the 15-day injured list with a left elbow bone bruise from 5/4-7/22... **since being reinstated from the I.L., has posted a 1.83 ERA (19.2IP, 4ER) and 25K in four starts (since 7/22-G2)**...went 19-5 with a 2.86 ERA (195.1IP, 164H, 73R/62ER, 51BB, 189K, 14HR) in 32 starts in his first season with the Yankees in 2025, setting career highs in wins, starts, innings pitched, strikeouts and pickoffs (eight)...over 10 Major League seasons with the Atlanta Braves (2017-24) and Yankees (2025-26), has gone 96-44 with six complete games (four shutouts) and a 3.02 ERA (1,161.0IP, 1001H, 431R/390ER, 322BB, 1,127K, 91HR) in 214 career games (197 starts)...among Major League pitchers since 2020, ranks first in ERA (2.83) and pickoffs (28), is tied for first in shutouts (four), second in HR/9.0IP (0.62), opponents' SLG (.324) and opponents' OPS (.604), third in wins (77), winning percentage (.700) and groundball percentage (53.6%), fourth in groundball/flyball ratio (2.13), fifth in WAR among pitchers (23.0, FanGraphs), tied for sixth in complete games (five) and eighth in opponents' OBP (.280) and WHIP (1.08)...his 94 wins since 2019 are the most in the Majors...the three-time All-Star (2022, '24-25) and four-time Gold Glove Award winner (2020-22, '25) has finished in the top-five of Cy Young Award voting three times in his career (second in 2022, fourth in 2025 and fifth in 2020)...the Santa Monica, Calif., native was originally selected by San Diego in the first round (seventh overall) of the 2012 First-Year Player Draft...was acquired by Atlanta along with INF Jace Peterson, OF Dustin Peterson and OF Mallex Smith in exchange for OF Justin Upton and RHP Aaron Northcraft on 12/19/14...was signed by the Yankees to an eight-year contract extending through the 2032 season on 12/17/24.

LAST TIME OUT: Started on Friday vs. Atlanta and did not record a decision after tossing 6.1 scoreless innings in the Yankees' 3-2 win in extra innings (3H, 2BB, 7K, 1BK)...marked his first career start vs. his former team...also marked his sixth scoreless start of the season...retired his final 12BF.

2026: In 14 starts this season, has gone 4-3 with a 2.88 ERA (81.1IP, 26ER)...has held opponents to a .192/.260/.246 (54-for-281) slash line this year... **has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 12 of his 14 starts, including 1R-or-fewer in seven of those starts**...has not allowed a run in six of his starts, including four of his last nine starts (since 4/22).

- **Since being reinstated from the I.L., has posted a 1.83 ERA (19.2IP, 4ER) and 25K in four starts (since 7/22-G2)**...has held opponents to a .169/.236/.235 (11-for-65) slash line during that stretch...the Yankees are 3-1 in those starts.
- Missed 57 games on the injured list ...exited his start on 5/13 at Baltimore game with left elbow posterior soreness...was placed on the 15-day I.L. on 5/16 (retroactive to 5/14) with a left elbow bone bruise...made one rehab start with Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes Barre on 7/17 vs. Worcester (3.0IP, 5H, 2R//ER, 0BB, 3K, 1HR)...was reinstated from the I.L. on 7/22 prior to Game 2 of the doubleheader.
- **Has tossed at least 6.0IP in eight of his 14 starts**...has tossed at least 7.0IP in three starts and 8.0IP in two starts.
- **Has recorded six scoreless starts of at least 5.0IP**, tied for the sixth-most in the Majors and tied for the fifth-most in the AL (OR in 6.1IP on 3/25 at San Francisco, OR in 7.0IP on 3/31 at Seattle, OR in 8.0IP on 4/22 at Boston, OR in 6.0IP on 4/27 at Texas, OR in 5.0IP in Game 2 on 7/22 vs. Pittsburgh and OR in 6.1IP on 8/7 vs. Atlanta).
- **Has allowed only 1HR to 312BF this season, posting a 0.11 HR/9.0IP (1HR/81.1IP)...is the only Yankees starting pitcher in the last 45 years (since 1982) and only the second in the last 93 years (since 1934) to allow one-or-zero home runs over his first 14 starts of a season (also Dave Righetti in 1981).**
- Has allowed 3BB-or-fewer in each of his starts.
- Has exited only two of his 14 starts this season with the Yankees trailing (one was his injury-shortened start on 5/13 at Baltimore).
- The Yankees are 6-3 in his last nine starts (since 4/22).
- Posted a season-high 16.0 scoreless inning streak from 4/22-5/3 and a season-opening 13.1 scoreless inning streak from 3/25-31...his season-opening 13.1 scoreless inning streak from 3/25-31 was tied for the fourth-longest by a Yankees starter to begin the season in the last 15 years (since 2012), trailing only Luis Gil's 18.2 scoreless inning streak in 2021, Cam Schlitler's 13.2 scoreless inning streak to begin this season and Gerrit Cole's 13.2 scoreless streak to start this year (Nestor Cortes also had a 13.1 scoreless inning steak in 2022).
- Was only the seventh pitcher in franchise history to toss at least 6.0 scoreless innings in each of his first two *appearances* of a season...was the 10th pitcher in franchise history to toss at least 6.0 scoreless innings in each of his first two starts of a season...Gerrit Cole accomplished the feat later in the season.
- Made his fourth career Opening Day start and first as a Yankee in the club's 7-0 win on 3/25 at San Francisco...earned the win after tossing 6.1 scoreless innings (2H, 1BB, 4K, 1HP)...was the first Yankees Opening Day starter to throw at least 6.1 scoreless innings since David Cone in 1996 (also OR in 7.0IP)...was only the fifth Yankees starter in the Divisional Era (since 1969) to do so.
- Tossed 8.0 scoreless innings and earned the win on 4/22 at Boston (3H, 2BB, 9K)...marked his longest scoreless start as a Yankee and his longest since 9/27/24 vs. Kansas City with Atlanta (8.2IP)...marked the longest scoreless start by a Yankee since Carlos Rodón tossed 8.0 scoreless innings on 7/11/25 vs. Chicago-NL...his 8.0IP matched his season high (also 8.0IP on 4/11 at Tampa Bay) and his 9K marked a season high...retired his final 14BF.
- Was reinstated from the 15-day I.L. prior to his start in Game 2 of the doubleheader on 7/22 vs. Pittsburgh and tossed 5.0 scoreless innings in a no-decision (1H, OR, 1BB, 7K)...retired 14-of-16BF, including his final 12BF...marked his first start since 5/13 at Baltimore.

ON A ROLL: Has gone 10-3 with a 2.40 ERA (127.2IP, 34ER) over his last 21 starts (since 8/22/25)...has allowed 1R-or-fewer in 12 of those 21 starts...has tossed at least 6.0IP in 14 of those 21 starts and at least 7.0IP in eight of those starts...the Yankees are 14-7 during that stretch.

- Has held opponents to a .196/.263/.248 (88-for-448) slash line over his last 21 starts.

VS.
