LAST SEASON

The Cardinals captured 2nd place (via head-tohead tie breaker over Cincinnati) in the NL Central and a 5th seed in the National League Playoffs, going 30-28, as they concluded their 129th season of play in the Senior Circuit, finishing 3.0 games back of 1st place Chicago...the Cardinals lost to the San Diego Padres, 2-1, in the Wild Card Series...St. Louis has recorded 13-straight winning seasons dating to 2008.

CARDINALS ROSTER REDUCED TO 44: Following Saturday game, the Cardinals reduced the number of players in Major League camp to 44, by optioning pitchers Seth Elledge and Angel Rondón and catchers Ivan Herrera and Ali Sánchez, and re-assigned pitcher Roel Ramirez, catcher Aaron Antonini, infielders Evan Mendoza and Delvin Pérez and outfielders Conner Capel and Scott Hurst.

CELEBRATING MIKE SHANNON'S 50TH & FINAL YEAR: The Cardinals announced a season-long campaign to honor radio broadcaster Mike Shannon throughout his 50th and final season in the broadcast booth. Shannon, who joined the team's radio broadcast in 1972 after nine seasons playing for the Cardinals, previously announced his retirement after the 2021 season. Mike will become the 14th announcer in baseball history to serve as long as 50 years in the booth and only the sixth announcer to log at least 50 years with one team. Shannon's tenure with the Cardinals is the fourth-longest active tenure among MLB announcers behind Jamie Jarrín (Dodgers, 1959), Denny Matthews (Royals, 1969) and **Bob Uecker** (Brewers, 1971).

GCS CREDIT UNION BALLPARK CHOSEN FOR AL-TERNATE SITE: The Cardinals will utilize GCS Credit Union Ballpark in Sauget, Illinois as their Alternate Training Site beginning in April. GCS Credit Union Ballpark, opened in 2002, serves as home of the Gateway Grizzlies of the 16-team Frontier League. Utilized as a training base for players serving as taxi squad and possible roster call-ups while the minor leagues are still awaiting the start to their season, the Alternate Training Site will host a maximum of 28 players who are all members of the Cardinals organization. Workouts will be run by the Cardinals triple-A Memphis coaching staff.

ANOTHER ONE FOR THE TROPHY CASE: Pitcher Adam Wainwright was the recipient of the prestigious 2020 Roberto Clemente Humanitarian Award for his outstanding philanthropy work around the world through his Big League Impact charitable foundation...Waino is the 6th Cardinal to win the award, most by any MLB Club, joining Lou Brock (1975), Ozzie Smith (1995), Albert Pujols (2008), Carlos Beltran (2013) and Yadier Molina (2018).

CARDINALS APPROVED TO HOST FANS AT BUSCH

IN 2021: The Cardinals, in cooperation with the City of St. Louis and Major League Baseball, have received approval to welcome guests back to Busch Stadium for the 2021 season, beginning Thursday, April 8. To begin the season, up to approximately 32% of capacity will be allowed to attend games at Busch Stadium. The organization will begin selling tickets to April home games soon, with Cardinals Season Ticket Holders receiving first opportunity to secure tickets for the first two homestands. If inventory allows, ticket on-sale dates for the general public will be determined and announced at a later date. Fans can view the full list of Busch Stadium policies and protocols for the start of the 2021 season at cardinals.com/backatbusch.

GOLD LEATHER: Left fielder Tyler O'Neill was the recipient of the 2020 NL Rawlings Gold Glove award, first of his career and the first left fielder in Cardinals history to win the coveted defensive trophy...First baseman Paul Goldschmidt finished as a Gold Glove finalist, while former Cardinal Kolton Wong took home the honor for second base...the Cardinals infield now boasts 20 Gold Gloves between Yadier Molina (9), Nolan Arenado (8) and Goldschmidt (3), while the 91 Gold Glove Awards are most all-time among MLB franchises.

THE BATTERY IS BACK: The Cardinals re-signed franchise icons Yadier Molina and Adam Wainwright to one-year contracts this offseason. The duo have paired up in 274 starts, ranking 6th all-time in MLB history as batterymates...Molina will move into 2nd this year with 18 seasons played solely for the Cardinals, trailing only Stan Musial's record 22 seasons. Wainwright enters his 17th season with the Cardinals, matching **Bob Gibson** (1959-75) for the 2nd-most as a pitcher in a Redbirds uniform behind Jesse Haines (18 years, 1920-37).

10 YEARS LATER: The 2021 season marks the 10th anniversary of the 2011 championship winning team that earned a Wild Card berth on the last day of the regular season after being 10.5 games back in late August and ultimately defeating the Texas Rangers in a thrilling seven-game series to earn the club's 11th World Series title.

TODAY'S PITCHERS

#22 • Jack Flaherty • RHP • 25 yrs

- Announced as the Cardinals 2021 Opening Day starter at Cincinnati (4/1), his second in consecutive seasons (2020-21). Since 1901, will become the 5th pitcher in Cardinals history to make multiple Opening Day starts before turning age 26, joining Joe Magrane (3), Dizzy Dean (3), Lee Meadows (2), and Johnny Lush (2).
- At age 24.283 in 2020, was the 16th youngest Cardinal to make an Opening Day start (since 1904) and youngest since Joe Magrane (24.275) on April 3, 1989 vs. the New York Mets.
- Finished 4th in 2019 NL Cy Young Award voting, 13th in NL MVP voting, and was named to the All-MLB Second Team.
- Since 2018, Flaherty (.198, 29.7%) is only one of three pitchers to record an opponent batting average below .200, and strikeout percentage of 24% or higher (minimum 1,000 batters faced), joining Justin Verlander (.185, 35.1%) and Gerrit Cole (.193, 36.6%).
- Since Major League debut (9/1/17), ranks 9th in MLB in opponent batting average (.203).
- In 75 career starts, is 30-13 when receiving 2 runs of support or more, and 21-5 when receiving 3 runs or more.
- Since 2018, his 4.48 runs of support is the 4th-lowest average in MLB. Jacob deGrom's 4.18 is lowest.
- Has struck out 482 batters over his first 76 career games, the most ever by a Cardinal and 12th-most in NL history (since 1901).
- Recorded nine dobule-digit strikeout games in his career, T-9th in Cardinals history and most by any Cardinal through his first 76 career games.

#65 • Giovanny Gallegos • RHP • 29 yrs

- Appeared in two games in the 2020 Wild Card Series at San Diego, recording a win tossing 1.1 scoreless innings in the Cardinals 7-4 win in Game 1 and a Hold while allowing back-toback home runs to Fernando Tatis Jr. and Manny Machado in Game 2.
- Leads all Cardinals pitchers in ERA (2.49), opponent BA (.170), strikeouts/9 IP (11.56), WHIP (0.82), hits/9 IP (5.38) and baserunners/9 IP (7.67) since acquired in 2018 from the New York Yankees with LHP Chasen Shreve in exchange for 1B Luke Voit.
- Ranks 15th among MLB pitchers in opponent BA (.196) since his debut in 2017.

#30 • Tyler Webb • LHP • 30 yrs

- Claimed off waivers by St. Louis in June 2018 and made 104 relief appearances since.
- Originally drafted by the New York Yankees, who he made his Major League debut with.
 Also has made Major League appearances with Milwaukee and San Diego.
- Has been outstanding in day games holding his opposition to one hit (2-47, .043) each of the last two seasons (2019-20). Ranks as the 2nd-lowest day game opponent BA (.138) in MLB history (since 1901) of pitcher with 30 or more day game appearances
- The first Major League Baseball game he attended in his life was at his Major League debut at Yankee Stadium on 6/24/17 as a member of the Yankees.

#21 • Andrew Miller • LHP • 35 yrs

- Co-led the Cardinals with Giovanny Gallegos with four saves in 2020.
- Since 2016, ranks 3rd in Major League Baseball in Holds (92) behind Tony Watson (104) and Will Harris (96)
- Has pitched for seven different organizations over his 15-year career and been involved in four trades, including those involving Miguel Cabrera and Dontrelle Willis (2007), Eduardo Rodriguez (2014); and Clint Frazier and Justus Sheffield (2016).
- 2016 American League Championship Series Most Valuable Player while with Cleveland.
- Two-time American League All-Star (2016-17).
- 2015 Mariano Rivera American League Reliever of the Year award winner while with the New York Yankees.
- Member of the 2017 World Baseball Classic Champion Team USA squad with current teammates Paul Goldschmidt & Nolan Arenado.

#57 • Zack Thompson • LHP • 23 yrs

- Assigned uniform number 57 in Spring Training, becoming the first Cardinals player in to wear the number since the death of pitcher Darryl Kile in 2002.
- Enters 2021 ranked as the No. 5 prospect in the Cardinals organization by Baseball America
 and the second-best pitching propsect behind Matthew Liberatore. Rated as having the
 "Best Curveball" in the Cardinals organization by the same publication.
- Selected by the Cardinals in the 1st round (19th overall) of the June 2019 First-Year Player Draft as a junior out of the University of Kentucky.
