- Making seventh start of season and 64th of career...has allowed eight earned runs in 30.1 innings (2.37 ERA) across five starts since eight-run season debut March 31 in Kansas City.
Last pitched on May 1 in Chicago-AL, allowing four runs on six hits in 6.0 innings, with no walks and three strikeouts...earned his third-straight win of the season.
Has made three career starts vs. Seattle Mariners, going 2-0 with a 4.20 ERA (15.0 IP, 7 ER), two walks and 15 strikeouts.

LAST TIME OUT: Faced Chicago-AL on May 1 for the first time this season, earned his third consecutive win of the season (tied for team lead) one shy of his career high...allowed four runs on six hits (1 HR), no walks and three strikeouts in 6.0 innings of work...gave up two runs in the first inning; Tommy Pham doubled to plate Robbie Grossman and an Andrew Vaughn single drove in the second run...allowed a third-inning home run to Tommy Pham, it was the first home run he allowed since March 31 at Kansas City where he allowed three...longest streak of his career since April 28, 2022-September 21, 2022 (19.0 innings)...has four consecutive starts in a row tossing 6.0+ innings starting on April 14.

TWO STARTS AGO: Made the start on April 26 at Los Angeles-AL, earning his second-straight win...allowed two runs on three hits in a career-high-tying 7.1 innings, with three walks and eight strikeouts - both season highs...retired nine-straight batters before walking Mike Trout in the third...allowed first hit to Luis Rengifo in the sixth; Rengifo scored on Nolan Schanuel's groundout...was pulled after Zach Neto's eighth-inning double; Matt Bowman entered and allowed Neto to score.
Generated 12 whiffs on 42 swings (28.6%).
In four starts since eight-run season debut March 31 in Kansas City, has allowed eight runs in 30.1 innings (2.37 ERA) with 17 total hits and one home run.
Second time Ober has gone four-or-more straight starts without allowing a home run (5 starts: 4/28-9/16, 2022).
Is one of three pitchers (Luis Gil, Kutter Crawford) to allow three-or-fewer hits in four-straight starts this season.

HELLO OLD FRIEND: Has made three career starts vs. Seattle, going 2-0 with a 4.20 ERA (15.0 IP, 7 ER), two walks and 15 strikeouts...Seattle hitters have hit .226 (12-for-53) with a .415 slugging percentage and a .683 OPS.
In his last start against the Mariners on July 18, 2023, Ober allowed three runs on seven hits (1 HR) no walks and seven strikeouts in 6.0 innings of work; earned his second consecutive win against the Mariners dating back to April 10, 2022...on April 10 he allowed four runs on four hits (1 HR) two walks and four strikeouts.
Second most wins in his career with two...tied with Detroit Tigers.
WELCOME BACK HOME: Making his third home start of the season today...in previous two, has gone 1-0 with a 1.64 ERA (11.0 IP, 2 ER), three walks, 13 strikeouts, a 0.73 WHIP and .139 (5-for-36) opponent batting average.
Career 8-4 with a 3.45 ERA (159.1 IP, 61 ER) in 31 home starts, compared to 8-9 with a 3.98 ERA (165.0 IP, 73 ER) in 32 road starts.
One career start against Seattle at Target Field coming on May 10, 2022 (W, 5.0 IP, 4 H, 4 R/ER, 1 HR, 2 BB, 4 K).
Since 2022, Ober is tied with former teammate Sonny Gray with eight home wins.

REVERSE SPLITS: On May 1, Chicago-AL's left-handed hitters went 2-for-11 with two doubles and zero strikeouts against Ober, while righties went 4-for-12 with one double, one home run and three strikeouts...through six games against Ober, lefties have hit .192 (10-for-52) with a .630 OPS and 25.0 percent strikeout rate, while righties have hit .246 (16-for-65) with a .756 OPS and 23.0 percent strikeout rate.
Lefties have a 26.3 percent whiff rate and 84.7 mph average exit velocity vs. Ober, righties a 20.6 percent whiff rate and 90.1 mph average exit velocity.
In four career starts, Mariners left-handed hitters have hit .214 (6-for-28), one extra-base hit (2B) with a .491 OPS and seven strikeouts, while Seattle righties have hit .205 (6-for-25) with five extra-base hits, three doubles, two home runs, an .896 OPS and eight strikeouts.

THE ARSENAL: Has used a five-pitch mix thus far in 2024, per Baseball Savant...uses 4-seamer and cutter against both left- and right-handed hitters...predominantly throws changeup and curveball to lefties, slider to righties. Here's his pitch usage through six starts:

Allowed his first two hits on a slider on the season in his last start vs Chicago-AL, previously 0-14.

ONE WIN AWAY: With a win in tonight's game he will tie his career high with four consecutive wins dating back to April 20 against Detroit...his last four-game win streak was from September 27, 2022- May 16, 2023.

2023 NOTES:
Was Triple-A St. Paul's Opening Day starter and pitched in four games for Saints to begin the season, posting a 2.55 ERA (17.2 IP, 5 ER) with six walks and 22 strikeouts.
Named Twins minor league Pitcher of the Week on April 23 after throwing 5.0 scoreless innings.
Recalled by Twins on April 23 and made season debut that day against Washington, allowing one run on three hits in 5.2 innings, earning the win.
Posted a 1.82 ERA (24.2 IP, 5 ER) with four walks and 24 strikeouts over his next four starts with the Twins.
Pitched 7.0 shutout innings twice: May 5 at Cleveland and July 1 at Baltimore.
Allowed three earned runs-or-fewer in 15 of first 16 starts with Twins from April 23-July 23.
Posted career-best four-start stretch (July 18-August 4) without issuing a walk.
To limit innings, returned to Triple-A from August 28-September 15 and started once in that span.
Set career highs in wins (8), innings pitched (144.1), starts (26) and strikeouts (146).
Ranked fourth on Twins staff in starts, innings and strikeouts.
Left off AL Wild Card Series roster vs. Toronto but added to ALDS roster vs. Houston.
Made Postseason debut and started Game 1 at Houston, allowing three runs on four hits (2 HR) in 3.0 innings...was dealt the loss in a 6-4 Twins defeat.
Made second appearance in relief in Game 3 vs. Houston, allowing three runs on four hits (2 HR) in 1.1 innings of Minnesota's 9-1 defeat.

TOMORROW'S STARTER - RHP CHRIS PADDACK (2024: 3-1, 4.78 ERA // CAREER: 25-22, 4.26 ERA)

Right-handed pitcher Chris Paddack is set to start the third of a four-game series against the Mariners...last pitched on May 3 vs. Boston; earned his career-high-tying third-straight win after allowing two hits and one walk, with six strikeouts in 6.0 innings of work...retired 16-straight hitters after allowing two hits in the first inning...marked his second scoreless start of at least 6.0 innings this season, after tossing 7.0 shutout frames on April 22 vs. Chicago-AL...has made four career starts against the Mariners going 3-1, 2.63 ERA (24.0 IP, 7 ER) with six walks, 25 strikeouts, a .157 (13-for-83) opponent batting average and a 0.79 WHIP.

CAREER NOTES

- Made Postseason debut in 2023 ALDS vs. Houston, allowing six runs on eight hits (4 HR) in 4.1 total innings between Games 1 and 3.
In 2023, made 26 regular season starts for the Twins, going 8-6 with a 3.43 ERA (144.1 IP, 55 ER), 29 walks, 146 strikeouts and 12 quality starts.
In 2022, made 11 starts for the Twins along with four rehab starts in the minors, going 2-3, 3.21 ERA (56.0 IP, 20 ER) with 11 walks and 51 strikeouts for Minnesota.
Set career highs in innings pitched (7.1) and strikeouts (10) in 4-0 win over Chicago-AL on September 27, 2022.
Made his MLB debut on May 18, 2021, starting for the Twins against Chicago-AL.
Finished the 2021 season with a record of 4-3, 3.99 ERA (10.1 IP, 48 ER), 24 walks and 117 strikeouts in 24 starts between St. Paul and Minnesota.
In 2020, spent spring training on minor league side of Lee County Sports Complex in Fort Myers, FL...was not part of Twins' 60-man Player Pool for season.
Added to Twins 40-man roster on November 20, 2020.
Split the 2019 season between three levels of Twins organization, combining to go 8-0, 0.69 ERA (78.2 IP, 6 ER) with nine walks, 100 strikeouts and a .194 opponent batting average in 14 games (13 starts) for GCL Twins, High-A Fort Myers and Double-A Pensacola.
Led all minor league pitchers (min. 75.0 IP) with a 0.69 ERA in 2019 and ranked second in the minors with a 0.81 WHIP...also became the first Twins minor league pitcher to allow six-or-fewer earned runs in 78.2-or-more innings pitched since at least 1961.
Named Twins minor league Pitcher of the Week twice during the 2019 season: once for Fort Myers on August 4 (6.1 IP, 0 ER, 6 H in 1 start) and again on August 25 with Pensacola (1-0, 7.0 IP, 0 ER, 3 H, 0 BB, 12 K).
In 2018, was named Twins minor league Pitcher of the Week in consecutive weeks: July 7, going 1-0 with 7.0 shutout innings and 12 strikeouts vs. Wisconsin for Low-A Cedar Rapids Kernels, and again July 14, going 1-0 with two runs allowed in 7.0 innings and 10 strikeouts vs. Fort Wayne...became first ever Twin to win the award twice in a season.
Selected by Twins in 12th round of 2017 First-Year Player Draft; signed by scout Seth Moir...originally selected by Los Angeles-NL in the 23rd round of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft, but elected to return to the College of Charleston.
Attended College of Charleston from 2014-17, missing the 2015 season recovering from Tommy John surgery on right elbow...compiled a 24-9 record with a 2.91 ERA and 254 strikeouts in 259.2 innings over the course of his collegiate career.
