**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets snapped a three-game losing streak with a 7-1 victory over the Pirates last night...The Mets are 72-13 when scoring first this season...New York is 32-10-3 in 45 series this year...The Mets continue a seven game homestand (1-3) against the Cubs (0-3) and Pirates (1-0)...Following this series, the Mets travel west for a seven-day, six-game road trip to Milwaukee (three games) and Oakland (three games).

**ROSTER MOVE:** INF Devan Marrero has been sent outright to Triple-A Syracuse.

**NO MINOR THING:** The Brooklyn Cyclones fell to the Aberdeen IronBirds, 6-1, in Aberdeen last night...The team was held to four hits in the loss...The two teams continue their best-of-three series this evening at Ripken Stadium in Maryland with the series knotted at one game apiece...The St. Lucie Mets defeated the Palm Beach Cardinals, 3-2, at home last night to win the Florida State League East Division title...Down 2-0 early, the team rallied for three runs in the sixth to earn the win...The victory sends the Mets to the FSL Finals for the first time since 2011...They will play the winner of Friday's game between the Dunedin Blue Jays and Fort Myers Mighty Mussels...Game 1 of the best-of-three FSL Finals is Sunday night at the West winner... Game 2 will be Tuesday at Clover Park at 6:10 p.m. and if necessary Game 3 will be Wednesday at Clover Park at 6:10 p.m...The Mets are seeking their first FSL title since 2006.

**IT'S FALL Y'ALL:** Several Mets players will participate in the Arizona Fall League in 2022...The Peoria Javelinas, which will be managed by Reid Brignac, will feature RHP Grant Harwig, RHP Troy Miller, RHP Franklin Sanchez, RHP Christian Scott and RHP Mike Vail...The team will also include infielders Kevin Kendall and Lute Ritter as well as outfielders Stanley Consuegra and Brandon McLlwin.

**GRAND CENTRAL STATION:** The Mets are 18-9 against the NL Central this year... They are in a stretch of 10 straight games against the division...The Mets have posted a 2.95 ERA with 77 walks and 298 strikeouts against the division...They are hitting .263/.348/.402 against the Central...The team's 18 wins against the division are the most since they went 22-10 in 2016...The team's .667 winning percentage is the fourth-highest in franchise history...The 2007 team set a franchise record going 28-12 (.700) against the Central.

**HOW STRIKING:** The Mets have struck out 1,388 batters this season, which places them a top the majors...The team's 1,388 strikeouts are already the fifth-most in a single-season in franchise history...The franchise record is 1,520 set in 2019...Mets pitchers are averaging 9.69 K/9 IP, a rate...Only the 2020 Mets had a higher K/9 IP ratio at 10.06...More than one of every four batters to face Mets pitching has struck out this season (26.0 percent), the highest rate in the majors and the highest rate in franchise history.

**GIVE ME A BREAK:** The Mets have posted a .615 winning percentage (32-20) following the All-Star break...The team's 32 wins are tied for fourth-most in the majors...The Mets are batting .269/.340/.435 with 58 home runs in 52 games following the break...This compares to a .252/.324/.397 slashline with 92 homers before the All-Star Game...The Mets rank third in average and OBP and fifth in SLG following the break.

**FOR PETE'S SAKE:** Pete Alonso is on a nine-game hitting streak, batting .325 (13-40) with five runs, a double, three home runs, six RBI, three walks with a .386 OBP and a .575 SLG...His nine-game hitting streak is tied for the second-longest of his career...Alonso recorded a career-best 11 game hitting streak from August 15-26, 2021...He has not hit 62 home runs at home...That places him 10th all-time in franchise history...Kevin McReynolds in ninth with 64.

**RIB EYE STEAKS:** Francisco Lindor has recorded 94 RBI this season...That is marks a new career-high...His 94 RBI as a shortstop is a franchise record...Pete Alonso is second in the majors and owns the National League lead with 112 RBI this season... Only five times in franchise history have the Mets had multiple players with 100 more RBI on the same team...The 2008 Mets were the last team to accomplish this feat (Carlos Beltrán, Carlos Delgado and David Wright).

**LINDOR CITY:** Francisco Lindor has hit 24 home runs this season...That surpasses Asdrubal Cabrera's 23 homer runs in 2018, for the most home runs by a Mets shortstop in a single season...He is batting .302/.378/.477 with 34 runs, nine doubles, a triple, eight home runs, 28 RBI, 22 walks with an .855 OPS in 52 games following the All-Star break...Lindor ranks sixth in the National League with a 6.2 fWAR this season.

**PIRATES-METS NOTES:** The Mets are 25-17 against the Pirates since Citi Field opened in 2009...They have won six of their last eight games against the club at home.

**1010 WINS:** The Mets have set a franchise record with 77 games in which they have struck out 10 or more batters...There 77 such games leads the major leagues and is nine more than the Astros, who have recorded 68 such games.

**EL JEFF-E:** Jeff McNeil is batting .353 (18-51) with seven runs, three doubles, seven RBI, five walks, two steals with a .410 OBP and a .412 SLG in 14 games in September... He is slashing .354/.391/.497 in 50 games following the All-Star break...His .354 average is third in the NL...Dating back to August 20, McNeil has just four strikeouts in his last 105 plate appearances...Overall this season, McNeil ranks sixth among qualified hitters and second in the NL with an 11.0 percent strikeout rate.

**ABOVE AVERAGE:** Jeff McNeil is third in the majors and in the National League with a .322 batting average...He is behind only Freddie Freeman (.329) and Paul Goldschmidt (.324) for the major league lead...José Reyes is the only player in Mets history to be crowned a batting champion after hitting .337 in 2011.

**CITI SLICKERS:** The Mets are 47-26 at Citi Field...New York's 47 wins at home are tied for third in the NL...They are fourth in National League with a .644 winning percentage at home...The team's .644 winning percentage is currently the fourth-highest in team history...Only the 1988 (56-24, .700), 2000 and 1986 teams (both 55-26, .679) had a better home winning percentage...The Mets have posted a 3.12 ERA with 207 walks and 730 strikeouts at Citi Field...The Mets own the second-best home ERA in the NL... The Mets have struck out 730 at home this year, which is the second-most in the NL...That is already the sixth-most in franchise history...The franchise record is 835 strikeouts at home accomplished in 2019.

**HERE'S MY SOUTHERN SLANG:** Edwin Díaz leads major league relievers with 105 strikeouts...That is 15 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...He is the fastest player to record 100 strikeouts in Mets history, reaching the mark in 51.2 IP...Elias says Aroldis Chapman is the only pitcher ever to get to 100 strikeouts faster (51.0 IP in 2014)...Díaz has posted a 0.79 ERA (three earned runs/34.1 innings) with 17 hits, seven walks and 67 strikeouts in 34 appearances since the start of June.

**30 FOR 39:** Díaz is tied for seventh in the majors with 29 saves this year...He is seeking to become the fifth player in franchise history to record multiple seasons with at least 30 saves...John Franco is the franchise leader with five such seasons.

**HERE'S THE CATCH:** As a team, Mets catchers are batting .348/.414/.587 in 14 games this month...Their .348 batting average is the highest in the National League and second-highest in the majors...Tomás Nido is batting .300 (24-80) with 13 runs, nine doubles, two home runs, 10 RBI, five walks with a .337 OBP and a .488 SLG in 29 games since the All-Star Break...He is 8-15 (.533) with five runs, three doubles, two home runs, four RBI, a walk with a .563 OBP and a 1.133 SLG over his last four games... James McCann is batting .286 (10-35) with seven runs, two doubles, two RBI, five walks, a steal with a .375 OBP over his last 12 games.

**WINNING!** The Mets have won 90 games, matching their total from 2015...The last time they won more games was in 2006, when they tallied 97 victories...The Mets have only recorded 100 wins in a season three times in franchise history: 1986 (108), 1988 (100) and 1969 (100)...The Mets own a 90-55 record through 145 games...That is the second-best record in franchise history through 145 games...Only the 1986 team (95-50) posted a better record.

**CANHA GET AN AMEN?:** Mark Canha has safely reached base in 10 straight games... Over his last 27 games, Canha is batting .286 (26-91) with 14 runs, 11 doubles, five home runs, 17 RBI, seven walks with a .369 OBP, a .571 SLG and a .940 OPS...He has recorded 19 extra-base hits in 46 games since the break compared to 15 he collected in 77 first-half games...Canha slugging .472 in the second half (.381 SLG in the first half).

**HURTS DONUT:** The Mets have been plunked a MLB-leading 96 times this year...The team's 96 HBP sets a franchise record...Since 1901, the Reds set the major league record in 2021 after they were hit by 105 pitches...Mark Canha has been plunked 19 times this year, which is tied for second in the majors...His 19 hit by pitches are the fourth-highest single-season total in franchise history...Brandon Nimmo set the record with 22 HBP in 2018.

### WALKER NEWS & NOTES

**LAST TIME OUT:** Earned his 11th win of the season on September 11 against the Marlins at Marlins Park, matching a career-best set in 2015...Picked up his second game with double-digit strikeouts this season (Also: 6/12 @ LAA) and 11th career game with double-digit strikeouts...Was his sixth career start with double-digit strikeouts and zero walks.

**BOUNCE BACK:** In four starts following a loss this season, Walker is 3-1 with a 2.88 ERA (8 ER/25.0 IP) and a K/9 rate of 10.44...Both of Walker's double-digit strikeout games this seasons have come after suffering a loss.

**CITI SLICKER:** In 10 starts at Citi Field this season, Walker is 4-1 with a 3.64 ERA (22 ER/54.1 IP)... Prior to allowing eight earned runs over 1.0+ inning at Citi Field on August 5 vs. ATL, Walker was tied with Justin Verlander for the eighth-lowest ERA at home this season among starting pitchers that have made at least seven home starts in the majors (1.93)...Since joining the Mets in 2021, Walker is 8-5 with a 3.53 ERA (57 earned runs/145.1 innings), a 1.09 WHIP and has held opposing batters to a .635 OPS in 26 games (25 starts).

**VS. PITTSBURGH:** In four career starts against the Pirates, Walker is 0-2 with a 7.71 ERA (14 ER/16.1 IP)...His 7.71 ERA is the highest mark against any one opponent Walker has faced in his career...In his one start against the Pirates at Citi Field, Walker allowed two runs over 5.0 innings on four hits, three walks and two strikeouts in the Mets 13-4 win on July 9, 2021.

**DAYTIME VS. NIGHTTIME:** In 11 day game starts this season, Walker is 7-0 with a 1.53 ERA (12 ER/70.2 IP)...Walker's day game ERA is the third -best in the majors among pitchers with at least eight daytime starts and his seven wins are the fifth best daytime total this season...Walker also ranks ninth in opponent's OPS (.533) and 15th in WHIP (0.96) among starting pitchers with at least eight day game starts...Walker is one of 10 starters to allow two or fewer home runs in a day game (Min. eight daytime starts)...On the contrast, Walker is 4-4 with a 5.63 ERA (40 ER/64.0 IP) in 14 night game starts this season...Walker's 5.63 ERA in night games this season is the 10th highest among pitchers who made 12 night starts.

**SPLIT FINGER SUCCESS:** In 25 starts this season, Walker has used his splitter just under 28 percent of the time and has held opposing hitters a .203 (37-182) batting average in at-bats ending in the pitch...44 of Walker's 106 strikeouts this season have come via the splitter.

**NICE TRY:** Walker is second in the majors with five pickoffs this season, trailing only Robbie Ray of the Mariners who has six pickoff on the season... Since 2021, Walker has nine pickoffs, tied with Ryan Weathers for the most during that span...His 18 pickoffs since his debut year of 2013 are the fourth-most by a right-handed pitcher.

**FEW KS, THAT'S OK:** Through 25 starts this season, Walker has 3.48 ERA this season (52 ER/134.2 IP) and a K/9 rate of 7.09...Among pitchers with 20 or more starts and a sub-3.50 ERA, only Miles Mikolas (6.63 K/9 rate, 3.46 ERA) and Adam Wainwright (6.93 K/9 rate, 3.29 ERA) are the only pitchers with a lower K/9 rate this season...Walker's 106 strikeouts are the sixth fewest by a Mets pitcher with a sub-3.50 ERA since 2000 through their first 25 starts of the season.

### TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP CHRIS BASSITT (13-8, 3.44)

**LAST TIME OUT:** Suffered the loss on September 12 against the Cubs...Allowed five runs over 3.2 innings, his second shortest outing of the season... Ended a streak of 14 straight starts allowing four runs or fewer, the third-longest such streak of his career and his longest such streak in a single season.

**HOMER UN-HAPPY:** Allowed a homer for the first time in eight starts...Prior to his last start, Bassitt had not allowed a homer since July 23 against the Padres...He allowed two home runs on September 12 which he had not done since June 25 in Miami...His eight starts without allowing a homer was the longest such streak of his career through a single season and the third-longest active streak in the majors among starters...
