METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets snapped a three-game losing streak with a 7-1 victory over the Pirates last night...The Mets are 72-13 when scoring first this season...New York is 32-10-3 in 45 series this year...The Mets continue a seven game homestand (1-3) against the Cubs (0-3) and Pirates (1-0)...Following this series, the Mets travel west for a seven-day, six-game road trip to Milwaukee (three games) and Oakland (three games).

ROSTER MOVE: INF Devan Marrero has been sent outright to Triple-A Syracuse.

NO MINOR THING: The Brooklyn Cyclones fell to the Aberdeen IronBirds, 6-1, in Aberdeen last night...The team was held to four hits in the loss...The two teams continue their best-of-three series this evening at Ripken Stadium in Maryland with the series knotted at one game apiece...The St. Lucie Mets defeated the Palm Beach Cardinals, 3-2, at home last night to win the Florida State League East Division title...Down 2-0 early, the team rallied for three runs in the sixth to earn the win...The victory sends the Mets to the FSL Finals for the first time since 2011. They will play the winner of Friday's game between the Dunedin Blue Jays and Fort Myers Mighty Mussels...Game 1 of the best-of-three FSL Finals is Sunday night at the West winner...
Game 2 will be Tuesday at Clover Park at 6:10 p.m. and if necessary Game 3 will be Wednesday at Clover Park at 6:10 p.m...The Mets are seeking their first FSL title since 2006.

IT'S FALL Y'ALL: Several Mets players will participate in the Arizona Fall League in 2022...The Peoria Javelinas, which will be managed by Reid Brignac, will feature RHP Grant Harwig, RHP Troy Miller, RHP Franklin Sanchez, RHP Christan Scott and RHP Mike Vail...The team will also include infielders Kevin Kendall and Lute Ritter as well as outfielders Stanley Consuegra and Brandon McIlwain.

GRAND CENTRAL STATION: The Mets are 18-9 against the NL Central this year... They are in a stretch of 10 straight games against the division...The Mets have posted a 2.95 ERA with 77 walks and 298 strikeouts against the division...The Mets have posted a 2.95 ERA with 77 walks and 298 strikeouts against the division...They are hitting .263/.348/.402 against the Central...The team's 18 wins against the division are the most since they went 22-10 in 2016...The team's .667 winning percentage is the fourth-highest in franchise history....The 2007 team set a franchise record going 28-12 (.700) against the Central.

GIVE ME A BREAK: The Mets have posted a .615 winning percentage (32-20) following the All-Star break...The team's 32 wins are tied for tied for fourth-most in the majors...The Mets are batting .269/.340/.435 with 58 home runs in 52 games following the break...This compares to a .252/.324/.397 slashline with 92 homers before the All-Star Game...The Mets rank third in average and OBP and fifth in SLG following the break.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso is on a nine-game hitting streak, batting .325 (13-40) with five runs, a double, three home runs, six RBI, three walks with a .386 OBP and a .575 SLG...His nine-game hitting streak is tied for the second-longest of his career... LINDOR CITY: Francisco Lindor has hit 24 home runs this season...That surpasses Asdrubal Cabrera's 23 homer runs in 2018, for the most home runs by a Mets shortstop in a single season...He is batting .302/.378/.477 with 34 runs, nine doubles, a triple, eight home runs, 28 RBI, 22 walks with an .855 OPS in 52 games following the All-Star break...Lindor ranks sixth in the National League with a 6.2 fWAR this season.

PIRATES-METS NOTES: The Mets are 25-17 against the Pirates since Citi Field opened in 2009...They have won six of their last eight games against the club at

EL JEFF-E: Jeff McNeil is batting .353 (18-51) with seven runs, three doubles, seven RBI, five walks, two steals with a .410 OBP and a .412 SLG in 14 games in September... He is slashing .354/.391/.497 in 50 games following the All-Star break...His .354 average is third in the NL...Dating back to August 20, McNeil has just four strikeouts in his last 105 plate appearances...Overall this season, McNeil ranks sixth among qualified hitters and second in the NL with an 11.0 percent strikeout rate.

HERE'S THE CATCH: As a team, Mets catchers are batting .348/.414/.587 in 14 games this month...Their .348 batting average is the highest in the National League and second-highest in the majors...Tomás Nido is batting .300 (24-80) with 13 runs, nine doubles, two home runs, 10 RBI, five walks with a .337 OBP and a .488 SLG in 29 games since the All-Star Break...He is 8-15 (.533) with five runs, three doubles, two home runs, four RBI, a walk with a .563 OBP and a 1.133 SLG over his last four games... James McCann is batting .286 (10-35) with seven runs, two doubles, two RBI, five walks, a steal with a .375 OBP over his last 12 games.
