TODAY'S GAME:

- Is Game 1 of a 3-game series vs **Grace McNamee's Angels** and the first game of a 10-day, 9-game road trip that includes upcoming series at **AZ** (Fri-Sun) and **LAD** (8/25-8/27).
- Is the first of 2 consecutive trips out west (at **SD**, **A's** and **StL** next month).
- The Reds enter this road trip having lost 8 of their last 14 road series.
- The Redlegs are coming off a 3-3 homestand vs **Phi** (2-1) and **Mil** (1-2).
- Return home for a 10-day, 9-game homestand 8/29-9/7 (3g vs **StL**, 3g vs **Tor**, 3g vs **NYM**).

**NO ROOM FOR THE BROOM:** The Reds have not been swept in any of their last 41 series dating back to last year and including all 40 series in which they've completed this year.

- Haven't been swept in a series of at least 2 games since 9/24-9/25, 2024 at **Cle** (2g), a span of 41 straight series...per *Elias*, that ranks as the fourth-longest streak of sweepless series in team history (see below).
- This 40-series, *in-season* streak without being swept is the longest run in club history, eclipsing the 1970 National League championship team, which opened its season with 32 straight series without getting swept.
- Cin is the only Major League team not to have been swept this season.
- On 7 occasions during this streak, avoided being swept with a win in the final game of a series (4/23 at **Mia**, 5/15 vs **CWS**, 6/22 at **StL**, 7/2 at **Bos**, 7/23 at **Wsh**, 7/30 vs **LAD**), 8/17 vs **Mil**.

**HOME (RUNS) AWAY FROM HOME:** The Redlegs are averaging 4.62 runs per game on the road compared to 4.51 runs per game back home in **Cincinnati**... overall during the **Great American Ball Park** era (since 2003), the team has averaged 4.60 runs per game at **GABP** and 4.26 runs per game on the road.

- 5 times in the history of **GABP** has Cin averaged more runs per game on the road than at home (2023, 2013, 2009, 2004, 2003).
- Cin has homered 65 times in 65 games this year at home compared to 60 times in 60 road games.
- 2004 marks the only season during the **GABP** era in which the Reds hit more home runs on the road (102) than at home (92).

**WELL ISN'T THAT ODD?:** Despite a winning record (65-60) and having not been swept in a series this season, the Reds have lost more series this year than they've won (17-20-3)...no team has ever finished a season with a winning record, lost more series than they won, and avoided being swept (*Elias*).

SERIES NOTES:

- The Redlegs are 12-10 all-time vs the **Angels**, including 8-3 at **Great American Ball Park** and 4-7 here at **Angel Stadium of Anaheim**.
- The Reds have won 8 straight games vs **LAA** dating back to 8/5/19... it's the Reds' second-longest winning streak ever vs an AL opponent.
- In 2013 the Reds and **Angels** played the first interleague **Opening Day** game in Major League history, a 3-1 Angels win in 13 innings in which the teams established the modern Major League record for strikeouts by both teams in a season-opener (Cin pitchers 17, LAA pitchers 13).
- OF Mike Trout** led off the 2015 All-Star Game at **GABP** with a home run off **RHP Zack Greinke** and became the first player ever to win the ASG's MVP award in consecutive years.

**TOUGH ROAD AHEAD:** Following the All-Star break, the Reds have played/will play **35** of their final **65** games against opponents with records at or above **.500** (2-1 at **NYM**, 3-0 vs **TB**, 1-2 vs **LAD**, 2-1 at **Chc**, 2-1 vs **Phi**, 1-2 vs **Mil**, 3g at **LAD**, 3g vs **Tor**, 3g vs **NYM**, 3g at **SD**, 4g at **Chc**, 3g at **Mil**).

- As of today, the Reds have the third-toughest remaining schedule in the Major Leagues, based on opponents' winning percentage (.522; **AZ** .537; **Col** .525).
- NYM** has the 13th-toughest remaining schedule (.507) while **Chc** (.479), **SD** (.463), and **LAD** (.459) have the easiest remaining schedules.

**NOELVI'S JUST RIGHT:** **RF Noelvi Marte** made his first 2 apps in RF on 7/20 & 7/22 and has played exclusively at that position beginning 7/29 (17g, 15gs) .

- In 17 games beginning 7/29, is slashing .338/.338/.569 with 3 HR, 6 2B, 10 RBI and 22 times on base.
- Has hit safely in each of his last 8 games (15-for-34, .441, 2hr, 9rbi).
- His .597 slugging pct. vs right-handed pitching this season ranks third among right-handed hitters (min. 100ab vs RHP)...only **NYY's Aaron Judge** (.659) and **Giancarlo Stanton** (.614) have higher marks.
- From 8/9-8/13 collected 5 doubles over 5 games to become the fifth Reds batter since 1900 to produce at least 5 doubles over any 5-game span at age 23 or younger...he joined **George Foster** (1971), **Bobby Tolan** (1969), **Vada Pinson** (several times from 1959-60), and **Frank Robinson** (1956) as the only Cin batters to accomplish that feat before turning 24 (*courtesy Elias*).

**REDS STARTERS SINCE ALL-STAR BREAK:** The Reds' starting rotation has pitched to a 3.20 ERA since the All-Star break, the second-best mark among all Major League starting staffs in that time, behind the **Cubs** (3.02).

**LAST TIME OUT:** Earned the 6-1 win vs Phi on 8/12 (6.0ip, 3h, 0r, 0bb, 6k, 71TP).

- Was perfect before allowing a leadoff single in the 5th inning to Nick Castellanos...at 4.0ip, marked the second-longest perfect game bid of his career (4.2ip, 8/14/23 vs Sea).
- Matched his career high with his 10th win (also 10w in 2022).
- Is the first Reds pitcher with 10 wins through his first 24 games with the team since Mat Latos (10, 2012).
- Was the second time over his last 3 starts in which he produced 6.0 scoreless innings (also 8/1 vs Atl).
- Over his last 2 home apps, has fanned 16 over 12.0 scoreless innings...became the seventh Reds pitcher since 1900 with at least 16k and 0r in any single-season span of 2 home starts (last: Nick Lodolo, 2022).
- Was his 10th quality start of the season, the 59th of his career.

**AUGUST 7 at PIT:** Opposed Paul Skenes and suffered the 7-0 loss at Pit on 8/7 (3.2ip, 6h, 4r/4er, 4bb, 2k, 1hr, 86TP).

- Threw 36 pitches in the 1st inning, 9 pitches in the 2nd inning, 20 pitches in the 3rd inning, and 21 pitches in the 4th inning before he was lifted for reliever Sam Moll.

**AUGUST 1 vs ATL:** Earned the 3-2 win on 8/1 vs Atl (6.0ip, 4h, 0r, 1bb, 10k, 97TP).

- Season-high 10 strikeouts...was his fifth career double-digit strikeout game (last: 10k, 3/31/24 for KC vs Min).
- Struck out all 3 batters he faced in the 1st inning, the 10th time he's done that in his career (last: 7/22/23 at NYY).
- Fanned Eli White in the 2nd inning for his 750th career K.
- Eclipsed the 800.0-inning mark for his career.
- Was his second straight quality start.
- Was his second scoreless start of the season (also: 3/31).

**JULY 27 vs TB:** Earned the 2-1 win on 7/27 vs TB (7.1ip, 3h, 1r/1er, 1bb, 8k, 1hr, 97TP).

- 7.1ip marked his longest start since 6/26/24 for KC vs Mia (also 7.1ip).
- Was his sixth start of the season in which he allowed 3 hits or fewer.
- Marked his eighth quality start of the season, the 57th of his career.
- Is approaching career milestones in innings pitched (5.0 shy of 800), strikeouts (4 shy of 750), and starts (5 shy of 150).

**JULY 21 at WSH:** Suffered the 10-8 loss at Wsh on 7/21 (2.1ip, 5h, 7r/7er, 2bb, 1k, 1hr, 1hbp, 57TP).

- Matched his shortest start of the season (also: 5/10 at Hou).
- Allowed 4 runs in the 1st inning (25TP)...pitched a perfect 2nd inning (11TP)...gave up a home run to lead off the 3rd followed by a lineup, single, and hit-batter (21TP) before he was pulled for reliever Lyon Richardson...Richardson allowed both inherited runners to score.

**DABBLING IN PERFECTION:** LHP Andrew Abbott (8/11) and RHP Brady Singer (8/12) are the first pair of Cin starters in the expansion era (since 1961) to each produce a perfect game bid of at least 4.0 innings in consecutive games.

- Abbott on 8/11 vs Phi went 4 perfect innings before allowing J.T. Realmuto's leadoff double in the 5th inning.
- Singer on 8/12 vs Phi also began the game with 4.0 perfect innings until Nick Castellanos led off with a single in the 5th inning.

**2-3-4 BATTERS:** Is holding Nos. 2-4 hitters in the lineup to a .215/.308/.401 slash line (37-for-172, 6hr, 21bb, 44k).

**ANSWERS THE CALL:** Since his 2020 debut his 148 starts rank 13th in the majors while his 810.2 innings rank 15th.

**PERSONAL:** Played collegiately at the University of Florida where he was named 2018 SEC Pitcher of the Year and winner of the Dick Howser Trophy...was named *Baseball America* College Player of the Year in 2018 and a finalist for the Golden Spikes Award... helped lead the Gators to the school's first NCAA College World Series championship in 2017...struck out 12 vs LSU in Game One of the CWS finals, the most strikeouts in the championship round since at least 2003...was teammates at Florida with another 2018 first-round pick, Jonathan India, for whom he was traded in 2024...Graduated from Eustis High School (FL), the same school attended by 1972 Nobel Prize winner John Robert Schrieffer, former NASA astronaut David Walker, and former Reds catcher Chris Okey.
