SNAKEBITES

THE NL CHAMPS: Last season, the D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth ('99, '01, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23).

A BOND BEYOND BASEBALL: MLB Network's Anthony Castrovince and Paul Solga teamed up on "A Bond Beyond Baseball," a heartfelt story about the friendship and working relationship of Arizona Diamondbacks' General Manager **Mike Hazen** & Manager **Torey Lovullo**.

FRANCHISE MARKS: The D-backs' 22 hits last night marked the most hits in a 9-inning game in franchise history (previous: 21, 4x; last: July 17, 2019 @ Rangers) and tied for the most ever in any game by the D-backs (22 hits in 18 inn. on Aug. 24, 2013 @ Phillies).

◆ The 16-run differential last night also tied for the largest margin of victory in franchise history (also: 16 runs on May 24, 2019 @ Giants).

MOST RUNS SCORED BY A TEAM @ ORACLE PARK [[@SlangsOnSports](https://twitter.com/SlangsOnSports)]: The D-backs 17 runs last night tied for the second most ever scored @ Oracle Park (opened in 2000)...Arizona also tied for the most runs in 2019:

18 Runs D-backs on May 24, 2019

18 Runs.....Giants on Sept. 3, 2004

18 Runs.....Giants on May 24, 2000

17 Runs..... D-backs last night, April 19, 2024

17 Runs.....Rockies on May 5, 2016

SNAKES (VERY) ALIVE: Last night marked the D-backs third game this season with 12+ runs scored (also: 16 on March 28 and 12 on April 16)...their 3 games with 12+ runs are the most in the Majors, ahead of the Padres (2).

BLAZIN' A TRAIL: Last night, **Blaze Alexander** collected his first career grand slam (8th inning off Nick Avila).

◆ He became the fourth player ever to record 2+ extra-base hits, 1 home run and 5 RBI in a game @ Oracle Park, joining Josh Donaldson/OAK (May 18, 2012), Paul Lo Duca/LAD (June 26, 2001) and Jeff Kent/SF (Aug. 3, 2000)...he also is the youngest player ever to do so @ Oracle Park at age 24-313 (previous: Donaldson, 26-162).

MONTY DID NOT DISAPPOINT: **Jordan Montgomery**, in his D-backs and season debut, earned the win following 6.0 innings of 4-hit, 1-run ball (0 BB, 3 K).

◆ His 2.65 road ERA (28 ER in 95.0 IP) since 2023 ranks third among all starting pitchers, behind Gerrit Cole/NYY (2.34) and Blake Snell/SF (2.57).

OFFENSE OFF SOUTHPAW STARTERS: D-backs hitters, against lefty opposing starting pitchers, are batting .345 (79-for-229)/.906 OPS with 42 runs, 16 doubles, 8 homers and 15 walks.

◆ Among all teams' offenses vs. lefty starting pitchers, the D-backs are first with 79 hits, 16 doubles, 8 home runs, 42 runs, 24 extra-base hits and 119 total bases.

RUN DIFFERENTIAL: The D-backs' +30 run differential is fourth in the Majors, behind the Guardians (+45), Royals (+45) and Braves (+34).

◆ The D-backs' 123 runs in their first 21 games of a season are third most in franchise history, behind 2008 (128) and 2001 (127).

MART-AY PART-AY: Last night, **Ketel Marte** recorded his 11th career 4-hit performance with 1 double and 1 RBI.

◆ Marte, over his last 15 games vs. Giants, is hitting .356 (21-for-59)/1.009 OPS with 2 doubles, 4 homers, 12 runs, 11 RBI and 5 walks.

3+-HIT GAMES: The D-backs 11 player games with 3+ hits are tied for fifth most in the Majors (also: Brewers), behind the Braves (17), Dodgers (14), Astros (14) and Padres (12).

HARD HITTING: The D-backs' 235 hard hits (No. of batted balls with exit velocity of 95 mph+) rank third in MLB, behind the Astros (245) and Dodgers (241).

◆ **Ketel Marte's** 42 hard hits are second in the Majors, behind Shohei Ohtani/LAD (44).

3+-RUN FRAMES: The D-backs have scored 3+ runs in an inning 16 times this season, which ranks tied for the most in the Majors (also: Cubs, Rangers and Brewers)...in the 16 occurrences, Arizona's 74 combined runs are the most, ahead of the Cubs (61) and Rangers (60).

VS. GIANTS: Since 2022, the D-backs are 18-16 vs. Giants...in their 34 matchups in the span, 12 of the contests have ended in 1-run decisions.

◆ The D-backs have won 5 of their last 9 games.

FIRST-INNING STRIKERS: The D-backs' 11 games this season with 1+ runs scored in the first inning is tied for the most in the Majors (also: Dodgers).

◆ In the opening frame this season, the D-backs have tallied an MLB-leading 26 runs with a .396 average (40-for-101)/1.169 OPS, 9 doubles and 8 home runs.

WHEN SCORING FIRST: The D-backs have scored first in all 10 games they have won this season...they have scored first in a game 15 times, tied for the second most in the Majors (also: Royals), behind the Red Sox (16).

STOPPING THE OPPONENT RUNNING GAME: Through 21 games this season, D-back backstops have held opponents to an MLB-low 3 stolen bases in 6 attempts...**Gabriel Moreno's** 39.7 caught-stealing pct. (31-for-78) since 2022 is highest among all active MLB catchers.

◆ There has been only 6 stolen base attempts against Arizona over 285 stolen base opportunities, which are the fewest among all MLB teams.

NEXT STARTER: RHP MERRILL KELLY (2-0, 2.19)

◆ Went decisionless in his last start on April 15 vs. Cubs (ND; 1 ER in 5.0 IP, 3 H, 5 K).

◆ Has allowed 2 or fewer runs with 5.0+ innings pitched in each of his first 4 starts of the season.

◆ His 33 consecutive starts (since April 6, 2023) of 5.0+ innings is the second longest active streak among starting pitchers, behind Mitch Keller/PIT (35).

SLAKEBITES

AT A GLANCE: Sixth season with the D-backs.

- 2023 All-MLB First Team, NL Cy Young finalist and D-backs' Most Valuable Pitcher by the Arizona chapter of the BBWAA for the third time (2020, '22, '23) after going 17-9 with a 3.47 ERA (81 ER in 210.0 IP) and 220 strikeouts over 34 starts.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW: Is making his fifth start of the season and second on the road.

- In 6 road starts in April, is 2-0 with a 2.62 ERA (11 R-10 ER in 34.1 IP), 0.93 WHIP and 34 strikeouts.
- The D-backs have scored a combined 33 runs in his 4 starts this year.
- He has exited each of his 4 starts this season with the lead (D-backs are 3-1 in those games).

NO APRIL SHOWERS: In 14 career April starts, is 7-0 with a 1.32 ERA (13 R-12 ER in 81.2 IP), 0.81 WHIP and 101 strikeouts.

- His 7 wins in April are the most by any starting pitcher in the modern era (since 1901) without suffering a loss.
- Dating back to 1915, his 1.32 ERA in April is the best among any starting pitcher (min. 10 starts), ahead of Lefty Williams/CWS (1.54, 1916-20), Tiny Bonham/PIT (1.64, 1941-48), Barry Moore/CLE (1.74, 1967-70) and Pete Schneider/CIN (1.74, 1915-18).
- His 1.32 ERA among D-backs starters (min. 10 starts) in April, is a franchise best, ahead of Brandon Webb (2.66) and Patrick Corbin (2.84).

NL RANKINGS: Ranks among NL starters in wins (T-1st, 3), home runs per 9.0 innings pitched (T-1st, 0.00), ERA (4th, 1.64) and strikeouts per 9.0 innings (9th, 10.64).

FRANCHISE RANKINGS: Ranks among D-backs starters in franchise history in ERA (4th, 3.18), WHIP (4th, 1.10), strikeouts (6th, 712) and wins (T-9th, 41).

AMONG OTHER STARTERS: Since 2022, his 12 starts of 6.0+ shutout innings, 6+ strikeouts and 3-or-fewer hits allowed are tied for the most in the Majors (also: Corbin Burnes/BAL), ahead of Blake Snell/SF (11) Shohei Ohtani/LAD (10).

LAST START: Tossed 6.0 shutout innings with 4 hits, 2 walks and 7 strikeouts in his third win of the season on April 14 vs. Cardinals.

VS. GIANTS: In his last 4 starts against the Giants, is 3-0 with a 3.12 ERA (9 ER in 26.0 IP, 30 K), including going 1-0 with a 2.02 ERA (3 ER in 13.1 IP, 18 K) in 2 starts @ Oracle Park.

- In 13 career starts, is 4-4 with a 4.13 ERA (34 R-33 ER in 72.0 IP, 76 K).

VS. NL WEST: In his last 6 starts against NL West teams, is 4-1 with a 4.13 ERA (15 ER in 32.2 IP, 33 K).

- Owns a 16-12 record with a 3.30 ERA (111R-107 ER in 292.0 IP, 324 K) in 51 career starts against the NL West.

2023 RECAP: Set career highs in virtually all categories, including wins, innings and strikeouts in 2023.

- His combined 243.2 innings in the regular season and postseason combined were 24.0 more innings than any other pitcher.
- Along with Gerrit Cole (209.0 IP, 222 K), were the only pitchers in the Majors in 2023 with 200.0+ innings and 200+ strikeouts.
- In 2023, ranked among qualifying National League leaders in innings pitched (2nd, 210.0), starts (2nd, 34), wins (2nd, 17), strikeouts (3rd, 220), WHIP (6th, 1.12), win percentage (6th, .654), ERA (7th, 3.47) and opponent average (T-9th, .238).

2023 POSTSEASON HIGHLIGHTS: Won the series-clincher in Game 2 of the National League Wild Card @ Brewers (2 ER in 6.0 IP) on Oct. 4, 2023.

- Won Game 2 of the NLDS @ Dodgers (2 ER in 5.1 IP) on Oct. 9, 2023.
- In 6 postseason starts, went 2-3 with a 4.54 ERA (17 ER in 33.2 IP), .248 opponent average, 14 walks and 24 strikeouts.
- Game 1 starter for NLCS @ Phillies and World Series @ Rangers.

ALL-MLB FIRST TEAM: Named to the 2023 All-MLB First Team, his first honor, along with Gerrit Cole/Yankees, Shohei Ohtani/Angels, Blake Snell/Padres and Spencer Strider/Braves.

CY YOUNG HOPEFUL: Finished third (68 votes) in 2023 NL Cy Young Award voting behind Blake Snell/SD (204) and Logan Webb/SF (86).

- In 2022 voting, finished fifth (45 votes).
- In 2020 voting, finished tied for ninth (2 votes)

ALL-STAR STARTER: Named to his first All-Star Game in 2023 and earned the starting nod...tossed 1.0 scoreless inning with 1 strikeout.

- At 27 years old, became the youngest D-backs pitcher, third overall (fourth time) and first since Curt Schilling (35 in 2002) to start an All-Star Game (also: Randy Johnson; 36 in 2000 and 37 in 2001).
- Was the youngest NL starting pitcher since Matt Harvey/NYM in 2013 (24).

MILKMAN DELIVERED: Tossed his first career 9.0-inning shutout on Sept. 8 @ Cubs with 3 hits allowed and 9 strikeouts.

- Previously had a 7.0-inning, complete-game shutout on April 25 – Game 1 @ Braves (7.0 IP, 1 H, 2 BB, 6 K).
- Fourth D-backs pitcher (sixth time) to toss 9.0 or more innings, 0 runs, 3 or fewer hits, 1 or fewer walks and 9 or more strikeouts (also: Curt Schilling on April 10, 2001 and May 14, 2003; Randy Johnson on Sept. 14, 2003 and May 18, 2004; Ian Kennedy on April 25, 2011).

HOW HE STARTED: Cardinals' third-round pick in the 2016 draft out of the University of North Carolina.

- Made his Major League debut on June 20, 2019 for the Marlins @ Cardinals (7-6 win, ND, 5.0 IP, 5 H, 1 R, 2 BB, 6 K).
- Acquired by D-backs on July 31, 2019 from the Marlins.
- Made his D-backs debut on August 7, 2019 vs. Phillies (6-1 win, W, 5.0 IP, 1 H, 0 R, 3 BB, 6 K).
