ROSTER MOVES—The Rays have optioned INF Taylor Walls to Triple-A Durham and recalled RH Sean Poppen, who will wear No. 60 and would be making his Rays debut...Poppen made 3 apps in his April 16–May 1 stint with the Pirates and has totaled 13 apps over parts of three seasons in the majors...he is a graduate of Harvard University and would become the third Ivy League alum in franchise history, joining OF Fernando Perez (Columbia) from 2008-09 and RH Cole Sulser (Dartmouth) in 2019.

- The Rays have also added LH Ryan Sherriff to the taxi squad.
- + OF Manuel Margot is scheduled for 9 inn. for Durham tonight.

**RAY MATTER**—The Rays have won four straight, tied with Boston for the longest active streak in the majors, to reach a season-high 20 games over .500 for the first time since ending the shortened season at 40-20...this is the seventh season the Rays have reached as many as 20 games over .500 and they made the postseason in the previous six...a win tonight would put them 21 games over for the first time since ending the 2019 season at 96-66...the Rays are 5-1 over their last 6 games and 6-2 since the break.

- + At 59-39, the Rays are tied with the Astros for the 3rd-best record in the majors behind the Giants (61-36) and Red Sox (60-38)...with 64 games remaining, the Rays are on pace to finish 98-64, which would set a franchise record for wins in a season (97-65 in 2008).
- + The Rays are 12-3 (.800) in their last 15 games, the best record in the majors over that span (since July 4)...this 12-3 stretch has seen them cut their deficit in the AL East from 4 GB to 1 GB of Boston.
- + The Rays currently occupy the AL's first Wild Card spot, holding a 3½-game lead over the Athletics (56-43)...the Rays hold a 7-game cushion over the Mariners (52-46) in regard to a postseason berth.
- + The Rays have won four consecutive series beginning July 5-7.
- + The Rays are 40-20 (.667) since May 13—matching the best singleseason 60-game stretch in franchise history—and 46-24 (.657) since May 2...both are the best records in the majors over those spans.
- + The Rays have held a lead in 78.6 pct. (77 of 98) of their games—they have led in 46.2 pct. (18 of 39) of losses and trailed in 30 of 59 wins... the 30 comeback wins rank 2nd in the majors (Red Sox, 31).
- + The Rays have 13 players on the IL including 12 pitchers.

**THIS DAY IN RAYS HISTORY**—Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Opening Day on **July 24, 2020** took place 288 days after the Rays 2019 season ended in the Division Series and 134 days after the final out was recorded in the club's last Grapefruit League game...the Rays lost to Toronto, 6-4.

FASHIONABLY LATE—This season the Rays have scored 188 runs in the 7th inning or later, most in the majors ahead of the Astros (173)...they have outscored opponents, 188-116, in these frames, and the +72 differential ranks 1st in the majors...the Rays have scored 56 runs in the 7th inning (tied for 7th in the majors), 58 runs in the 8th (4th), 54 runs in the 9th (1st) and 20 runs in extras (tied for 3rd)...the 116 runs allowed in the 7th inning or later are the 5th-fewest in the majors and 2nd among AL clubs (Indians, 107).

- + Opposing starting pitchers have a 3.98 ERA (507-IP, 224-ER) and .221 opp avg. (421-for-1,906) when pitching against the Rays this season, but opposing relic
  - the Rays this season, but opposing relievers have a 5.22 ERA (365.1-IP, 212-ER) and .248 opp avg. (350-for-1,413) against the Rays.
- + Over the last 3 games, the Rays are 1-for-17 with RISP through the 8th inning and 6-for-12 with RISP in the 9th inning and later.

**ABOUT THE OFFENSE**—Last night Cleveland fans were treated to fireworks an inning earlier than expected when the Rays put up 6 runs in the 9th inning, the fifth time this season the Rays scored 6 runs (or more) in a single frame...it marked their highest-scoring frame since a 7-run 11th inning on May 24 at TOR and highest-scoring 9th inning since May 14, 2017 at BOS (7)...last night the Rays reached double-digit runs for the eighth time this season, first since June 26 vs. LAA (13)...since July 23—the Rays debut of DH **Nelson Cruz**—the club leads the majors with 10 runs.

+ During this 12-3 stretch the Rays are averaging 5.33 runs per game, totaling 81 runs in the 12 wins and 2 runs in the 3 losses...they have scored 5 runs (or more) in 11 of the 12 wins and 7 runs (or more) in seven of them...the Rays are batting just .255 (125-for-491) during

- this stretch overall but have a .294 avg. (32-for-109) with RISP.
- + This season the Rays are batting .232, 24th in the majors and 12th in the AL...the .232 avg.—which would be the lowest mark in franchise history—includes .238 with RISP and .225 with RISP/2 outs.
- + The Rays have scored 192 runs this season with 2 outs, 4th-most in the majors behind the Red Sox (218), Dodgers (212) and Giants (199).
- + This season the Rays are batting .279 (149-for-535) with RISP in the 59 wins, compared to .165 (49-for-297) with RISP in the 39 losses.

HERE COMES THE BOOM—Last night Nelson Cruz made his Rays debut at 41 years, 22 days and homered off Zach Plesac in the 3rd, the 26th player to homer in his Rays debut and second this season (20-year-old Wander Franco)...only 1 HR in Rays history has been hit by a player older than Cruz: at 41 years, 53 days, Wade Boggs homered for his 3,000th hit on Aug 7, 1999 vs. CLE...according to Sarah Langs of MLB.com, Cruz became the fourth player age-41 or older since data is available (1901) to homer in his debut with a team, joining SEA Henry Blanco (41.290) in 2013, MIN Dave Winfield (41.185) in 1993 and NYM Willie Mays (41.008) in 1972.

+ With last night's homer, Cruz has reached 20 HR (or more) 12 times in his career, all since 2009—no other player has 20+ HR more than nine times over that stretch...it was the 437th of his career, one shy of tying Andre Dawson for 45th place in major league history.

**ROAD BLOCK**—The Rays are 29-21 (.580) on the road this season, 5th in the majors and 3rd in the AL...spanning multiple trips, they have won three straight road games and are 5-1 in their last six road games on the heels of a 10-game road losing streak from June 15–July 3...the Rays are 5-11 on the road since June 15 and 9-14 since June 1 after a 20-7 start.

- + The Rays have lost in walk-off fashion eight times, most in the AL and tied for 2nd in the majors behind the Marlins (9)...this is tied with 2002 for the most through 98 games in franchise history, and the club record for walk-off losses in a single season is 13 in 2015.
- + The Rays lead the majors with 269 runs scored on the road, ahead of the Dodgers (265), and they rank 4th in the majors with 68 HR.

PITCHING PROPERLY—The Rays have a 3.61 ERA this season, which leads the AL over the White Sox (3.62) and ranks 7th in the majors...the Rays are attempting to finish among the majors' top ten in ERA for a fifth consecutive season...the Rays have allowed 3 runs (or fewer) 52 times this season—most in the AL (Astros, 51)—and are 42-10 (.808) when doing so.

+ The Rays bullpen has a 1.32 ERA (54.2-IP, 8-ER) in the last 13 games and a 3.13 ERA (416.2-IP, 145-ER) this season, which ranks 1st in the AL and 2nd in the majors behind the Padres (2.92)...the Rays bullpen ranked 26th in the majors with a 5.07 ERA through games of April 21, but since April 22 their 2.66 ERA ranks 1st in the majors.

PITCHING PLANS—Tonight's game will be started by Drew Rasmussen, the second start of his major league career (June 30 at WSH; 2-IP, 2-ER)... tonight is the 15th time this season the Rays are using an opener, and they are 9-5 in the previous 14 games...the Rays introduced the opener concept against the Angels on May 19, 2018 at LAA, when Sergio Romo pitched a perfect 1st inning and struck out Zack Cozart, Mike Trout and Justin Upton...Romo opened again the next day, pitching 1.1 scoreless innings.

+ Incl. postseason, since the debut of the opener on May 19, 2018, the Rays have used one 122 times and are 74-48 (.607) in those games.

RAYS vs. INDIANS—Beginning May 25, 2019, the Rays have won 10 consecutive games over the Indians, tied for the 3rd-longest winning streak against a single opponent in franchise history behind a 12-0 stretch over the Orioles (2008) and 11-0 stretch over the Twins (2012-13)...the Rays are 5-0 this season (3-0 at home, 2-0 on the road): two 7-inning wins, 2 wins when trailing after 8 innings and 1 win when tied after 8...since 2018, the Rays are 15-3 against the Indians, their best mark against any opponent.

- + The Rays are 20-13 (.606) at Progressive Field on the heels of an 18-game losing streak here from Sep 29, 2005–July 23, 2010...it remains the longest losing streak at a visiting park in club history.
- + Nelson Cruz ranks 2nd among actives with 28 HR vs. Cleveland.

ON THE CLOCK—The Rays have signed LH Mason Montgomery, their sixth-round selection out of Texas Tech in the 2021 First-Year Player Draft...this brings their total to 18 of 21 picks signed in advance of the Aug 1 signing deadline...unsigned are third-round INF Ryan Spikes, eighthround LH Patrick Wicklander and 16th-round RH Ian Leatherman.
