TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners play the finale of a 3-game set against the Minnesota Twins (1-1)...Seattle is also coming off a series sweep of the St. Louis Cardinals (3-0) on the trip...following the off-day tomorrow, Seattle will open a 6-game homestand against the Kansas City Royals (3 G, 5/1-3) and Atlanta Braves (3 G, 5/4-6)...today's game against the Twins will be televised and streamed live on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Angie Mentink** on the call, with **Brad Adam** serving as field reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Gary Hill Jr.** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners earned a 7-1 win last night to even the series with Minnesota at 1-1...with a win today, Seattle would improve to 5-2 over their last 7 series (4/10-c).

- **Programming Note** - Friday's game will be aired exclusively on **Apple TV**, with **Wayne Randazzo** and **Dontrelle Willis** on the call and **Heidi Watney** serving as field reporter.
- **Length** - Seattle is 9-7 when its starter goes at least 6.0 innings this season, and 4-2 when its starter goes at least 7.0 innings in a game.
- **Julio! Julio! Julio!** - Over his last 17 games (4/11-c), **Julio Rodríguez** is batting .343 (23x67) with 9 runs, 6 doubles, 2 home runs, 10 RBI, 6 walks, 3 stolen bases, a .405 OBP and slugging .522 for an .927 OPS...he has reached base safely in 22 of his last 24 games (4/3-c), including a 19-game on-base streak from April 3-24.

CY HE'S PRETTY GOOD...over his last 12 games (4/16-c), **Cole Young** is batting .372 (16x43) with 7 runs, 1 double, 1 home run, 7 RBI, 3 walks, 1 stolen base and an .882 OPS...Young has recorded an RBI in 5-consecutive games (4/24-c)...the 22-year-old leads the Mariners with 1.9 Wins Above Replacement (*Baseball-Reference*) and leads MLB second basemen, ranking ahead of Nico Hoerner-CHC (1.8 bWAR)...Young also has 8 defensive runs saved which leads second basemen and ranks 2nd in MLB overall.

"Very impressed. But it's a credit to his work on and off the field. He grew a lot this spring. He asked a lot of questions. He gained a lot of knowledge. He worked his butt off in early work, pre-game stuff, post-game. I mean, he's doing phenomenal because he's putting in the work."

PLAYING THE HITS...since the start of the Astros series on April 10, the Mariners offense has come alive, averaging 4.94 runs per game while batting .271 (163x601) with 31 doubles, 2 triples, 22 home runs, 87 RBI and 71 walks, getting on base at a .355 clip and slugging .439...during that span, the Mariners rank 4th in MLB in batting average, 3rd in OBP, 6th in OPS (.794), 8th in slugging percentage and 3rd in wRC+ (129).

JUST JOSHING AROUND...over his last 9 games (4/17-c), first baseman **Josh Naylor** is batting .455 (15x33) with 2 doubles, 2 home runs, 8 RBI, 4 stolen bases and 5 walks, slugging .697 with a 1.210 OPS...since Naylor made his Mariners debut on July 25, 2025, he is 23-for-25 in stolen base attempts, ranking T-6th in the Majors and T-4th in AL in stolen bases over that span...he was caught stealing for the first time with Seattle in last night's game.

MARINERS TO RETIRE RANDY JOHNSON'S NUMBER 51...the Mariners are set to retire Randy Johnson's #51 this Saturday, May 2...he will join fellow Hall of Famers Ken Griffey Jr. (#24), Edgar Martinez (#11), Ichiro Suzuki (#51) and Jackie Robinson (#42) as the only numbers retired by the Mariners...Johnson will be the 14th player in MLB history to have his number retired by multiple teams, and his and Ichiro's #51 will be the 8th number to be retired by the same team for multiple players (in addition to #42 which is retired across Major League Baseball).

UPCOMING HOMESTAND...on Friday, the Mariners return to T-Mobile Park for a 6 game homestand against the Royals (3 G, 5/1-3) and Braves (3 G, 5/4-6)...headlining the homestand is Randy Johnson Number Retirement Night on Saturday...additionally, the Mariners will celebrate '80s Weekend (5/1-3) with Randy Johnson '80s Jersey Night (5/1) and '80s Pin Day (5/3)...fans can also enjoy Mariners Value Games during each game of the Braves series (5/4-6)...visit Mariners.com/Tickets for more information.

RALEIGH RIGHT WHERE HE NEEDS TO BE...Cal Raleigh has hit 5 home runs over his last 8 games (4/20-c), tied for the most in MLB since April 20 with Seiya Suzuki-CHC and Spencer Torkelson-DET...in those 8 games (4/20-c), Cal is batting .294 (10x34) with 7 runs, 1 double, 5 homers, 6 RBI, and 3 walks, getting on base at a .351 clip, slugging .765 with a 1.116 OPS...Cal's 12-game on-base streak (4/15-c) was snapped last night.

MARINERS IN THE MEDIA...over 300 interviews and media sessions have taken place during the Mariners 2026 season so far, in a variety of local, national, and international outlets...national media this season have included MLB Network, Apple TV, ESPN, FOX, NBC/Peacock, and more.

MITCH GARVER STOPS BY "THE CAL RALEIGH SHOW"...Mariners catcher **Mitch Garver** joined **Cal Raleigh** and Mariners insider **Shannon Drayer** on last week's episode of "The Cal Raleigh Show"...all episodes of the show air on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** and **SeattleSports.com**.

THAT'S JUST BRASHTY...reliever **Matt Brash** is 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER, 11.1 IP), 8 strikeouts and 2 walks (1 intentional) in 13 appearances this season...he's posted a 0.44 WHIP and held opponents to a .091 batting average (3x33)...Brash is 1-of-3 players in Mariners history to have multiple season opening streaks of at least 10 games without an earned run (also: 19 G in 2025), joining teammates **Andrés Muñoz** (2023 and 2025) and **Gabe Speier** (2023 and 2025).

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Julio Rodríguez** recorded 3 doubles in last night's game, the 29th Mariners player (done 32x) to record 3 doubles in a game (last: Jorge Polanco, 9/14/25 vs. LAA), but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...at 25 years, 120 days, Julio is the 4th-youngest Mariners player to hit 3 doubles in a game?...he trails Alvin Davis (23 years, 222 days) on April 18, 1984 vs. OAK, Kyle Seager (23 years, 294 days) done on Aug. 24, 2011 at Cleveland and Ray Quiñones (24 years, 270 days) done on Aug. 7, 1988 at OAK...no Mariner has ever recorded 4 doubles in a game.

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - APRIL 29

- **1985** - Recently acquired catcher Donnie Scott led off the 9th inning with a home run batting left-handed to tie the Milwaukee Brewers at 7-7, and, batting right-handed in the 10th, led the Mariners to a 9-7 win with his second consecutive home run.
- **1999** - Seattle sets the club record with 22 runs, including a club-record 11 runs in 5th inning vs. Detroit. Ken Griffey Jr. ties a career-high with six RBI, including his 11th career grand slam.
- **2015** - Félix Hernández moved past Jamie Moyer for most innings pitched in club history.
- **2016** - Félix Hernández tied Jamie Moyer as the all-time Mariners wins leader, notching his 145th career win in a 1-0 win over the Royals...also marked the 4th win in franchise history when being one-hit.
- **2021** - Mariners win 1-0 on a Taylor Trammell home run in the 3rd inning against Houston. 17th time in franchise history they have won 1-0 courtesy of a home run, and first since 4/29/16.

ABOUT GEORGE KIRBY...

- The 28-year-old right-hander is making his 7th start of the season and 1st against the Twins...is making the 119th start of his career and his 5th career start against Minnesota.
Is in his 5th season with Seattle; selected by the Mariners in the first round (20th overall) of the 2019 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Ty Holub.
Named to his 1st All-Star team in 2023.
Named AL Rookie of the Month in August 2022 after posting a 2.15 ERA and 5-0 record.
Is the highest drafted player out of Elon University.

LAST TIME OUT...W#4 on April 24 at St. Louis, tossing 6.0 innings and allowing 2 runs (2 ER) on 6 hits and 1 walk with 2 strikeouts...has earned the win in each of his last 3 consecutive starts, his longest winning streak since 4-consecutive starts from July 26-Aug. 12, 2025.

THE FIRST SIX...his 39.1 innings pitched are the most he has tossed across his first six starts of any season in his career (prev. 37.2 IP in 2023) and his 2.97 ERA through his first six starts is also a career-best mark (prev. 3.11 ERA in 2023)...his 32 hits allowed are tied for fewest (also: 2022, '24).

AGAINST THE AL CENTRAL...making his 2nd start against an AL Central opponent this season (also: 3/27 vs. CLE)... across 7 starts against AL Central teams since 2025, he is 4-1 with a 2.97 ERA (13 ER, 41.0 IP) and 40 strikeouts to 11 walks allowed, while limiting batters to a .196 average...he has allowed 1-or-fewer walks in 12 of his 13 career road starts against AL Central teams.

AGAINST MINNESOTA...is making his 5th career start against the Twins...3 of his 4 career starts against the Twins have been in Minnesota at Target Field... in last road start against the Twins (6/25/25), he threw 6.0 IP of 1-run baseball (1 ER), allowing just 3 hits and 1 walk while striking out 3 batters...in his first career start vs. Minnesota (7/20/23), he recorded 10 strikeouts over 7.0 IP, marking the first of 6 career games he has thrown 10+ strikeouts (last: 10 SO on 9/26/25 vs. LAD).

QUALITY STUFF...has thrown a quality start in 4 of his 6 starts this season (last: 4/24 at STL)...has thrown 67 quality starts across his career, tied for 8th-most in MLB since 2022...has thrown 32 quality starts on the road, tied with rotationmate Luis Castillo for 10th-most among pitchers since 2022.

MORE QUALITY FROM KIRBY...has thrown a quality start without any walks in 36 career starts (1x this season, 4/7 at TEX), most in MLB since 2022, ahead of Tarik Skubal-DET, Logan Webb-SF, and Zack Wheeler-PHI (25 G)... has also tossed a quality start with no walks on the road in 16 career games, 2nd-most since 2022, trailing Skubal (17 G).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN...making his 3rd road start of the season and 2nd of the current road trip (last: 4/24 at STL)...among all MLB pitchers with 50+ career road starts, his 1.25 walks-per-nine innings ranks 3rd-best all-time, trailing Hall of Famer Cy Young (1.08) and Deacon Phillippe (1.21)...his 6.32 strikeout-to-walk ratio on the road leads MLB all-time among starters (min. 50 road starts), ahead of Shane Bieber's 5.73 SO/BB.

CRUISE CONTROL...tossed 8.0 innings on April 7 vs. Texas on the road, his 2nd career complete game (also: 8/12/23 vs. BAL)...became the first Mariners pitcher to toss 8.0+ IP since Logan Gilbert did so twice in 2024 (last: 9/7/24 at STL)...Kirby has thrown 8.0+ IP without a walk in 3 career games (last: 4/7 at TEX) and is 1 of 8 pitchers in MLB with 3-or-more such games since 2023, joining fellow teammate Logan Gilbert (3 G, last: 6/16/24 vs. TEX).

BEST IN ALL THE LAND...among starting pitchers since 2022 (min. 600 IP), he leads the Majors in fewest walks allowed (102), strikeout-to-walk ratio (6.37), walks-per-nine innings (1.36), and walk rate (3.7%).

FOR THE M'S HISTORY BOOKS...leads the Mariners franchise (min. 100 GS) in fewest walks-per-nine innings (1.4), ahead of Hisashi Iwakuma (1.9) and Logan Gilbert (1.9)...also leads franchise in strikeout-to-walk ratio (6.37), also ahead of Gilbert (4.89)...ranks 5th in franchise history in career ERA (3.55), ahead of Luis Castillo (3.59) and Logan Gilbert (3.61)...12th in total strikeouts (650 SO).

#50...is 1 win away from 50 career wins...will become the 12th player in franchise history with 50+ wins...if he factors into the win in his next start, his 119 games will be the 4th-fewest to reach 50 wins with the Mariners, behind: Jamie Moyer (100 G), Freddy Garcia (100 G), Marco Gonzales (118 G).

GETTING STARTED...across 17 career starts in March/April, he is 9-6 with a 3.34 ERA (38 ER, 102.1 IP), 91 strikeouts, 1.036 WHIP, 8.00 strikeouts-per-nine, while allowing just 15 walks...has thrown 6.0+ innings in 12 of those 17 starts, including a quality start in 11 total starts during March/April.

IT'S BEEN DECIDED...has factored into the decision in his last 9-consecutive starts, going 6-3 since Sept. 14, 2025...marks the 3rd-longest streak of his career, trailing a 10-game stretch from July 25-Aug. 17, 2025 (7-3)...has factored into the decision in 24 of his 29 starts since last season, going 14-10...since 2023, he has factored into the decision in 72 of his 93 starts (77% of starts), going 41-31 over the stretch...his 72 decisions since 2023 are tied for 3rd-most in MLB, alongside Framber Valdez-HOU/DET.

NO FREE PASSES...has not allowed more than 3 walks in any start over his first 118 career games, the 2nd-longest such streak in MLB history to start a career by a starting pitcher, behind only Carlos Silva's 150 game streak from 8/2/2003-8/15/2008...Kirby's 38 career games of 6.0+ IP without a walk are the most such games among a pitcher's first 118 career games, ahead of Hall of Famer Cy Young (37 G)...has also tossed 6.0+ IP with no walks in 18 road starts, tied for the most in MLB since 2022 alongside Tarik Skubal-DET.

FEW FREE BAGS...has allowed 1-or-fewer walks in 96 starts and 2-or-fewer walks in 110 career starts, both the most such games in MLB through a pitcher's first 119 career starts...his 102 walks allowed are the fewest among all MLB pitchers through their first 118 career games, ranking ahead of Josh Tomlin (103 BB, 2010-17).

GOING THE DISTANCE...since 2025, the Mariners are 12-6 when he pitches 6.0+ innings compared to 5-6 when he tosses fewer than 6.0 innings...across his career, they are 49-25 when he tosses 6.0+ innings and are 17-27 when he tosses fewer than 6.0 innings.

2025 TOTALS...went 10-8 with a 4.21 ERA (59 ER, 126.0 IP) with 29 walks and 137 strikeouts over 23 starts last season...wrapped up the 2025 season with career-best marks in both strikeouts-per-nine innings (9.8) and strikeout percentage (26.1%)...tossed a combined 31 strikeouts across his last 3 starts of the 2025 regular season (9/14-9/26) which is the most by a Mariners pitcher across a 3-game span since James Paxton tossed 33 strikeouts from April 26-May 8, 2018.

14:0 (x2)...tossed a career-high 14 strikeouts without a walk twice during the 2025 regular season, on June 8 at Los Angeles-AL then on Sept. 14 vs. Los Angeles-AL at home, the only pitcher to throw 14+ strikeouts without a walk in multiple starts last season.

- **2025 Totals** - Went 1-3 with 4 saves, a 2.47 ERA (13 ER, 47.1 IP), 18 walks, 58 strikeouts and a 1.25 WHIP in 53 relief appearances...held opponents to a .236 average while recording 21 holds.
