## PITTSBURGH PIRATES (55-90) vs. NEW YORK METS (91-55) SEPTEMBER 17, 2022 at CITI FIELD, NEW YORK, NY -- GAME #146/ROAD #75 RHP BRYSE WILSON (3-8, 6.03 ERA) vs. RHP CHRIS BASSITT (13-8, 3.44 ERA)

**THE PIRATES:** Will play the third of four games against the Mets at Citi Field tonight, having dropped last night's contest by a score of 4-3...The Bucs will continue on against the Mets through Sunday, enjoy an off day on Monday, and then play two against the Yankees at Yankee Stadium next Tuesday and Wednesday.

- The Pirates are coming off a four-game series sweep over the Reds at Great American Ball Park, their first four-game series sweep since August 29-Sept. 1, 2019, when they took all four games of a four-game set against the Rockies at Coors Field...It was the club's first four-game sweep in Cincinnati since taking all four games against the Reds at Riverfront Stadium from July 11-14, 1991...Pirates TV and Radio color analyst **Bob Walk** earned the win in that series finale, tossing 6.1 innings of 3-run baseball with seven punchouts.

**SEPTEMBER SURGE:** Cal Mitchell went 1-for-4 yesterday and has now reached base safely in 10 of his 12 games since being promoted back to the big leagues on September 1, going 12-for-36 (.333) with a .914 OPS in 12 games...Mitchell's .333 batting average this month is the third-highest in all of NL among rookies, trailing only Atlanta's Michael Harris II (.380) and Arizona's Jake McCarthy (.367) [min. 25 PA].

**MAKE HIS GLOVE GOLD:** According to the Fielding Bible, **Ke'Bryan Hayes** leads all Major League third basemen with 19 defensive runs saved, ahead of nine-time defending Gold Glover Nolan Arenado (17) of the Cardinals and Ramon Urias (16) of the Orioles...His 19 defensive runs saved are third most in baseball regardless of position, behind only Aristides Aquino of the Reds (22) and Brendan Rodgers of the Rockies (21).

**REHAB ROAD:** Last night, RHP **David Bednar** made his second rehab appearance for Triple-A Indianapolis, pitching a scoreless fourth inning on nine pitches against Toledo...The 2022 NL All-Star has been on the IL with lower back inflammation since August 3.

**LONG LIVE THE LONG BALL!:** The Pirates have hit 15 home runs over their last 9 games since September 9, which is tied with the Phillies for the highest total in the NL and tied for the third highest total in baseball in that time trailing only the Astros (16) and Mariners (16)...they've also totaled 28 extra-base hits in that time, tied with the Reds for the second-most in the NL, behind only the Dodgers (29).

- Leading the way for the Bucs in home runs in that time are Rodolfo Castro (3; T-2nd in the NL), Oneil Cruz (3; T-2nd), Bryan Reynolds (2; T-12th) and Jack Suwinski (2; T-12th).

**BIG APPLE, MEET BIG ONEIL:** Since being recalled from Triple-A Indianapolis on June 20, **Oneil Cruz** leads NL rookies with 16 home runs and 48 RBI (ATL Michael Harris II is second in both categories with 15 homers and 45 RBI)...in total, Cruz is tied for second among NL rookies in homers on the season (see chart on the right).

- 15 of his homers have come while playing shortstop, which are the second most by a Bucco shortstop since 1974, trailing only the 16 that Jay Bell hit during the 1991 campaign.
- Over his last 17 games since August 29, Oneil Cruz leads the NL with 18 RBI and ranks second in the Majors behind only TOR Bo Bichette (22)...in that time, Cruz is batting .282 (20-for-71)/.320 OBP/.683 SLG with three doubles, two triples and six home runs.
- This month Cruz leads National League rookies with 38 total bases, ranks third in SLG (.644) and fourth in OPS (.956).
- In 71 games this season, Cruz already has hit the hardest hit ball in the history of Statcast (122.4 mph), thrown the hardest ball by an infielder in the history of Statcast (97.8 mph) and averages a sprint speed of 30.0 feet per second, which ranks in the top 2 percent of active Major Leaguers.

**YOUNG BUCS:** Pirates rookies have totaled 52 home runs this season, the second-most in all of baseball behind Kansas City (64)...the 51 home runs by rookies this season are already the most in a single season by Pirates rookies.

- Jack Suwinski** and **Oneil Cruz** lead Pirates rookies with 16 home runs each, followed by **Diego Castillo** who has 11...This is the first time in franchise history that the Pirates have had three different rookies with 10+ home runs in a single season (source: Elias Sports Bureau).

**FALL BALL:** Yesterday, Major League Baseball announced the rosters and coaching staffs for the 2022 Arizona Fall League...Representing the Pirates will be RHP **Omar Cruz**, RHP **Quinn Priester**, RHP **Colin Selby**, RHP **Tahnaj Thomas**, C **Henry Davis**, INF **Nick Gonzales**, INF **Jacob Gonzalez** (taxi squad), OF **Matt Gorski** and extra coach **Ruben Gotay**.

- In total, there will be 16 of the Top 100 prospects as rated by MLB.com participating in the Fall League, with three of those being Buccos (Davis - 20; Preister - 47; Gonzales - 97)...the Pirates and Cardinals are tied for the most Top 100 prospects represented at this year's AFL.
