DETROIT TIGERS (15-14) AT ATLANTA BRAVES (20-9)

FIRST THINGS FIRST: The first-place Detroit Tigers this evening begin a three-game series at the Atlanta Braves, their second and final stop of a two-city, six-game road trip vs. a pair of first-place clubs that began this past weekend in Cincinnati (1-2) ... the Tigers have won 11 of their last 16 games after dropping nine of their first 13 games to start the season.

- This is already Detroit's fourth road trip overall this season but its first two-city trek since their opening jaunt through San Diego and Arizona ... the Tigers have since taken two one-city trips and hosted a pair of one-team homestands within the month of April.

THAT'S SOME HIGH-END TORK: Spencer Torkelson on Sunday tied the Tigers franchise record by hitting a home run in his fifth-consecutive game, becoming the sixth Tiger to ever do so and the first since Marcus Thames in 2008 ... Torkelson also joins Willie Horton (1969), Vic Wertz (1950), Hank Greenberg (1940) and Rudy York (1937) in this exclusive sextet of Tigers.

- Torkelson is the second major leaguer to homer in five-straight games this season, joining Chicago's Munezaka Murakami from April 17-22 ... Boston's Rafael Devers is the last big leaguer to homer in six-consecutive games from May 15-20, 2024.

IT IS IN FACT GOOD FOR SOMETHING: Kevin McGonigle leads the majors with a 2.0 bWAR through his first 28 major league games, ahead of both Chicago's Nico Hoerner (1.9 bWAR) and Houston's Yordan Alvarez (1.9 bWAR) ... the 21-year-old McGonigle is the only player in the top 10 on this list younger than 24-years-old.

THERE'S SO MUCH MORE TO 24: Kevin McGonigle, who is the first 21-year-old or younger in major league history with at least 15 extra-base hits and 15 walks in his first 28 games, has reached base safely in his last 24 starts, the first Tigers rookie to do so since Austin Jackson reached in 25-straight starts in 2010 ... the last 21-year-old or younger Tiger prior to reach in 24-or-more starts in a row?: 21-year-old Al Kaline in 34-straight starts nearly 70 years ago from July 26-August 28, 1956.

- McGonigle's run of reaching base safely in 24-straight starts is the longest active streak in the majors, two starts more than anyone else (Nick Kurtz is at 22 starts).
- McGonigle is the second big league player ever 21-years-old or younger to reach base safely in 24-consecutive starts, all within the early season months of March/April, joining 21-year-old Rocco Baldelli who did so in 24-straight starts with Tampa Bay from March 31-April 27, 2003.

GO GREENE: Riley Greene is now batting .408 (20-for-49) with four doubles, three homers, 11 RBI, a .508 on-base percentage, a .673 slugging percentage and a 1.182 OPS in his last 15 games over the last two+ weeks starting April 11 ... he ranks second in the majors in on-base percentage, third in the majors in batting average and sixth in the majors in OPS in this span.

- In his first 29 games this season, Greene is slashing .301/.400/.466 with a 14.2 walk percentage and a 24.2 strikeout percentage ... in his first 29 games last season, Greene slashed .235/.279/.435 with a 5.7 walk percentage and 32.0 strikeout percentage.

A SMASH HIT: Kevin McGonigle on Sunday extended his hitting streak 11 games, becoming the first 21-year-old or younger Tiger with an 11-game hitting streak since 21-year-old Riley Greene had a 13-gamer in 2022 ... the last such Tiger to do so entirely within the early season months of March/April?: 20-year-old Al Kaline and his 14-game hitting streak from April 12-29, 1955.

- McGonigle is batting .356 (16-45) with a .431 on-base percentage and 1.009 OPS during this 11-game streak ... he is now tied for the third-longest active hitting streak in all of baseball, trailing only Arizona's Ildemaro Vargas (20 games) and Houston's Yordan Alvarez (12 games).

YES! MORE MR. MIZE GUY: Last time out Casey Mize tossed 6.0 strong innings with seven strikeouts and just one run allowed to earn the 5-2 win vs. Milwaukee ... it was his second quality start in a row (third of the season) as he has now allowed one run or less in four of his five starts ... in his last three starts, Mize has pitched to a 0.98 ERA (2 ER/18.1 IP) with 19 strikeouts and just five walks.

- Mize is tied for seventh in the A.L. with a team-best 2.51 ERA (min. 28.0 innings pitched).

THEY'RE IN ANOTHER LEAGUE: This series with the Braves concludes a run of nine-straight games against N.L. competition, a stretch that will bring Detroit's total to 21 interleague contests out of 32 games to start the year through the end of April ... put differently, nearly two-thirds of Detroit's schedule prior to May 1 will take place against interleague competition (barring postponements).

- The Tigers will quickly make up for lost time, however, as they will play all but three games (59 of 62 contests) against A.L. competition from May 1-July 9.

AND FINALLY: Spencer Torkelson's franchise-tying five-game streak with a home run is rare in that it has featured his first five homers of the season ... Torkelson is only the seventh-player in major league history to have a home-run streak of five or more games begin with his first homer of the year, the first to do so since Aaron Judge in 2020 ... Torkelson's feat is unique in that he went homerless in his first 23 games of the season before this run began ... the previous record for most homerless games before a streak like this began belonged to Chicago's Carlos Lee, who started his run after 13 homerless games with the White Sox in 2003 ... thanks to Elias.

- Last time out, he tossed 6.0 strong innings with seven strikeouts and just one run allowed to earn the 5-2 win vs. Milwaukee...it was his second quality start in a row (third of the season) as he has now allowed one run or less in four of his five starts...in his last three starts, Mize has pitched to a 0.98 ERA (2 ER/18.1 IP) with 19 strikeouts and just five walks.
- As of April 28, he is tied for seventh in the A.L. with a team-best 2.51 ERA (min. 28.0 innings pitched).
- Earned his first win of the season on April 11 against Miami, coming one out shy of a quality start...he tossed 5.2 innings allowing just one earned run on six hits and a walk while striking out five.
- Allowed just one run over six strong innings, striking out nine in his first start of the year against Arizona.
- Started 28 games for the Tigers in 2025 and marked a career-best 14-6 record...posted a 3.48 ERA (64ER/149.0IP) and a career-high 139 strikeouts.
- Named a 2025 All-Star for the first time in his career on July 11, becoming the sixth Tigers' player to be named to the team.
- Made his first postseason appearance on Oct. 1 against the Cleveland Guardians...made his first postseason start at home on Oct. 8, posting six strikeouts in three innings to start the game in the teams' 9-3 win over the Seattle Mariners to force a game five of the ALDS. That start marked the first time Mize threw six strikeouts in less than 4.1 innings.
- Mize (14-6) and Tarik Skubal (13-6) were the first Tigers teammates to reach 13 wins since 2014: Max Scherzer (18), Justin Verlander (15) and Rick Porcello (15)...New York's Max Fried and Carlos Rodón were the only other A.L. teammates with at least 13 wins last year.
- Became the first Tigers pitcher to win four games in April since Jordan Zimmerman won five games in 2016...went 4-1 with a 2.12 ERA (6 ER/24.1 IP) in five starts in April.
- Recorded first win at home since 2021 on April 7 last year in a 6-2 win against the New York Yankees...recorded six strikeouts and held the Yankees to four hits and one run through six innings of work.

- Earned his first career major league save with 3.1 scoreless innings, allowing two walks while striking out two in a victory over the Marlins on April 11.
- Signed with Detroit on a one-year major league contract with a club option for the 2027 season on Dec. 16, 2025.
- Spent each of the previous two seasons with the SSG Langers of the KBO League...went 12-7 with a 2.25 ERA (43 ER/171.2 IP) in 30 starts for SSG last season, recording 245 strikeouts in his 171.2 innings pitched, an average of 12.8 strikeouts per nine innings.
- In his two seasons with SSG, went 23-10 with a 2.91 ERA (93 ER/287.1 IP) in 54 appearances (53 starts)...released by Detroit after nine appearances with Triple-A Toledo in 2024 prior to signing with the Langers.
- Has spent parts of five seasons with the Philadelphia Phillies (2017-19), Chicago White Sox (2020) and Texas Rangers (2021) prior to joining the Tigers this year...also pitched with Hiroshima in the NPB for the 2022-23 campaigns.

- Did not allow a run over his first 11 games (11.0 innings) this year, allowing five hits and eight walks while striking out five over that span...his first earned run came on April 24 against Cincinnati in a game in which he struck out four batters over 1.2 frames.
- Re-signed with Detroit on a two-year deal as a free agent on Dec. 20, 2025...appeared in 16 games with the Tigers last season, posting a 3-0 record with a 1.50 ERA (3ER/18IP) with 23 strikeouts.
- Made his first postseason appearance with the Tigers in 2025, playing six games and striking out three in 7.1 innings of work.
- Landed on the injured list on Sept. 5 with a right adductor strain...activated Sept. 19 and allowed one run in three of the first four games since returning from the IL.
- Became the first MLB reliever to change teams at the deadline and immediately throw 14+ scoreless innings since Erik Goeddel in 2018...the first Tigers reliever to do so since Doug Blair in 1983.
- Recorded a four-out save on Aug. 2 at Philadelphia in his Tigers debut...started his Tigers career going 3-0 with a hold and four saves, allowing just three hits and three walks while striking out 19 over his first 14.1 innings (12 games).
- Earned 20 saves with the Nationals in 2025 prior to being traded to Detroit on July 31, sixth-most in the N.L. at the time...went 1-4 with a 4.38 ERA (19 ER/39.0 IP) in 40 relief outings, including 34 games finished for Washington.
