DETROIT TIGERS (60-40) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (39-61)
July 21, 2025 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 6:40 EDT - Game #101/Home #51

THE PIRATES: were swept in a three-game series vs. Chicago-AL (Friday-Sunday) to begin this nine-game homestand...Will host Detroit for three games (Monday-Wednesday) before welcoming Arizona (July 25-27) to PNC Park to conclude the homestand...Are in a stretch of 15 consecutive games against American League teams, including 12 straight games against the American League Central...Are 26-24 at home...Are 27-35 since Don Kelly made his managerial debut on May 9.

RHP Jack Flaherty (5-9, 4.65 ERA) vs. RHP Paul Skenes (4-8, 2.01 ERA)

TIGER TALES: The Pirates continue their season-high-tying nine-game homestand with the beginning of this three-game series against Detroit tonight at PNC Park...Pittsburgh dropped two of three games from June 17-19 at Comerica Park...This will mark the first three-game series against the Tigers here at PNC Park since September 6-8, 2021, when the Pirates won two of three games.

PAUL GETS THE CALL: Paul Skenes gets the start in his first outing following the All-Star break tonight vs. Detroit...Skenes, who started for the National League in the All-Star Game for the second straight season on July 15, had a 2.03 ERA (66.2ip/15er) following the All-Star break in 2024...That was the fifth-lowest ERA among Major League pitchers with at least 66.0 innings pitched, behind only San Francisco's Blake Snell (1.45), Atlanta's Chris Sale (1.86), Seattle's Bryce Miller (1.89) and Houston's Framber Valdez (1.96).

DENNIS DEALIN': Dennis Santana struck out two batters in a perfect eighth inning on Sunday vs. Chicago (AL)...Santana's 1.52 ERA (41.1ip/7er) ranks fifth among all Major League relievers...He's faced 32 straight batters at home without giving up a hit (last hit allowed here was on June 3, a two-run home run to Houston's Isaac Paredes)...According to Elias, that's the longest-such active streak among all Major League pitchers.

YO-LO: Yohan Ramírez struck out a career-high five batters in 3.0 scoreless innings of relief on Sunday...He's struck out at least three batters in each of his first three outings, making him one of five Pirates relievers with at least three strikeouts in each of his first three outings of a season, joining Cody Ponce (2021, four), Don Robinson (1984), Cecilio Guante (1982) and Mike Cvengros (1927)... Ramírez has struck out 12 batters and allowed just four hits over his first three appearances (6.1ip), making him one of just six Pirates relievers (seven instances) since at least 1901 to have a three-game span with 12 strikeouts and four hits or fewer allowed, along with Alejandro Pena (1994), Rich Gossage (1977), Luke Walker (1968), Elroy Face (1960, twice) and Homer Hillebrand (1905).

THE RENEGADE: David Bednar pitched a perfect ninth inning on Sunday afternoon against Chicago (AL) and has not allowed an earned run in 19 consecutive appearances (18.1ip), dating back to May 24 vs. Milwaukee...Bednar's .131 batting average against (8-for-61) in that span is tied with Los Angeles (NL)'s Alex Vesia for the fourth-lowest mark among Major League relievers with at least 60 at-bats, trailing Baltimore's Félix Bautista (.091), San Diego's Adrian Morejon (.091) and Boston's Aroldis Chapman (.111).

GOOD AS GONZO: Nick Gonzales has doubled, recorded an RBI and scored a run in back-to-back games (since Saturday vs. Chicago-AL), joining Isiah Kiner-Falefa (May 27-28 at Arizona) as the only Pirates to do that this season... The last Pirate to do that in three consecutive contests was Oneil Cruz from July 14-20, 2024...Across his last 25 games, dating back to the June 19 doubleheader against Detroit at Comerica Park, Gonzales is batting .298 (28-for-94) with seven doubles, three homers, 12 RBI, 11 walks and 11 runs scored.

CLIMB THE CHARTS: With his ninth-inning double off Mike Vasil on Sunday vs. the White Sox, Andrew McCutchen moved into a tie with National Baseball Hall of Famer Willie Stargell for 180th place on Major League Baseball's all-time hits list (2232)...He has recorded 1747 of those hits with Pittsburgh, the ninth-most in club history (Roberto Clemente, 3000, ranks first)...In 47 career games against the Tigers, McCutchen is batting .307 (55-for-179) with 10 doubles, six home runs, 26 RBI, 22 walks, eight steals and 24 runs scored.

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

<u>July 21, 2024</u>: Former Pirates manager Jim Leyland was officially enshrined into the National Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown, New York. Leyland, who managed Pittsburgh from 1986-96 and won three straight NL East titles from 1990-92, was the 44th former player, manager or executive who spent part of their professional career with the Pirates to be inducted.

TONIGHT'S STARTER RHP PAUL SKENES #30

2025 RECORD: 4-8, 2.01 ERA

AGE: 23 **SIGNED:** Thru 2025 **HOW ACQUIRED:** Selected in the first round (No. 1) of the 2023 Draft.

STARTING OFF: Skenes will make his 21st start of the season tonight...He took home BBWAA National League Rookie of the Year honors in 2024 after making his Major League debut on May 11 vs. Chicago (NL)...He was the first-overall pick by Pittsburgh in the 2023 Draft (out of LSU).

LAST TIME OUT: Skenes allowed two runs in 5.0 innings on July 11 at Minnesota, losing a 2-1 decision...Both of the Twins' runs came off a two-run, fourth-inning home run from Trevor Larnach...It was the fourth homer (first this season) that Skenes allowed in 23 career road starts (131.2ip)...He also surrendered solo shots last season to Los Angeles (NL)'s Teoscar Hernández on August 10, Atlanta's Jarred Kelenic on June 29 and Detroit's Matt Vierling on May 29 [G2].

PAUL-STAR: Skenes started for the National League in the All-Star Game on July 15 at Atlanta's Truist Park (he was named the starter by manager Dave Roberts on July 12)...He struck out Detroit's Gleyber Torres and Riley Greene on 100-mile-per-hour fastballs before getting New York's Aaron Judge to ground out, completing a perfect inning on 14 pitches...He was opposed by Detroit's Tarik Skubal, who allowed two runs in his 1.0 inning of work...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, Skenes became the first pitcher and one of five Major League players ever to start the All-Star Game in each of his first two big-league seasons, joining Joe DiMaggio (seven, 1936-42), Ichiro Suzuki (four, 2001-04), Rod Carew (three, 1967-69) and Frank Robinson (two, 1956-57).

ALL-STAR ACCOLADES: During his start on July 6 at Seattle, Skenes was named to the National League All-Star team for the second straight season...Last season, he became the first Pirates rookie pitcher to ever be selected to an All-Star Game (was the fifth Major League rookie pitcher to start the All-Star Game)...In 2024, he also became one of four Pittsburgh rookies to ever be named an All-Star, joining Tony Womack (1997), Jason Kendall (1996) and Frankie Zak (1944).

AGAINST THE TIGERS: Skenes has faced Detroit twice in his career, with both starts coming at Comerica Park...He allowed two runs on three hits and a career-high five walks while striking out nine batters over 6.0 innings on June 19 [G2] this season, having a no-decision in the Pirates' 8-4, 10-inning win...Skenes also allowed two runs on three hits and one walk while striking out nine batters across 6.0 innings on May 29 [G2], 2024, winning a 10-2 decision over Keider Montero.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: Skenes needed a total of just 12 pitches to retire the side in order in the first inning of his last start on July 11 at Minnesota...He has yet to allow a run in the first inning in his first 20 starts of this season...Since making his big-league debut, Skenes has posted a 1.05 ERA (43.0ip/5er), 55 strikeouts and a .204 batting average against in the first inning of his starts.

300 PUNCHOUTS: With his fourth-inning strikeout of Matt Wallner on July 11 at Minnesota, Skenes reached 300 career strikeouts in his 43rd career start (he also struck out Willi Castro in the the fifth inning, finishing the night with 301 career strikeouts)...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, he became the first Pirates pitcher and one of 17 Major League pitchers all-time to record at least 300 strikeouts in his first 43 starts...Skenes is also one of five active pitchers to have done that, along with Spencer Strider (376, 2022-23 with Atlanta), Yu Darvish (348, 2012-13 with Texas), Corbin Burnes (340, 2019-22 with Milwaukee) and Shane Bieber (308, 2018-19 with Cleveland).

FLYING HIGH IN JULY: Skenes has recorded a 1.45 ERA (43.1ip/7er) in seven career starts during the month of July...This season, Skenes has posted a 1.20 ERA (15.0ip/2er) in three July starts.

10-0-0: Skenes struck out 10 batters in 5.0 scoreless innings (no walks allowed) in his start on July 6 at Seattle...He became the first Pirates pitcher to strike out at least 10 batters in an outing of 5.0 innings or fewer since Roansy Contreras had 10 strikeouts in 4.2 innings on September 21, 2022 at New York (AL)...Skenes also became just one of five Pirates pitchers since at least 1901 to strike out 10 or more batters while allowing zero walks and zero runs in an appearance, along with Jared Jones (May 4, 2024 vs. Colorado), Mitch Keller (May 14, 2023 at Baltimore), Larry McWilliams (September 20, 1983 at New York-NL) and Bob Veale (Sept. 23, 1966 at Atlanta).
