METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Angels, 5-1, yesterday in Anaheim...The team earned their second series win on the road this year...The Mets have won two of their last three games and are 3-3 over their last six games...The team continues their third trip of the year, a nine-game tripe (2-1) against the Angels (2-1), Diamondbacks (three games) and Rockies (three games).

ROSTER MOVE: RHP Carl Edwards Jr. was outrighted to Triple-A and elected free agency in lieu of accepting the assignment.

ROCKY MOUNTAIN HIGH: David Peterson, a native of Denver, has appeared in one game at Coors Field...On August 8, 2024 the lefty tossed 5.0 innings and allowed one earned run on four hits with three walks and struck out five...He has made four starts against the Rockies in his career and his 3-1 with 1.99 ERA (5 ER/22.2 IP) with seven walks and 20 strikeouts.

MY OH MYERS: Tobias Myers is now 0-1 with a 2.05 ERA (5 ER/22.0 IP), four walks and 16 strikeouts in 10 games this year...He has not allowed an earned run over his last four appearances, tossing 9.0 scoreless innings and allowing six hits, three walks and seven strikeouts.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are in the midst of their third road trip of the season...They are 6-10 in 2026...Last season, the Mets went 34-47 on the road...The team has posted a 3.34 ERA on the road, which is fourth in the majors and second in the National League.

RETURN OF THE MARK: Yesterday, Mark Vientos recorded his sixth career multi-homer game, finishing 2-4 with two runs, two homers and four RBI...His six multi-homer games are tied with Francisco Alvarez for the second-most on the current team...Francisco Lindor has 11 which is tied for the ninth-most in team history.

AW SNAP: Juan Soto went 0-5 yesterday, snapping his 18 game on-base streak...It was his longest streak to begin a season in his career...In 19 games this season, he is batting .314/.415/.500 with eight runs, four doubles, three homers, eight RBI, 12 walks and a .916 OPS.

HUASCAR GOES TO...: In 14 games this year, Huascar Brazoban is 2-0 with a 1.15 ERA (2 ER/15.2 IP) with three walks and 13 strikeouts... He has made three starts in his career, posting a 0.00 ERA (0 ER/4.0 IP) with three walks and five strikeouts.

ROX-METS NOTES: The Mets have won five straight at Coors Field...Overall the team is 47-60 at the ballpark.

DOWN ON THE FARM: LHP Zach Thornton tossed 4.0 scoreless innings and allowed three hits with two walks and struck out seven for the Rumble Ponies last night...He has made five starts this season and is 0-2 with a 3.60 ERA (10 ER/25.0 IP) with nine walks and 27 strikeouts...The lefty was selected by the Mets in the fifth round in the 2023 First-Year Player Draft out of Grand Canyon University.

WE REMEMBER: The New York Mets announced that the club will wear a memorial "Davey" patch on the sleeve of their home and road uniforms during the 2026 season...Johnson passed away on September 5, 2025 at the age of 82...He finished his Mets career with the most managerial wins in franchise history (595) and the best winning percentage (.588)...In 1986, Johnson guided the team to a franchise-record 108 regular season victories and capped the year off with a dramatic World Championship...From 1984-1990, under his helm, the Mets averaged more than 95 wins.

THIS DAY IN 1986: The Mets earned a 7-2 win over the Reds to secure a sweep...Ron Darling tossed 6.2 innings and allowed four hits, two runs, six walks and struck out five to improve to 2-0 on the season...Wally Backman went 4-5 with two runs, an RBI and two doubles in the win...Darryl Strawberry socked two homers in the win...This season, the Mets will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the 1986 World Series Champions New York Mets...The Mets will also host a 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration to celebrate the 1986 World Champion Mets on Saturday, August 1 prior to the 4:10 p.m. game against the Miami Marlins...Additional information regarding programming for the 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration will be available at a later date at Mets.com/1986.

LAST TIME OUT: Allowed seven runs, tied for the second-most he has ever allowed in a start (also: 4/22/23 at San Francisco)...Was his shortest start of the season and tied for his second-shortest outing of the season (also: 4/19 at Chicago-NL)...In five starts this season, has an 8.10 ERA (21 ER/23.2 IP).

VS. COLORADO/NATIONAL LEAGUE: Peterson has made four starts against the Rockies, recording one run or fewer in three of those four games...Holds a 1.99 ERA (5 ER/22.2 IP) and a 7.94 SO/9.0 IP...Peterson made 25 appearances vs. the National League last season, posting a 4.53 ERA (70 ER/139.0 IP)...The Mets were 14-11 last year when Peterson started against a National League team.

ON THE ROAD: Dating back to last season, Peterson has recorded seven starts where he's completed at least 6.0 innings and allowed two or fewer runs...Today's outing will mark his third road start this season.

SPRING TRAINING: In three Spring outings (three starts), Peterson recorded a 4.15 ERA (6 ER/13.0 IP) with nine strikeouts...Held Spring batters to a .235 (12-51) average...Last pitched on March 22 at Miami, tossing a spring-high 5.0 innings (1R, 5H, 1BB, 4K).

2025 YEAR IN REVIEW: Over a career-high 30 starts in 2025, he went 9-6 with a 4.22 ERA (79 ER/168.2 IP), 65 walks and a career-high 150 strikeouts...He allowed three earned runs or less in 22 of his 30 starts this season and one or zero earned runs in 10 starts...He picked up at least eight strikeouts in five of his 30 starts this season...Allowed four or more earned runs in eight of his last 16 starts after not allowing more than three earned runs through his first 14 starts of the season...Among qualified Major League pitchers this season, finished third in HR/9.0 IP ratio (0.59), tied for fourth in opponent GIDP (20) and sixth in groundball percentage (54.7).

GOING THE DISTANCE: Completed at least 7.0+ innings in six of his 30 starts last season...Mets starters completed 7.0 innings 10 times in 2025, six of those starts came from Peterson...Him and Nolan McLean were the only Mets pitchers to complete 8.0 innings this season...His two 8.0+ innings pitched starts were the most by a Mets southpaw in a single season since Jon Niese (2014)...He completed pitched 5.0 or more in 24 of his 30 starts this season, and 6.0+ innings in 16 of those starts...His 24 such starts were the most on the team and his 16 such starts of 6.0 or more innings were the most on the team...He became one of 13 left-handed starters this season to record at least 16 starts with 6.0+ innings pitched...He joined Sean Manaea (16 in 2024) as the only Mets lefties to record as many 6.0+ IP starts since Steven Matz (16 in 2016 and 2019)...Peterson's 24 starts of 5.0+ innings pitched, his 16 starts of 6.0+ innings pitched, six starts of 7.0+ innings pitched and two 8.0+ innings pitched are all his most in a single season.

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL STAR: On July 10, 2025, Peterson was named to his first career All-Star Game after posting a first-half career-best 3.06 ERA and 93 strikeouts (previous: 3.09 ERA in 2024 and 84 K in 2022)...He became the first Mets starting pitcher to be named an All-Star since Kodai Senga in 2023 and is the first left-handed Mets pitcher to be named an All-Star since Johan Santana (2009)...He threw 1.0 scoreless inning in the Midsummer Classic on July 15, becoming the first Met to do so since Jacob deGrom in 2019 and the first left-handed Mets pitcher to do so since Tom Glavine in 2004.

LEFTY LEADERBOARD: His 614 strikeouts are the seventh-most by a left-hander in franchise history...Tug McGraw is next on the list with 618 K...His 115 career starts are the eighth-most in franchise history by a southpaw...Vs. left-handers this season, he posted a .228/.275/.289 slash line (34-149) and allowed just one home run to 161 lefty batters faced...Among qualified left-handed pitchers facing left-handed batters this season, he finished fifth in groundball percentage (63.7), tied for fifth in strikeouts (48), seventh in opponents' SLG (.289), 10th in OPS (.564) and 13th in opponents' OBP...He reached 500.0 career innings pitched on May 18, becoming one of 18 left-handed pitchers to reach the milestone with the franchise...He also became the 13th Mets southpaw to reach 500 strikeouts on May 6 and was the first to do so since Steven Matz (recorded his 500th strikeout on 9/11/19).

QUALITY CONTROL: Recorded 15 quality starts in 30 total outings last season, including 12 of his last 23 starts...Recorded five straight quality starts from July 3 - August 1, which was tied for the longest such streak in his career (also: 8/14-9/3/24)...Peterson recorded 27 quality starts since his start to last season (5/29/24), with 25 of them coming in his last 46 games (since July 1)...From July 1, 2024 to the end of this season, he was one of 12 pitchers (one of five in the NL) to record at least 25 quality starts and one of five left-handers to do so (also: Tarik Skubal, Framber Valdez, Max Fried and Cristopher Sánchez).

APPLE PICKING: Last season, Peterson recorded a net bases prevented of eight (a sum of advances prevented and outs added assigned to the pitcher) according to Baseball Savant, which was tied for the second-best in the majors with six others, trailing Matthew Boyd and Max Fried...Since his Major League debut in 2020, his 33 net bases prevented is the most among qualified Major League pitchers...Max Fried is next on the list at 23...Peterson has recorded 18 career pickoffs (three this season), which is tied with Sid Fernandez for the seventh-most by a Mets pitcher...He trails only Ron Darling (41), Jerry Koosman (36), Dwight Gooden (32), Al Leiter (28), Jon Matlack (24), Mike Scott (20)...According to *OPTA*.

CAREER NOTES: Set new career highs in strikeouts, innings pitched and starts last season...Had a career-high 15.0 scoreless inning streak from June 5-17...He threw at least 5.0 innings in 12 straight starts from April 12 - June 17, which was the longest such streak of his career...Over parts of seven Major League seasons with the Mets, the southpaw has gone 37-34 with a 4.23 ERA (307 ER/653.0 IP), 276 walks and 643 strikeouts in 138 games (120 starts)...Was drafted by the Mets in the first round (20th overall) of the 2017 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Oregon.

- Threw 1.1 scoreless innings in relief on May 2 at Los Angeles-AL (1.1 IP, K)...Since the start of last year, he has recorded four or more outs without allowing an earned run in 19 relief appearances, which is the sixth-most appearances among NL relievers.

- Hasn't allowed a run over seven road appearances this season (6.1 IP).
- Earned his second win of the season after throwing a scoreless sixth inning on May 1 at Los Angeles-AL (1.0 IP, K)...12 of his 14 appearances this season have been scoreless.
- Fired 2.0 innings of relief on April 26 vs. Colorado (G1) (2.0 IP, 2 H, ER, K, BB)...Marked his second multi-inning relief outing of the season.
- Fired 2.2 scoreless innings in relief on April 11 vs. the Athletics (2.2 IP, 2 H, 3 K)...Marked his ninth scoreless relief appearance of at least 2.0 innings since the beginning of last season...Is tied for the ninth-most such games among NL relievers during that span.
- Made his third career Opening Day roster and his second consecutive with the Mets.
- Pitched in three games for the Dominican Republic in the World Baseball Classic...He tossed 4.0 scoreless innings and struck out seven of the 13 batters he faced.
- Appeared in three Grapefruit League games and he threw 3.0 scoreless innings...He struck out five of the 11 batters he faced during the spring.
- Last season, he made a career-high 52 appearances and finished with a 5-2 record, two saves, 12 holds, 57 strikeouts, and a 3.57 ERA (25 ER/63.0 IP).
- In 2025, he allowed just five earned runs over 25 combined appearances in March, April, and May (1.34 ERA)...His ERA through his first 25 games of the season is the 11th-best in franchise history.
