**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets defeated the Texas Rangers, 4-1, yesterday in New York...The Mets improved to 38-9 when scoring first this season...Their .809 winning percentage ranks fifth in MLB...The Mets secured their 18th series victory of the season...New York is 18-5-2 in 25 series this year...The Mets are in a stretch of 17 games in 17 days (2-1) to finish out the first-half...Tonight, the Mets begin a quick three-game road trip against the Reds...Following this series, the Mets head home for a four-game series against the Marlins.

**HAPPY FOURTH OF JULY:** The Mets are 31-37 all-time on Independence Day.

**THE BUCK STARTS HERE:** With the victory yesterday, Mets Manager Buck Showalter earned his 1,600th career managerial win...The win places him 22nd on the all-time win list, surpassing Tommy Lasorda...Fred Clarke is next with 1,602 wins...His 1,600 wins rank fourth among active managers.

**IT'S GREAT!:** Luis Guillorme is 5-10 (.500) with a run, a double, a home run, three RBI and a walk in three career games in Cincinnati...Francisco Lindor is a lifetime .349 (22-63) hitter with 14 runs, three doubles, five home runs, nine RBI, seven walks with a .423 OBP and a .635 SLG in 14 career games here...Ender Inciarte has hit .319 (29-91) with 12 runs, four doubles, two home runs, 14 RBI, eight walks with a .356 BP with a .429 SLG in 24 career games at the ballpark.

**RIGHT ON:** The Mets are batting .260 against right-handed pitchers this year...That is the best mark in the majors...Their .327 OBP is third in MLB...The Mets are 33-17 when facing a right-handed starting pitcher...Jeff McNeil is batting .327 against righties this year, which is sixth in the majors and third in the NL...Pete Alonso's .296 average against RHP is ninth in the NL, while his .579 SLG is seventh in The Show and second in the Senior Circuit.

**DOMINATING DÍAZ:** Edwin Díaz, the reigning NL Reliever of the Month, has posted a 1-0 record with eight saves, a 0.66 ERA (one earned run/13.2 innings) with 10 hits, three walks and 29 strikeouts over his last 14 appearances since May 27...Overall, he has recorded 18 saves this season, the fifth-most in the majors...He leads the major leagues among relievers with 63 strikeouts...His 17.54 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors...No other reliever has a K/9 rate over 16.00...He has struck out 63 of the 130 batters he faced, good for 48.5%...He is 2-1 with 18 saves, a 1.95 ERA (seven earned runs/32.1 innings), allowing 25 hits and 12 walks...The Mets are 30-3 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

**ADAM EXPLAINS EVERYTHING:** Adam Ottavino has allowed two runs over his last 22 appearances...He is 1-1 with a 0.87 ERA (two earned runs/22.2 innings) in that span with five walks and 18 strikeouts...Overall, he is 2-2 with a 2.67 ERA (nine earned runs/30.1 innings) with 10 walks and 35 strikeouts...In 15 road games, he is 0-1 with a 1.35 ERA (two earned runs/13.1 innings) with three walks and 14 strikeouts...Right-handed batters are hitting .149 (11-74) against him this season.

**FOGO POWER:** Eduardo Escobar has homered in three straight games...It is the longest home run streak by the Mets this year...The last time a Met homered in at least four consecutive games was September 6-9, 2020, when Jeff McNeil hit all four of his 2020 dingers...He is batting .364 (4-11) with three runs and six RBI in that span...It's the third time in his career that he has homered in three-straight games...His career high is four consecutive games with a blast, accomplishing that feat from April 8-11, 2021...He is batting .289/.322/.566 with seven doubles, two triples and four home runs against left-handed hitters this year...This compares to a .201/.270/.339 against right-handed hitters.

**ON THE RECORD:** New York has won 49 games this season, tied for the most in the National League...Their .620 winning percentage is fourth in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a 49-30 record through the team's first 79 games...Only the 1986 (55-24) and the 1988 (50-29) teams posted a better record through the first 79 games of the season.

**ROAD TRIPPIN':** New York is 23-17 on the road this year...Their .575 road winning percentage is the fifth-best in the majors and is the third-best in the NL...The Mets finished the first-half of the 2021 season going 19-26 on the road...New York is batting .256/.320/.402 away from Citi Field...Their .256 road average ranks fourth in the majors, while their .320 OBP ranks eighth.

**A CENTURY:** Jeff McNeil collected his 100th career double yesterday...He ranks eighth in the majors and fifth in the National League with a .317 batting average...His batting average has not dropped below .300 since it was .280 on April 22... He is batting .360 (40-111) with 12 doubles, a triple, two home runs, 32 RBI with a .410 OBP and a .541 SLG with runners on base this year...His .360 average ranks 10th in the majors and seventh in the National League...McNeil is batting .339/.398/.441 on the road this year...His .339 average is seventh in the majors.

**REDS-METS NOTES:** The Mets have won their last two series at Great American Ball Park...The Mets are 36-21 all-time at the ballpark.

**MARTE PARTAY:** Over the last seven games, Starling Marte is 10-26 (.385) with four runs, three doubles, two home runs, three RBI, a walk, a steal with a .448 OBP, a .731 SLG and a 1.179 OPS...He is one double away from 250 for his career... In 48 games since May 1, Starling Marte is batting .311 (59-190) with 38 runs, 14 doubles, three triples, seven home runs, 24 RBI, nine walks, five steals with a .355 OBP, a .526 SLG and an .881 OPS.

**STRIKE THAT:** The Mets have struck out 10 or more in a game 39 times this year... That is the second-most in the majors...Only the White Sox (40) and Braves (40) have recorded more such games...Overall, the Mets rank third in the majors with 735 strikeouts this season...On the other side of the ball, the Mets have struck out 596 times this season...That is the fifth-fewest times in the majors and the second-fewest times in the Senior Circuit.

**HURTS DONUT:** The Mets have been plunked a MLB-leading 53 times this year... The Mets have been hit 287 times since the start of the 2019 season...That is first in the majors in that span...Since 2019, Mark Canha has been plunked 63 times, which is the second-most in the majors...Pete Alonso ranks sixth with 46 HBP, while Starling Marte is seventh with 45 HBP and Jeff McNeil is tied for ninth at 37 HBP.

**OUCH:** Brandon Nimmo has been hit by 49 pitches in his career...That is the second-most HBP in team history...Pete Alonso is fourth with 46 HBP...Michael Conforto is the franchise leader with 50 in his Mets career.

**MULTIPLICITY:** Pete Alonso has recorded 23 multi-hit games this year, which is tied with teammates Jeff McNeil and Starling Marte for the ninth-most in the National League...He has recorded 114 multi-hit games in his career...That places him 51st on the team's all-time list...Next up is Cliff Floyd who recorded 114 multi-hit games in his career.

**MV-PETE:** Pete Alonso became the third Mets player in team history to record 60 or more RBI before the All-Star break in multiple seasons...He joins Carlos Beltran (2006 and 2008) and David Wright (2006, 2008 and 2010)...The Mets record for most RBI in the first half is 74, accomplished by David Wright in 2006.

**LINSANE IN THE MEMBRANE:** Francisco Lindor has recorded 56 RBI in 78 games this year...Lindor did not record his 56th RBI until his 118th game last year on September 26...Lindor recorded a total of 63 RBI in 2021...Francisco Lindor set a franchise record with the most RBI by a shortstop before the All-Star break... José Reyes was the previous record holder, collecting 43 RBI before the 2008 Midsummer Classic.

**THE GAME OF RISP:** The Mets are second in the majors with a .271 average with runners in scoring position...They rank seventh in MLB with a .343 OBP...Jeff McNeil - .387 (24-62), Tomás Nido - .343 (12-35) and Pete Alonso - .315 (23-73) are all hitting .300 or better with RISP...Alonso leads the major leagues with 51 RBI in RISP situations...He has 10 home runs with runner(s) in scoring position this year, three more than any other hitter in the majors...Jeff McNeil's .387 average with RISP is seventh in the majors.

**FIVE DAYS UNTIL NO. 17:** On Saturday, July 9, 2022, the Mets will retire Keith Hernandez's uniform #17 prior to the Saturday, July 9 game vs. Miami...In anticipation of the event, the Mets are counting down 17 moments of Hernandez career with the Mets at metsheritage.com...Hernandez was elected to the Mets Hall of Fame in 1997, ranks second in team history in batting average (.297) and earned six Rawlings Gold Gloves with the Mets, the most in franchise history.

### WALKER NEWS & NOTES

**LAST TIME OUT:** Threw 7.1 scoreless innings against the Astros on June 29 at Citi Field...Was tied for his longest start as a member of the Mets (Also: 9/29/21 vs. MIA)...Was his longest start without allowing a run since September 13, 2016 when he threw a complete game shutout against the Angels with the Mariners...Finished the month of June 3-2 with a 2.63 ERA (11 earned runs/37.2 innings).

**NO FLY ZONE:** Walker has allowed just three home runs in 72.2 innings this season, good for a 0.37 HR/9 ratio...That ranks third in the majors and first in the NL among pitchers with at least 70.0 innings...Over his last four starts, Walker has not allowed a home run totaling 30.2 innings, his third longest streak without giving up a long ball... In five starts from May 12-June 2, Walker had not yielded a long ball, totaling 29.2 innings...The streak ended after he allowed a leadoff home run to Jurickson Profar on June 7.

**LUCKY 13:** Through 13 starts this season, Walker is 6-2 with a 2.72 ERA (22 earned runs/72.2 innings)...His six wins are tied for the most with the 2017 and 2021 seasons in Walker's career through his first 13 starts...His 2.35 ERA (19 earned runs/72.2 innings) in 2021 was his best total through his first 13 starts of the season...He is the only starting pitcher to allow five or fewer home runs through their first 13 starts over the last two seasons.

**VS. CINCINNATI:** Tonight, Walker will make his second career start against the Reds...Walker's lone start against the Reds came on July 8, 2017 as a member of the Diamondbacks at Chase Field...In that start, Walker took the loss after allowing five runs in 5.0 innings with three walks and four strikeouts.

**SPLIT-FINGER SUCCESS:** In 13 starts this season, Walker has used his splitter just under 30 percent of the time and has held opposing hitters a .151 (16-106) batting average in at-bats ending in the pitch...32 of Walker's 52 strikeouts this season have come via the splitter.

**FEW Ks, THAT'S OK:** Through 13 starts this season, Walker has a K/9 rate of 6.44 and an ERA of 2.72...Michael Wacha (2.69 ERA, 6.40 K/9) is the only other pitcher with an ERA under 3.00 with a lower strikeout rate (min. 10 starts).

**ROAD IMPROVEMENT:** In seven road starts this season, Walker is 4-2 with a 3.30 ERA (16 earned runs/43.2 innings)...Last season, Walker went 3-7 with a 5.82 ERA (44 earned runs/68.0 innings) in 14 road starts.

**LIMITING LEFTIES:** Since 2021, Walker has held left-handed batters to .205 (72-352) average, the seventh-best mark among right-handed pitchers in that span (min. 300 LHB faced)...Since his debut year, 2013, Walker has limited left-handed batters to a .231 (339-1469) average, 12th-best among right-handed arms during that span (min. 1,500 LHB faced).

**DEFENSE WINS CHAMPIONSHIPS:** Last season, Walker tied a career-high with four pickoffs, tied for the fifth-most in the majors and the most among right-handed pitchers that year...The righty also posted a career-high 33 assists, which ranked second in the National League and third in the majors, as well as a career-high 16 putouts, which tied for 10th in the NL...This season, Walker owns the major league-lead with three pickoffs.

### TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP MAX SCHERZER (5-1, 2.54)

**LAST TIME OUT:** Left his start on May 18 vs. St. Louis with a right oblique strain in the sixth inning...Was placed on the Injured list the following day...Allowed two runs (one earned) over 5.2 innings with four strikeouts and no walks.

**SEEING REDS:** His 1.84 ERA against the Reds is tied for the ninth-lowest mark among all pitchers with at least 50.0 innings pitched against the franchise since the earned run became official in 1913...His 0.33 ERA at Great American Ball Park is the lowest among all pitchers with at least 25.0 innings pitched at the venue.
