LAST TIME OUT: Threw 7.1 scoreless innings against the Astros on June 29 at Citi Field...Was tied for his longest start as a member of the Mets (Also: 9/29/21 vs. MIA)...Was his longest start without allowing a run since September 13, 2016 when he threw a complete game shutout against the Angels with the Mariners...Finished the month of June 3-2 with a 2.63 ERA (11 earned runs/37.2 innings).

NO FLY ZONE: Walker has allowed just three home runs in 72.2 innings this season, good for a $0.37 \mathrm{HR} / 9$ ratio...That ranks third in the majors and first in the NL among pitchers with at least 70.0 innings...Over his last four starts, Walker has not allowed a home run totaling 30.2 innings, his third longest streak without giving up a long ball...
