**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets won 12-6 yesterday vs. the Yankees...It was their fourth straight victory and New York improved to 4-1 on the homestand... The Mets hit the road for the final time before the All-Star break, heading to Baltimore (three games) and Kansas City (three games).

**SUBWAY SERIES:** The Mets are 3-2 in the Subway Series this year...They went 4-0 in the Subway Series in 2024, sweeping both two-game series...The last time the Mets swept the Yankees in a three-game series was in 2008 at Yankee Stadium (3-0)...The last time the Mets swept a three-game series at home was in 2004 (3-0) at Shea Stadium...The Mets have won five straight home games vs. the Yankees, the longest streak in team history.

**IN THE CITI:** New York is 33-13 at Citi Field in 2025...The .717 home winning percentage is the best in the majors...New York's 33-13 mark after 46 home games is the best in franchise history.

**BRANDON BASHES SLAMS:** Brandon Nimmo has three grand slams this year, tying a franchise record with John Milner (1976), Robin Ventura (1999), Mike Piazza (2000) and Carlos Beltrán (2006)...Joins Milner (6/26-7/1/76), Ventura (5/20/99 G1 and G2) and Beltrán (7/16-18/06) as the only Mets to hit two grand slams in a span of four or fewer games...Courtesy of *Elias*...Is the fourth Met to hit a grand slam in the Subway Series...The others are Piazza (6/9/00 at NYY), Carlos Delgado (6/27/08 G1 at NYY) and Curtis Granderson (8/17/17 vs. NYY)...Joins Eugenio Suárez as the only player in the majors with three grand slams this season.

**WE FOUND NIMMO:** Brandon Nimmo's 18 home runs are his most prior to the All-Star Break in any season...Over the last 37 games, Nimmo is batting .313 (45-144) with 22 runs, seven doubles, 10 homers, 25 RBI, 10 walks, eight steals and a .935 OPS...Nimmo scored his 552nd career run on Juan Soto's home run on Friday...He passed Carlos Beltrán for sole possession for place eighth place in franchise history...Five of Nimmo's last seven hits have gone for extra-bases (3 HR, 2 2B).

**ONLY JUAN:** Since May 30, Juan Soto leads the majors with a .483 OBP, 30 walks, and a 1.211 OPS...He is also tied for first in the majors with 31 runs scored, third with a .728 slugging percentage and tied for thrd with 13 homers during that span.

**JUAN-DERFUL:** Overall, Soto leads the majors with 72 walks, leads the NL in times on base (157), is second in the NL with a .401 OBP and 65 runs scored, and seventh in the NL with a .915 OPS and 21 homers.

**HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR:** Congrats to Francisco Lindor who was named the National League's starting shortstop in the All-Star Game...Lindor will make his first trip to the Midsummer Classic as a member of the Mets and his fifth overall after making four straight AL All-Star teams with Cleveland from 2016-19... He will become the third Mets shortstop to start for the National League, joining Buddy Harrelson (1971) and José Reyes (2007). Reyes was named a starter in 2011, but was injured and didn't start...The last time the Mets had a fan-elected starter was in 2016 when Yoenis Céspedes started in the outfield.

**SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT:** According to *Elias*, Francisco Lindor has hit 257 home runs and stolen 197 bases as a shortstop...Only two players in major league history had 200/200 (HR/SB) as a shortstop - Derek Jeter (255 HR, 351 SB) and Jimmy Rollins (229 HR, 469 SB).

**YANKEES-METS NOTES:** The Mets are 9-2 against the Yankees at Citi Field since 2021...The have outscored the Bronx Bombers, 59-34 during that span.

**THE FUTURE IS BRIGHT:** Congrats to RHP Jonah Tong and OF Carson Benge have been selected to participate in the 2025 All Star Futures Game on Saturday, July 12 at Truist Park in Atlanta...Tong, the Mets #4 prospect and #92 prospect in MLB Pipeline's Top 100 prospects leads all of minor league baseball with 115 strikeouts and is second in the minors with a 1.73 ERA in 14 starts.... He is also second in MiLB and first in all of Double-A with a .137 opponent's batting average, while his strikeout percentage (K%) of 40.5% is second in all of MiLB...Tong was selected by the Mets in the seventh round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Georgia Premier Academy...Benge, the Mets #3 prospect and #81 prospect in MLB Pipeline's Top 100, was promoted to Binghamton on June 23 after starting the year with High-A Brooklyn...Benge slashed .302/.417/.480 with an .897 OPS in 60 games with the Cyclones...He was selected by the Mets with the 19th overall pick in the 2024 draft out of Oklahoma State.

**ED, EDD AND EDDY:** Edwin Díaz has recorded 18 saves in 19 chances...The one blown save in LA on June 2, Díaz picked up the win as the Mets rallied for a 4-3 win in 10 innings...He is tied for fourth in the NL and tied for eighth in the majors with 18 saves...He has not allowed a run in 23 of his last 24 games dating back to April 26 with 36 strikeouts covering 24.0 innings.

**JEFF McNEIL:** Is batting .275 (30-109) with 13 runs scored, five doubles, seven homers, 18 RBI and a .855 OPS over his last 31 games dating to May 27.

**20 FOR THE POLAR BEAR:** Pete Alonso hit his 20th home run yesterday...It was the sixth time in his career he's had 20 or more homers in a season, tying Mike Piazza and David Wright for the second-most such seasons in franchise history...Darryl Strawberry is first with eight seasons with 20 or more homes.

**DYNAMITC DUOS:** Juan Soto and Pete Alonso became the third pair of teammates to each reach the 20-home run plateau through the team's first 90 games...They joined David Wright, Carlos Delgado and Carlos Beltrán in 2006 and Darryl Strawberry and Howard Johnson in 1987.

**100 SB:** Yesterday, Francisco Lindor picked up his 100th stolen base as a Met becoming the 12th player in franchise history to reach the milestone...He is the sixth player to accumulate 100+ home runs and 100+ stolen bases as a Met...The others are Darryl Strawberry, Howard Johnson, Carlos Beltrán, David Wright and José Reyes...He is also one stolen base away from 200 in his career.

- Will open today's game vs. the Yankees...Is the eighth start of his career and first since August 13, 2019 at Chicago-AL with Houston (2.0 IP, 5 H, 3 R)...All seven of his previous starts came from 2016-19 and he combined to go 1-4 with a 4.40 ERA (14 ER/28.2 IP), nine walks and 23 strikeouts in those games...Allowed two earned runs or less in six of those seven starts and one or zero runs in three.
- Recorded the final out in the seventh inning on July 5 vs. the Yankees (0.1 IP, H)...Has been scoreless in each of his last four outings with the team (since May 31).
- Was recalled from Triple-A Syracuse prior to the game on July 4...It marks his fourth stint with the club this season (also: 4/30-5/1, 5/30-6/2 and 6/12-24).
- On June 22 at Philadelphia, tossed a hitless inning of relief (K)...Was his first time pitching on consecutive days since June 20-21, 2024 with Tampa...Tossed a perfect ninth inning on June 21 at Philadelphia...Made his first appearance vs. the Phillies and has now faced all 30 Major League teams at least once in his career.
- He made his Mets debut on April 30 vs. Arizona, allowing two earned runs over 2.0 innings in relief (2 H, BB, 2 K)...Was his longest Major League appearance since June 21, 2024 at Pittsburgh with Tampa Bay (also: 2.0 IP).
- Last pitched for the Syracuse Mets on July 2 (G1) at Worcester and allowed two earned runs over 1.1 innings in his first start this season (24th appearance)...He allowed two hits, including a home run and recorded a strikeout...He has spent the majority of the season with Syracuse, posting a 4.32 ERA (12 ER/25.0 IP) with four walks and 17 strikeouts in 24 games (one start)...17 of his 24 appearances have been scoreless...Prior to his game on 6/17, he had posted a 2.42 ERA and a .197 opponents' BA in 21 games with Syracuse.
- Has faced the Yankees 14 times in his career, going 1-1 with four holds and a 4.20 ERA (7 ER/15.0 IP) in those games...Has not allowed an earned run in 10of those 14 games.
- In his Major League career, has held left-handed batters to a .211 average (156-738) compared to a .246 average (191-775) against right-handed hitters.
- Over parts of 10 seasons with the Houston Astros (2016-20), Arizona Diamondbacks (2021-22), Philadelphia Phillies (2022), Los Angeles Angels (2023), Tampa Bay Rays (2023-24) and the Mets (2025), has combined to go 27-22 with a 3.97 ERA (179 ER/405.1 IP), 112 walks and 420 strikeouts in 308 games (seven starts)...Was originally drafted by the Chicago White Sox in the 25th round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft out of California State Fullerton...Was signed by the Mets as a minor league free agent on October 31, 2024.
- Was an All-Star and World Series Champion in 2017 with the Astros.

- Earned his fourth win of the season after tossing a scoreless seventh inning on July 4 vs. New York-AL (BB, 3 K)...Was his fifth appearance this season recording at least three strikeouts and his first since June 3 at Los Angeles-NL.
- Was used as an opener for the third time this season and threw a scoreless first inning on July 2 vs. Milwaukee (G2)...Has not allowed a hit over 4.0 scoreless innings as a starter this season.
- On June 28 at Pittsburgh, allowed a season-high-tying four earned runs over 0.1 IP (2 H, 2 BB, K)...Gave up an RBI single to Ke'Bryan Hayes in eighth inning and left the game with the bases loaded, all runners eventually scored...Allowed four or more runs for the fourth time in his career and second time this year (also: June 19 at ATL)...Was also tied for his shortest outing of the season (also 5/3-G1 at St. Louis and June 24 vs. ATL).
- Has been scoreless over 15.0 innings against Interleague opponents this season, holding American League batters to a .087 average (4-46)...Has faced the Yankees three times this season (5/17-18 and 7/4) and has combined to throw 3.2 scoreless innings (H, 3 BB, 5 K).
- Prior to his outing on June 19, had not allowed more than one earned run in each of his first 30 outings of the season...Has allowed a total of 11 earned runs in three of his last six appearances (5.1 IP)...Allowed 13 earned runs over nine appearances in the month of June (13.50 ERA) after allowing just five earned runs over 25 combined appearances in March, April and May (1.34 ERA).
- This season, has gone 4-2 with one save, 10 holds and a 3.65 ERA (18 ER/44.1 IP) through 36 appearances (three as an opener), holding batters to a .189 average (28-148)...Right-handed hitters have batted .163 (14-86) against him compared to a .226 average against left-handers (14-62)...With runners on base, has held batters to a .130 average (9-69)...His 1.11 ERA through his first 24 games of the season was the eighth-best in franchise history through as many games.
- Has stranded 21 of 24 inherited runners this season...His inherited runners scored percentage (12.5%) is the eighth -best mark in the majors and the second-best in the NL among qualified relievers.
- 12 of his appearances this season have been for four or more outs...11 of those appearances have been scoreless, which is the sixth-most in the among Major League relievers...Has posted 10 scoreless relief appearances of 1.2 innings or more which is tied for the second-most such outings among Major League relievers...His seven scoreless outings of 2.0+ innings are tied for the fifth-most and he is one of eight relievers to post such numbers.
