THE NL CHAMPS: The 2023 National League Champion D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth ('99, '01, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23) last season.

LAST GAME: The D-backs lost 7-8 vs. Blue Jays on July 14.

- The D-backs overcame a 7-run deficit to tie the game with 7 runs in the fifth inning.
- Ketel Marte went 3-for-5, highlighted by his fourth career grand slam in the fifth inning (first since 2021).
