TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners conclude their final road trip of the regular season with the last of 3 games against the Texas Rangers (0-2)...Seattle opened the trip with a 3-game sweep of the Oakland Athletics... following today's finale, the Mariners return home for the final homestand of the regular season, with 3 games against the Houston Astros (Sept. 25-27) and 4 more games vs. Texas (Sept. 28-Oct. 1)...today's game will be televised live on ROOT SPORTS with Dave Sims and Mike Blowers on the call...the game will also be broadcast live on AM 770 KTTH and Mariners.com with Rick Rizzs and Aaron Goldsmith.
ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners dropped last night's game to the Rangers by a 2-0 score...the Mariners are 21-16 over their last 37 games, 29-18 over their last 47, 31-19 over their last 50, 34-20 over their last 54, 37-22 over their last 59 and 46-28 over their last 74 contests...the Mariners are $65-25$ when scoring at least 4 runs and 19-45 when scoring 3-or-fewer...the Mariners are 41-33 at T-Mobile Park and 43-37 on the road this season...they are 28-26 in day games and 56-44 at night.

- Programming Note - Today's game will be broadcast live on AM 770 KTTH.
- Since July 1 - Seattle is 46-28 (.622) since July 1, 2nd-best record in the AL over that span and 3rdbest in the Majors, trailing the Dodgers (.671/49-24) and Orioles (.640/48-27).
- Ric Flair - Over his last 6 starts, Bryan Woo is $3-1$ with a 2.27 ERA ( 8 ER, 31.2 IP) with 11 walks and 28 strikeouts...Seattle owns a 5-1 record over Woo's last 6 outings ( $8 / 3-c$ ).
- The Power Generation - The Mariners have hit 201 home runs this season...Seattle has hit 200+ home runs in a season 8 times in franchise history: 1996-99, 2016-17, '19 \& '23.
- Déjà vu? - With a win today, the Mariners would finish 2023 with a 44-37 (.543) road record for the 3rd consecutive season...Seattle finished both its 2021 and 2022 road slates with a 44-37 record.
POSTSEASON PICTURE...the Mariners have 8 regular season games remaining ( 1 at TEX, 3 vs. HOU, 4 vs. TEX)...Seattle enters play today 2.0 games back of the AL West Division lead and a half-game back of the 3rd and final AL Wild Card spot...the Astros have 7 games remaining ( 1 vs . KC, 3 at SEA, 3 at ARI), the Rangers have 8 games remaining ( $\mathbf{1}$ vs. SEA, 3 at LAA, 4 at SEA) and Toronto has 7 games remaining ( 1 at TB, 3 vs. NYY, 3 vs. TB).
ON THE MOUND...the Mariners pitching staff ranks 1 st in MLB in ERA (3.72), 1st in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.52), T-1st in walks-per-9 innings (2.57), 3rd in WHIP (1.19), 2nd in FIP (3.84) and 2nd in fWAR (20.3) this season...Seattle's 16 shutouts thrown this season are a franchise record...the Mariners are the only team in the Majors to have 3 pitchers with 17+ quality starts this season...Luis Castillo (18), George Kirby (18) and Logan Gilbert (17) make up the trio...Seattle pitchers age 26-or-vounger lead the Majors in fWAR (14.1) by a wide margin over next-closest Cleveland (9.3) and Los Angeles-NL (9.2).

THE J-ROD SHOW: AL MVP CANDIDATE? ...Julio Rodríguez leads American League outfielders in fWAR (6.0) by a full "win", ranking ahead of Luis Robert Jr.-CWS (5.0) and Aaron Judge-NYY (4.8)...among AL outfielders with at least 400 plate appearances, Julio ranks 1st in hits (177), 2nd in stolen bases (36), 5th in batting average (.283), 4th in home runs (31), 2nd in runs scored (98), 3rd in RBI (100), 6th in slugging percentage (.495), 6th in OPS (.836), 4th in OPS + (132), T-2nd in doubles (36), 1 st in total bases (310) and 2nd in extra-base hits (69)...in 2022, Julio won an AL Silver Slugger Award in his rookie season, alongside outfielders Aaron Judge-NYY and Mike Trout-LAA
36, 36, 100...Julio is the 4th player age 22-or-younger with $36+$ doubles, $36+$ stolen bases and $100+$ RBI in a season...he joins Denny Lyons for the 1887 Philadelphia Athletics of the American Association, Joe Kelley for the 1894 Baltimore Orioles of the National League and Ty Cobb for the 1908 Detroit Tigers.
BIG DUMPER: SILVER IN HIS FUTURE?...Cal Raleigh leads Maior Leaque catchers in home runs (30) a year after he led MLB catchers in homers (27) in 2022 and set a Mariners record for most homers by a catcher in a season...the 26 -year-old backstop has been the best catcher in the American League by fWAR (5.2) this season, ranking ahead of Adley Rutschman-BAL (4.3) and Jonah Heim-TEX (4.2).
CRAWFORD'S CAREER YEAR...J.P. Crawford this season has set career-highs in home runs (16) and RBI (57) and is on pace to set additional highs in on-base percentage (.378), slugging (.427) and OPS (.805)...J.P. ranks 4th in the American League in walks (88) and 4th in OBP.

I LOVE GOLLLDDD...Julio Rodríguez's 12 Outs Above Average rank T-2nd among American League outfielders with Kevin Kiermaier-TOR, trailing only Luis Robert Jr.-CWS (13)...Eugenio Suárez' 9 OAA rank 2nd among AL third basemen, trailing only Maikel Garcia-KC (12)...Cal Raleigh's 22 catcher caught stealings rank 2nd among AL catchers, trailing only Shea Langeliers-OAK (23).
IF YOU SMELL WHAT LA PIEDRA IS COOKING...Luis Castillo has been one of the best pitchers in the American League this season...Castillo is 14-7 with a 3.06 ERA ( 64 ER, 188.1 IP) with 50 walks and 207 strikeouts in 31 starts...the righty has gone $5.0+$ innings in all 31 of his outings...Castillo has gone $6.0+$ innings in 22 of them, recording 18 quality starts....he is the 8th Mariners pitcher (and 3rd right-hander) to tally 200+ strikeouts in a season in franchise history...among AL pitchers this season, Castillo ranks in the top-5 in ERA (4th), wins (T-3rd), strikeouts (4th), opponent batting average (1st, .211) and WHIP (3rd, 1.05). JULIO \& GEORGE: A DYNAMIC DUO...Julio Rodríguez has produced 6.0 FanGraphs Wins Above Replacement this season, 3rd-most in the American League behind Shohei Ohtani-LAA (6.6) and Corey Seager-TEX (6.1)...George Kirby's 3.9 fWAR places him 7th among AL pitchers...the second-year stalwarts produced 5.4 and 3.0 fWAR, respectively, during their 2022 rookie campaigns...Rodríguez and Kirby became the first position player/pitcher rookie duo to accumulate $5.0+$ and $3.0+$ fWAR, respectively, as teammates since Alvin Davis and Mark Langston did it for the 1984 Mariners...Rodríguez and Kirby are the first teammate duo in Major League history to follow up those rookie performances with 5.0+ and 3.0+ fWAR, respectively, in their follow-up season of their rookie campaigns.

- The 23-year-old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make his 17th Major League start and 2nd career start against Tex as.
- Selected by Seattle in the 6th round (174th overall) of the 2021 MLB First-Year Player Draft out of Cal Poly University.. signed by Mariners scout Chris Hom.
- Spent 3 seasons at Cal Poly before being drafted, making 3 appearances (6GS) for the Mustangs.
- Did not pitch in 2021 while recovering from right elbow sur gery.
LAST TIME OUT...W\#4 in his 16th Major League start at Oakland, tossed 5.0 scoreless innings and allowed 3 hits and 4 walks while striking out 8...Woo's last two starts have resulted on Mariners shutouts.

FINDING HIS RHYTHM...over his last 6 starts (8/3-c) Woo has gone 3-1 and owns a 2.27 ERA (8 ER, 31.2 IP) with 11 walks, home run allowed and 28 strikeouts. over that span opponents are batting just .186 (21x113) against him and he has given up just 4 extra-base hits...in these 6 games Woo has made 2 starts of 6.0 innings and has recorded 3 scorless out ings.

DIVISIONAL RIVALS...is set to make his 8th start against an AL West opponent and his 2nd start against Texas...over his previous 7 starts Woo owns a 2.80 ERA (11 ER, 35.1 IP) with 10 walks and 40 strikeouts...his 2.80 ERA against the AL West ranks 2 nd among Mariners starters this season...he trails only George Kirby who owns a 2.77 ERA (12 ER, 39.0 IP) against he AL West this season

IN THE ZONE...has allowed 26 walks while striking out 82 batters in 16 starts...he currently has a 3.15 strikeout-towalk ratio...Woo also owns a 9.1 strikeouts-per-nine which ranks 3rd on team behind Luis Castillo (9.9) and Logan Gilbert (9.2) Woo's 2.9 walks-per-nine rank 5th among Mariners starters this season.

AMONG MARINERS GREATS...Woo's 76 strikeouts are the 6th most in Mariners history in a pitcher's first 15 career starts, he trails Michael Pineda (94), Félix Hernández (94), Logan Gilbert (84), George Kirby (81) and Roenis Elías (80).
IN THE WIN COLUMN...Woo earned his 1st career win on $6 / 22$ against New YorkAL...he carried a no hitter into the 6th inning before giving up a 1 -out single to Gelyber Torres...he became the 5th Mariners pitcher this season to carry a no-hitter into the 6th inning (also: Bryce Miller, Logan Gilbert, Luis Castillo, Easton McGee).
CAREER-HIGH PUNCHIES...recorded a new career high in strikeouts in his outing against the White Sox on $6 / 16$ with 9 ...his Minor League career high is 11 which he achieved on 8/19/22 against Vancouver.
PROSPECTING...became the 2nd top 10 Mariners prospect to debut this season... teammate Bryce Miller, who was ranked as the Mariners 2nd overall prospect by MLB.com, also debuted earlier this season.

POW POW...was named Mariners Minor League Pitcher of the Month in April and May while pitching for Double-A Arkansas...Woo was 0-0 with a 1.59 ERA (3 ER, $17.0 \mathrm{IP})$ with 27 strikeouts and 8 walks in 4 April starts and was $3-2$ with a 2.33 ERA ( $7 \mathrm{ER}, 27.0$ IP) with 32 strikeouts and 8 walks in 5 starts in May.
AWARDS...won 2 League Pitcher of the Week Awards in his minor league career... Northwest League Pitcher of the Week on $8 / 21 / 22$ and Texas League Pitcher of the Week on 5/14/23.
