RHP Jameson Taillon (2-5, 5.38 ERA) vs. RHP Braxton Ashcraft (9-4, 3.95 ERA)

THE PIRATES: have dropped each of the first two games of this six-game homestand vs. Chicago-NL (0-2, Friday-Sunday) and Arizona (Monday-Wednesday), including an 11-0 loss on Saturday at PNC Park...Went 3-3 on their recent six-game road trip to Cleveland (2-1, July 18-19) and New York-AL (1-2, July 20-22)...Are in the third game of a stretch of 20 straight games against National League opponents (11 of their 14 games from July 24-August 6 are vs. the National League Central), with their next interleague game scheduled for August 14 vs. Boston...Are in the third day of a stretch of 17 straight days with a game, with their next off day scheduled for August 10...Have hit 132 home runs after hitting 117 home runs last season...Have hit 71 home runs at home (their single-season record at PNC Park [since 2001] is 81, set in 2003)...Have the most hits (946) in all of Major League Baseball...Have scored the second-most runs (545) in all of Major League Baseball, trailing only Washington (574), after scoring 583 runs last season...Have struck out the third-most batters (970) in all of Major League Baseball, behind only Philadelphia (1027) and Milwaukee (1012)...Have recorded the eighth-best run differential (+39) in MLB.

DIAMOND FACTS: Pittsburgh will host Arizona for three games (Monday-Wednesday) this week...The Pirates have won three straight series against the Diamondbacks...They won two of three games from May 26-28, 2025 at Chase Field, won two of three games from July 25-27, 2025 at PNC Park and won two of three games this year from May 5-7 at Chase Field...Pittsburgh has won four straight series against Arizona just twice since the Diamondbacks entered the league prior to the 1998 season...The Pirates also did that in four straight series from May 16, 2003-May 8, 2005 and in four straight series from April 24, 2015-May 26, 2016.

BEAT 'EM BUC(KS): Pirates pitchers struck out a season-high-tying 16 batters on Saturday vs. Chicago-NL (also March 29 at New York-NL)...It was their most in a home game since May 23, 2025 vs. Milwaukee (also 16), their most in a nine-inning game since August 20, 2023 at Minnesota (also 16) and their most in a nine-inning home game since September 27, 2019 vs. Cincinnati (also 16)...The Pirates have at least 10 strikeouts in six of eight games since the All-Star break...Their 87 strikeouts since the All-Star break are sixth in Major League Baseball, behind Cleveland (99), Detroit (90), New York-AL (90), Atlanta (89) and Houston (89).

THANK YINZ FOR COMING AHT: The paid attendance of 39,105 fans for Saturday night's game between Pittsburgh and Chicago (NL) marked the largest crowd for a game at PNC Park since July 20, 2024 vs. Philadelphia (39,114 fans)...It was also the largest crowd for a regular-season game at PNC Park (excluding Home Openers and games against Philadelphia) since August 7, 2015 vs. Los Angeles-NL (39,404 fans)...It was also the fifth crowd of at least 39,000 fans for a game between the Pirates and Cubs in PNC Park history (they have played 216 games here)...Pittsburgh drew 39,235 fans on July 9, 2011, 39,078 fans on April 1, 2013 (Home Opener), 39,833 fans on March 31, 2014 (Home Opener) and 40,889 fans on October 7, 2015 (National League Wild Card Game).

GOOD AS GONZO: Nick Gonzales had an infield single in the sixth inning on Saturday vs. Chicago (NL), extending his hitting streak to nine straight games (since July 12 vs. Milwaukee)...He has gone 14-for-40 (.350) with four doubles, two home runs, six RBI, a .950 OPS and eight runs scored during the streak...Gonzales' .311 batting average (116-for-373) this year ranks fourth in Major League Baseball, behind Miami's Otto Lopez (.331), San Francisco's Luis Arraez (.326) and Houston's Yordan Alvarez (.325).

47 BUCS: Ron Marinaccio tossed 1.1 innings of relief in his Pirates debut on Saturday vs. Chicago (NL), while Shawn Ross played the ninth inning at first base and flew out in his first Major League at-bat (ninth inning) during his Major League debut on Saturday night against the Cubs...The Pirates have now used 47 different players this season (23 position players & 24 pitchers).

JAKE RAKES: Jake Mangum singled on Saturday vs. Chicago (NL) and is now 14-for-43 (.326) with six RBI and an .821 OPS in his last 11 games (since July 9 vs. Atlanta)...Mangum's .324 July average (23-for-71) is tied with Los Angeles' Freddie Freeman for the ninth-best mark in the National League...They rank behind only Arizona's Gabriel Moreno (.387), Washington's CJ Abrams (.382), Nick Gonzales (.377), Curtis Mead [traded to Boston] (.367), Colorado's Hunter Goodman (.345), Milwaukee's Garrett Mitchell (.333), Atlanta's Drake Baldwin (.329) and Chicago's Pete Crow-Armstrong (.328).

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the second round of the 2018 Draft.

AS OF LATE: Ashcraft lost an 8-5 decision after allowing a career-high eight runs (seven earned) on a career-high-tying nine hits (also June 6 at Atlanta) and a walk in 3.0 innings of work on July 20 at New York (AL)...He has gone 2-1 with an 8.24 ERA (19.2ip/18er) and 23 strikeouts over his last four starts (since June 29 at Philadelphia).

SUNDAY FUNDAY: Ashcraft is 2-0 with a 1.37 ERA (19.2ip/3er) and 25 strikeouts (two walks) in three Sunday starts, with all three starts coming in sweep-clinching wins for Pittsburgh...He won an 8-2 decision after allowing one run and striking out eight batters over 6.0 innings on April 5 vs. Baltimore...Ashcraft had a no-decision after striking out six batters (two walks issued) and not allowing a run over a career-high 7.2 innings in the Pirates' 1-0 win on May 3 vs. Cincinnati...He also won a 9-3 decision after allowing two runs and striking out a career-high 11 batters over 6.0 innings on May 31 vs. Minnesota...His Sunday ERA ranks fifth in MLB (minimum 19.2 innings), behind only Washington's Foster Griffin (0.72), Tampa Bay's Drew Rasmussen (0.74), San Francisco's Logan Webb (1.17) and Los Angeles (NL)' Yoshinobu Yamamoto (1.27).

HEY NOW: Ashcraft was named to his first career All-Star team this season, joining Paul Skenes as Pittsburgh's representatives (he replaced Skenes on the roster)...Skenes (130) and Ashcraft (128) became just the second pair of Pirates teammates to both have at least 115 strikeouts prior to the All-Star break in a single season (the first All-Star Game was held in 1933), joining Francisco Liriano (125) and Gerrit Cole (116) in 2015...They were also only the third pair of Pittsburgh starters to be named to the All-Star team in the same season, along with Bob Friend and Vernon Law (1960), as well as A.J. Burnett and Cole (2015)...Ashcraft's 128 strikeouts prior to the All-Star break were the sixth-most in Pirates history, behind Bob Veale (137) in 1965, Veale (134) in 1966, Skenes (131) in 2025, Skenes (130) this year and teammate Mitch Keller (129) in 2023.

TWICE AS NICE: Ashcraft has made multiple starts where he recorded at least 10 strikeouts and did not issue a walk...He struck out 11 batters on May 31 vs. Minnesota and 10 batters on June 24 vs. Seattle...Ashcraft became the only Pittsburgh pitcher during the Modern Era (since 1901) to post multiple such starts during a single season.

MR. CONSISTENT: Ashcraft pitched at least 6.0 innings, struck out at least five batters and walked two or fewer batters in six consecutive starts from May 3-May 31...He became one of five Pirates (six instances) during the Modern Era (since 1901) to do that, joining Rick Reuschel (six starts, September 4-October 1, 1985), Jon Lieber (six starts, June 15-July 13, 1998), Gerrit Cole (six starts, April 14-May 11, 2017 and six starts, July 30-August 26, 2017) and Paul Skenes (seven starts, June 11-July 23, 2024).

FIRST THINGS FIRST: Ashcraft did not allow a first-inning run in any of his first 20 Major League starts (from last year on June 23 at Milwaukee to May 31 vs. Minnesota)...The streak was snapped on June 6 at Atlanta (allowed two runs in the first inning)...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, he was one of three Major League pitchers in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to allow zero first-inning runs in at least each of his first 20 career starts, along with Rollie Sheldon (20, 1961) & Dennis Rasmussen (22, 1983-84).

PITCH EFFICIENCY: Ashcraft had a career-high 11 strikeouts (issued zero walks) while throwing just 80 pitches over 6.0 innings on May 31 vs. Minnesota...He became the 12th Pirate (13th instance) in the Modern Era (since 1901) to have at least 11 strikeouts and zero walks in an outing, the first since Mitch Keller (13k) on May 14, 2023 at Baltimore...Ashcraft also became the 11th Major Leaguer (since pitch tracking began in 1988) to have at least 11 strikeouts and zero walks in an outing of 80 or fewer pitches, the first since Tampa Bay's Ryan Pepiot (12k, 76 pitches) on Sept. 18, 2024 vs. Boston.
