ST. LOUIS CARDINALS (52-48) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (51-49)

July 23, 2024 at PNC Park, Pittsburgh, PA – 6:40 EDT – GAME #101/HOME #51 RHP LANCE LYNN (5-4, 4.39 ERA) vs. RHP PAUL SKENES (6-0, 1.90 ERA)

THE PIRATES:...beat the Cardinals 2-1 in the opener of their three-game series last night...Have the second-best record in all of MLB this month (Detroit has a league-best 12-5 record in July)...Are two games over .500 at 50-48 (a win tonight would put them at three games over .500 for the first time since 4/17 when the team was 11-8)...Have won 12 games in their last at-bat (the most since winning 13 games in the final at-bat of 2022)...Have gone 38-3 (.927 winning percentage)

games in their last at-bat (the most since winning 13 games in the final at-bat of 2022)...Have gone 38-3 (.927 winning percentage) when outhitting their opponents this season...Have drawn at least one walk in 65 straight games, which is the longest active streak in MLB (the longest streak for the season is 75 straight games by the Phillies from 4/15 to 7/9)...Have played in 33 one-run games, which are the second-most among National League teams behind the Cubs (35)...Have the fourth-most quality starts (47) in MLB behind the Mariners (61), Phillies (54) and Royals (52)...Have the fourth-best ERA (3.53) among all starting rotations in MLB behind the Phillies (3.24), Mariners (3.30) and Royals (3.45)...Rank second in all of MLB in stolen base percentage (83.3 percent) behind the Brewers (84.5 percent)...Have gone 12-2 on the 14 occasions the team has stolen multiple bases in a game this year...Have won nine straight and 12 of their last 13 games when scoring at least four runs...Have gone 17-2 since the beginning of June when scoring first in a game.

THE BATTLIN' BUCS: The Pirates have won seven of their last eight and nine of their last 11 games...During this 11-game stretch that began on July 8, the pitching staff's 2.94 ERA is the second-best in the National League and fifth-best in all of MLB...The only four teams with a lower ERA since July 8 are the Cubs (2.30), Mariners (2.56), Astros (2.73) and Royals (2.85)...The Pirates are also tied for the fourth-most runs scored (54) in MLB since July 8 along with the Mets...The only three teams to score more runs during that time are the Athletics (73), Tigers (66) and Reds (65).

NICKY G: Nick Gonzales' run-scoring single in the eighth inning last night was his third game-winning RBI of the month and eighth since being promoted from Triple-A on May 10...The Pirates are 17-6, including wins in six straight games, when Gonzales knocks in a run this season.

HISTORICALLY SPEAKING: Paul Skenes has won each of the first six decisions of his big league career, making him the first Pirates <u>starter</u> to accomplish that since Zach Duke also won each of his first six decisions in 2005...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the only Pirates <u>starting pitcher</u> to win each of his first seven decisions was Emil Yde from May 31 to August 3, 1924.

PAUL GETS THE CALL: Paul Skenes' six-game winning streak is tied for the longest active streak in MLB...The last Pirate to have a single-season winning streak longer than six games was southpaw Jeff Locke, who won eight straight decisions in 2013...The last Pirates righthander with a single-season winning streak longer than six games was Kevin Correia, who won seven straight from June 19 to August 8, 2012.

EIGHT IS GREAT: Andrew McCutchen is hitting .323 (10-for-31) with four doubles, a home run, one RBI and a .948 OPS during his current eight-game hitting streak...lt's the longest single-season hitting streak for McCutchen since also hitting safely in eight straight as a member of the Brewers from July 8-16, 2022...His last single-season hitting streak of more than eight games came in 2018 when he hit safely in 13 straight as a member of the Giants.

KEEPING UP WITH CUTCH'S MILESTONES: Andrew McCutchen ranks 11th in Pirates history coming into today with 1637 hits...He is one shy of tying Hall of Famer Fred Clarke for the 10th-most in team history.

CRUZ CONTROL: Oneil Cruz has knocked in 10 runs in his last six games and 15 in his first 14 games of this month, which is tied for the fifth-most in the National League...Cruz ranks 11th in the National League in batting (.321) this month and has four go-ahead RBI, which are tied for the third-most in the National League...The only two NL players with more go-ahead RBI this month are Teoscar Hernandez (six) and Brenton Doyle (five).

BORN: May 29, 2002

AGE: 22 SIGNED: Thru 2024

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected by the Pirates in the 1st round (No. 1) of the 2023 Draft.

STARTING OFF: The 22-year-old righthander is in his first Major League season with the Pirates...Began the season with Triple-A Indianapolis where he made seven starts, posting an 0.99 ERA (27.1ip/3er) with 45 strikeouts against just eight walks before being selected to the Major League roster on May 11...Was the No. 1 overall selection by the Pirates in the 2023 First-Year Player draft out of Louisiana State University.

LEAGUE LEADERS: Since making his Major League debut on May 11, Skenes ranks among the NL leaders in ERA (1st, 1.90), WHIP (1st, 0.92), strikeout-to-walk ratio (1st, 6.85), strikeouts per 9.0 IP (2nd, 12.08), strikeouts (2nd, 89) and opponents batting average (3rd, .202).

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: Skenes made the start for the National League at the 2024 All-Star Game in Arlington on July 16, tossing a scoreless first inning with three groundouts and a walk...He was the first Pirate to earn the starting honors in the All-Star Game since Jerry Reuss in 1975...Dock Ellis (1971), Bob Friend (1960 All-Star Game on July 11), Vernon Law (1960 All-Star Game on July 13) and Bob Friend (1956) are the only other Pirate pitchers to start in the Midsummer Classic.

 He was the fifth rookie pitcher to ever start the All-Star game, joining LAD Hideo Nomo in 1995, LAD Fernando Valenzuela in 1981, DET Mark Fidrych in 1976 and WSH Dave Stenhouse in 1962.

LAST TIME OUT: Prior to the All-Star Game, Skenes' last start came on July 11 at Milwaukee, where he threw 7.0 no-hit innings, walking one and matching his career high with 11 strikeouts...He was the seventh Pirates pitcher to ever leave a game with 7.0+ no-hit innings and the first since Francisco Cordova (9.0) did so in a combined, extra-inning no-hit bid on July 12, 1997.

- Skenes now has two outings of 6.0+ innings with no hits allowed this season, marking the 12th time since 1901 that a Major League pitcher recorded multiple such outings in a single season (third time in 2024)...Skenes also threw 6.0 hitless innings (with 11 strikeouts) on May 17 at Chicago-NL.
- He is just the third Major League player to record multiple outings of 6.0+ innings of hitless baseball with 10+ strikeouts in a single season, joining Nolan Ryan in 1973 and Max Scherzer in 2015.

STRIIIIIIKE THREE!: Skenes has 89 strikeouts through 11 career games, the fifth-most of all time to start a career and the most since Kerry Wood posted 98 punchouts through 11 games in 1998...Other players with more are Hideo Nomo in 1995 (96), Herb Score in 1955 (92) and Jose DeLeon in 1983 (91).

RACKING UP PUNCHIES: Skenes has recorded seven or more strikeouts in eight consecutive games dating back to the second game of a doubleheader in Detroit on May 29, surpassing the previous franchise record of seven set by Mitch Keller from April 27-May 31, 2023.

 In total, Skenes has recorded seven or more strikeouts in 10 of his 11 career outings, making him the first pitcher in Major League history to have 10 such outings in their first 11 career games.

HE'S A WINNER: Since being drafted first overall in the 2023 MLB Draft, Skenes has not lost a game as a professional (Major or Minor Leagues)...His last loss came on May 25, 2023 at Arkansas while pitching at LSU.

• Skenes has not exited a game while trailing yet in his Major League career.

BODY OF WORK: Is making his 12th career start and appearance today...He has allowed three earned runs or fewer in each of his 11 career outings, including two or fewer nine times and one or fewer seven times (three scoreless outings).

BRINGING THE HEAT: Skenes has thrown 75 pitches of 100.0+ mph this season, the most of any Major League starter in 2024 (next most has 36)...To date, Skenes has thrown three of the top-10 hardest thrown pitches by Major League starters this season and eight of the top 20...Prior to Angels flamethrower Ben Joyce making his first career start on June 16 and throwing nine pitches of 101.0+ mph, Skenes had previously thrown seven of the top-10 hardest thrown pitches by Major League starters this season

- Skenes has thrown 10 pitches of 101.0+ mph, including the hardest thrown pitch by a Pirates starter since data started being tracked in 2008 (101.9 on May 11 vs. Chicago-NL)...His 10 pitches at that velocity are tops in the Majors among starters in that category, ahead of LAA Ben Joyce (9).
- His 75 pitches of 100.0-plus mph are already the most ever by a Pirates starter since 2008, topping Gerrit Cole's 33 he had during his five years with the Bucs.

ON DECK: The 33-year-old Pérez will make his 16th start of the season tomorrow afternoon in the finale of this three-game series and six-game homestand...Had a no-decision (3.2ip/6r) in his last start in the team's 8-7 walkoff win Friday night against the Phillies...Missed 26 games while being on the 15-day injured list with a left groin muscle strain from 5/28 to 6/28...Has lost each of his last five decisions...Had a 2.55 ERA after his first three starts of this season...Has received one run of support or fewer when he has been in the game in nine of his last 15 starts...Is 1-0 with a 2.36 ERA (26.2ip/7er) in four career starts against the Cardinals...Allowed one run in 7.1 innings but had a no-decision in his only start against St. Louis this year on 7/4.
