The Reds have won 3 of their last 4 games, 5 of their last 7 games and 6 of 9 games since a **3-22 start**...have **won consecutive series** (2-1 vs Pit, 2-1 vs Mil) after beginning **0-7-1** in their first 8 series, including a 4-game split at Atl to open the season...have **won consecutive series** for the first time since **3 straight series wins** from **7/23-8/1, 2021** (2-1 vs StL, 3-1 at Cubs, 2-1 at NYM).

Last night the Reds became the **10th team** for whom **LHP Ross Detwiler** has played, second-most among active position players or pitchers...he trails only Bos' **Rich Hill**, who has pitched for **11 teams**...courtesy @EliasSports.

TODAY'S GAME: Is **Game 4** (2-1) of an 11-day, 9-game, 3-city road trip to Pit's **PNC Park** (2-1), Cle's **Progressive Field** (off day, 2g) and Tor's **Rogers Centre** (off day, 3g)...is the Reds' longest road trip of the season by day... regardless of today's outcome the Reds will snap their **4-road series losing streak** (0-4 at LAD, 0-3 at SD, 0-3 at Col, 0-3 at Mil).

TRANSACTION: Prior to today's game, the Reds added to the Taxi Squad **C Sandy León** (#87).

REHABBING: **1B Joey Votto**, who on 5/3 went on the injured list, last night began a rehabilitation assignment at Louisville...in a 7-inning, rain-shortened 7-1 Bats win vs Toledo delayed 2 hours at the start, **Votto** batted leadoff as the designated hitter and reached base safely in all 3 plate apps (1-1, 2bb, 1rbi, 1r)...he is expected to get 3-4 plate apps today...**LHP Mike Minor** (left shoulder strain) is scheduled to pitch for the Bats this afternoon in his second start of this rehabilitation stint (4ip, 60-65 pitches).

SERIES NOTES: The Reds are **12-24 at PNC Park** the **last 5 seasons**, including an **11-game losing streak** spanning **2018-2019** and an **8-game losing streak** to begin the 2019 season...are **24-11 vs Pit** over the last 3 seasons...including 3 series wins and 2 series sweeps last year, the Reds have won **21** of the **last 29 games** vs the Pirates...4 times in 2021 the Reds beat the Pirates by 10 runs, a club record vs any opponent in a season...the **1945 Pirates** club was the National League's last team to beat an opponent 4 times in a season by at least 10 runs (Brooklyn).

GUARDIANS UP NEXT: Last season the Reds went **3-3 vs Cle**, their first record of at least .500 against the Indians since **2017** (2-2)...the Reds won or tied **12** of the first **23 Ohio Cup** season series, including **11** of the **last 17** and 5 straight from **2006-2010**, but lost **5** of the **last 7** season series.

OHIO CUP: The coveted **Ohio Cup** will be awarded to the team that wins each season's series between the Reds and Guardians...should the season series end in a tie, the **extraordinary trophy** will be retained by the previous year's winner...the **Guardians** currently are in possession of the Ohio cup following last season's 3-3 series tie...the **Ohio Cup** has been won outright **11 times** by the **Guardians** (retained 8 times) and **5 times** by the **Reds**.

MOP: In 2019, the award for the season series' best player was named the **Frank Robinson Most Outstanding Player Award**...previous winners of the **MOP** include Reds **OF Adam Dunn** (2008), Reds **C Ramon Hernandez** (2009), Indians **OF Shin-Soo Choo** (2010), Indians **SS Asdrubal Cabrera** (2011), Reds **2B Kristopher Negron** (2014), Indians **2B Jason Kipnis** (2015), Indians **CF Rajai Davis** (2016), Indians **1B Carlos Santana** (2017), Indians **3B José Ramírez** (2018), Indians **RHP Trevor Bauer** (2019), Indians **3B José Ramírez** (2020) and Reds **LHP Wade Miley** (2021, no-hitter)...no award was given in 2012 or 2013.

INTERLEAGUE NOTES: Following tomorrow's off day in Cleveland, the Reds begin a stretch of **5 straight games** vs **American League teams** (2g at Cle, 3g at Tor)...beginning in **1997** are **176-241 all-time vs the AL**, at **.422** the **lowest interleague winning percentage** of any Major League team (Phi 29th, .442) and including **9-11 in 2021 & 0-2 this season** (0-2 vs Cle)...the Redlegs haven't produced a **winning record** vs the **American League** since **2013** (11-9)...in **9 seasons** since then, the Reds are **61-101 vs AL teams** (.377).

RED HOTS:

- Per @EliasSports, the Reds have played the **third-toughest schedule** in the Major Leagues...in games already played, their opponents have posted a winning percentage of **.545** (Wsh .561, Tor .554)...the winning percentage for the teams remaining on the Reds' schedule is **.500**, 14th-highest.
- Since a 2-2 series split at Atl to open the season the Reds are **7-23**, including a **1-20 stretch** bookended by losing streaks of **11 games** (4/12-4/23) and **9 games** (4/26-5/5).
- The Reds are **2-7-1 in 10 series** this season (2-3 home, 0-4-1 road) after winning each of their last 2 series...have been swept 6 times.
- **43 players** have appeared in at least 1 game for the Reds this season (last, **LHP Ross Detwiler**, 5/14 at Pit)...the club record for number of players in a season is **57** (2003).
- The Reds' current injured list includes **14 players**...began the season with **8 players** on the **injured list**, their highest total to begin a season since they began the **2014 campaign** with **8 players** on the **disabled list**...since **2022 Opening Day** have made **15 more additions** to the injured list for a season total of **23 IL stints**.
- The Reds' **11.5-game deficit** on **May 1** was their largest ever on that date.

ROAD TRIPPED: The Reds' **13-game road losing streak** from **4/14-5/5** was their longest in a single season since an **0-19 road stretch** from **7/5-8/24, 1933** and included series sweep losses at LA's **Dodger Stadium** (4g), at SD's **Petco Park** (3g), at Col's **Coors Field** (3g) and at Mil's **American Family Field** (3g).

RED HOTS

- This afternoon is making his seventh Major League appearance and start, all this season.
- In Tue's 5-4 vs Mil didn't allow a hit until Luis Urias led off the fourth inning with a home run...left with the score tied, 1-1, but was charged with a second run on Jace Peterson's RBI-double off Tony Santillan.
- In the 10-5 loss on 5/5 at Mil allowed 5 HR, tying the club record (last, Scott Feldman, 8/17/2017 at Cubs)...became the first Reds pitcher to allow home runs to the first 2 batters of a game (Luis Urias, Christian Yelich) since Jimmy Rollins & Wil Nieves homered off Tony Cingrani on 5/18/2014.
- In the 5-2 loss on 4/16 at LAD threw 39 pitches at more than 100 miles per hour, the most recorded in the pitch-tracking era (since 2008)...his 13 pitches at 101mph were the most ever recorded by a starter in a game...struck out 2 batters on fastballs clocked at 101mph, tied for the most in a game by a starter on a strikeout pitch of that velocity (Jacob deGrom, Justin Verlander)...courtesy @SlangsOnSports.
- Made his Major League debut in the 6-3 win on 4/10 at Atl in the Reds' fourth game of the season...became the ninth Reds pitcher and first since Jackson Stephens in 2016 to record the win and at least 7 strikeouts in his first career appearance...first career strikeout was Matt Olson (2nd batter)...recorded 2 strikeouts in each of his first 3 innings...didn't allow a hit until Matt Olson singled to lead off the fourth inning...in the fifth allowed a leadoff HR to Travis d'Arnaud and a 2-out HR to Olson, both solo homers...RHP Art Warren threw a scoreless ninth inning for his first career save.
- At age 22 years, 247 days became the youngest starting pitcher to make his Major League debut for the Reds since Mike Leake received no decision a 3-1 Reds win on 4/11/10 vs the Cubs at 22 years, 150 days old.
- Became the youngest pitcher to start for the Reds since LHP Brandon Finnegan made his team debut on 9/18/15 at Mil at age 22 years, 5 months, 4 days and the youngest righthander since Leake.
- Was 1 of 3 pitchers on the Reds' Opening Day roster with 0.000 days of service time (Alexis Diaz, Daniel Duarte) and 1 of 9 Reds pitchers with less than 1.000 year of service time.
- Was selected by the Reds in the first round (2nd overall pick) of the June 2017 first-year player draft...was rated by MLB.com the best overall prospect and by *Baseball America* the best high school player in that draft...the Twins selected high school SS Royce Lewis with the No. 1 overall pick.
- Missed the 2019 season while recovering from 4/9/19 "Tommy John" surgery to repair the torn ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow.

RED HOTS

- Tue at Cle's Progressive Field will make his fourth appearance and start of the season...will be his 13th Major League appearance and seventh career start...will be his first career appearance vs the Guardians...will be his first career start and fourth appearance vs an American League team (WSox, Det, LAA).
- In Thu's 4-0 win at Pit earned his first Major League victory...in the team's 32nd game, became the first Reds pitcher this season to throw at least 6.0 innings...the Reds' 31 games to begin a season in which the starting pitcher failed to pitch at least 6.0 innings are the most in the Major Leagues since 1893, when the mound was moved to its current distance...the second-longest streak belongs to the Pirates, who began this season with 21 games without a 6-inning stint by a starter until Mitch Keller threw 6.0 innings in a 5-2 loss on 5/1 vs SD.
- Joined the Reds in Denver on 4/29, when he was named to the Taxi Squad...the next day was promoted from Class AAA Louisville to the 28-man active roster to start that night's game at Coors Field...left that 4-3 loss with a 2-0 lead and was the victim of a blown save.
- Was a non-roster invitee to 2022 early minor league spring training camp and post-lockout Major League camp...in 3 exhibition "A" game relief apps for the Reds posted a 5.40 ERA (5ip, 5h, 3er, 2bb, 3k).
- On 3/28 was reassigned to minor league camp...began the season at Louisville, where in 2 starts and 2 relief apps he went 2-1, 2.84 (19ip, 16h, 2bb, 22k, 2hr).
- In 2021, in his Major League debut made 3 starts and 6 relief apps for the Blue Jays and Pirates.
- On 11/26/21 was signed by the Reds to a minor league contract with an invitation to 2022 Major League spring training camp.
- Pitched in 2 seasons in the independent leagues, for the American Association's Sioux City Explorers in 2016 and in the Atlantic League for the Lancaster Barnstormers in 2019.
- Spent most of the 2016 season pitching for Sioux City but did make 1 appearance, on 8/13, for the Giants' Class A San Jose affiliate...didn't pitch again the rest of that season because of a right elbow injury.
- Missed the entire 2017 season following "Tommy John" surgery to repair the torn ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow.

- Rank last in the Major Leagues in ERA (4.95), first in walks allowed (75bb, 147.1ip) and fourth in highest opponents' batting average (.245).
