METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Angels, 5-3, on Saturday night...New York has dropped three straight contests...New York is looking to avoid their seventh sweep of the season...The Mets have never been swept by the Angels...The Mets continue a 10-day, ninegame homestand (0-2) against the Angels (0-2), Rangers (three games) and Mariners (three games).

MUST SEE TV: Today's game against the Los Angeles Angels will be aired exclusively on Peacock...Fans can access the game by using the Peacock app or by visiting peacocktv.com.

TAKE THE TRAIN TO THE GAME: The Mets are encouraging all fans attending the games taking place August 25 - September 3 to take the train to the game...With the capacity crowds expected at both Citi Field and the US Open, using mass transit and rideshare will be the most efficient ways to arrive to the ballpark...The LIRR and the 7 train have added additional trains for baseball and tennis fans...If you drive, please arrive early to avoid traffic delays.

LINSANITY: The Mets have been hit by 84 pitches this season...That is the second-most in the majors and the most in the National League... Since the start of last season, the Mets have been plunked 196 times, that's 16 times more than the second-place team the Mariners...It's 30 times more the next place team in the NL, the Cincinnati Reds who have been hit by 166 pitches in that span.

LINSANITY: Lindor is on a 12-game hitting streak, batting .367 (18-49) in that span with 12 runs, four doubles, two home runs, nine RBI, three walks and three steals...His longest streak as a Met is 13 games, accomplished from September 14-28, 2022...His career-best is 15 games, from April 29-May 14, 2018...Over his last 58 games, he is batting .307 (67-218) with 46 runs, 12 doubles, two triples, 12 home runs, 35 RBI, 28 walks, 16 steals with a .393 OBP, a .546 SLG and a .939 OPS...Lindor has stolen 22 bases in 128 games this season, exceeding his total from 2022 (16 steals in 161 games)...His career-best is 25 steals 158 games in 2018.

I DECLARE fWAR: Francisco Lindor ranks fifth in the majors and fourth in the National League with a 5.2 fWAR...Since he joined the Mets, Lindor has posted a 16.1 fWAR...Only Freddie Freeman (18.5) and Mookie Betts (17.5) have posted a higher mark in the Senior Circuit... His 16.1 fWAR since 2021 ranks fifth in the majors in that span.

THE ROAD TO 100: Pete Alonso is tied for second in the majors and is second in the NL with 95 RBI...He has previously recorded two seasons with 100 RBI (120 in 2019 and 131 in 2022)...He is seeking to become the fourth player in Mets history to record three or more seasons with 100 or more RBI...David Wright is the franchise leader with five such seasons...Carlos Beltrán and Darryl Strawberry recorded three seasons each.

GIMME A BREAK: Alonso is hitting .241 (34-141) with 20 extra-base hits, 34 RBI, 23 runs, 20 walks and a .929 OPS in 40 games following the All-Star break...He batted .211 (64-304) with 50 runs, seven one triple, 26 home runs, 61 RBI and an .807 OPS in the 82 games before the break.

MONTHLY REPORT: Pete Alonso has recorded nine home runs in 25 games this month...His career-best for any single month is 11 home runs, which he recorded in 27 games in September of 2019...He has recorded five months with at least 10 home runs in his career...His next home run would mark the second time this year that Alonso has hit 10 homers in a single month...He hit 10 home runs in May...He also hit one home run in March and nine in April.

ANGELS-METS NOTES: The Mets will host the Angels at Citi Field for the first time since May 19-21, 2017.

THIS IS ALMOST 40: Pete Alonso is third in the majors and second in the National League with 39 home runs...Alonso is one home run shy of recording his third season of 40 or more home runs...He socked 53 in 2019 and 40 last season...He is the only player in franchise history with multiple seasons of 40 or more home runs...Since he entered the league in 2019, only two other players have recorded multiple seasons with 40 or more home runs (Shohei Ohtani and Mike Trout)... Only one active player (Nelson Cruz, four) has more than three 40-HR seasons... Alonso's 185 home runs since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues...With one more long ball, he'll become the fifth player in MLB history with three or more seasons with 40+ home runs in a player's first five years...He would join Ralph Kiner (4), Ryan Howard (3), Albert Pujols (3) and Eddie Matthews (3).

## PETERSON NEWS & NOTES

**LAST TIME OUT:** Threw 4.2 innings in the Mets' 10-4 victory over the Braves at Truist Park...Allowed four runs on seven hits while issuing two walks and striking out four.

**ANGEL NUMBERS:** Tonight, Peterson will make his second career appearance and first career start against the Angels...His only apperance came as relief on June 10, 2022...Pitched 2.2 innings and allowed just one run to earn the win in the Mets' 7-3 victory...This will be Peterson's first time facing the Angels at home.

**MAKIN' IT MAJOR:** Since returning to the majors on June 27 after a stint with Syracuse (AAA), Peterson has pitched to a 2-1 record with a 3.05 ERA (13 ER/38.1 IP) in 13 games, seven of which were starts.

A MINUTE IN THE MINORS: Peterson was optioned to Triple-A Syracuse on April 29, was recalled on May 9, then optioned again on May 16...In his first start with Syracuse following his May 16 option, he dealt 8.0 shutout innings, allowed just two hits and struck out nine...For his effort, he as named International League Pitcher of the Week...All told, he has made seven starts for the Syracuse Mets this season...Has a 1-2 record with a 4.86 ERA (20 ER/37.0 IP).

**NEW YORK, NEW YORK:** This season, Peterson has pitched to a 2.88 ERA (11 ER/34.1 IP) in ten home outings (six starts)...Over 11 road outings (nine starts) this season, the southpaw has pitched to an 7.74 ERA (37 ER/43.0 IP).

**LETHAL LEFTY:** Peterson has limited lefties to a .239 (63-264) average in his career...He whiffed 32 of the 96 left-handed batters he faced last year, a 33 percent strikeout rate that ranked fourth among all left-handed pitchers to face a minimum of 90 LHB in 2022.

**SLIP 'N' SLIDE:** Peterson held batters to a .175 (24-137) average with his slider last season and 78 of his 126 strikeouts came on the pitch...His 52.0 slider-strikeout percentage was the second-highest in MLB (min. 150 PA) behind only teammate Edwin Díaz (54.7) and his 47.9 whiff percentage with the pitch was the third-highest in the majors behind only Díaz (54.7) and Seattle's Andres Muñoz (50.8).

**STRIKE 'EM OUT, STRIKE 'EM OUT:** Peterson struck out at least five batters in 11 straight starts from June 20-September 9 last season, the second-longest streak by a left-handed starter last season...lt was the sixth-longest streak by a Mets left-handed starter in franchise history...Peterson had 82 strikeouts across 58.2 innings during that span (13 G/11 GS) good for a 12.58 K/9 ratio.

**2022 RECAP:** Set career-high marks in wins (seven), games (28), starts (19), innings (105.2), and strikeouts (126) last season...Went 7-5 with a 3.83 ERA for New York...Appeared mostly as a starter until mid-September...His final five appearances of the season came out of the bullpen...Went 6-5 with a 3.86 ERA (39 ER/91.0 IP) as a starter...In nine relief appearances, Peterson went 1-0 with a 3.68 ERA (6 ER/14.2 IP).
