PITTSBURGH PIRATES (70-90) vs. ATLANTA BRAVES (75-85)
September 27, 2025 - Truist Park - Atlanta, GA - 7:15 EDT - Game #161/Road #80
RHP Bubba Chandler (3-1, 4.56 ERA) vs. RHP Spencer Strider (7-13, 4.45 ERA)

THE PIRATES: have won three of the first four games on this season-ending, six-game road trip to Cincinnati and Atlanta, including a 9-3 win on Friday night at Truist Park...Have won five of their last six games (since September 20 vs. the Athletics)...Are 58-64 since Don Kelly made his managerial debut on May 9 vs. Atlanta...Have recorded at least one

extra-base hit in 59 straight games (since July 22 vs. Detroit), the second-longest active streak in all of Major League Baseball (the Athletics, 77 games, rank first) and their longest single-season streak since a 64-game streak from June 1-August 14, 2019...Have played in a Major League-high 60 one-run games (Atlanta ranks third with 56 one-run games), their most in a season since also playing in 60 such games in 2014 (have not played more than 60 one-run games in a season since playing 62 such games in 1992)... Have won 14 of their last 30 road games (since July 13 at Minnesota) after winning only 12 of their first 49 road games this season.

BOGART'S BEST: Pirates starter Bubba Chandler was born in Lawrenceville, Georgia and is a 2021 graduate of North Oconee High School in Bogart, Georgia...Chandler, who was drafted by Pittsburgh in the third round of the 2021 First-Year Player Draft, has become the only Pirates pitcher in the Modern Era (since 1901) to make back-to-back starts with two or fewer hits allowed, one or zero runs allowed, zero walks issued and at least six strikeouts (September 13 at Washington and September 20 vs. the Athletics)... The only Major League pitcher since 1901 to do that in three consecutive starts was Milwaukee's Corbin Burnes (April 3-14, 2021).

FINISH STRONG: With a win tonight, the Pirates would move to 4-1 vs. the Braves in 2025 and would secure their first season series win vs. Atlanta since 2017 (5-2)...They would also win their first series in Atlanta since winning two of three from June 5-7, 2015 at Turner Field...Pittsburgh has won each of its last two series, taking two of three from September 19-21 vs. the A's and two of three from Tuesday-Thursday at Cincinnati...According to OptaStats, the Pirates last won three straight series to end a season in 1977 (five straight)...They have not won consecutive road series since July 9-11, 2024 at Milwaukee and July 12-14, 2024 at Chicago (AL).

TAKE IT IN STRIDE: Pittsburgh scored six runs off Atlanta starter Spencer Strider in the third inning of a 7-6 win on August 7, 2023 at PNC Park (the last time he faced the Pirates)...Jared Triolo went 2-for-3 with two RBI and a walk in Pittsburgh's victory that night.

THE KIDS ARE ALRIGHT: Dating back to Mike Burrows' start on September 9 at Baltimore, the Pirates' rookie starting pitchers (Braxton Ashcraft, Burrows and Bubba Chandler) have posted a combined 2.84 ERA (31.2ip/10er) in seven starts...According to Baseball America, Pittsburgh currently has the second-best farm system among all Major League organizations, behind Milwaukee.

INDISPENCEABLE: Spencer Horwitz recorded his fourth career multi-homer game and second of 2025 (also August 3 at Colorado) on Friday at Atlanta...It was also his second career multi-homer game here at Truist Park (also September 7, 2024 with Toronto)... His two homers came in the seventh and ninth inning, respectively, making him the first Pirate to hit each of his homers in a multi-homer game in the seventh inning or later since Jack Suwinski on May 29, 2023 at San Francisco (the last to do it in a win was Jordan Luplow on July 14, 2018 [G2] vs. Milwaukee)...Horwitz had three hits (including two home runs), four RBI, two walks and three runs on Friday, making him one of four Pirates in the Modern Era (since 1901) to post those stats or better in a game, along with Ralph Kiner (August 16, 1947 vs. St. Louis), Brian Giles (September 27, 2002 at Chicago-NL) and Craig Wilson (May 11, 2004 at Colorado).

PRIDE OF BUFORD: Joey Bart, who graduated from Buford High School in 2015 and played collegiately at Georgia Tech from 2016-18, is batting .321 (9-for-28) with two doubles, two home runs, eight RBI and a 1.048 OPS so far this month...Bart, who had his first career four-hit game on May 10 vs. Atlanta, has gone 8-for-19 (.421) with three RBI in six career games against the Braves.

IN THE TRUIST SENSE: Spencer Horwitz is 9-for-11 (.818) with five home runs, nine RBI, seven runs and a 3.119 OPS in four career games at Truist Park... He is one of four visiting players to record two multi-homer games in this stadium, which opened in 2017, along with New York (NL)'s Starling Marte, New York (NL)'s Brandon Nimmo and Philadelphia's Trea Turner...Horwitz has homered in three straight games here, making him one of five visiting players to do that, the first since Miami's Jesús Sánchez from September 10-12, 2021.

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

<u>September 27, 2019</u>: Kevin Newman had a career-high five RBI and hit the first walkoff home run of his career, a two-out, two-run shot off Raisel Iglesias, in Pittsburgh's 6-5 win over Cincinnati. The win, which came in Steve Blass' final game as a television broadcaster, improved the Pirates to 8-0 against the Reds at PNC Park that year. It was Newman's fourth walkoff of the season.

ROOKIE RUNDOWN: Chandler will make his seventh Major League appearance (fourth start) tonight...In his three relief appearances, which came on August 22 vs. Colorado, August 27 at St. Louis and September 2 vs. Los Angeles (NL), he has gone 2-0 with one save, a 2.25 ERA (12.0ip/3er) and a 0.83 WHIP...In his three starts, which came on September 7 vs. Milwaukee, September 13 at Washington and September 20 vs. the Athletics, Chandler has gone 1-1 with a 6.59 ERA (13.2ip/10er) and 16 strikeouts (he has issued only three walks).

LAST TIME OUT: Chandler allowed one hit and one hit by pitch while striking out six batters over 5.0 scoreless innings of work in his start on September 20 vs. the Athletics, winning a 2-0 decision against Luis Morales...With that start, he became the first Pirates pitcher in the Modern Era (since 1901) to make back-to-back starts with two or fewer hits allowed, one or zero runs allowed, zero walks issued and at least six strikeouts (he also allowed one run on two hits while striking out seven batters on September 13 at Washington)...The only Major League pitcher in the Modern Era to accomplish that in three consecutive starts was Milwaukee's Corbin Burnes...He did that in three straight starts from April 3-14, 2021.

PRIZED PROSPECT: Chandler allowed one run on two hits (zero walks) while striking out seven batters over 6.0 innings of work on September 13 at Washington, having a no-decision in Pittsburgh's 5-1 win...He had a perfect game through 5.0 innings before the Nationals' Dylan Crews led off the bottom of the sixth inning with a single...With that start, Chandler became the fourth Pirates rookie in the Modern Era (since 1901) to post those stats or better in a game, joining Woodie Fryman (July 1, 1966 at New York), Nick Kingham (April 29, 2018 vs. St. Louis) and Jared Jones (May 4, 2024 vs. Colorado)...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, he was the fourth Pirates rookie in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to have a bid for a perfect game of at least 5.0 innings, joining Kingham (6.2ip) on April 29, 2018, Bruce Kison (5.2ip) on July 23, 1971 at San Diego and Max Kranick (5.0ip) on June 27, 2021 at St. Louis.

IHREE'S COMPANY: Chandler allowed three runs on six hits (three strikeouts) over 4.0 innings in his outing on September 2 vs. Los Angeles (NL), earning a 9-7 win...Two of the three runs he allowed came via solo home runs from Shohei Ohtani and Andy Pages...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, Chandler became the second Pittsburgh reliever since at least 1900 to pitch at least 4.0 innings in each of his first three outings, along with Carmen Hill (1915)... He became the second Pirates reliever in the Modern Era (since 1901) to record at least three strikeouts in each of his first three Major League outings, joining Cecilio Guante (1982)... With that win, Chandler became one of three Major League pitchers (since saves became an official stat in 1969) to earn two wins and a save in his first three Major League games...He joined Minnesota's Tom Johnson (1974) and Cincinnati's Hector Carrasco (1994) on that list.

WIN (AND SAVE) THE DAY: Chandler earned his first Major League win with 4.0 scoreless innings of relief on August 27 at St. Louis (second big-league appearance)...He also earned his first Major League save with 4.0 scoreless innings of relief on August 22 vs. Colorado, making him one of five Major League pitchers (since saves became an official stat in 1969) to earn both a win and a save in his first two MLB games, joining Rick Waits (1973/1975), Bob Stanley (1977), Mardie Cornejo (1978) and Mickey Weston (1989)...He became one of four MLB relievers in the Modern Era (since 1901) to begin his career with two outings of at least 4.0 scoreless innings (Hugh Bedient in 1912, Von McDaniel in 1957, Eric King in 1986).

DYNAMITE DEBUT: Chandler secured a 4.0-inning save in his Major League debut on August 22 vs. Colorado...Since saves became an official statistic in 1969, he was the first Pirate to earn a save in his big-league debut, and he was one of four Major Leaguers to earn a 4.0-inning save in his Major League debut, joining Boston's Bob Stanley (April 16, 1977 at Cleveland), St. Louis' Zack Thompson (June 3, 2022 at Chicago-NL) and San Francisco's Keaton Winn (June 13, 2023 at St. Louis)...Chandler was the only one to not surrender a run.
