## PITTSBURGH PIRATES (72-82) vs. CINCINNATI REDS (75-80)

SEPTEMBER 21, 2024 AT GREAT AMERICAN BALL PARK, CINCINNATI, OH - 1:10 EDT - GAME #155/ROAD #77

RHP JARED JONES (6-7, 3.85 ERA) vs. RHP RHETT LOWDER (1-2, 1.74 ERA)

**THE PIRATES:** lost 8-3 last night in the opener of their three-game series against the Reds...Are 2-6 in their last eight games since winning four straight from September 8-11... Have won 15 games in their last at-bat (their most since having 16 last at-bat wins in 2021)...Have won eight games when trailing after seven innings (their most since winning nine times in 2019 when trailing after seven frames)...Have played in 50 one-run games, which are tied for the second-most in the National League behind the Brewers (51); it's also the most one-run games for the team since playing in 51 one-run contests in 2018...Have the best stolen base percentage (85.8 percent) in MLB...Have gone 23-24 against the National League Central (Pittsburgh's last winning record against the NL Central came in 2018 when the team went 43-33).

**KEEPING UP WITH THE JONES':** Jared Jones will face the Reds this afternoon for the first time in his big league career...The 23-year-old Jones comes into today ranked seventh among all National League rookies in ERA (3.85), tied for fourth in strikeouts (120) and fifth in WHIP (1.15) and batting average against (.228).

**#H2P:** Last night Isaac Mattson became the fourth player to play for both the University of Pittsburgh and the Pirates, joining right-handed pitcher Steve Swetonic, infielder Ken Macha and right-handed pitcher Doc Medich (special thanks to StatsPerform)...Mattson also joined James Meeker (Milwaukee), Austin Kitchen (Colorado and Miami) and Spencer Bivens (San Francisco) as former members of the Washington Wild Things who have played in MLB this year.

**NICK WITH THE STICK:** Nick Gonzales comes into today with an 11-game on-base streak, which is the longest of his career...Gonzales is hitting .317 (13-for-41) with a pair of doubles, triple, two RBI and four runs scored during his current 11-game on-base streak.

**20-20 VISION:** Last night Oneil Cruz became the 10th different player in Pirates history to achieve 20 home runs and 20 stolen bases in a season...It's now the 18th instance in Pirates history that a player has recorded 20 home runs and 20 stolen bases in a season and the first since Starling Marte did so in 2019.

**BOMBS AWAY AT GABP:** The Pirates have gone deep in eight consecutive games at Great American Ball Park...Since the beginning of last season, the only game in which the Pirates did not connect for at least one home run came on April 1 of 2023.

**KEEPING UP WITH CUTCH'S MILESTONES:** Andrew McCutchen comes into today one run shy of tying Arky Vaughan (936) for 10th all time in Pirates history...McCutchen ranks second among all active players with 1239 runs scored, trailing only Freddie Freeman (1298)...McCutchen is also two extra base hits shy of 800 in his career (his 798 extra base hits are the third-most among active players)...McCutchen has also played in 1573 games as a Pirate...His next game will tie him with Tommy Leach for ninth all time in team history.

**RED HOTS:** Bryan Reynolds is tied with Brendan Donovan for the most hits (14) against the Reds this year...Rowdy Tellez went 2-for-4 with a double last night and is now 12-for-34 (.353) this season against Cincinnati...Jared Triolo is 10-for-19 (.526) with two doubles and two home runs in five career games played at Great American Ball Park...Oneil Cruz has hit safely in seven of his last eight games played at Great American Ball Park, going 10-for-33 (.303) with four home runs.

**FIRING CUBAN MISSILES:** Aroldis Chapman comes into today ninth in all of MLB among relief pitchers with 92 strikeouts (Josh Hader leads all relievers in MLB with 101 strikeouts)...Chapman's 92 punchouts are the second-most in a single season by a Pirates left-handed reliever...The only Pirates southpaw reliever with more strikeouts in a single season is Rod Scurry (94 in 1982).

**TODAY'S STARTER** RHP JARED JONES #37

 HOW ACQUIRED: Selected by the Pirates in the 2nd round of the 2020 Draft.

**STARTING OFF:** The 23-year-old righthander is in his first Major League season with the Pirates...Was named to the Opening Day roster after being a non-roster invitee to big league camp...The Whittier, California, native was Pittsburgh's second-round draft selection in 2020 out of La Mirada (CA) High School.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Jones allowed two runs on six hits in 4.0 innings but had a no-decision in his last start Sunday against Kansas City at PNC Park.

**VS. CINCINNATI:** Has never faced the Reds.

**KEEPING THE TEAM IN THE GAME:** Jones has posted a 2-1 record in his last six starts... The Pirates have gone 5-1 in those six outings, which dates back to his outing on June 22 against the Rays.

**AS A PROSPECT:** Jones entered the 2024 season rated as the team's No. 3 prospect and the No. 74 prospect in all of baseball according to Baseball America.

**ON THE ROAD:** Jones has gone 2-4 with a 5.40 ERA (43.1ip/26er) in eight starts this season on the road (the Pirates are 3-5 in his eight starts)...Jones is 0-2 in his last three starts away from PNC Park since winning a 5-4 decision (6.0ip/3er) on May 16 at Wrigley Field.

**THE CENTURY MARK:** Jones has amassed 120 strikeouts in his 20 starts this season... Since the mound was moved to its current distance in 1893, the only other three Pirates to reach 100 career strikeouts in fewer than 20 games are Gerrit Cole in 2013 (19), Jose DeLeon in 1983 (13) and Paul Skenes (13).

**ROOKIES ROLLING:** Jared Jones will make his 21st start this afternoon...Jones comes into today ranked seventh among all National League rookies with a 3.85 ERA while teammate Paul Skenes ranks first with a 2.07 ERA...The last time the Pirates had two pitchers finish in the top 10 among National League rookies in ERA was 2001...That year Dave Williams ranked third with a 3.71 ERA, while Joe Beimel ranked eighth with a 5.82 ERA.

**BODY OF WORK:** Is making his 21st career start and appearance today...He has allowed three earned runs or fewer in 17 of his 20 starts, as well as two or fewer 11 times and one or fewer five times.

**WHAT A DEBUT:** Jones became the first Pirate since Tim Wakefield in 1992 and the third pitcher in team history to record at least 10 strikeouts in his big league debut on March 30 at Miami...In addition, he became one of just five starting pitchers since 1900 to strike out at least 10 batters in less than 6.0 innings in a big league debut...Prior to Jones, Milwaukee's Freddy Peralta was the last pitcher to record 10-plus strikeouts in a big league debut when he did so on May 13, 2018 (13 punchouts)...Dick Hall struck out 11 batters in his first MLB start, but he made his MLB debut as a third baseman for the Pirates on April 15, 1952.

**BEFORE HE WAS A PIRATE:** Was committed to being a two-way player at the University of Texas prior to signing with the Pirates...As a senior in high school, he hit .394 with 32 extra base hits and 59 RBI.

**NO WALK SIGN IS ON:** Jones opened his career with a streak of 21.1 consecutive innings without issuing a walk before allowing his free pass to Blake Perkins in the fifth inning on April 22 vs. Milwaukee...It was the fifth-longest streak by a Major League pitcher within their first five career games since 1971 and the longest since Cleveland's Cody Anderson had a streak of 25.2 consecutive innings without a walk in 2015.

**ON DECK:** The 22-year-old Skenes will be making his 22nd start tomorrow...Allowed one run in 6.0 innings and lost a 4-0 decision in his last start Monday at St. Louis... Has posted the lowest ERA (2.07) in all of MLB since making his debut on 5/11...Two of his three losses have come vs. St. Louis...Has a 1.59 ERA (34.0ip/6er) in his last six starts since allowing a season-high four runs on 8/10...Has allowed just one run in 12.0 innings while winning each of his two starts against the Reds.
