AT A GLANCE: The Yankees begin a five-game road trip tonight with the first game of a two-game Subway Series vs. the Mets (through Wed.)...after an off-day on Thursday, will also play three games at Boston (Fri. Sun.)...went 2-4 on their six-game homestand, losing two of three games against both Chicago-AL and Boston.

▶ At 38-29 (.567), have the fourth-best record in the AL

- and the sixth-best record in the Majors.

  Are 8-6 in their last 14 games, 13-9 in their last 22

WHERE WE LEFT OFF: The Yankees fell to the Red Sox, 3-2, in 10 innings on Sunday at Yankee Stadium... RHP Clarke Schmidt (5.1IP, 4H, 1ER, 0BB, 4K, 1HR) did not record a decision despite allowing just 1ER over not record a decision despite allowing just 1ER over 5.1IP...C Jose Trevino (1-for-4, 2RBI) drove in both of the Yankees' runs with a go-ahead two-run single in the second inning...CF/LF Billy McKinney (1-for-4, 1R, 1 double) recorded the Yankees' only extra-base hit... 3B DJ LeMahieu (1-for-4) recorded his 600th hit as a Yankee with a fourth-inning single...LHP Nick Ramirez (1.0IP) and RHP Clay Holmes (1.0IP, 1H) each tossed a scoreless inning...LHP Wandy Peralta (0.1IP) retired his only batter faced...RHP Michael King (1.1IP, 1H, 1ER, 2BB) allowed 1ER in 1.1 innings of relief...RHP Ron Marinaccio (1.0IP, 1H, 1R/0ER) recorded the loss after allowing the automatic runner score in the 10th inning allowing the automatic runner score in the 10th inning.

NATIONAL TREASURE: The Yankees are 11-4 in 15 Interleague games this season...marks the second-best record in Interleague games this season, trailing only Miami (15-4, .789)...have won each of their five series vs. NL opponents this season.

- At 292-205 (.588), the Yankees own the second-most wins and second-best winning percentage in Interleague history (Boston: 298-209, a higher .588).
- Have posted a winning record in 20-of-26 completed seasons (20-3-3 overall) since Interleague play was established in 1997...have a *non-losing* Interleague record in 23-of-26 seasons (5-10 in 1997; 9-11 in 2013; and 8-12 in 2016).

**HIP HIP JOSE: C Jose Trevino** drove in both of the Yankees' runs with a go-ahead two-run single in the second inning on Sunday...is batting .286 (8-for-28) with 1 double and 9RBI with RISP this season.

As a Yankee (since 2022), has hit .339 (41-for-121) with 7 doubles, 1 triple, 2HR, 40RBI, 6BB, 1HP and 1SF with RISP.

WHAT A RELIEF: Yankees relievers have posted a Major League-best 2.76 ERA (254.0IP, 78ER) and a .209 opponents' BA...the Yankees are the only Major League bullpen that currently owns an ERA below 3.00 (next: Cleveland - 3.01).

- Lead the Majors with a .331 opponents' SLG and .632 opponents' OPS...also rank second in HR/9.0IP (0.74), third in WHIP (1.18) and fourth in opponents' OBP (.301).
- Have posted a 1.54 ERA (46.2IP, 8ER) in their last 14 games (since 5/27) and a 1.90 ERA (80.1IP, 17ER) in their last 22 games (since 5/18)...have held opponents to a .157 BA (43-for-274) over that 22-game stretch.

**BEST VS. THE METS:** The Yankees are 78-60 (.565) all time vs. the Mets...marks the highest win total by any team over any single opponent in the history of Interleague play (next: Tampa Bay's 75 wins vs. Miami).

HOLMES SWEET HOLMES: RHP Clay Holmes tossed a scoreless ninth inning on Sunday...has not allowed a run in 17 of his last 18 appearances (since 5/6), going 4-0 with four saves, a 0.49 ERA (18.1IP, 1ER) and 22K in that

STANTON ISLAND: In 119 career games vs. the Mets, OF/ **DH Giancarlo Stanton** has batted .264/.349/.556 (114-for-432) with 71R, 15 doubles, 37HR, 87RBI, 56BB, 3HP and his 37HR vs. the Mets mark his most against a

- single opponent in his career (next: Washington 36HR).
  Has hit .257/.343/.612 (55-for-214) with 36R, 7 doubles, 23HR, 47RBI, 27BB/3IBB, 2HP and 2SF in 57 career games at Citi Field...his 23HR at Citi Field mark the most homers by an opposing player at the venue (next: Bryce Harper, Anthony Rendon and Chase Utley - 14HR). Is 6-for-24 with 3HR and 8RBI in his career off the
- Mets' Max Scherzer.

**CLOSE CALLS:** Each of the Yankees' last eight games and nine of their last 10 games have been decided by 3R-orfewer...the club's 45 games this season that have been decided by 3R-or-fewer are tied for the third-most in the

Majors, trailing only Cleveland (50) and Atlanta (46).

Each of the Yankees' last four losses, five of their last six losses and nine of their last 15 losses have been

PITCH PERFECT: Yankees pitchers have posted a 3.58 **ERA this season, the fourth-lowest in the Majors...** have allowed 3R-or-fewer in seven of their last eight games, nine of their last 11 games and 11 of their last

▶ Have held opponents to a .225 BA, the second-lowest opponents' BA in the Majors...also rank fourth in WHIP (1.21), fifth in opponents' OBP (.304) and sixth in opponents' SLG (.381) and opponents' OPS (.685).

**BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters** have hit 102HR this season, the second-most home runs in the AL and the fourth-most in the Majors...their 68HR since the beginning of May are tied with Atlanta for the most in the Majors in that span.

- Their 33 games with multiple home runs this season are tied with Tampa Bay for the second-most in the Majors, trailing only Los Angeles-NL (34).

LEMACHINE: INF DJ LeMahieu has hit .316/.395/.502 (92-for-291) with 58R, 13 doubles, 4 triples, 11HR, 31RBI, 36BB/1IBB, 4SB, 3HP and 2SF in 76 Interleague games as a Yankee (since 2019)...his .316 BA is the fourth-highest batting average (min. 100PA) by a Yankee in the history of Interleague play, trailing only Carlos Beltrán (.326), Derek Jeter (.320) and Bernie Williams

- Has batted .307 (65-for-212) with 29R, 13 doubles, 2 triples, 1HR, 15RBI, 22BB and 3SF in 59 career games vs. the Mets.
- In 32 career games at Citi Field, has hit .301 (34-for-113) with 16R, 7 doubles, 1HR, 7RBI, 10BB/1IBB, 2SF and 4SB...has hit safely in six of his last seven games at Citi Field (since 7/3/19), batting .333 (10-for-30) with 6R, 3 doubles, 2RBI, 4BB and 1SF in that span.

HOT START: OF Billy McKinney has hit safely in each of his five games this season, recording four extra-base hits (2 doubles, 1 triple, 1HR).

**MAGIC WANDY: LHP Wandy Peralta** retired his only batter faced on Sunday...his 31 relief appearances this season are tied for the fourth-most in the AL and tied for the sixth-most in the Majors.

**SCHMIDT'S CREEK: RHP Clarke Schmidt** did not record a decision on Sunday despite allowing 1ER in 5.1IP...<u>has posted a 2.33 ERA (27.0IP, 7ER) over his last five starts</u> (since 5/19)...has allowed 1ER-or-fewer in three of his last four starts (since 5/25)...has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in each of his last five starts (specially starts). each of his last five starts, seven of his last eight starts (since 5/3) and eight of his last 10 starts (since 4/23). ▶ Has posted a 3.59 ERA (52.2IP, 21ER) and 54K over his

last 10 starts...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in seven of those 10 starts.

### TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP LUIS SEVERINO (0-1, 5.75 ERA)

RHP Luis Severino will make his fifth start of the season in tonight's Subway Series opener at New York-NL... the 29-year-old will make the start on regular four days' rest... last started in Game 1 of a doubleheader on Thursday vs. Chicago-AL and did not record a decision in the Yankees' 6-5 loss despite allowing 4ER and a career-high-tying 3HR over 5.0IP (6H, 2BB, 6K, 1HP)...his 6K marked a season high...marked his second straight start with 3HR allowed...missed the first 48 games of the season with a right lat strain...went 7-3 with a 3.18 ERA (102.0IP, 72H, 37R/36ER, 30BB, 112K, 14HR) in 19 starts for the Yankees in 2022...allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 15 of his starts, 2ER-or-fewer in 12 of those starts and one-or-zero earned runs in nine of those games...missed 59 team games in 2022 with a low grade right lat strain (7/14-9/20)...the two-time AL All-Star (2017, '18) ranked third in the Majors in 2018 with 19 wins (19-8), tied for second-most by a Yankee in the last 14 seasons (since 2009) behind CC Sabathia (21-7 in 2010)...has two of the top-eight single-season strikeout totals in Yankees history (230K in 2017, 220K in 2018)...is one of four pitchers in Yankees history with multiple 200-strikeout seasons (also Gerrit Cole from 2021-22, David Cone from 1997-98 and Ron Guidry from 1978-79)...finished third in 2017 AL Cy Young Award voting...was originally signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent on 12/26/11...signed to a four-year contract extending through the 2022 season with a club option for the 2023 season on 2/15/19... the Yankees exercised his club option for the 2023 season on 11/7/22.

**LAST START:** Did not record a decision in the Yankees' 6-5 loss in Game 1 of a doubleheader on Thursday vs. Chicago-AL despite allowing 4ER and a career-high-tying 3HR over 5.0IP (6H, 2BB, 6K, 1HP)...surrendered a two-run HR to Jake Burger in the second inning and solo HRs to Luis Robert Jr. and Yoán Moncada in the third inning...his 6K marked a season high...marked his second straight start with 3HR allowed.

2023: Will make his fifth start of the season tonight...will mark his fourth start vs. a National League opponent this season...will match his most starts vs. NL opponents in a season (also 4GS vs. NL clubs in 2022, '18 and '17)...has allowed 1ER-or-fewer in two starts this season...has received 2R-or-fewer of support in three starts... allowed at least 3HR in each of his last two starts, marking just the third time in his career he's allowed multiple HR in consecutive starts (also three starts from 7/7-23/18 and two starts from 5/3-8/16).

- Took his first loss of the season on 6/2 at Los Angeles-NL after allowing 7ER and a career-high-tying 3HR over 4.0IP (9H, 1BB, 2K)...marked his most ER in a game since he allowed a career-high 8ER on 8/12/17 vs. Boston...surrendered six of his seven ER in the first inning.
- Did not record a decision on 5/27 vs. San Diego despite allowing just 2R/1ER over 6.2IP (1H, 3BB, 5K, 1HR)...surrendered his only hit on a solo HR by Fernando Tatis
- Did not record a decision in his first start of the season on 5/21 at Cincinnati (4.2IP, 4H, 1ER, 1BB, 5K, 0HR)...was returned from rehab and reinstated from the 15-day injured list on 5/21 prior to his start.
- Allowed 1ER-or-fewer in three straight starts (10/3/22-5/27/23), tied for the second-longest such streak of his career (trails only a five-start streak from 7/15-8/6/17...allowed 2ER-or-fewer in five straight starts from 9/21/22-5/27/23, tied for the second-longest such streak of his career (trails only a nine-start streak from 9/12/18-4/20/22)...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in seven of his last 10 starts (since 6/30/22).

  Missed the first 48 games of the season with a right lat strain...combined to make two rehab starts with Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre and Double-A Somerset,
- posting a 4.05 ERA (6.2IP, 8H, 3ER, 2BB, 6K, 1HR).

VS. NEW YORK-NL/INTERLEAGUE: In four career games (three starts) vs. the Mets, is 2-2 with a 2.75 ERA (19.2IP, 17H, 8R/6ER, 7BB, 27K, 3HR)...last faced New York-NL on 8/13/18 at Yankee Stadium and took the loss after allowing 4ER over 4.0IP (7H, 1BB, 6K, 2HR).

+ In two career starts at Citi Field, is 1-1 with a 1.59 ERA (11.1IP, 2ER) and 16K...allowed 2R-or-fewer in both of his career starts at Citi Field...has recorded at least

- 7K in both of those starts.
- Has recorded 6K-or-more in each of his three career starts vs. the Mets.
- Is 0-1 with a 5.28 ERA (15.1IP, 9ER) and 12K in three Interleague starts this season...has allowed 1ER-or-fewer in two of those starts.
- In 18 career Interleague appearances (16 starts), is 8-3 with a 2.34 ERA (96.0IP, 25ER) and 110K...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 13 of his 16 career starts vs. NL clubs.
- Has tossed at least 6.0IP and recorded 8K-or-more in seven of his 16 career Interleague starts.

ROAD RULES: Will make his third road start of the season...is 0-1 with an 8.31 ERA (8.2IP, 8ER) in two road starts this season

- In 65 career games (55 starts) on the road, is 23-16 with a 3.44 ERA (329.1IP, 126ER) and 351K.
- Has surrendered 3ER-or-fewer in 42-of-55 career starts on the road and 2ER-or-fewer in 33 of those starts.
- From 4/7/17-6/26/18, recorded at least 6K in 23 consecutive road starts...at the time, was the fourth-longest streak in Major League history (Randy Johnson-33GS from 8/22/98-8/14/00; Pedro Martinez-28GS from 8/24/99-6/21/01 and Randy Johnson-25GS from 8/30/00-5/11/02)...was later surpassed by Shane Bieber (28GS from 4/27/19-5/27/21).

**START ME UP:** The Yankees are 61-28 in his 89 starts since 2017...has allowed 1ER-or-fewer in 42-of-89 starts (47.2%) over that span

From 7/8/17-7/12/18, the Yankees went 31-4 in his 35 starts, the first time the Yankees won at least 31 games in a pitcher's 35-start span since going 31-4 over 35 Ron Guidry starts from 8/10/77-8/15/78 (Elias).

**CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:** Is 50-30 with a 3.46 ERA (658.1IP, 554H, 271R/253ER, 188BB, 727K, 81HR) in 126 career games (111 starts)...is a two-time All-Star (2017-18).

- Has made four career Opening Day rosters (2016-18, '22), all as a member of the Yankees' starting rotation... began the 2019, '20, '21 and '23 seasons on the injured list.
- Has two of the top-eight single-season strikeout totals in Yankees history (230K in 2017, 220K in 2018). of four pitchers in Yankees history with multiple 200-strikeout seasons (also Gerrit Cole from 2021-22, David Cone from 1997-98 and Ron Guidry from 1978-79)...his 450K from 2017-18 were the most over a two-season span in Yankees history (previously Guidry, 449K from 1978-79)...has since been surpassed by Gerrit Cole . from 2021-22 (500K).
- from 2021-22 (500K). Finished third in 2017 AL Cy Young Award voting...at the time was the highest finish by a Yankees pitcher since CC Sabathia also got third in 2010. Made his Major League debut as a 21-year-old in 2015, going 5-3 with a 2.89 ERA (62.1IP, 20ER) in 11 starts...was just the fourth pitcher in Yankees history to record at least five wins and post an ERA of 3.00-or-lower in his age-21 season or younger, joining Whitey Ford (1950), Hank Thormahlen (1918) and Ray Keating (1914). Was originally signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent on 12/26/11...on 2/15/19, was signed to a four-
- year contract extending through the 2022 season, with a club option for the 2023 season.
