Ichiro Suzuki is set to become the third player inducted to the National Baseball Hall of Fame with the Seattle Mariners in 66 days on July 27 in Cooperstown...he is also set to have his #51 retired by the Mariners on Aug. 9 at T-Mobile Park.

VS. HOUSTON

The Mariners and Astros face off for the second of four series this season...Seattle took 2-of-3 from Houston at T-Mobile Park in April in their first matchup of the year.

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners begin the last leg of the 10-game, 3-city road trip (5-1) with the first of four games against the Houston Astros...Seattle is coming off a pair of series wins already on the trip over the San Diego Padres (3-0) and the Chicago White Sox (2-1)...tonight's game will be televised live on **ROOT SPORTS** with **Aaron Goldsmith**, **Ryan Rowland-Smith** and Mariners Hall of Famer **Jay Buhner** on the call and **Brad Adam** serving as dugout reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** and Mariners.com with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.**

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners won yesterday's game over the White Sox by a 6-5 final to improve to 7-1 in rubber matches on the season...Seattle is 20-11 (.645) over its last 31 games and 24-12 (.667) over its last 36 games, tied for the best record in MLB since April 9 (also: Detroit, .667/26-13).

- **Best In The West** - Seattle is in first place in the American League West, 3.5 games ahead of the Astros and 4.0 games ahead of the Rangers.
- **Series-ly Solid** - The Mariners own a 11-4-1 series record, 4-3-1 at home and 7-1 on the road...the Mariners won 9 consecutive series from April 7-May 7, the second-longest series winning streak in club history...since **Dan Wilson** took the helm on Aug. 23, 2024, Seattle owns a 18-6-3 series record.
- **Rising Tide** - The Mariners are a season-high tying 8 games above the .500 mark.
- **Home Runs Are Good** - Seattle is 26-11 (.703) in games with at least one home run...they are 2-9 (.182) in games when they do not homer.
- **Yesterday's Roster Moves** - The Mariners yesterday selected RHP **Jesse Hahn**, while RHP Casey Lawrence was designated for assignment.

FURIOUS GEORGE RETURNS...today the Mariners activated RHP **George Kirby** from the 15-day Injured List (right shoulder inflammation) and optioned RHP **Troy Taylor** to Triple-A Tacoma (post-game May 21)...Kirby will make his season debut tonight when he starts against Houston...last season, Kirby led all qualified MLB starters for the second consecutive year in both strikeout-to-walk ratio (7.78) and walks-per-9-innings (1.1), becoming the first pitcher to lead the Majors in both categories since Cliff Lee in 2012-13.

LATE AND CLUTCH...yesterday outfielder **Leody Taveras** hit the game-winning 2-run home run in the 8th inning, the Mariners 7th go-ahead or game-tying home run in the 7th-inning or later this season, tied for the most in the Majors...**Randy Arozarena** (2x, 3/27 vs. ATH and 4/17 at CIN) and **Cal Raleigh** (2x, 4/11 vs. TEX and 5/17 at SD) each are tied for the most such home runs in the Majors this season, while **Jorge Polanco** (3/27 vs. ATH) and **Ben Williamson** (4/19 at TOR) each have one...Seattle's 83 go-ahead or game-tying home runs in the 7th inning or later lead the Majors since 2021...the Mariners have also recorded 23 go-ahead or game-tying plate appearances in the 7th-inning or later this season, tied for the most in the Majors (also: Phillies).

HORS D'OEUVRES...Seattle starting pitchers over their last 8 games (5/13-c) are 3-0 with an MLB-leading 1.43 ERA (7 ER, 44.0 IP), ranking ahead of the Pirates (2.00 ERA) during that span...Seattle starters **Luis Castillo** 1-0, 0.69 ERA (1 ER, 13.0 IP), **Bryan Woo** 1-0, 0.68 ERA (1 ER, 13.1 IP), **Logan Evans** 1-0, 3.00 ERA (4 ER, 12.0 IP), **Emerson Hancock** 0-0, 1.93 ERA (1 ER, 4.2 IP) and opener **Casey Legumina** 0-0, 0.00 ERA (0 ER, 1.0 IP) have all contributed during that span while **Logan Gilbert** and **Bryce Miller** are currently on the 15-day Injured List and **George Kirby** is set to make his season debut today.

DUMPED ON...Cal Raleigh reached base 4 times yesterday, including a game-tying home run in the 6th inning...he has a .954 OPS this season, hitting .249 (43x173) with 32 runs, 10 doubles, 16 homers, 33 RBI, 32 walks and 5 stolen bases, getting on base at a .370 clip and slugging .584...Cal is tied for the AL lead in home runs with Aaron Judge-NYY...among MLB catchers with at least 100 PA, Cal leads the Majors in home runs, runs, RBI, walks, total bases (101), extra-base hits (26), times on base (77) fWAR (2.8) and bWAR (2.6), while ranking 6th in OBP, 2nd in slugging and 3rd in OPS.

THE BEST CLOSER IN BASEBALL...right-hander **Andrés Muñoz** earned his MLB-leading 16th save of the season yesterday...in 22 appearances this season, the reigning American League Reliever of the Month is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER, 21.2 IP) with 8 hits allowed, 2 runs allowed (0 earned runs), 8 walks (2 intentional) and 28 strikeouts, sporting a 0.74 WHIP, while limiting opponents to a .113 batting average (8x71)...Muñoz leads MLB relief pitchers with 2.0 Wins Above Replacement (*Baseball-Reference*).

'PEN PALS...the Mariners bullpen is 13-8 with 17 saves and a 3.35 ERA (69 ER, 185.1 IP) this season, the 8th-best ERA among MLB bullpens...aside from star closer **Andrés Muñoz**, Seattle has gotten major contributions from **Gabe Speier** (2.37 ERA in 22 games), **Carlos Vargas** (3.38 ERA in 20 games), **Collin Snider** (3.80 ERA in 19 games), **Casey Legumina** (1.62 ERA in 17 games) and **Matt Brash** (0.00 ERA in 5 games).

ROAD WARRIORS...the Mariners are 15-9 (.625) on the road this season, best road record in the Majors, ranking ahead of the Cubs (.600/15-10)...Seattle has won 7-consecutive road series since dropping their first one at San Francisco from April 4-6...since then, the Mariners have captured series victories on the road at Cincinnati (2-1), Toronto (2-1), Boston (2-1), Texas (2-1), against the Athletics (2-1), against the Padres (3-0) and the White Sox (2-1)...the Mariners last won 7+ consecutive road series during the 2023 season, when they won 8 consecutive road series from July 3-Aug. 23.

ALL ABOARD ON THE ROAD...Seattle hitters hold a .346 OBP and have recorded 108 walks in road games this season, the 2nd highest mark in both categories among all Major League teams, trailing only the New York Mets (.355 OBP, 110 BB)...among Major League batters (min. 50 PA on the road), **Cal Raleigh** ranks 4th with 19 walks and **J.P. Crawford** ranks T-5th with 18...Crawford also holds a .434 OBP on the road, which ranks 4th.

NEXT HOMESTAND...following the last leg of the 10-game road trip in Houston and an off-day on Monday, the Mariners return to T-Mobile Park for a 9-game homestand where they will host the Washington Nationals (3 G, 5/27-5/29), Minnesota Twins (3 G, 5/30-6/1) and Baltimore Orioles (3 G, 6/3-6/5)...the homestand is highlighted by **Randy Arozarena Bobblehead 3-Day Giveaway** from May 27-29, **K-Pop Fireworks Night** on May 30, **Little League Day** on June 1, **Pride Night** on June 4 and a pair of **Mariners Value Games** on June 3 and June 5, with tickets starting at \$11.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Julio Rodríguez** hit a 3-run home run in the first inning yesterday, becoming the first Mariners player to hit a 3-run home run and a grand slam in the same series since Jake Fraley (June 3 and 5, 2021 at LAA), and...**YOU MAY ALSO KNOW?**...in 18 games in May, Julio is batting .270 (20x74) with 11 runs, 1 double, 5 home runs, 14 RBI and a .794 OPS, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that Julio has been one of the game's elite centerfielders since he entered the league in 2022, ranking 3rd among MLB centerfielders and 5th among all outfielders with 34 outs above average (*Baseball Savant*)?...he has been stellar defensively again this season, ranking tied for 2nd among AL outfielders with 5 outs above average.

ABOUT GEORGE KIRBY...

- 27-year-old right-hander is making his season debut...he is also making his 90th career start and 8th against the Astros.
- Is in his 4th season with Seattle; selected by the Mariners in the first round (20th overall) of the 2019 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Ty Holub.
- Named to his 1st All-Star team in 2023.
- Named AL Rookie of the Month in August 2022 after posting a 2.15 ERA and 5-0 record.
- Is the highest drafted player out of Elon University.

LAST TIME OUT...ND in his last rehab start with Triple-A Tacoma on May 16...he allowed 4 runs on 10 hits (2 HR), with no walks and 4 strikeouts across 4.0 innings of work...he threw 3 rehab starts with the Rainiers.

BEEN AWHILE...this will mark his 1st Major League start of the season and his first ML start since Sept. 25, 2024 when he pitched 6.0 innings of 1-run baseball against the Astros, allowing 4 hits, 1 walk, and striking out 6 batters.

MESSIN' WITH TEXAS...is 3-0 with a 1.55 ERA (7 ER, 40.2 IP) and 37 strikeouts against the Houston Astros across 7 starts...is 10-0 with a 1.32 ERA (14 ER, 95.1 IP) and 82 strikeouts against Texas teams (Astros and Rangers) across 16 career starts.

IN THE LONE STAR STATE...is 4-0 with a 2.45 ERA (11 ER, 40.1 IP) across 7 career starts in the state of Texas...in road games against the Astros and Rangers, he has allowed a combined 35 hits while collecting 31 strikeouts...holds a 1.99 ERA (5 ER, 22.2 IP) across 4 starts at Houston's Daikin Park.

IN HIS OWN WORDS

"First off, I like the atmosphere here. ... So it's just fun. It's a fun challenge. Every time we come here or they come [to Seattle], I love it."

BEST VS. THE WEST...holds a 19-4 record against AL West teams, including a 2.55 ERA (53 ER, 187.1 IP) across 32 career starts...he has allowed 162 hits, 12 home runs and 23 walks with 178 strikeouts against AL West teams...his 2.55 ERA is his best career mark against any division and is the 2nd-best ERA by a pitcher against the AL West since 1969 (min. 32 GS), trailing Pedro Martinez' MLB-leading 1.92 ERA (78 ER, 366.0 IP).

2024 TOTALS...went 14-11 with a 3.53 ERA (75 ER, 191 IP) with 23 walks and 179 strikeouts in the 2024 season...he also limited opponents to a .245 batting average with a 1.068 WHIP across a career-high 33 starts...he also set career-high marks in wins (14), innings pitched (191) and strikeouts (179).

KING GEORGE...led the Majors in SO/BB ratio (7.78) for the 2nd straight season, becoming the 1st pitcher to do that since Cliff Lee in 2012-13...Kirby also led the Majors in fewest walks-per-9 innings (1.1) for the 2nd straight season, also the first to do that since Lee in 2012-13.

QUALITY STUFF...recorded 20 quality starts (for the 2nd consecutive season, becoming 1 of 3 pitchers in MLB with 20+ starts in each of the last 2 years (also: Logan Webb-SF and Zack Wheeler-PHI)...Kirby is 1 of 8 pitchers to record multiple 20+ quality start seasons with Seattle, joining Felix Hernandez (7x), Jamie Moyer (5x), Randy Johnson (4x), Mark Langston (3x), Mike Moore (3x), Erik Hanson (2x) and Jason Vargas (2x).

MORE QUALITY STUFF...recorded 9 consecutive quality starts from June 9-July 26, longest quality start streak of his career and 4th-longest in MLB... he has completed 6.0 innings in 56 of his 89 career starts and 22 games in his 33 starts in 2024...last season, the Mariners went 14-8 in games that Kirby pitched 6.0+ innings, compared to their 2-9 record when he went less than 6.0 innings.
