RAY REPORT—The Rays continue a six-game, seven-day road trip against the Red Sox (2-1) and Blue Jays (three to play) tonight at Rogers Centre...have won eight of nine, 14 of 16, and 24 of their last 32 games...are a season-high-tying 13 games over .500 for the second time (also: 25-12 on May 7)...have won 10 of their last 14 road games since a 2-5 start...since April 4, they own the majors' best record (24-8/.750) and ERA (2.94)...own MLB's second-best record behind the Braves (28-13)...marks their first time leading the AL after calendar flips to May since July 18, 2023 (60-38)...are off to their fourth-best start in franchise history (see table on the right)...have led the AL East for two straight days...overall, they have spent eight days atop the division, 25 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth.

- The Rays claimed yesterday's rubber match at Fenway Park, 4-1...it was their MLB-leading 11th time holding an opponent to one or zero runs, seven of which have come in their last 11 games (April 28-pres)...their only extra-base hit was a **Junior Caminero** solo homer in the 1st inning, marking their majors-leading eighth win when tallying 1 or 0 XBH.
- The Rays have won nine straight and 19 of the last 20 games in which they scored four runs or more...their AL-best 20-4 (.833) record when plating four or more ranks fifth in MLB.
- Rays pitching has allowed three earned runs or fewer in a franchise-record 16 straight games (April 22-pres.) — see "The Ray Way" note below for more.
- Rays batters have recorded 3 XBH or fewer in 13 straight games, tied for the ninth-longest streak in franchise history, but have gone 11-2 in that span...on the year, they have tallied the fewest extra-base hits in the majors (84), but their AL-leading .279 (89-for-319) RISP average ranks fourth behind the Braves (.295), Brewers (.289), and Diamondbacks (.286).
- Through 39 games, Rays opponents have combined for a .511 winning pct., the fourth-hardest strength of schedule in the AL behind the Rangers (.534), Guardians (.519), and Angels (.512)...their remaining opponents have a combined winning pct. of .477—only the Rangers (.470) and Guardians (.476) have easier remaining schedules in all of MLB...including this series, only three of the Rays 18 sets before the All-Star break will come against clubs that currently have winning records: May 22-24 at NYY, June 15-17 at LAD, and July 6-9 vs. NYY.
- The Rays are in the midst of 10 consecutive games vs. AL East opponents, winning five of six thus far...with a win tonight, they would become the first AL East team to win nine of their first 10 games against divisional foes since the 1992 Blue Jays (9-1), according to MLB Network.
- The Rays are the sixth AL club to win 18 of their first 21 games vs. AL opponents, joining the 1987 Brewers (18-3), 1984 Tigers (19-2), 1981 Athletics (18-3), 1946 Red Sox (18-3), and 1911 Tigers (19-2)...in the modern era (since 1900), four NL clubs have turned the trick in intraleague games: the 1955 Brooklyn Dodgers (19-2), 1938 and 1918 New York Giants (both 18-3), and 1902 Pirates (18-3).

RECENT TRANSACTIONS—Earlier today, OF **Justyn-Henry Malloy** cleared waivers and was outrighted to Triple-A Durham.

SERIES-LY SPEAKING—The Rays have won five straight series, their longest streak since June 18-July 4, 2024 (also 5), and are 7-2-0 in their last nine sets on the heels of dropping three of their first four series...in team history, they have won six consecutive sets (or more) on six separate occasions, most recently from Aug. 11-30, 2023 (6)...they lead the majors with five sweeps, three of which have come in their last five series, and have won six of seven series against clubs that entered with a sub-.500 record...the Rays have won all seven of their series vs. AL opponents, the majors' longest streak to open a season since the 2005 World Champion White Sox (7)...they are the first team to win each of their first seven intraleague sets since the 2022 Mets (7), with the last longer streaks belonging to the 2018 Diamondbacks (9) and 2001 Mariners (9), according to Stats Perform...the seven-series run is tied for the Rays fourth longest vs. AL clubs at any point in a season, with their last longer streak being an eight-series stretch from Aug. 20-Sept. 19, 2018...the franchise record is 14 straight sets (June 24-Aug. 25, 2013).

- The Rays have won five straight series openers, their longest streak since Aug. 25-Sept. 9, 2025 (5)...their last longer streak was 10 straight from May 23-June 24, 2025—that stretch was the second longest in team history and one shy of the franchise record (11G) established from April 21-May 26, 2023...their 9-4 (.692) record in openers is tied for second in MLB behind the Yankees (10-3/.769).

LA MÁXIMA—**Junior Caminero** homered twice last series at Fenway Park to bring his season total to 11 HR, tied for sixth most in the AL...nine of those homers have come in his last 23 games since April 15, fourth in the AL but 1 HR shy of three co-leaders with 10 HR: **MIN Byron Buxton**, **NYY Aaron Judge**, and **CWS Munetaka Murakami**...an MLB-leading five of his 11 HR have come on pitches outside the strike zone—he had six homers on pitches out of the zone all of last season...he also leads the majors with 4 HR that traveled 403 feet or farther, tying **COL Mickey Moniak**.

- Caminero's solo shot in the 1st inning yesterday came on a pitch 115 ft. off the ground, the fourth-lowest pitch resulting in a Rays home run under Statcast (since 2015)...it trails only **Corey Dickerson** (0.82 ft.) on Oct. 1, 2016 at TEX, Caminero earlier this season on April 5 at MIN (1.04 ft.), and **Brad Miller** (1.08 ft.) on June 11, 2016 vs. HOU...he has gone deep on two of the four lowest pitches resulting in home runs in MLB this season, with only **ATL Drake Baldwin** (0.99 ft. on April 21 at WSH) and **DET Kerry Carpenter** (1.00 ft. on April 12 vs. MIA) homering on pitches closer to the ground.
- The Rays are 9-1 when Caminero homers, including four straight wins, and 40-18 in his career.
- His .960 slugging pct. vs. four-seam fastballs ranks second in MLB to NYY **Ben Rice** (1.033)...he has 4 HR off four-seamers and has struck out against them only six times.
- The 22-year-old has 63 HR in 243 career games, tied for 12th most in MLB history through such a span and the most since HOU **Jordan Alvarez** had 64 HR (2019-22)...the only Dominican-born players with more long balls through 243 games are **Gary Sánchez** (67) and **Fernando Tatís Jr.** (75).

THE RAY WAY—The Rays staff has yielded 3 ER or fewer in a franchise-record 16 consecutive games...it marks longest streak in the majors since the 2010 Giants (18G from Sept. 5-24, 2010) en route to a World Series title...in the divisional era (since 1969), only the 2010 Giants and 1981 Yankees (18G from Aug. 22-Sept. 1 [G1]) have streaks longer than the Rays...since earned runs became an official statistic in both leagues in 1913, MLB's longest streak is 21 games, set by the 1917 White Sox from May 12-June 8...there have been 23 streaks of 17 games or more and 15 of 18 games or more, and six of 19 games or more.

- The Rays have yielded 24 runs during the 16-game streak, fewest over any 16-game span in club history...since 1993, only the 2025 Guardians (23R from Sept. 5-20 [G2]) have permitted fewer runs over a 16-game span in all of MLB...in the live-ball era (since 1920), the Rays are the seventh AL team to turn the trick (see table on the right).
- The rotation paces the majors in WHIP (1.09) and opp. on-base pct. (.273) while ranking third in ERA (3.11) behind the Braves (3.03) and Yankees (3.07)...this includes an MLB-best 1.67 ERA (86.0IP, 16ER) in their last 16 outings (April 22-pres.).
- The Rays bullpen has thrown 7.2 straight scoreless innings and has permitted one run in their last 29.0 IP and two in their last 44.1 IP...the pen's 0.95 ERA (56.2IP, 15ER) over the last 16 games leads the majors (April 22-pres.), with the Guardians (2.38) being the next closest team...they entered that stretch with a 5.61 ERA (96.1IP, 60ER), 27th in MLB (Opening Day-April 21).
- Over the last 11 games, Rays pitching has held opponents to 3 HR (0.28 HR/9.0IP)...they allowed 37 HR in their first 28 games (1.32 HR/9.0IP), tied for fourth most in the majors (OD-April 27).

O. CANADA—The Rays and Blue Jays continue a stretch of six meetings in a 10-day span (May 4-13) tonight...the Rays swept the Jays in three games from May 4-6 at Tropicana Field to complete a 6-0 homestand...they need to go 4-6 or better over the next 10 matchups for a season series win...they have won eight straight season sets over Toronto since 2018, 10 in 11 seasons under **Kevin Cash** (since 2015), and 16 in 18 seasons since becoming the Rays in 2008...the eight-season streak is tied for the longest over a single opponent in franchise history, matching another eight-year run over the Angels (2016-24), and is tied for the fourth-longest active streak in the majors by one team over a single opponent, trailing ATL over MIA (11), CHC over PIT (11), and NYY over KC (10), according to Stats Perform...the Rays were swept in their last visit to Rogers Centre (Sept. 26-28, 2025), their first three-game losing streak in Toronto since Sept. 15, 2021-July 1, 2022 (also 3G)...they haven't lost four straight games in Canada since July 19-Sept. 21, 2015 (4G)...they have won four of their last five sets north of the border (Sept. 29, 2023-pres.).

- Junior Caminero** has hit safely in each of his nine career games at Rogers Centre, going 13-for-38 (.342) with 3 HR and 10 RBI...it ties the eighth-longest career-opening streak by a Ray at this ballpark and is the longest since **Manuel Margot** (10G) from 2021-23...Caminero recorded his first career home run (Oct. 1, 2023) and grand slam (May 13, 2025) in this venue.

DOWN ON THE FARM—Today, Class-A Charleston RHP **Aidan Cremarosa** was named Carolina League Pitcher of the Week for May 4-10...he threw the seventh nine-inning no-hitter by a Rays farmhand on May 8 at Augusta, including the first since **Justin Marks** on July 16, 2016 for Triple-A Durham.

TONIGHT'S START—Drew Rasmussen takes the mound against the Blue Jays for his eighth start of the 2026 season...marks his 138th career appearance (89th start) and 13th opposite Toronto (11th start).

- ✦ Min. 30.0 IP, Rasmussen ranks highly among major league pitchers in walks per 9.0 IP (2nd, 1.47), strikeout-to-walk ratio (5th, 6.17), and WHIP (9th, 0.93).
- ✦ Is one of six Rays pitchers (min. 10.0IP) holding opponents to a .200 batting average or lower (.200), joining Hunter Bigge (.111), Kevin Kelly (.159), Bryan Baker (.175), Shane McClanahan (.183), and Joe Boyle (.190).
- ✦ Rasmussen has gone 45 straight regular-season starts (April 30-pres.) with four runs or fewer allowed, good for the longest run in franchise history by a traditional starter, surpassing McClanahan (44G, April 29, 2021–July 26, 2022) and the longest active streak in the majors...he is 11 starts behind Ryne Stanek (56G, May 26, 2018–July 16, 2019) for the longest streak by any starter in franchise history.

LAST TIME OUT—Rasmussen recorded his third quality start of the season on May 5 vs. TOR (6.0IP, 7H, 3ER, BB, 5SO, HR), surrendering a 1st inning homer to Kazuma Okamoto and an RBI-single to Andrés Gimenez in the 2nd inning before retiring 12 of his final 17 batters faced...allowed a season-high seven hits, the most hits he has given up in any of his last 24 starts dating back to June 14, 2025 at NYM (7H)...also matched his season high in innings pitched (6.0IP).

- ✦ Fired first-pitch strikes to 17 of 25 batters faced.

TAKING FLIGHT—Over 12 career appearances (10 starts) against the Blue Jays, Rasmussen is 2-4 with a 2.84 ERA (57.0 IP, 18 ER), 35 strikeouts, a .240 opp. batting average (49-for-204), and a 1.23 WHIP...Toronto hitters have reached base at a .297 clip...in 10 starts against the club, he owns a 3.06 ERA (53.0 IP, 18 ER)...four of his last six starts against the Jays have been quality, with all four quality starts coming at home.

- ✦ Four of Rasmussen's 10 career starts against Toronto have come at Rogers Centre...he is 1-2 with a 5.00 ERA (18.0IP, 10ER), posting a .313 opp. average (21-for-67) and a 1.61 WHIP...among the 29 MLB ballparks he has pitched in, Rogers Centre is one of 16 in which he has recorded at least one win (1-2) and one of 12 where he has totaled 10 strikeouts or more.
- ✦ With a quality start tonight, it would mark his fifth career quality start against Toronto, breaking a tie with the Yankees (4) for his most against any AL East club.

ALL DIVISIONAL—Will be making his 41st career appearance and 31st start against an AL East opponent, going 9-3 with a 2.43 ERA (166.1 IP, 45 ER) and 142 strikeouts...his ERA and strikeout total against the AL East are both his best marks against any other division.

- ✦ Has already faced two AL East opponents this season, turning in quality starts in both outings...earned the win on April 12 vs. NYY after tossing 6.0 scoreless innings, allowing just one hit while striking out seven...did not factor into the decision on May 5 against Toronto...tonight marks his first road start against an AL East opponent since Sept. 25, 2025 at BAL.
- ✦ Rasmussen's nine wins against AL East opponents are tied for his most against any division, matching his 9-3 mark against the AL West.

ROAD RHYTHM—Rasmussen is making his fifth start on the road this season...is still searching for his first win away from home, but he has gone 5.0 IP or more with 2 ER in three of his four road outings.

- ✦ Across 23 career starts on the road, Rasmussen has a 17-8 record with a 3.13 ERA (241.2IP, 84ER) and 224 strikeouts compared to a 15-10 career record with a 2.68 ERA (255.2IP, 76ER) and 241 strikeouts.
- ✦ Rasmussen's 17 career road wins are seventh most in franchise history among right-handed pitchers, two shy of sixth-ranked Jake Odorizzi (19)...min. 15 decisions, his .708 (17-7) winning pct. on the road as a Ray is the best in franchise history.

AMONG THE BEST—Through his first seven starts of the campaign, he has held hitters to a .200 (28-for-140) average while recording a 0.93 WHIP...among AL pitchers with 25.0 IP or more, his WHIP ranks third in the majors behind NYY Cam Schlitler and TEX Jacob deGrom and his .200 opp. average ranks 10th...opposing hitters are reaching base at a .231 clip against him, second lowest in the majors behind Schlitler (.214).

- ✦ Right-handers have slashed .128/.128/.227 (6-for-47) against him this season, with his .128 opp. average ranking second in the majors behind PIT Mitch Keller's .123 opp. average (min. 25.0IP).

MAY MOMENTUM—Eight of Rasmussen's 32 career wins have come during May, his most across any month...has limited opposing hitters to a .193 batting average during May, his lowest mark across any month (min. 15.0IP)...his 2.30 ERA (82.1IP, 21ER) during May is his second lowest of any month, followed by his 2.03 ERA (102.0IP, 23ER) during August.

RALLYING FOR RAS—Rasmussen has received three runs of support or more in 43 of his 88 career appearances...in those 43 outings, he holds a 30-0 record, 1.92 ERA (225.1IP, 48ER), a .193/.236/.279 (157-for-813) opponent slash line, 0.88 WHIP, and 217 strikeouts to 42 walks...in starts where he receives three runs of support or more, his teams are 42-6.

LEADING THE WAY—Rasmussen paced the Rays rotation and ranked fourth in the AL (min. 150.0IP) with a 2.76 ERA (150.0IP, 46ER) last season, trailing only DET Tarik Skubal (2.21), HOU Hunter Brown (2.43), and BOS Garrett Crochet (2.59)...under the same parameter, he also ranked among AL leaders in WHIP (4th, 1.02), opp. slugging pct. (5th, .340), ground ball rate (5th, 49.0%), opp. OPS (6th, .611), opp. on-base pct. (6th, .271), fewest pitches per IP (6th, 15.4), opp. average (7th, .221), walks per 9.0 IP (8th, 2.22), and strikeout-to-walk ratio (10th, 3.43).

- ✦ In 2025, he became the fourth Rays pitcher (5x) to record a sub-3.00 ERA while making 30 starts or more, joining Cy Young winners Blake Snell (1.89) in 2018 and David Price (2.56) in 2012, James Shields (2.82) in 2011 and Price
