METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets bounced back with a 10-8 victory over the Tigers yesterday...The Mets are on the last leg of a stretch of 16 straight games...The team is 8-6 in that span...The Mets are in the midst of their penultimate road trip of the season, a 10-game trip (1-0) against Detroit (1-0), Cincinnati (three games) and Philadelphia (four games).

JUAN OF A KIND: According to @OptaStats, Juan Soto became the only player in the modern era to hit a go-ahead grand slam and a go-ahead multi-run triple in the same game...Over his last four games, Soto has four home runs, one triple, three stolen bases & 11 RBI...Since RBI became official in 1920, only one other MLB player has reached those marks over a four-game span (Ryan Klesko in May 2001).

25/25 GOING ON 30/30: Juan Soto (36 HR/26 SB) and Francisco Lindor (26 HR/27 SB) join Howard Johnson (36 HR/32 SB) and Darryl Strawberry (39 HR/36 SB) in 1987 as the only pair of Mets teammates to have a 25/25 season...Along with the 1987 Mets, the 1996 Rockies are the only other team that featured two players with a 30/30 season - Dante Bichette (31 HR/31 SB) and Ellis Burks (40 HR/32 SB).

AND I WOULD WALK 100 MILES: Juan Soto has recorded a Major League-leading 113 walks this year...He recorded his sixth season with 100+ walks and became the second Mets player to break the 100 walk barrier...John Olerud recorded 125 walks during the 1999 season.

THIS ONE GOES TO 11: Soto has safely reached base in 11 straight games...He is batting .378 (14-37) in that span with one triple, five homers, 15 walks, six steals, a .566 OBP and an .838 SLG...He has safely reached base in 28 of his last 29 games, batting .288/.449/.625 in that span with one triple, 11 homers, 28 RBI, 29 walks, 11 steals and a 1.074 OPS.

INTERGALACTIC: Pete Alonso has hit a franchise-record 65 home runs in Interleague Play...His 65 home runs are the fourth-most all-time...It is third-most among active players...Only Aaron Judge (82) and Kyle Schwarber (78) have hit more.

THE 7.0 LINE: McLean is the first Major League pitcher to record two 7.0+ IP games in his first three career games since Sixto Sánchez in 2020...He is one of eight Mets pitchers to have multiple 7.0 IP games in three career games and the first since Dillon Gee (2010)...They join Gary Gentry (3 - 1969), Bill Graham (1967), Tom Seaver (1967), Walt Terrell (1982), Jason Isringhausen (1995) and Bill Pulsipher (1995).

TIGERS-METS NOTES: The Mets last visited Detroit in May of 2023...The Mets have dropped six of their last eight in the Motor City...New York is 5-8 lifetime at Comerica Park.

STEAL THIS BASE: The Mets have stolen 120 bases this season, which ranks fifth in the majors and third in the National League...The team's 89.6 stolen base percentage is the best in The Show and the highest in franchise history...The team's 120 steals is their most since they stole 130 in 2011.

LIGHTNING MCLEAN: On August 27 vs. Philadelphia, Nolan McLean threw 8.0 shutout innings and earned his third win in as many career games...He became the first Met ever to record a win in each of his first three games...He's the first Met to complete at least 8.0+ innings within his first three career games since Jon Niese in 2008...McLean became the first pitcher since Brian Johnson in 2017 to have an outing of 8.0+ scoreless innings and zero walks in his first three career games and the first Met to do so since Jason Jacome (9.0 IP/0 BB on 7/7/94)...He joins Jacome, Eric Hillman (8/11/92) and Dennis Ribant (8/17/64) as the only franchise pitchers to do so...His 20.1 innings are the most through a player's first three career games since Andrew Moore and Ben Lively both recorded 21.0 innings through as many games in 2017.

THREE'S COMPANY: In three career starts, McLean has gone 3-0 with a 0.89 ERA (2 ER/20.1 IP) and 21 strikeouts...His 21 strikeouts are tied with Kodai Senga for the second-most by a Mets pitcher in franchise history through three career games (most: Matt Harvey - 23 K)...His 11.0 scoreless inning streak is the longest by a Mets rookie since José Buttó (11.2 IP from 5/14-7/22/24)...Courtesy of Elias...He has been scoreless in all but two innings in his career thus far...He is the first pitcher to allow two earned runs or less in their first three career starts while pitching at least 20.0 innings since Cody Anderson in 2015 (2 ER/23.2 IP).

EIGHT IS GREAT: Since the mound was moved back in 1968, McLean is one of eight pitchers to record at least 20 strikeouts and two or fewer earned runs in their first three career starts, joining Tanner Houck (2020), Fernando Romero (2018), Eduardo Rodríguez (2015), Félix Hernández (2005), Vicente Padilla (2002), Fernando Valenzuela (1981) and Wayne Simpson (1970).

THEY'RE OUT OF OUR LEAGUE: This year marked the first time in franchise history that the Mets opened their home and road schedule against an Interleague Opponent...The Mets are 22-21 in Interleague Play this season...The team went 24-22 in Interleague Play last year.

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his third consecutive win after tossing 8.0 scoreless innings on August 27 vs. Philadelphia...Recorded six strikeouts and didn't issue any walks...He has recorded at least six strikeouts in all three of his starts and he hasn't allowed a walk in each of his last two starts...He is one 11 pitchers since 2020 to record at least 21 strikeouts through his first three starts and he is the second pitcher to do so this season (also: Logan Henderson 23, MIL).

ONE OF A KIND: He is the first pitcher in franchise history to record a win in each of his first three career outings...He is just the fifth pitcher in Major League history to record a win, throw at least 5.0 innings, and strikeout out at least six in all three of his first starts...Has recorded 21 strikeouts through his first three games which is tied for the second-most in franchise history behind Matt Harvey's 23...There are four pitchers tied with 26 strikeouts for the most through four starts in franchise history (Tylor Megill 2021, Matt Harvey 2012, Dwight Gooden 1984, Dick Selma, 1965)...Since the mound was moved back in 1968, he is one of eight pitchers to record at least 20 strikeouts and two or fewer earned runs in their first three career starts, joining Tanner Houck (2020), Fernando Romero (2018), Eduardo Rodríguez (2015), Félix Hernández (2005), Vicente Padilla (2002), Fernando Valenzuela (1981) and Wayne Simpson (1970)...His 20.1 IP are the most through a player's first three career games since Andrew Moore and Ben Lively both recorded 21.0 IP through as many games in 2017...McLean's the first Met to throw as many innings in three career games since Bill Pulsipher (21.0 IP - 1995) and Jason Isringhausen (20.2 IP - 1995).

DAZZLING DEBUT: Made his Major League Debut on August 16 vs. Seattle...Earned his first Major League win after tossing 5.1 scoreless innings and striking out eight...He joined Matt Harvey as the only pitchers in Mets history to earn a win, strike out eight or more batters, and allow zero runs in their Major League Debut...His eight strikeouts are tied for the third-most by a Met in their Major League debut (also: Tom Seaver, Bill Denehy, and Kodai Senga)...The only Mets who have recorded more strikeouts in their Major League debut are Harvey (11) and Collin McHugh (9)...Becomes the second pitcher in franchise history to throw at least 5.0 scoreless innings, allow two or fewer hits and strike out eight or more batters in their Major League debut (also: McHugh)...He became the fourth starter in the majors this season to record eight or more strikeouts in their Major League debut (also: Mick Abel 9, Logan Henderson 9, and Chase Burns).

SPIN THAT THING: Through his first two starts he has thrown his sweeper 28.9% of the time and his curveball 18.2% of the time...His curveball averages a league-leading 3,267 RM which is the most anyone generates on a curveball and any pitch this season...He has generated a 25.0 whiff rate on his sweeper and a 41.7% whiff rate on his curveball...11 of his strikeouts this season have come via the curveball/sweeper and in at-bats ending with either of those pitches opposing batters are hitting .173 (4-23)...In the minors, he threw his sweeper 28.4% of the time and recorded 51 swings and misses with the pitch...Opposing hitters only hit .186 (17-91) in at-bats ending with his sweeper.

WELCOME TO THE SHOW: He became the sixth player (fifth pitcher) to make his MLB debut with the Mets this season, joining Hayden Senger, Alex Carrillo, Justin Hagenman, Jonathan Pintaro and Blade Tidwell...He is also the 43rd pitcher the Mets have used this season which is a franchise record topping the previous high of 42 in 2021.

MINOR LEAGUE RECAP: The Mets number three prospect and the number 37 prospect in baseball according to MLBPipeline.com, appeared in 21 games between Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse and posted a 2.45 ERA (31 ER/113.2 IP)...He recorded 127 strikeouts over those 113.2 innings, good for a K/9 of 10.06...His 127 strikeouts were the second-most among Mets minor leaguers and the 18th among all minor leaguer players...He has only surrendered two or more earned runs in one of his last 14 appearances.

TWO-WAY COWBOY: The Willow Spring, North Carolina native, was a two-way player during his time at Oklahoma State and during the beginning of his professional career...During his final collegiate season he pitched in 14 games and posted a 3.30 ERA (11 ER/30.0 IP) while batting .250 (31-124) and having a .911 OPS...Overall he finished he career at Oklahoma State with a career .957 OPS and 36 HR...Was originally drafted by Baltimore in the third round of the 2022 draft but decided to return to school and was drafted by the Mets in the third round of the 2023 draft...He hit in his first two professional seasons and overall he finished as a .185 (27-146) hitter with nine home runs and 24 RBI.

LET ME GET A WHIFF: In the minors he had a 12.5% whiff percentage this year...Of his 1,363 pitches, he has generated whiffs at least 20 times with four different pitches in his arsenal...Sweeper (51 pitches), Curveball (30 pitches), sinker (29 pitches), and 4-seam fastball (28 pitches).

CAREER: Overall, in three minor league seasons he has posted a 3.10 ERA (78 ER/226.2 IP) and has recorded 245 strikeouts, good for a K/9 of 9.72In three seasons at Oklahoma State he finished with a 4.55 ERA (29 ER/57.1 IP) and recorded 76 strikeouts good for a K/9 of 11.93.

- Earned his 250th career save after recording the final four outs on September 1 vs. Detroit (1.1 IP, 2 K)...He is the 39th pitcher in Major League history to reach the milestone and he is only one of four active relievers who have reached the milestone (also: Kenley Jansen, Craig Kimbrel, Aroldis Chapman).
- Allowed multiple earned runs in an outing for just the third time this season on August 30 vs. Miami (1.0 IP, 3 H, 2 ER, 3 K, BB)...Was the first time he's allowed multiple runs in an outing since April 11 at the Athletics...He has recorded multiple strikeouts in six of his last eight games.
- Earned his career-high-tying sixth win of the season after getting the final five outs against Philadelphia on August 26 (1.2 IP, 4 K)...Struck out a season high four of the five batters he faced...His four strikeouts were his most in a game since September 22, 2024 vs. Philadelphia.
- Earned his 24th save of the season after tossing 2.0 innings on August 16 vs. Seattle (2 H, ER, 2 K, HR)...It was his fourth career six-out save and second of the season (also: July 12 at KC)...Has allowed two home runs over his last five outings after going 34 consecutive games without allowing a home run (from 4/23-8/4)...The homer marked the first home run he had given up to a right hander in 160 at-bats.
- In 60 Interleague games since joining the Mets in 2019, he has posted a 6-1 record with 30 saves while having a 1.74 ERA (12 ER/62.0 IP) and he has recorded 109 strikeouts during that span for a 15.82 K/9.
- Had 19 consecutive appearances without allowing an earned run from 6/6-8/4, which was tied for the tenth-longest single-season streak in Mets history and his longest such streak since his 21-game span from 6/22-8/17/22.
- Has allowed just five earned runs over his last 41 games, posting a 1.04 ERA (5 ER/43.1 IP) with 12 walks and 66 strikeouts since April 23...During that span, his 1.04 ERA is the third-best in the majors.
- Over 51 games this season, has gone 6-2 with 25 saves, a 1.87 ERA (11 ER/53.0 IP), 18 walks and 81 strikeouts...The Mets are 39-12 in games that Díaz has pitched in...Hitters have posted a .169 (31-183) average against Díaz this season...He has recorded six saves this season of four outs or more, which are the most such games in the majors this season...His six saves this season with three-plus strikeouts are tied with Mason Miller and Jeff Hoffman for the most such games in the majors...He has 57 career saves with three or more strikeouts are the most since his debut in 2016...Josh Hader is second with 44.

- On August 4, was named as the NL Reliever of the Month for July after going 2-0 with seven saves and a 0.00 ERA (11.0 IP) over 10 appearances...His 10 Reliever of the Month Awards (five as a Met) are the most by any player since the honor was established in 2005...Was also named the NL Reliever of the Month for May...He is the only pitcher to win a monthly award multiple times this year.
- Among relievers in franchise history, he ranks second in strikeouts (521), third in saves (141), eighth in appearances (322) and tied for seventh in wins (24).
- Became the 11th pitcher in Major League history to record at least 20 saves in at least seven of their first nine seasons (since saves became an official stat in 1969), joining Craig Kimbrel, Jonathan Papelbon, Troy Percival, Trevor Hoffman, Bruce Sutter, Aroldis Chapman, Kenley Jansen, Huston Street, Mariano Rivera and Robb Nen.
- Was named to the 2025 National League All-Star team after going 3-0, 15-for-16 in save opportunities with a 2.22 ERA (7 ER/28.1 IP) in 28 first half appearances...It marks the third time in his career he's gone to the Midsummer classic and the second time as a member of the Mets (also 2022)...Named the Trevor Hoffman NL Reliever of the Year in 2022...Finished ninth in the NL Cy Young Award balloting.
