A LITTLE SOMETHING EXTRA: Dillon Dingler matched his career bests with four hits and two homers while Riley Greene added a three-run blast of his own as the Detroit Tigers last night picked up an 8-6, 10-inning win in the opener of this three game set at the Chicago Cubs ... the Tigers have won three of their first four games of this two-city, six-game road trip that started with a series win at the Angels (2-1) ... the Tigers have won 12 of their last 16 and 17 of their last 26 games.

- The Tigers have gone 25-15 in 40 games starting June 1, good for a .625 winning percentage, the second-best record in the A.L. and the fourth-best mark in baseball in this span.
- With a win tonight or tomorrow, the Tigers would notch a fourth road series win in a row for the first time since a five-series road win streak from May 1-June 1, 2025.
- The Tigers return to Detroit for a seven-game homestand starting Thursday against the Kansas City Royals (four games) and the Baltimore Orioles (three games starting Monday).

FEELING 100: The Tigers last night completed their 100th game of the season with a 47-53 record ... a year ago, the Tigers were 60-40 through 100 games with an 11.0-game lead in the A.L. Central.

- The Tigers have played exactly 50 games at home and 50 games on the road ... the Tigers are 27-23 at home but 20-30 on the road, a .400 winning percentage, fifth-lowest in the majors.
- The Tigers are 10-14 in games decided by two runs or less at home ... the Tigers are 3-19 in games decided by two runs or less on the road (two wins this trip), a .136 win percentage, the lowest in baseball ... nearly half of Detroit 50 home games (24) and 22 of Detroit's 50 road games have been decided by two runs or less this year (13-33 record overall, last in baseball).
- The Tigers are batting .238 with a .321 on-base percentage, .402 slugging percentage and .723 OPS at home this season, the 17th-best home OPS in baseball ... the club is batting .232 with a .305 on-base, .398 slugging and .703 OPS on the road, the 20th-best road OPS in baseball.
- The Tigers have posted a 3.48 team ERA and .648 team OPS against at home, the fourth-lowest home ERA and fourth-lowest OPS against in baseball ... the club has posted a 3.92 team ERA and .715 team OPS against on the road, the ninth-lowest road OPS against in baseball

RIGHTY TIGHTY LEFTY LOOSY: The Tigers are 13-18 (.419) vs. left-handed pitching this year, the ninth-lowest winning percentage vs. southpaw starters in the majors this season ... last year, the Tigers went 25-17 (.595) vs. left-handed starters, the fourth-best win percentage in baseball.

- Last season, Tigers right-handed hitters led the majors with a team .280 batting average and an .835 OPS vs. left-handed pitching ... this year, Tigers right-handed hitters have a .234 batting average, seventh-to-last in baseball, and a .729 OPS, 16th in baseball, vs. lefties.

IT TAKES A VILLAGE: The Tigers pitching staff has turned in a 2.93 team ERA in its last 39 games starting June 2, the lowest mark in all of baseball (next closest: the Red Sox with a 3.16 team ERA) ... Detroit's starting rotation has a 2.91 ERA starting June 2, best in all of baseball, while the bullpen has a 2.97 ERA, third-best in the majors (the Yankees bullpen leads with a 2.48 team ERA).

NO PANIC! AT THE DISH, OH?: Including two homers with two strikes last night, Dillon Dingler leads the A.L. with 31 RBI with two strikes this year, two shy of Cincinnati's Sal Stewart (33 RBI) for tops in the majors ... Dingler's 11 homers with two strikes rank second in the A.L. behind only Houston's Jordan Alvarez with 15 ... Dingler's .434 slugging percentage with two strikes ranks third in all of baseball ... Dingler also leads the majors with 34 two-out RBI this season.

GET ON WITH IT: Kevin McGonigle has reached base safely 169 times in his first 97 major league games ... he is only the fifth player 21-years-old or younger to reach base safely that many times in his first 97 games of a campaign, joining Rickey Henderson (181, 1981), Alex Rodriguez (185, 1996), Mike Trout (179 in 2012; 180 in 2013) and Juan Soto (171 in 2018; 169 in 2019) ... thanks to Elias.

IT'S GOOD FOR SOMETHING: 21-year-old Kevin McGonigle boasts a 4.8 bWAR this season, the second-best mark by any position player in the A.L. (just behind Bobby Witt Jr., 4.9 bWAR) and the fourth-best mark by any position player in the majors.

- Meanwhile, Dillon Dingler boasts a 4.3 fWAR this season, tied for the fourth-best mark by a position player in baseball and tied for sixth-best overall ... there's no other catcher in Dingler's orbit in all of baseball as the next closest backstop is Shea Langeliers with a 2.5 fWAR.

IT HAS BEEN A GRIND: Through their first 26 games of 2026, the Tigers went 14-12 and woke up on April 24 with a share of first place in the A.L. Central ... in 74 games since, the Tigers have gone 33-41 to drop to 47-53 and fourth place in the division ... Detroit's 33-41 (.446) record starting April 24 is the ninth-lowest winning percentage in baseball in this span.

- Despite going 25-15 starting June 1, the Tigers have lost 28 of their last 55 games, 31 of their last 59 games and 36 of their last 65 games starting May 4.

AND FINALLY: After last night, Dillon Dingler has three games with four hits and two homers this year, the only player in the majors to have three such games in 2026 ... he is the first big leaguer to have three such games in the same season since Minnesota's Nelson Cruz in 2019 ... the last Tiger?: Miguel Cabrera in 2013 ... the last catcher to do so since 1901?: never ... Dingler is the first (Elias).

- Tossed 7.0 strong innings last time out, allowing just one earned run on three hits while striking out nine...has gone at least 5.0 innings in 11 straight starts, since May 5 against Boston.
- Has not pitched for 11 days, going on the Bereavement List on Sunday, July 12 along with the All-Star Break...was added back to Detroit's active roster on July 18.
- Earned his first win since April 19 on June 5 against Seattle, allowing just one earned run on five hits and two walks while striking out five over 5.0 innings.
- Tied his career high allowing eight earned runs including six in the first inning on April 8 against Minnesota...had previously surrendered eight earned runs twice, both with the Astros while facing the Angels.
- Spun six scoreless innings in his home debut and Detroit's home opener on Friday, April 3 against St. Louis.
- Made his Tigers debut on Friday, March 27 against San Diego...allowed one earned run on seven hits and a walk while striking out five over 6.0 innings.
- Signed with the Detroit Tigers as a free agent on Feb. 10, 2026...went 2-0 with a 0.98 ERA in four Spring Training starts for the Tigers.
- In 2025, led the Astros in wins (13) and innings (192)...marked the 3rd-highest win total of his career behind his 17 wins in 2022 and 15 wins in 2024...also led the team in starts alongside RHP Hunter Brown (31).
- Among AL pitchers on the 2025 season, finished 2nd in GB% (59.2), 2nd in opponent GIDP (22), 2nd in GIDP/9 (1.03), 5th in Pitching WAR (4.3), T-5th in quality starts (20), 6th in innings pitched (192.0), T-6th in wins, and 10th in opponent OPS (.667).
- Surpassed 1,000 career strikeouts in his start on July 28, 2025, vs. WSH, finishing the season with 1,053...surpassed 1,000 career innings during his start on July 5 at LAD last season.

- Suffered the loss on July 19 against the Angels, allowing an earned run on a hit and three walks over 1.1 innings...has allowed at least one run in eight of his last 11 outings.
- Was an emergency starter on June 15 against Houston, allowing just one earned run on two hits and two walks while striking out five over 2.2 innings pitched.
- Blew back-to-back save opportunities on May 29 and May 31 against Chicago-AL...allowed three earned runs on five hits over 1.1 innings between the two outings.
- Tossed 3.0 perfect innings and earned the win on May 27 against Los Angeles-AL...continued a stretch of 14.0 consecutive innings over five games dating back to May 13 in which he has not allowed an earned run...has allowed just five hits and four walks compared to 16 strikeouts over this span.
- Earned a six-out save on May 24 against Baltimore, striking out four over his two scoreless frames.
- Made the third big league start of his career on May 20 against Cleveland, his first since Aug. 7, 2021, with the Texas Rangers against the Athletics...tossed 4.2 scoreless frames, allowing just two hits and two walks while striking out a career-high seven batters.
- Earned his first win of the season and second of his major league career on April 30 against Atlanta.
- Earned his first career major league save with 3.1 scoreless innings, allowing two walks while striking out two in a victory over the Marlins on April 11.
- Signed with Detroit on a one-year major league contract with a club option for the 2027 season on Dec. 16, 2025.
- Spent each of the previous two seasons with the SSG Langers of the KBO League...went 12-7 with a 2.25 ERA (43 ER/171.2 IP) in 30 starts for SSG last season, recording 245 strikeouts in his 171.2 innings pitched, an average of 12.8 strikeouts per nine innings.
- Has spent parts of five seasons with the Philadelphia Phillies (2017-19), Chicago White Sox (2020) and Texas Rangers (2021) prior to joining the Tigers this year...also pitched with Hiroshima in the NPB for the 2022-23 campaigns.

- Struck out all four batters he faced in a perfect 1.1 innings on June 23 against the Yankees.
- Blew a save in the eighth inning against Kansas City on May 8 and ninth inning on May 29 against Chicago.
- Earned his first save of the season on April 30 against Atlanta, allowing one hit while striking out one in a scoreless ninth inning...marked his first save with the Tigers since Aug. 16, 2025, at Minnesota.
- Did not allow a run over his first 11 games (11.0 innings) this year, allowing five hits and eight walks while striking out five over that span...his first earned run came on April 24 against Cincinnati in a game in which he struck out four batters over 1.2 frames.
- Re-signed with Detroit on a two-year deal as a free agent on Dec. 20, 2025...appeared in 16 games with the Tigers last season, posting a 3-0 record with a 1.50 ERA (3ER/18IP) with 23 strikeouts.
