HERE'S THE RUB: Tied for the best record in American League, the Detroit Tigers tonight play the rubber match of their three-game series at the Philadelphia Phillies after a pair of dramatic, playoff-type atmospheres in the first two affairs that were split between the clubs ... the Tigers have won five of their last six games and tonight take aim at their 23rd series victory in 36 tries this year.

- The Tigers have posted a 99-66 (.600) record since the beginning of August 2024, good for the best record in the American League and half a game behind the Los Angeles Dodgers (99-65) for the best record in all of baseball ... the Tigers are 5.0 games up on the Astros (94-70), the next-best A.L. club in this past calendar year.
- The Tigers are 99-66 since August 1, 2024, good for a 15.5-game lead on the next best A.L. Central club in that span, the Cleveland Guardians (83-81) ... Detroit's 15.5-game lead in its division since last August 1 is by far the largest in all of baseball and more than double the next-biggest lead held by Houston at +7.0 games in the A.L. West in this span.
- This weekend series represents three of the six games for the Tigers against teams with .500 or better records in all of August... the Tigers also host the Astros August 18-20 ... Detroit plays 22 games this month vs. teams that currently own sub-.500 records.
- After this three-game set in the City of Brotherly Love, the Tigers return to Comerica Park tomorrow for a six-game homestand vs. the Twins (three games) and Angels (three games).

SOUTHERN HOSPITALITY: Detroit boasts a 20-11 (.645) record vs. lefty starters this year, second to only Milwaukee (22) for most wins vs. lefty starters this year and statistically tied with Toronto (19-10) for the second-best record vs. southpaw starters behind only Milwaukee (22-11).

- Collectively, the Tigers have a .772 OPS vs. left-handed pitching this season, the second-highest mark in all of baseball behind only the Yankees (.781).
- Individually, the Tigers have seven players with an OPS greater than .800 vs. left-handed pitchers: Spencer Torkelson (.968), Wenceel Pérez (.957), Zach McKinstry (.934), Gleyber Torres (.924), Dillon Dingler (.876), Jahmai Jones (.825) and Javier Báez (.817).

HE'S WORTH HIS SALT: Charlie Morton tonight makes his 400th career start in his Tigers debut after being acquired from the Orioles at the trade deadline ... he has gone 7-1 with a 3.88 ERA (26 ER/60.1 IP) with 61 strikeouts in his last 11 starts since Memorial Day, just better than one strikeout per inning ... he is one of only four A.L. pitchers with at least seven wins in this span ... he has allowed three earned runs or less in nine of those 11 outings (2.56 ERA in those nine starts), with 11 of his 26 earned runs taking place in the other two starts.

- Morton will become only the fourth active pitcher to reach 400 career starts, joining Justin Verlander (544 starts), Max Scherzer (464) and Clayton Kershaw (442) ... no other active pitcher is within 50 starts of 400 in his career.

THE DEPARTMENT OF GLEYBER: Gleyber Torres has posted an .807 OPS this year, the best OPS by a second baseman in the A.L. this season (Arizona's Ketel Marte leads the majors at .943) ... Torres leads A.L. second basemen with a .374 on-base percentage, ranks second among A.L. second basemen with a .277 batting average and is second in the majors with 54 RBI (leaders have 55 RBI).

GRAND CENTRAL: Despite fret, the Tigers maintain an 8.0-game lead in the A.L. Central, the largest lead within any of the six divisions in baseball and double the next-largest division lead in baseball.

TELL IT TO THE JUDGE: Riley Greene joins New York's Aaron Judge as the only two players in all of baseball to reach 23 doubles, 26 homers and 84 RBI this season ... Greene has those exact totals through 112 team games, which puts him on pace for 33 doubles, 38 homers and 122 RBI in a 162-game season, shattering previous career bests.

CASH IS GREENE: Riley Greene became the first Tigers left-handed hitter with 26 homers by the end of July in 63 years when Norm Cash had 30 homers through the end of July in 1962 ... Greene and Cash, who also had 27 homers thru the end of July in 1961, are the lone left-handed batters in Tigers franchise history with 26 homers by the end of July in any single season.

- Greene was the first Tigers left-handed hitter with 84 RBI by the end of July since Rusty Staub had 86 RBI through July 31, 1978 ... only seven left-handed hitters in Tigers history have reached 84 RBI by the end of July: Riley Greene (2025), Rusty Staub (1978), Norm Cash (1961), Vic Wertz (1949 and 1950), Goose Goslin (1936), Bobby Veach (1921) and Ty Cobb (1911).

THIS DIFFERENCE ISN'T NEGLIGIBLE: The Tigers are tied for the best record in the A.L. on the strength of a +82 overall run differential, trailing only the Yankees (+96) for the best mark in the A.L. ... in the A.L. Central, the Tigers have a +109 edge on the second-place Guardians (-27), are +96 on the third-place Royals (-14) and are +117 on the fourth-place Twins (-35).

AND FINALLY: Javier Báez yesterday became the 31st active player to reach 5,000 career plate appearances ... five of the other 30 players might be in Philadelphia's line-up tonight: Bryce Harper, Nick Castellanos, Trea Turner, J.T. Realmuto and Kyle Schwarber ... Gleyber Torres (4,095 career plate appearances) joins Báez as the lone Tigers with more than 2,000 career plate appearances.
