## SNAKEBITES

THE NL CHAMPS: Last season, the D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth ('99, '01, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23).

LAST GAME: The D-backs lost, 13-0, vs. Tigers.
$\bullet$ Ryne Nelson gave up 8 runs in 4.0 innings.

- Logan Allen tossed 3.0 scoreless innings in relief ( 0 H 0 BB, 4 K).
- Randal Grichuk's fifth-inning double off the center field wall snapped Tigers starter Tarik Skubal's no-hitter and 13 straight batters retired.
- Jake McCarthy and Ketel Marte each had a single.

GALLEN'S UNCORK FOR A CAUSE: Zac Gallen hosted Uncork For A Cause benefitting the Zac Gallen Charitable Fund, his first charity event, Wednesday evening...the 250 guests enjoyed an exclusive wine tasting soiree featuring limited-edition autographed bottles of Zac's very own Sonoma Reserve Red Wine...the event raised $\$ 100,000$ to be donated to St. Mary's Food Bank to ensure children will receive milk during the difficult summer months.

THIS DAY IN D-BACKS HISTORY: On this day in 2004, 40-yearold Randy Johnson tossed a perfect game with 13 strikeouts in a 2-0 win @ Braves.

- It was the 15th perfect game in modern day regular season history (16th including Don Larsen's in the 1956 World Series).
- At 40 years, 251 days, Johnson became the older pitcher in history to record a perfect game, bettering Cy Young, who was 37 years, 37 days on May 5, 1904.

SNAKEBITES: The D-backs are 7-4 in their last 11 games.

- The D-backs, in 1-run decisions, have won 6 of their last 7 such games and are an overall $8-5$ in 1-run games and 11-10 in 1- or 2-run games.

VS. TIGERS: The D-backs are 23-18 all-time vs. Tigers, 11 10 at home.

- Eighth time facing the Tigers at Chase Field (2001, '02, '05, '08, '14, '17, '22).
- Last faced the Tigers last season in Detroit, sweeping a 3-game set from June 9-11 (outscored them 23-11).

STARTERS STALLING OPPONENTS: D-backs starting pitchers have allowed 3 or fewer runs in 8 of their last 10 starts, since May 7 ( 4.58 ERA, 261 opponent average, 19 walks and 40 strikeouts)...of the 29 runs allowed during this stretch, 14 have come in 2 outings while the other 8 games totaled 15 runs.
-When D-backs starting pitchers allow 3 or fewer runs, the team is 19-14.
bWAR(e) OF KETEL: Ketel Marte's 2.7 bWAR is sixth among all players [pitcher or position], behind Mookie Betts/ LAD (3.5), Shohei Ohtani/LAD (3.1), Bobby Witt Jr./KC (3.0), Jarren Duran/BOS (2.8) and Gunnar Henderson/ BAL (2.8).

NEWMAN AT THE DISH: Kevin Newman, in his last 11 games, since May 4, is hitting . 389 (14-for-36)/1.004 OPS with 5 doubles, 1 triple, 2 RBI and 2 walks.

- Had a career-high-tying 4 straight multi-hit games May 11-14 (also: May 23-28, 2023), the team's first such streak this season.

JOC AT HOME: Joc Pederson, among all players at home (min. 50 PA ), is sixth with a . 660 SLG and 10th with a 1.073 OPS.

- In his last 7 home games, is hitting . 321 (9-for-28)/. 964 OPS with 3 doubles, 2 homers and 3 RBI.

MARTE STREAKING: Ketel Marte's season-long 16-game hitting streak is the longest active streak in the Majors and tied for the second-longest streak this season with Marcell Ozuna/ATL, behind Alec Bohm/PHI (18).

- His career best is 16 games (May 16-June 4, 2022; .390, 23-for-59, 72 B, 1 HR, 9 RBI, 5 BB).
- His 10 career hit streaks of $10+$ games are third in team history (Luis Gonzalez-12; Paul Goldschmidt - 11).
- Has hit safely in 11 straight home games at a .370 clip (17-for-46)/1.048 OPS with 4 doubles, 3 homers, 5 RBI and 2 walks.

GRICHUK GAINING STEAM: Randal Grichuk has hit safely in 8 of his last 12 games at a 320 clip (8-for-25) with 2 doubles and 3 RBI.

- With runners in scoring position, is batting .417 (5-for12)/1.067 OPS with 3 doubles and 9 RBI.
bULLPEN HANGING ZEROES: Ryan Thompson has held opponents scoreless in his last 8 games (8.1 IP) and 16 of 18 games overall (2 ER in 18.0 IP ).
$\bullet$ Joe Mantiply has held opponents scoreless in 9 of his last 10 games ( 1 ER in 9.1 IP).
- Justin Martinez has held opponents scoreless in 5 outings in May (6.2 IP) and 9 of 10 overall this season.

DEFENSE RULES: The D-backs are the only team to feature multiple players in the Top 13 among outs above average (OAA) leaders: Christian Walker (T-2nd, 8) and Ketel Marte (T-6th, 6).

- Marte (8 DRS) and Walker (7 DRS) rank tied for fourth and tied for seventh, respectively, in defensive runs saved (DRS).
- The D-backs 12 DRS are fourth in the NL, behind the Dodgers (29), Braves (17) and Cardinals (14).

AT A GLANCE: Sixth season with the D-backs.

- 2023 All-MLB First Team, NL Cy Young finalist and D-backs' Most Valuable Pitcher by the Arizona chapter of the BBWAA for the third time (2020, '22, '23) after going 17-9 with a 3.47 ERA (81 ER in 210.0 IP) and 220 strikeouts over 34 starts.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW: Ninth start of the season, fourth @ home.

- Making his first home start since April 14 vs. Cardinals.
- In his last 2 starts, is 2-0 with a 1.50 ERA (2 ER in 12.0 IP), . 125 opponent average ( 5 -for-40), 0.83 WHIP and 10 strikeouts.
- Limiting opponents to a . 111 average (5-for-45) with 23 strikeouts off his curveball.
- The D-backs have scored a combined 52 runs in his 7 starts this year.

HOME COOKIN:In 3 home games this season, is $3-0$ with a 0.53 ERA ( 1 ER in 17.0 IP), 172 opponent average (10-for-58), 1.00 WHIP, 16 strikeouts, and 0 home runs allowed.

- His 0.53 home ERA is the best among starters in the Majors in 2024 (min. 3 starts), ahead of Cristian Javier/HOU (0.75) and Reynaldo López/ATL (0.77).
- Since the start of the 2022 season, Gallen's 2.32 home ERA (min. 150 IP) is second in the Majors behind Shohei Ohtanin (2.24).
- Dating back to the start of the 2022 season, his 103 opponent average with runners in scoring position at home is second-best in the Majors, behind Jared Jones/PIT (.056) and ahead of Shohei Ohtani/ LAD (.168) and Kodai Senga/NYM (.177).
- Ranks among D-backs pitchers all-time at home (min. 50 starts) in ERA (1st, 2.77), WHIP (1st, 1.05), home runs allowed (T-1st, 34), strikeouts per 9.0 innings (3rd, 10.17), walks (4th, 92), strikeout-towalk ratio (4th, 4.07), wins (6th, 26) and strikeouts (7th, 374).
- In 16 home games in 2023, went 12-3 with a 2.47 ERA (28 ER in 102.0 IP), . 230 opponent average (87-for-378), 1.03 WHIP, 120 strikeouts, and 7 home runs allowed.

NL RANKINGS: Ranks among NL starters in wins (T-4th, 5) and ERA (9th, 2.86).

FRANCHISE RANKINGS: Ranks among D-backs starters in franchise history in ERA (3rd, 3.21), WHIP (5th, 1.10), strikeouts (6th, 731), wins (9th, 43) and quality starts (9th, 63).

AMONG OTHER STARTERS: Since 2022, his 13 starts of $6.0+$ shutout innings, $6+$ strikeouts and 3 -or-fewer hits allowed are the most in the Majors ahead of Corbin Burnes/BAL (12), Blake Snell/SF (11) and Shohei Ohtani/LAD (10).

LAST START: Earned his fifth win of the season on April 12 @ Orioles (2 ER in $6.0 \mathrm{IP}, 4 \mathrm{H}, 2 \mathrm{BB}, 4 \mathrm{~K}$ ).

- Retired 17 of 23 batters faced, including 11 of the first 12.

VS. TIGERS: Second career start vs. Tigers, first @ Chase Field.

- Faced Detroit on June 11, 2023 @ Comerica Park (ND; 5 ER in 5.2 IP).

VS. AL CENTRAL @ HOME: In 4 career home starts ( 1 with Marlins and 3 with D-backs) vs. the AL Central, is 2-1 with a 3.16 ERA (9 ER in 25.2 IP)... the D-backs are 3-0 in those contests.

INTERLEAGUE INSIGHT: In 3 starts vs. the AL in 2024, is 2-1 with a 2.65 ERA (5 ER in 17.0 IP ) and 13 strikeouts.

- In his last 7 home starts vs. the AL, is $5-2$ with a 2.72 ERA ( 13 ER in 43.0 IP) and 51 strikeouts...the D-backs are 5-2 in those contests.

2023 RECAP: Set career highs in virtually all categories, including wins, innings and strikeouts in 2023.

- His combined 243.2 innings in the regular season and postseason combined were 24.0 more innings than any other pitcher.
- Along with Gerrit Cole (209.0 IP, 222 K), were the only pitchers in the Majors in 2023 with 200.0+ innings and 200+ strikeouts.
- In 2023, ranked among qualifying National League leaders in innings pitched (2nd, 210.0), starts (2nd, 34), wins (2nd, 17), strikeouts (3rd, 220), WHIP (6th, 1.12), win percentage (6th, .654), ERA (7th, 3.47) and opponent average (T-9th, .238).

2023 POSTSEASON HIGHLIGHTS: Won the series-clincher in Game 2 of the National League Wild Card @ Brewers (2 ER in 6.0 IP) on Oct. 4, 2023.

- Won Game 2 of the NLDS @ Dodgers (2 ER in 5.1 IP) on Oct. 9, 2023. - In 6 postseason starts, went 2-3 with a 4.54 ERA (17 ER in 33.2 IP), .248 opponent average, 14 walks and 24 strikeouts.
- Game 1 starter for NLCS @ Phillies and World Series @ Rangers.

ALL-MLB FIRST TEAM: Named to the 2023 All-MLB First Team, his first honor, along with Gerrit Cole/Yankees, Shohei Ohtani/Angels, Blake Snell/Padres and Spencer Strider/Braves.

CYYOUNG HOPEFUL: Finished third (68 votes) in 2023 NL Cy Young Award voting behind Blake Snell/SD (204) and Logan Webb/SF (86).

- In 2022 voting, finished fifth ( 45 votes).
- In 2020 voting, finished tied for ninth (2 votes)

ALL-STAR STARTER: Named to his first All-Star Game in 2023 at T-Mobile Park and earned the starting nod...tossed 1.0 scoreless inning with 1 strikeout.

- At 27 years old, became the youngest D-backs pitcher, third overall (fourth time) and first since Curt Schilling (35 in 2002) to start an All-Star Game (also: Randy Johnson; 36 in 2000 and 37 in 2001.
- Was the youngest NL starting pitcher since Matt Harvey/NYM in 2013 (24).

MILKMAN DELIVERED: Tossed his first career 9.0-inning shutout on Sept. 8 @ Cubs with 3 hits allowed and 9 strikeouts.

- Previously had a 7.0-inning, complete-game shutout on April 25 Game 1 @ Braves (7.0 IP, 1 H, 2 BB, 6 K).
- Fourth D-backs pitcher (sixth time) to toss 9.0 or more innings, 0 runs, 3 or fewer hits, 1 or fewer walks and 9 or more strikeouts (also: Curt Schilling on April 10, 2001 and May 14, 2003; Randy Johnson on Sept. 14, 2003 and May 18, 2004; Ian Kennedy on April 25, 2011).

HOW HE STARTED: Cardinals' third-round pick in the 2016 draft out of the University of North Carolina.

- Made his Major League debut on June 20, 2019 for the Marlins @ Cardinals (7-6 win, ND, 5.0 IP, 5 H, 1 R, 2 BB, 6 K).
- Acquired by D-backs on July 31, 2019 from the Marlins.
- Made his D-backs debut on August 7, 2019 vs. Phillies (6-1 win, W, 5.0 IP, 1 H, 0 R, 3 BB, 6 K).
