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NEW YORK METS (48-35) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (33-50)

June 28, 2025 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 4:05 EDT - Game #84/Home #43

RHP Paul Blackburn (0-2, 6.62 ERA) vs. LHP Bailey Falter (6-3, 3.59 ERA)

THE PIRATES: won the first game of this six-game homestand with a 9-1 win over New York (NL) on Friday...Will play two more games against the Mets (today and Sunday) before welcoming St. Louis to town for three games (Monday-Wednesday)...Are 13-11 against the National League East (11-3 at home)...Have gone 41-34 all-time against the Mets here at PNC Park...Are 21-24 since Don Kelly took over as manager on May 8 (have played in 21 one-run games in that span).

CUTCH 2200: Andrew McCutchen's next game will be No. 2200 in his Major League career...McCutchen ranks first among all active Major League players in games played (Cleveland's Carlos Santana, 2154, ranks second)...McCutchen has played 1650 games as a member of the Pirates, the ninth-most in team history (Lloyd Waner, 1803, ranks eighth)...Over his last 17 games (since June 7 vs. Philadelphia), McCutchen is batting .296 (21-for-71) with four doubles, three home runs, nine RBI, two walks and seven runs scored.

HIGH FIVE: Bailey Falter has won a career-high-tying five consecutive decisions (also August 20-September 13, 2022 with Philadelphia) coming into today's start vs. the Mets...Since the streak began on May 9 vs. Atlanta, Falter's 2.44 ERA (48.0ip/13er) ranks seventh in the National League, trailing only Atlanta's Chris Sale (1.14), Philadelphia's Ranger Suárez (1.17), Philadelphia's Zack Wheeler (1.50), teammate Paul Skenes (1.57), Cincinnati's Andrew Abbott (1.58) and San Francisco's Landen Roupp (2.33).

BEASTS AGAINST THE EAST: The Pirates are 13-11 against teams from the National League East this season, including 11-3 here at PNC Park...Pittsburgh has gone 22-9 against the National League East here at PNC Park since the beginning of the 2024 season (7-0-2 in nine series)...The Pirates' last series loss here against the NL East came from September 29-October 1, 2023 vs. Miami.

LET'S GO REYNOLDS: Bryan Reynolds went 2-for-5 with a double, a three-run home run and two runs scored in Friday's win vs. New York (NL)...He moved into a tie with Pedro Alvarez for 13th place on the Pirates' all-time home runs list with 131 bombs (Al Oliver, 135, ranks 12th)...Over his last five games, dating back to June 22 vs. Texas, Reynolds has gone 10-for-22 (.455) with four doubles, a home run, three RBI, a walk and six runs scored.

PHAMTASTIC: Tommy Pham was 1-for-4 with two RBI, a walk and a run scored in Friday's 9-1 victory against the Mets...He has recorded at least one RBI in four consecutive games (since June 22 vs. Texas) for the first time since May 6-10, 2024 with Chicago-AL (also four straight games)...Pham has done that in five consecutive games twice in his career (September 1-7, 2018 with Tampa Bay and August 7-12, 2022 with Boston)...He is 8-for-15 (.533) with two doubles, a home run, eight RBI, a walk and three runs scored since June 22...Pham's eight RBI since June 22 are tied for the fourth-most in all of Major League Baseball.

LOCK IN, KE': Ke'Bryan Hayes went 2-for-4 with a double, an RBI, a walk and a run scored on Friday vs. New York (NL), extending his hitting streak to six consecutive games, dating back to game two of the June 19 doubleheader at Detroit...During the streak, Hayes is batting .400 (8-for-20) with four RBI, two walks and four runs scored.

46 BUCS: Génesis Cabrera pitched 1.1 scoreless innings in his team debut on Friday vs. New York (NL), becoming the 46th different player to appear in at least one game for Pittsburgh this season (23 position players and 23 pitchers).

WELCOME, MATT: Isaac Mattson struck out three batters for the second straight outing (also Monday at Milwaukee) on Friday vs. New York (NL), tossing 1.1 scoreless innings...His .122 batting average against (6-for-49) since making his season debut on May 22 vs. Milwaukee is the fourth-lowest among Major League relievers (min. 49 at-bats), behind only San Diego's Adrian Morejon (.058), Houston's Bennett Sousa (.098) and Atlanta's Dylan Lee (.113).

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

June 28, 1916: Art Wilson's solo home run in the top of the 18th inning led the Pirates to a 3-2 win over the Cubs at Chicago's Weeghman Park, completing a doubleheader sweep. Max Carey went 4-for-8 with a double, while also temporarily giving Pittsburgh the lead with his solo shot in the 11th inning. Wilbur Cooper earned the win with his 5.2 scoreless innings in relief.

HOW ACQUIRED: From Philadelphia for INF Rodolfo Castro on August 1, 2023.

STARTING OFF: The 28-year-old lefty is in his third season with the Pirates after being acquired from the Phillies at the trade deadline on August 1, 2023, in exchange for infielder Rodolfo Castro...He's in his fifth Major League season after debuting in 2021... He was selected by Philadelphia in the fifth round of the 2015 First-Year Player Draft.

LAST TIME OUT: Falter allowed three runs over 5.1 innings on June 22 vs. Texas, winning an 8-3 decision...Pittsburgh scored seven runs while Falter was in the game, marking the most runs of support he received since May 24, 2024 vs. Atlanta (11 runs).

AGAINST THE METS: Falter will make his eighth career appearance (seventh start) against New York (NL) and second this season...He threw 78 pitches over 3.2 scoreless innings on May 14 at Citi Field (no-decision in the 4-0 win)...Falter has lost each of his last two decisions vs. the Mets (last win came on August 20, 2022 with Philadelphia).

CASHING IN AT PNC: Falter is 5-1 with a 3.18 ERA (51.0ip/18er) in his nine starts at PNC Park this season...His only home loss came in his first start here on April 5 vs. New York (AL), when he allowed a season-high seven runs over his 4.0 innings of work... Since then, Falter has a 2.11 ERA (47.0ip/11er) along the banks of the Allegheny River.

SOUTHPAW SUCCESS: Falter enters today with a 3.59 ERA (85.1ip/34er), the seventh-lowest mark among all qualified left-handed pitchers in the National League...The only pitchers with lower marks than him are Atlanta's Chris Sale (2.52), Chicago's Matthew Boyd (2.65), Philadelphia's Cristopher Sánchez (2.79), San Francisco's Robbie Ray (2.83), Washington's MacKenzie Gore (3.09) and New York's David Peterson (3.30).

THE MERRY MONTH OF MAY: Falter finished the month of May with a 0.76 ERA (35.2ip/3er), the third-lowest mark among qualified Major League pitchers during the month, behind Cincinnati's Andrew Abbott (0.55) and Kansas City's Kris Bubic (0.56)... Falter's 0.76 ERA was the lowest by any Pirates pitcher in a single month (minimum six starts) during the Live-Ball Era (since 1920)...In his outing on May 31 at San Diego, he became the first Pittsburgh pitcher to throw 6.1-plus scoreless innings on one/zero strikeouts since Jeff Locke (9.0ip/1k) did in a 10-0 win on May 30, 2016 at Miami.

WINNING THE DAY: Falter brings a five-game winning streak into this start...He has a 2.44 ERA (48.0ip/13er) and a .213 batting average against during the streak (began on May 9 vs. Atlanta)...This is Falter's longest winning streak since also winning a career-high five consecutive decisions from August 20-September 13, 2022 with Philadelphia.

SHUT 'EM DOWN: In his starts on May 3 vs. San Diego and May 9 vs. Atlanta, Falter pitched 6.0-plus innings while allowing one run or fewer, two hits or fewer and two walks or fewer...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, he joined Sam Leever (June 28-July 2, 1900) as the only Pirates since at least 1893, within a single season, to pitch 6.0-plus innings with one run or fewer, two hits or fewer and two walks or fewer in consecutive games (Babe Adams did it in his final appearance of 1915 and his first outing of 1916).

THE FALTER FILE: Attended Chino Hills High School, where he was classmates with NBA players Lonzo and LaMelo Ball...Had committed to play collegiately at the University of California, Santa Barbara prior to being drafted by Philadelphia in 2015.
