CINCINNATI REDS (6-2) at ARIZONA DIAMONDBACKS (3-6)

FIRST-PLACE REDS

For the last 8 days the Reds have at least shared first place in the NL Central and for the fifth straight day are in first place alone... prior to this season hadn't held the top spot alone since 3/30/19, when following a rainout of that season's second game they had a 1-0 record and a lead in the NL Central of .033 percentage points over the Brewers...for the second straight day and fourth time this season have a 1.0-game lead, their first division lead of at least 1.0g since 5/7/17 following Scott Feldman's 4-0 shutout vs Johnny Cueto and the Giants...haven't held a division lead of more than 1.0g since a season-high 1.5-game cushion on 4/18/17...haven't held a division lead of at least 2.0g since the 2015 team started 4-0 and built a season-high 2.5-game lead on 4/10.

STREAKING

With last night's 8-3 loss at Ari, the Reds fell short in their bid to begin a season with a 7-1 record for the first time since the wire-to-wire 1990 World Series champion won its first 9 games...the Reds' 6-game winning streak snapped last night was the longest active streak in the Major Leagues and matches last season's high (9/13-9/18).

TODAY'S GAME: Is Game 3 (1-1) of the Reds' first road trip of the season (1-1 at Ari, 3g at SF)...the Redlegs began the 2021 championship season with a 5-1 homestand vs the Cardinals (2-1) and Pirates (3-0)...following this road trip return to Great American Ball Park for a 7-day, 6-game homestand vs the Indians (3g) and these Diamondbacks (3g).

SCORING CHANGE: In the seventh inning of Wed's 11-4 win vs Pit, Nick Senzel was credited with an RBI-triple off Michael Feliz...that scoring decision was reviewed by Major League Baseball and has been changed to a double, with Senzel reaching third base and the run scoring on an error on LF Phillip Evans...the run becomes unearned to Feliz.

<u>SERIES NOTES</u>: The Reds and Diamondbacks this weekend meeting for the first time since 2019...the Reds are **6-4** in their **last 10 games** at **Chase Field**... are **34-19 at Ari** with the ballpark roof closed and **7-13** with the roof open, including last night...Cin won its **first 7 games** here until a 9-6 loss on **7/1/00**.

GIANTS UP NEXT: In the series vs the Giants that begins tomorrow night at Oracle Park, the Reds will face former teammates Kevin Gausman (2015, 15g, 1gs) and Johnny Cueto (2008-2015, 213gs, 92-63, 3.21)...beginning with the 2008 season the Reds are 48-32 vs SF (.600), the best winning percentage of any Giants opponent since then (minimum 50g)...beginning 6/29/12 and including that 2012 season's National League Division Series, the Redlegs have won 18 of the last 29 meetings at Oracle Park.

ROOKIE OF THE YEAR: Jonathan India ranks second in the National League in RBI and T9th in batting average...in his first 6 career apps produced 10 RBI, tied for fifth-most in Major League history by a player in his first 6 career apps behind only Dale Alexander (13 RBI in 1939), Trevor Story (12 in 2016), Nico Hoerner (11 in 2019) and Mandy Brooks (11 in 1925)...the RBI became an official statistic in 1920...courtesy @ EliasSports.

LEADING OFF: **Tyler Naquin** tied for the Major League lead in HR and RBI and leads the National League in slugging percentage...Tue and Wed vs Pit, he became the first Reds batter with a **leadoff HR** in consecutive apps since **Eddie Milner** did it on **6/24 vs SD & 6/25 at SF**, **1984**...**Pete Rose** (1976) and **Gary Redus** (1983) are the only other Reds batters with **leadoff HR** in consecutive apps...**Naquin's 7 RBI** on Tue vs Pit tie **Brandon Phillips** (7/30/15 vs Pit) for the most in a game by a **Reds leadoff batter** since the statistic became official in 1920...courtesy **@EliasSports**.

<u>HISTORIC</u>: Reds batters have produced **66 runs** runs, the highest total in franchise history through the first 8 games of a season...**Reds batters** lead the Major Leagues in **runs scored**, **RBI**, **batting average** and **slugging percentage**...are tied with the Astros for the Major League lead in **HR**...rank second in the majors to the defending World Series champion Dodgers in **on-base percentage**.

ALL-STAR GAME STATEMENT: The decision to move the All-Star Game was made by the Commissioner Rob Manfred and Major League Baseball...the Reds will support the All-Star Game wherever it is played because it is so important to baseball...we thank the Colorado Rockies and the city of Denver for agreeing to host the All-Star Game, to make sure this important jewel event takes place.

SHADES OF GRAY: RHP Sonny Gray threw simulated games Mon and Sat without issue...he could join the rotation as early as the next homestand...has been on the injured list all season with a muscle strain in his back.

<u>DISCIPLINED</u>: Reds RF Nick Castellanos on Monday received from Major League Baseball a 2-game suspension and an undisclosed fine for his aggressive actions and for instigating a benches-clearing incident in the bottom of the fourth inning of the 9-6 win on 4/3 vs StL...he will continue to play while he appeals the suspension...teammates Eugenio Suárez and Jesse Winker also were fined undisclosed amounts, as were Nolan Arenado, Jordan Hicks and Yadier Molina of the Cardinals...in the fourth inning, Castellanos was ejected for the first time in his career after play was halted for 10 minutes when benches cleared...he reached base that inning when he was hit in the ribs by a Jake Woodford pitch and later scored on a wild pitch.

<u>VOTTO</u>: **1B Joey Votto** on Opening Day was reinstated from the injured list...he **missed 13 days** of spring training camp (3/8-3/20) after testing positive for the **COVID-19 virus**...returned to camp on **3/21** and 5 days later was back in the starting lineup...played in 3 of the Reds' last 4 exhibition games...the **2010 MVP** and **6-time All-Star** gave the team permission to disclose the positive test result.

SHIFTING: Beginning with an exhibition game on 3/16, Eugenio Suárez made his last 10 starts of the spring at shortstop and Mike Moustakas made his last 9 starts at third base...Jonathan India led the team with 16 spring training starts at second base...in 2015, Suárez led the Reds in starts SS but in each of the last 5 seasons led the team in starts at 3B... he holds the National League record for home runs by a third baseman (49hr in 2019)...in the first 9 seasons of his Major League career through 2019, Moustakas made 1,042 apps at 3B and 47 apps at 2B...he received Rawlings Gold Glove Award votes for defensive excellence at third base in 2012, 2015, 2018 and 2019, finishing second in the balloting in 2012... last season he played second base full-time for the first time in his career and led the Reds in games at that position.

2020 RED HOTS

- The 2020 Championship Season was shortened to 60 games by a global pandemic fueled by the COVID-19 virus.
- With 7-2 win at Min in the 58th game of the season, the Reds cliched their first Postseason berth since 2013...Joey Votto was the only player or coach remaining from that 2013 club.
- The Reds joined the 1906 White Sox and 2007 Diamondbacks as the only teams ever to finish last in the league in batting average and still earn a Postseason berth.
- Became the first Reds team, since 1900, with more walks (239) than singles (221).

Today's Pitcher - #87 José De León, RHP

- Accent marks in José De León.
- Today is making his second career start vs the Diamondbacks, his first since 2016...never has faced any of the current Diamondbacks hitters.
- Is trying to become the first pitcher from Puerto Rico to win a game for the Reds as a starter.
- In Mon's 5-3 win vs Pit, became only the second pitcher born in Puerto Rico to start a game for the Reds...joined Ricky Bones, who in 1997 went 0-1, 10.19 in 2 starts and 7 relief apps...on 9/9/20 at Wrigley Field wore uniform #21, instead of his usual #87, in recognition of Roberto Clemente Day.
- In the second inning of Mon's 5-3 win vs Pit, in the fifth plate appearance of his career and first since 2016 produced an RBI-single off JT Brubaker that pulled the Reds to within 2-1...was his first Major League hit and first career RBI...Brubaker also singled in his first plate appearance...both starting pitchers recorded their first career hits in the same game for the first time since 7/21/15 (TB's Nate Karns, Phi's Aaron Nola).
- Mon's start was his first since his rookie season, in 2016 for the Dodgers, when he made all 4 of his previous Major League starts...in between his 2016 and 2021 starts made each of his 9 apps out of the bullpen for the Rays and Reds.
- Following the 2020 season, his changeup was rated by Baseball America the best among Reds minor league pitchers.
- Entered the 2021 season rated by Baseball America the 20th-best prospect in the organization.
- During 2020 spring training led the Reds with 24 strikeouts (16.2ip).

 Made his first Opening Day roster as an active player...began the 2018 and 2019 seasons on the Rays' 60-day injured list while recovering from March 2018 Tommy John" surgery to repair the torn ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow.
- In 2020, in his first season in the organization made 5 relief apps during 6 stints on the Reds' 28-man roster.
- While on the injured list traveled to the 2020 Wild Card Series at Atl as part of the Reds' 40-player Postseason pool.
- Following the 2020 season played for Caguas in the Puerto Rico Winter League (4gs, 2-1, 3.18, 17ip, 8h, 10bb, 31k, .145oba).

RED HOTS

- Tomorrow at SF will make his second start of the season...will be his 12th career start vs the Giants and ninth career appearance and start at Oracle Park.
- In his season debut on Tue vs Pit, threw 6.0 scoreless innings in the 250th start of his career.
- Was bothered early in spring training by an irritation in his left hamstring that forced him to leave his first "A" start, on 3/11...didn't miss his next appearance, on 3/16.
- Is his second season with the Reds...joined the club in December 2019, when he signed a 2-year contract through this year.
- In 2020, in his first season with the Reds made 4 starts and 2 relief apps surrounding a pair of stints on the 10-day injured list, from 7/31-8/11 with a left groin strain and from 8/28-9/22 with a left shoulder strain.
- Made his first 4 apps of the 2020 season as a starter (0-3, 6.57) and his last 2 apps in relief (2ip, 1h, 0r, 1bb, 0k).
- Was disabled after his first start, an 8-7 loss on 7/27 vs Cubs...returned for 3 more starts from 8/12-8/27 (0-2, 3.38) before he returned to the IL on 8/28.
- Was reinstated for the second time on 9/23 and joined the Reds' bullpen for the final 4 games of the regular season.
- In the 6-1 win on 9/23/20 vs Mil came out of the bullpen to throw a scoreless ninth inning, snapping at 242 his streak of consecutive regular season starts dating back to 2012...threw a hitless ninth inning in the 2020 Postseason-clinching win at Min in the 58th game of the season.
- Was selected by the Diamondbacks in the first round (43rd overall) of the 2008 first-year player draft.
- In 2012, his first full Major League season, was a National League All-Star, finished second to Wsh's Bryce Harper in the BBWAA's Jackie Robinson Rookie of the Year Award voting, was *The Sporting News*' NL Rookie of the Year and was named by the Arizona chapter of the BBWAA the Diamondbacks' Most Valuable Player and their Rookie of the Year...also was named to Baseball America's Major League All-Rookie team.
- 5 times in his career finished in the Top 10 among the National or American League leaders in starts.
