METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Snakes, 5-1, on Sunday...The team has lost three of their four, but won five of their last nine...The Mets were off yesterday and return to Citi Field tonight for the start of a six-game homestand against the Tigers (three games) and Yankees (three games).

ROSTER MOVES: Prior to tonight's game, the Mets announced the following roster moves - OF A.J. Ewing (#9) has been selected to the Major League roster...INF Andy Ibanez has been designated for assignment...The 21-year-old Ewing has appeared in 30 games between Double-A and Triple-A, batting .339/.447/.514 with 25 runs, nine doubles, two triples, two homers, 11 RBI, 17 steals and 22 walks... He is the second-best prospect and the top position player prospect in the Mets system according to MLB Pipeline.com.

STARTED OUT WITH A BANG: Earlier this year, Carson Benge became the 17th player in franchise history whose first career hit was a home run (last: Francisco Alvarez, 10/4/22 vs. WSH)...Below is a list of players who homered in their first at-bat as a Met.

MAY FLOWERS: The Mets are 5-4 in May...The team has posted a 2.71 ERA (24 ER/79.2 IP) with 28 walks and 87 strikeouts...Their 2.71 May ERA is fifth in the majors and fourth in the National League...Their 87 strikeouts are the seventh-most in the majors...They are hitting .205/.279/.336 in the month of May...Their .205 average is 28th in the majors...They have posted a .615 OPS in May, which ranks 27th in the majors.

READY FREDDY: Freddy Peralta is set to make his ninth start of the season tonight...He is 2-3 with a 3.12 ERA (15 ER/43.1 IP) with 18 walks and 43 strikeouts...He has posted a 1-1 record with a 1.62 ERA (3 ER/16.1 IP) with eight walks and 15 punchouts over his last three starts...Tonight will mark his fourth start against the Tigers...He is 1-0 with a 2.93 ERA (5 ER/15.1 IP), five walks and 20 strikeouts in his previous three starts.

IN THE CITI: The Mets are in the midst of their fourth homestand of the season...The team is 6-12 in New York this year...The team has posted a 4.50 ERA (83 ER/166.0 IP) at Citi Field in 2026...They are hitting .224/.289/.337 at Citi Field.

PETE AND PETE: David Peterson has appeared in nine games (five starts) this year, going 1-4 with a 5.49 ERA (24 ER/39.1 IP) with 14 walks and 38 strikeouts...He is 0-4 with an 8.10 ERA (21 ER/23.1 IP), 13 walks and 26 strikeouts as a starter...In four appearances in relief, Peterson is 1-0 with a 1.69 ERA (3 ER/16.0 IP) with one walk and 12 strikeouts.

RETURN OF THE MARK: Over his last 12 games, Mark Vientos is batting .239 (11-46) with five runs, three doubles, three homers, nine RBI, three walks, a .286 OBP, a .500 SLG and a .786 OPS...His six multi-homer games are tied with Francisco Alvarez for the second-most on the current team...Francisco Lindor has 11 which is tied for the ninth-most in team history.

TIGERS-METS NOTES: The Mets hosted the Tigers from April 1-4, 2024...The team dropped the first two games of the series before winning the nightcap of a doubleheader on April 4 to earn their first win of the 2024 season.

THEY'RE OUT OF OUR LEAGUE: The Mets are 4-5 against the AL in 2026...New York went 24-24 against the American League in 2025... Since Interleague Play began in 1997, the Mets are 306-305 against the American League.

MR. PULCHRITUDINOUS: Carson Benge is 7-21 with six runs, three doubles, one homer, five RBI, five walks and a 1.059 OPS over his last seven games...He is batting .300 (15-50) with nine runs, four doubles, two homers, eight RBI, five walks, a .352 OBP, a .500 SLG and an .852 OPS over his last 16 games.

I RALEY LIKE YOU: Brooks Raley has appeared in 16 games this year for the Mets...He is 0-1 with a 1.20 ERA (2 ER/15.0 IP), five walks and 18 strikeouts...He has allowed one home run this season...Over his last eight games, he has tossed 7.2 scoreless innings, allowing four hits with two walks and nine strikeouts.

DREAM WEAVER: Over his last nine games, Luke Weaver is 1-1 with a 1.86 ERA (2 ER/9.2 IP) allowing seven hits, three walks and striking out 12...He has stranded all four inherited runners in that span.

WE REMEMBER: The New York Mets announced that the club will wear a memorial "Davey" patch on the sleeve of their home and road uniforms during the 2026 season...Johnson passed away on September 5, 2025 at the age of 82...He finished his Mets career with the most managerial wins in franchise history (595) and the best winning percentage (.588)...In 1986, Johnson guided the team to a franchise-record 108 regular season victories and capped the year off with a dramatic World Championship...From 1984-1990, under his helm, the Mets averaged more than 95 wins.

THIS DAY IN 1986: The Mets got back in the win column earning a 1-0 walk-off win over the Braves...Sid Fernandez tossed 7.0 scoreless innings, allowing four hits, one walk and struck out 10, while Roger McDowell earned the win, tossed 2.0 scoreless innings...Tim Lincecum played hero, hitting an RBI single to center allowing Ray Knight to score...This season, the Mets will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the 1986 World Series Champions New York Mets...The Mets will also host a 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration to celebrate the 1986 World Champion Mets on Saturday, August 1 prior to the 4:10 p.m. game against the Miami Marlins...Additional information regarding programming for the 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration will be available at a later date at Mets.com/1986.

PREVIOUSLY ON: Threw 5.0 shutout innings and earned his second win of the season on May 6 at Colorado...Was his 34th career game of 5.0 or more shutout innings...15 of those outings have come since 2024, tied with Max Fried, Yoshinobu Yamamoto and Ranger Suárez for the fourth-most in the majors during that span...Recorded only one strikeout, his fewest in any start of his career...Was the first Met since Jose Quintana (8/25/24 at SD) to throw 5.0 or more scoreless innings and strikeout one or zero batters.

THE GAME OF RISP: So far this season, opposing batters are 3-34 (.088) with runners in scoring position against Peralta...Peralta ranks third in the NL and fourth in the majors in opponents' batting average with runners in scoring position (min. 30 batters faced w/RISP)...Since 2021, Peralta has held opposing batters to a .201 (100-498) average with RISP, the best mark in the majors during that span (min. 500 batters faced w/RISP).

DAY AND NIGHT: Today, Freddy Peralta will make his third start of the season at night and his second in as many starts...Peralta's only other prior night start of the season was on April 24 vs. Colorado...In 130 career night games (95 starts), Peralta is 44-26 with a 3.61 ERA (225 ER/561.2 IP)...In 89 career day games (75 starts), Peralta is 28-19 with a 3.51 ERA (161 ER/412.2 IP)...Peralta is one of six pitchers in the majors this season with six daytime starts.

MOTOR CITY MADNESS: Tonight, Peralta will face the Tigers for the fourth time in his career...Through his first three career starts against Detroit, the right-hander is 1-0 with a 2.93 ERA (5 ER/15.1 IP), 20 strikeouts and a 1.04 WHIP...In 48 career Interleague games (37 starts), Peralta is 16-10 with a 3.45 ERA (85 ER/221.2 IP) and 277 strikeouts.

NEW FACE IN A NEW PLACE: On January 21, the Mets acquired Peralta from Milwaukee along with RHP Tobias Myers in exchange for RHP Brandon Sproat and INF Jett Williams...Peralta spent his first eight Big League seasons with Milwaukee and went 70-42 with a 3.59 ERA (371 ER/931.0 IP) and 1153 strikeouts across 211 games (162 starts)...In Brewers franchise history, Peralta ranks third in strikeouts, fifth in ERA, eighth in wins and 10th in starts (min. 500.0 IP)...Peralta made his Major League debut at age 21 on May 13, 2018 vs. Colorado...The right-hander struck out 13 over 5.2 innings and took a no-hitter into the sixth innings...His 13 strikeouts were tied with Cliff Melton (1937) for the fourth-most in Major League history in a season debut...Peralta finished his rookie season at 6-4 with a 4.25 ERA (37 ER/78.1 IP) and 96 strikeouts over 16 games (14 starts)...From 2019-2020, 45 of 54 of his appearances during that span came in relief...In 2021, Peralta was selected to his first career All-Star game after he went 10-5 with a 2.81 ERA (45 ER/144.1 IP) and 195 strikeouts across 28 games (27 starts)...In 2022, Peralta pitched to a 3.58 ERA (31 ER/78.0 IP) over 18 games (17 starts) in an injury-riddled season...Over the past three seasons, Peralta has pitched exclusively as a starter and has gone 40-25 with a 3.40 ERA (195 ER/516.0 IP) and 614 strikeouts over 95 starts...Since 2023, Peralta ranks tied for second in the majors in wins, third in strikeouts and opponents' batting average (.210), fourth in SO/IP (10.71) and tied for fifth in starts...A native of Moca, Dominican Republic, Peralta was originally signed as a non-drafted free agent by the Seattle Mariners on April 18, 2013...The right-hander was acquired by Milwaukee in a four-player trade on December 9, 2015.

2025 RECAP: Last season, Peralta went 17-6 with a 2.70 ERA (53 ER/176.2 IP), a 1.08 WHIP, a .193 opponents' batting average and 204 strikeouts across 33 starts...Peralta established career bests in wins, ERA, starts and innings...In the NL, Peralta ranked first in wins, second among qualifiers in opponents' batting average, fourth in ERA, fifth in WHIP, sixth in strikeouts and tied for 11th in innings...The righty earned his second career All-Star selection (also: 2021), finished fifth in the NL Cy Young vote and was an All-MLB Second Team selection...On May 8 at Cleveland, Peralta recorded his 1000th career strikeout...From June 13 - July 19, Peralta earned a win in seven straight starts, the longest such streak in the majors last season...In five August starts, Peralta went 4-0 with a 0.32 ERA (1 ER/28.0 IP) and 32 strikeouts...He earned NL Pitcher of the Month for August, his second career Pitcher of the Month honor (also: August, 2023)...From August 5 - September 10, Peralta tossed 30.0 consecutive scoreless innings, the second-longest scoreless streak in Brewers franchise history behind Teddy Higuera's 32.0-inning scoreless streak in 1987...In each of his five starts from August 12 - September 4, Peralta threw 5.0 or more scoreless innings, the longest such streak in the majors since Zac Gallen's six straight scoreless starts of 5.0 or more innings from August 8 - September 4, 2022...Peralta started three games for Milwaukee in the Postseason and went 1-2 with a 4.70 ERA (8 ER/15.1 IP) and 19 strikeouts...He earned the win in Game 1 of the NLDS vs. Chicago-NL and suffered the loss in Game 4 of the NLDS at Chicago-NL and Game 2 of the NLCS vs. Los Angeles-NL.

OPENING DAY IN THE BIG APPLE PART THREE: On March 26 vs. Pittsburgh, Freddy Peralta made his third career Opening Day start...He allowed four runs over 5.0 innings and struck out seven...Peralta's first career Opening Day start came with Milwaukee on March 29, 2024 at Citi Field...That day, the right-hander threw 6.0 innings of one-run ball and fanned eight Mets batters...The lone hit he surrendered was a solo home run off the bat of Starling Marte in the second inning...Last season, Peralta was named the Brewers' Opening Day starter for the second consecutive season...The Brewers opened their 2025 regular season at Yankee Stadium, where Peralta allowed two runs over 5.0 innings and struck out eight batters...Peralta is the fifth different Mets pitcher to get the Opening Day nod in each of the last five seasons...The last Mets pitcher to start consecutive season openers for the Mets was Jacob deGrom, who started three consecutive Opening Days from 2019-2021.

KEEPIN' IT 200: In each of his last three seasons, Peralta has recorded 200 or more strikeouts...The only other pitcher in the majors to record 200+ strikeouts in each of the last three seasons is Dylan Cease...Additionally, Peralta's three seasons of 200+ strikeouts are tied with Mario Soto for the third-most by a Dominican-born pitcher...The only Dominican Republic natives with more such seasons are Hall of Famers Pedro Martínez (9) and Juan Marichal (6)...His highest single season strikeout total came in 2023 at 210.

REVERSE, REVERSE: For his career, Peralta has held left-handed batters to a .200 batting average, the fourth-best mark in the majors by a right-handed pitcher since his debut season, 2018 (min. 1500 LHB faced)...In 2021, Peralta held lefties to a .157 batting average (43-274), the third-best mark in a single season by a right-handed pitcher in the Expansion Era (since 1961, min. 300 LHB faced)...Last season, left-handed batters hit .204 (66-323) off of Peralta, the fourth-lowest mark among right-handers in the NL and the 11th-lowest mark in the majors (min. 300 LHB faced).

EXPANDING HIS ARSENAL: In his first two seasons, Peralta threw his four-seam fastball 77.7% of the time as part of a three-pitch repertoire that also featured a curveball and changeup... In 2020, Peralta added a slider to his arsenal and was his second-most thrown pitch from 2021-2024 with his highest usage coming in 2021 at 26.5%...Last season, Peralta only threw his slider 10.2% of the time, his lowest-used pitch...Despite the low usage of his slider, Peralta held opposing batters to a .155 (9-58) average in at-bats ending with the pitch...With the addition of another pitch to arsenal, Peralta's fastball usage has decreased from his first two seasons, however, he has thrown the pitch at least 50% of the time in every season of his career...Peralta has increased his changeup usage from season to season and was his second-most used pitch in 2025 at a career-high 21.2%.
