PLAYOFF BOUND!: The Detroit Tigers yesterday clinched a spot in the postseason by way of their 2-1 win vs. the Boston Red Sox at Fenway Park ... the Tigers have earned their 18th playoff appearance and second in as many seasons, earning consecutive trips to the postseason for the first time since a four-year run from 2011-14 ... the Tigers now await their Wild Card series opponent and locale.

- The Tigers remain co-leaders of the American League Central heading into Game 162 as they seek their first division title since the 2014 campaign ... scenarios detailed further below.
- The Tigers have lost 12 of their last 15 and 21 of their past 30 games since August 24 ... Detroit
 has gone 28-40 in its last 68 games after going 59-34 in its first 93 games through July 8.
- The Tigers have reached 87 wins this year, surpassing their total of 86 wins from a season ago ... the Tigers have 87 wins for the first time in 11 years since winning 90 games in 2014 ... Detroit has reached 86 wins in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 2011-14.
- The Tigers return to the postseason a year after sweeping a Wild Card series at Houston before losing a decisive Game 5 at Cleveland in the ALDS last season.

WHERE THINGS STAND: The Tigers can clinch an American League Central title with a win today and a loss by the Guardians vs. the Texas Rangers ... the Tigers are guaranteed to play a best-of-three Wild Card series starting Tuesday in parts unknown ... Detroit could finish the season as the #3, #5 or #6 seeds ...all six A.L. playoff teams are established into the final day of the season.

WHERE WILL THE TIGERS SLEEP TONIGHT?: The Tigers woke up this morning in Boston but could go to bed tonight in Detroit, Cleveland, New York or Toronto ... here is a breakdown of how the results of the Tigers and Guardians games today impact where Tuesday's Wild Card series begins.

- Tigers Win, Guardians Lose: Detroit wins the A.L. Central title and enters the playoffs as the #3 seed, hosting the Guardians at Comerica Park for the Wild Card series beginning Tuesday.
- #3 seed, hosting the Guardians at Comerica Park for the Wild Card series beginning Tuesday.
 Tigers Win, Guardians Win: Detroit enters the playoffs as the #5 seed and will play the Wild
- Card series on the road at either New York or Toronto, whomever is A.L. East runner-up.
 Tigers Lose, Guardians Lose: Detroit enters the playoffs as the #6 seed and will play the Wild Card Seres on the road at Cleveland, the A.L. Central division champs thanks to the tiebreaker.
- Tigers Lose, Guardians Win: Similar scenario as above ... Detroit enters the playoffs as the #6 seed and will play the Wild Card Seres on the road at Cleveland, the outright division champs.

WAKE ME UP WHEN SEPTEMBER ENDS: The Tigers are 7-16 (.304) in September, the second-lowest winning percentage in the majors this month ahead of only the Rockies (4-20, .167) ... the Guardians lead the majors with a 19-7 (.731) record in September while the Mariners and Yankees are both at 17-7 (.708), tied for the second best record this month in all of baseball.

- Detroit's 4.79 ERA (109 ER/204.2 IP) this month is third-highest in the A.L. and nearly a point higher than its 3.80 team ERA through August, which was fourth-best in the A.L. ... Cleveland leads the majors with a 2.49 ERA this month, 0.57 points better than anyone else.
- The Tigers offense has posted a collective .670 OPS thus far in September, which ranks 10th in the A.L. ... the club had a .740 team OPS through the end of August, fifth-best in the A.L.

YOUNG AND POWERFUL: The Tigers this year have now hit 101 homers by players in their age-25 season or younger, by far their most in a single season since TruMedia began tracking this statistic in 1974 ... their next best mark in the last 52 seasons?: the 1979 Tigers with 87 such homers.

• The Tigers rank second in all of baseball this season with the 101 home runs, trailing only the Athletics and their 116 homers from players in their age-25 season or younger ... Detroit is now one of only four teams to have reached 100 such homers in the last five seasons, joining the 2025 Athletics, the 2023 Royals (103 homers) and the 2022 Braves (105 homers).

COVERT OPS: Dillon Dingler has an .864 OPS on the road, the best mark on the club ... he is in the neighborhood for one of the highest road OPS' by a Tigers catcher in 45 years, as Lance Parrish had a .927 OPS in 1980 ... only a handful of guys have been near Dingler's mark: Pudge Rodriguez had an .866 OPS in 2004 and Chad Kreuter had an .871 OPS in 1993 ... min. 200 plate apps.

A SEASON FOR THE AGES: Riley Greene has 31 doubles, 36 homers and 111 RBI, just the second Tiger in the 125-season history of the franchise to reach those numbers in his age-24-or-younger season, joining Hank Greenberg in 1935 (46 doubles/36 homers/168 RBI) ... Greene (2025), Greenberg (1935, 1937, 1940) and Miguel Cabrera (2008, 2010, 2012) own the only seven individual seasons in the history of the franchise that reach those totals, regardless of age.

- Only five other major leaguers in the past 20 years have reached Riley's current totals in their age-24-or-younger season: Rafael Devers (BOS, 2021), Cody Bellinger (LAD, 2019), Nolan Arenado (COL, 2015), Mike Trout (LAA, 2014) and Prince Fielder (MIL, 2007).
- Overall, Greene is the second Tigers left-handed hitter to reach 36 homers in the past 50 years, the first in the last 40 years when Darrell Evans slugged 40 bombs in 1985 ... Greene is the first Tigers lefty to reach 36 homers and 111 RBI since Norm Cash in 1961 (41 HR, 132 RBI).

AND FINALLY: On the current Tigers roster, 12 position players and 11 pitchers have post-season experience ... only Dingler, Jones, Mize, Melton and Finnegan do not, a stark contrast from last year.

 Made a career-best 26 starts in 2019, his first season in the big leagues...went 20-19 with a 4.21 ERA over 61 games (60 starts) in three seasons with the Padres.

- Recorded a four-out save on Aug. 2 at Philadelphia in his Tigers debut...started his Tigers career going 3-0 with a hold and four saves, allowing just
 three hits and three walks while striking out 19 over his first 14.1 innings (12 games).
- · Acquired by Detroit on July 31 for minor league RHPs Josh Randall and R.J. Sales.
- Earned 20 saves with the Nationals this season prior to the trade, sixth-most in the N.L. at the time...went 1-4 with a 4.38 ERA (19 ER/39.0 IP) in 40 relief outings, including 34 games finished for Washington.
