THIS DATE IN ORIOLES HISTORY

On this date in 1975, 2B Bobby Grich drew five walks in a 12-6 win at Chicago-AL, the only time in Orioles history that a player walked five times in a game...RHP Jim Palmer earned the win, coming within one out of a complete game...RHP Dyar Miller recorded the final out in the win.



DATE August 10 SEEKING THE SWEEP: A win today would give the Orioles their second series sweep of the season and first since July 31-August 2 when the O's swept the Tampa Bay Rays in a threegame series at Oriole Park...The sweep of the Rays marked the O's first series sweep since August 27-29, 2018 when they swept Toronto in a three-game set at Camden Yards.

- ♠ The Orioles last series sweep of the Nationals came on May 8-9, 2017 when the O's swept a two-game series at Oriole Park...Their last three-game series sweep of Washington came on September 22--24, 2015 at Nationals Park.
- The O's last series sweep on the road came on June 5-6, 2018 when the Orioles swept the New York Mets in a two-game set at Citi Field...The Orioles last three-game series sweep on the road came on August 25-27, 2017 against the Boston Red Sox, when the O's won all three at Fenway Park.

IN A PINCH: Pat Valaika and Pedro Severino hit back-to-back, pinch-hit home runs in the top of the eighth inning of Saturday night's 5-3 win at Washington...It marked the first pinch-hit home run of the season for Valaika and the sixth of his career... It was the first pinch-hit homer of the season for Severino and the second of his career.

Ox According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the back-to-back blasts marked the first by pinch-hitters since September 3, 2018 when Alen Hanson and Chris Shaw did so for the San Francisco Giants at Colorado...It marked the first pinch-hit back-to-back home runs for the Orioles since August 12, 1985 when Wayne Gross and Larry Sheets did so against Cleveland at Memorial Stadium, and only the third occurrence in O's history.

I SAN-TAN-DARE YOU: OF Anthony Santander connected for a three-run, go-ahead home run in the top of the eighth inning, giving the Orioles a 5-3 lead...Eight of his 14 hits this season have been for extra-bases (4 doubles, 1 triple, 3 home runs).

IF YOU AIN'T FIRST, YOU'RE LAST: The Orioles have been one of the more successful teams in baseball at swinging at the first pitch...They rank first in the majors in batting average (.475), doubles (9), extra-base hits (16), and OPS (1.450), and lead the AL and rank second in the majors in hits (28) as a team on the first pitch.

- OF Anthony Santander leads the O's with seven hits on the first pitch, tied for most in the majors. (tied with Chicago-AL's Luis Robert).
- Os Santander is tied for the Major-League lead with four extra-base hits on the first pitch, while INF Renato Núñez is tied for third in the majors with three hits on the first pitch.

THESE GO TO 11: The Orioles recorded a season-high 19 hits in Friday night's 11-0 win at Washington...The 19 hits marked the most for the O's since August 30, 2019 at Kansas City (21).

- & According to STATS, LLC., the O's 11-0 win marked the largest shutout victory by a team off a 100-loss season against a defending World Series champion in Major League history.
- θ_x The shutout marked the eighth road shutout of at least 11 runs in O's history (since 1954) and their largest shutout victory on the road since September 4, 2012 (12-0 at Toronto).
- $\theta_{\!\scriptscriptstyle N}$ Friday night marked the O's fourth ever shutout against the Nationals, with three of the four coming at Nationals Park...It also marked the largest win against the Nationals in O's history.

MAKE MINE A DOUBLE: INF José Iglesias went 4-for-4 with a double and two RBI in Friday's win...His four hits matched his career-high and marked his sixth career four-hit game (second this season)...He is tied for the Major-League lead with seven doubles.

 Θ_{α} According to the Elias Sports Bureau. Iglesias' seven doubles in his first 10 games were the most doubles in Orioles history through a player's first 10 games of a season.

ALL ABOUT THAT (ON) BASE: The Orioles rank second in the American League and fourth in the majors with a .770 team OPS (on-base percentage plus slugging percentage)...INF Renato Núñez (1.027) leads the team and ranks sixth in the AL in OPS among qualifying hitters

RACKING UP THE K'S: From July 29-August 2, O's pitchers struck out at least 10 batters in five consecutive games, setting a new club record...The previous record of four-straight had been done three times...The O's have recorded 10-or-more strikeouts in eight of their 14 games this season.

- The O's rank sixth in the AL with a 8.93 strikeouts per 9.0 innings mark (120 K/121.0 IP).
- Orioles starting pitchers are tied for ninth in the AL with 58 strikeouts...Only Rays starters (69 K) have more among AL East clubs.

THAT HANSER IS SO HOT RIGHT NOW: Since the start of the 2019 season, INF Hanser Alberto leads the majors with 94 hits off of left-handed pitching (16 more than then the next on the list)...In that time, he also leads the majors with a .407 (94-for-231) average against lefties... This season, Alberto ranks ninth in the AL with a .333 (20-for-60) against all pitchers.

INTERLEAGUE INFO: The O's will play a total of 20 games against National League opponents this season, including contests with the Miami Marlins (0-4), Washington Nationals (2-0), Philadelphia Phillies (three games), New York Mets (four games), and Atlanta Braves (three games)... Since Interleague Play began in 1997, the O's are 199-230...The O's went 7-13 in Interleague Play last season...Baltimore's 14 Interleague victories in 2016 were the most in club history.

INJURED LIST: Four players are on the Injured List...**RHP Hunter Harvey** (right forearm strain) and RHP Dillon Tate (right elbow contusion) are on the 10-day Injured List...INF/OF Trey Mancini (colorectal cancer recovery/treatment) and INF Richie Martin (right wrist fracture) are on the 60-day IL...LHP John Means is currently on the bereavement list.

THE SKIPPER: Brandon Hyde was named the 20th manager in O's history on December 14, 2018...He began his first Major League managerial role following 16 professional seasons in the coaching ranks and four as a player...Most recently, Hyde served as bench coach for the Chicago Cubs in 2018, his second season in that role (also 2014)...Hyde spent three seasons as the Cubs first base coach from 2015-17, and previously served as Chicago's Director of Player Development from August 2012-2013, after joining the Cubs in December of 2011 as their Minor League Field Coordinator...Prior to joining the Cubs, Hyde spent nine seasons in the Marlins organization.

LAST START: Was dealt his second straight loss on 8/5 vs. MIA (G2) after allowing two runs on four hits and one walk with four strikeouts through 5.0 innings pitched...Has now been charged with the loss in seven of his last nine decisions, dating back to 8/1/19...Has worked 5.0 innings and allowed four hits in each of his two starts this season.

 $\underline{\textbf{SHORT REST:}}$ Will be starting on three days rest for the fourth time in his career...Has gone 0-2 with a 9.69 ERA (14 ER/13.0 IP) in his first three starts on three days rest...His last start on three days rest came last season on July 16 at Oriole Park, also against the Nationals, when he worked 5.1 innings, allowing three runs on six hits, two home runs, with seven strikeouts...Opponents have a slash line of .321/.387/.696 in his previous starts on three days rest.

AGAINST WASHINGTON: Has pitched in four games (two starts) against Washington in his career...Owns a 0-2 record with a 4.96 ERA (9 ER/16.1 IP) through his first four outings...Both starts against the Nationals came in 2019 and in his last start on 8/28/19, Wojciechowski was charged with his seventh loss of the season after yielding five runs on six hits, one home run, with three strikeouts through 4.0 innings of work at Nationals Park.

FACING THE NL EAST: Has made 10 career appearances (three starts) against the NL East, posting a 0-3 record with a 5.46 ERA (18 ER/28.0 IP) and 29 strikeouts...made two starts against the NL East in 2019 (both against Washington), going 0-2 with a 7.71 ERA (8 ER, 9.1 IP), no walks and 10 strikeouts...Faced an NL East opponent (Marlins) in his last start on 8/5 in the second game of a

BUMPY ROADS: Made eight starts on the road last season, going 3-4 with a 4.60 ERA (22 ER/43.0 IP)...Has gone 4-5 with an 6.84 ERA (57 ER/75.0 IP) and a 1.48 WHIP in 24 career road games (13 starts), compared to 4-9 with a 4.88 ERA (52 ER/96.0 IP) in 25 career home games (16 starts)...In road games, opponents hit .293 (89-for-304) against Wojciechowski, compared to .253 (85-for-336) at home...Will be making his second career start at Nationals Park, where he has gone 0-1 and opponents have hit .353 (6-for-17) against him.

THE TERRIBLE THREE: In 2019, the top three batters in the lineup averaged 336 (41-for-122) with 20 extra-base-hits (10 doubles, two triples, eight home runs), 19 RBI, and 11 walks while striking out 11 batters against Wojciechowski, compared to the four through nine-hole hitters, who averaged just .194 (39-for-201) with 18 extra-base-hits (seven doubles, two triples, nine home runs), and 17 walks while striking out 54...Held the heart of the order to a .252 (30-for-119) clip last season.

A LOT OF PUNCHOUTS: Wojciechowski struck out 54 batters in his first nine starts last season (7/2/19-8/17/19)...According to STATS LLC., his 54 strikeouts ranked as the fifth-most in Orioles history (since 1954) among a pitcher's first nine starts of the season...Gene Brabender - 55 (7/4/66-8/30/67), Kevin Brown - 57 (4/29/95-6/12/95), Jack Harshman - 58 (4/22)58-6/7/58), and Hoyt Wilhelm - 60 (8/31/58-5/9/59) all rank ahead of him.

OUT OF THE BULLPEN: Made his sole appearance in relief and first outing at home as an Oriole on 7/12/19 vs. TB...Entered the game in the seventh inning, and threw 0.2 innings, surrendering one hit while striking out two...Has made 20 career appearances in relief, and owns a 2-0 record with a 3.38 ERA (12 ER/32.0 IP) and an opponent average of .200 (23-for-115) with 13 walks and 33 strikeouts...In nine relief outings at home, he has surrendered just one run in 20.2 innings pitched (0.44 ERA) while surrendering seven hits and six walks with 23 strikeouts in 75 batters faced.
