10 YEARS AT THE HELM

- ◆ **Torey Lovullo**, the winningest and longest-tenured skipper in franchise history, enters his 10th season as Manager as only the second manager/head coach in Phoenix professional sports history to reach double-digits (Cardinals, Coyotes, Mercury, Suns), joining the Suns' John MacLeod (14 seasons, 1974-87).
 - 8 seasons: Sandy Brondello (2014-21), Dave Tippett/Coyotes (2010-17)
 - 6 seasons: Corey Gaines/Mercury (2008-13), Ken Whisenhunt/Cardinals (2007-12), Jim Hanifan/Cardinals (1980-85)
 - 5 seasons: Bruce Arians/Cardinals (2013-17), Kirk Gibson/D-backs (2010-14), Bob Melvin/D-backs (2005-09), Bobby Francis/Coyotes (2000-04), Vince Tobin/Cardinals (1996-2000), Don Coryell/Cardinals (1973-77), Charley Winner/Cardinals (1966-70), Phil Handler/Cardinals (1943-45, '49, '51)
- ◆ Through the 2025 season, Lovullo's 9 seasons are sixth among active Managers behind Terry Francona/CIN (24), A.J. Hinch/DET (12), Kevin Cash/TB (11), Craig Counsell/MIL (11) and Dave Roberts/LAD (11) [source: Elias Sports Bureau].

- ◆ **Torey Lovullo** returns 9 coaches and added 1 new coach...returnees: **Jeff Banister** (bench coach, fifth season), **Dave McKay** (first base coach, 13th season), **Joe Mather** (hitting coach, fifth season), **Damion Easley** (assistant hitting coach, fifth season), **Brian Kaplan** (pitching coach, second season), **Wellington Cepeda** (bullpen coach, second season), **Travis Denker** (assistant hitting coach, second season), **Owen Dew** (assistant pitching coach, second season) and **Shaun Larkin** (infield coach, second season...new coach: **J.R. House** (third base & catching coach) rejoins the organization (previously 2012-18 in player development).

SCHEDULED PITCHERS**STARTING PITCHER****No. 60 - LHP Mitch Bratt**

- In 2025, began the season with Double-A Frisco (Rangers), going 6-3 with a 3.18 ERA (32 ER in 90.2 IP), 16 walks and 106 strikeouts in 17 starts (18 G).
- Last season, earned Rangers' organization Starting Pitcher of the Month honors for May after going 3-0 with a 1.33 ERA (4 ER in 27.0 IP), 3 walks and 31 strikeouts over 5 starts with Frisco.
- Acquired with LHP Kohl Drake and RHP David Hagaman from the Rangers for RHP Merrill Kelly on July 31.
- In 6 starts with Double-A Amarillo, went 1-1 with a 3.98 ERA (14 ER in 31.2 IP), opponent .242 AVG, 5 walks and 42 strikeouts.
- Began 2024 with High-A Hickory (Rangers), going 6-4 with a 3.03 ERA (26 ER in 77.1 IP), 16 walks and 84 strikeouts in 15 starts (17 G)... promoted to Double-A in July and in 6 starts (7 G), went 2-2 with a 5.45 ERA (20 ER in 33.0 IP), 12 walks and 33 strikeouts.
- In 2021, played in the inaugural season of the MLB Draft League with the West Virginia Black Bears, who play at Kendrick Family Ballpark, named after West Virginia University alum and D-backs' Managing General Partner, Ken Kendrick.
- Signed by the Rangers in 2021 as a fifth-round selection out of Georgia Premier Academy.

ADDITIONAL PITCHERS**No. 70 - LHP Spencer Giesting**

- In 2025, went 3-2 with a 3.67 ERA (23 ER in 56.1 IP), 19 walks and 59 strikeouts in 10 starts with Double-A Amarillo...promoted to Triple-A Reno on June 3 and went 5-7 with a 6.47 ERA (57 ER in 79.1 IP), 45 walks and 72 strikeouts in 17 starts.
- Named the D-backs' Minor League Pitcher of the Month for September, after going 1-1 with a 3.38 ERA (6 ER in 16.0 IP), 5 walks and 15 strikeouts in 3 starts with Reno.
- In 2024, went a combined 9-10 with a 3.31 ERA (52 ER in 141.1 IP), 44 walks and 154 strikeouts over 25 starts between High-A Hillsboro (10 GS) and Amarillo (15 GS)...named D-backs' Minor League Pitcher of the Month in May and September.
- Signed the D-backs in 2022 as an 11th-round selection out of the University of North Carolina at Charlotte from 2021-22, where he finished his collegiate career as the school's all-time leader in K/9.0 IP at 12.55.

No. 78 - RHP Alfred Morillo

- In 2025, split the season with Double-A Amarillo (25 G) and Triple-A Reno (20 G), going 4-1 with 4 saves, a 4.92 ERA (33 ER in 60.1 IP), 34 walks and 60 strikeouts over 45 games...promoted to Reno on July 9 and went 1-0 with a 5.59 ERA (18 ER in 29.0 IP), 20 walks and 23 strikeouts in 20 games.
- In 2024, was limited to 34 appearances with High-A Hillsboro after beginning the season on the injured list (left knee surgery) from April 5-May 2...went 3-1 with 13 saves, a 2.41 ERA (10 ER in 37.1 IP), opponent .148 AVG, 21 walks and 45 strikeouts.
- Played with Salt River in the 2024 Arizona Fall League, going 0-0 with 1 save, a 5.00 ERA (5 ER in 9.0 IP), opponent .206 AVG, 6 walks and 12 strikeouts in 8 games.
- Signed by the D-backs as a non-drafted free agent in 2021.

No. 89 - LHP Yu-Min Lin

- In 2025, went 5-7 with a 6.64 ERA (75 ER in 101.2 IP), 60 walks and 85 strikeouts in 23 starts with Triple-A Reno.
- Selected to play for Team Chinese Taipei in the 2026 WBC.
- In 2024, spent most of the season with Double-A Amarillo, going 3-6 with a 4.28 ERA (45 ER in 94.2 IP), 33 walks and 90 strikeouts in 19 starts...made his final start of the season with Reno on Sept. 21.
- In 2023, combined to go 6-5 with a 3.86 ERA (52 ER in 121.1 IP), opponent .222 AVG, 48 walks and 140 strikeouts in 24 starts between High-A Hillsboro (13 GS) and Amarillo (11 GS).
- In 2021, played for Chinese Taipei at the WBSC U-23 Baseball World Cup... in starts vs. Cuba and Venezuela, struck out 14 in 8.2 innings.
- Signed by the D-backs in 2021 as a non-drafted free agent.

- In 2025, went 3-3 with 10 saves, a 4.22 ERA (23 ER in 49.0 IP), opponent .143 AVG, 35 walks and 74 strikeouts across 3 levels with High-A Hillsboro, Double-A Amarillo and Triple-A Reno in 45 games.
- Promoted to Amarillo on May 27 after 15 games with Hillsboro...in 11 games with Amarillo, went 0-1 with 4 saves, a 2.31 ERA (3 ER in 11.2 IP), opponent .105 AVG, 6 walks and 18 strikeouts...promoted to Reno on July 8 and went 0-2 with 1 save, a 9.53 ERA (18 ER in 17.0 IP), 18 walks and 20 strikeouts in 15 games.
- Signed by the D-backs in 2023 as a 13th-round selection out of Rice University...transferred from the University of Louisiana at Lafayette, where he attended from 2021-22...did not see action in 2022 and 2023 due to injury.
