TONIGHT’S STARTERS: RHP ZAC GALLEN (3-9, 6.34) vs. LHP DANIEL LYNCH IV (4-5, 3.51)

UPS AND DOWNS: The Royals suffered a 5-3 loss to Arizona last night in 11 innings, a game that was forced into extras by **John Rave’s**, 2-out, 2-run home run in the 9th inning.

- + After being scoreless through the 9th on Monday night, last night’s game was scoreless through the 7th, as these teams combined to go 3-for-23 with runners in scoring position while stranding a total of 23 baserunners.
- + **Michael Wacha** pitched 6.0 scoreless innings to mark his American League-leading 20th quality start, but the ‘pen was charged with 5 runs (3 ER) in 5.0 innings, allowing 1 run in the 8th, 9th and 10th and 2 runs in the 11th.

BONUS BASEBALL: The Royals are 4-7 in extra-inning games this season but have lost 6 of their last 7 such games...they’ve played back-to-back extra-inning games for the second time this season, following April 26-28 vs. the Angels and at the Athletics...they’ve played 3 straight extra-inning games six times in franchise history, most recently from April 3-6, 2011.

SWEEPSTAKES: After losing the 1st 2 games of the series, the Royals are hoping to win tonight to avoid what would be their 11th series sweep...if not, they would break a tie with the Rockies and A’s for the most times being swept this year.

- + Their 10 times being swept this season are already more than twice as many as the 4 sweeps they suffered in each of 2024 and 2025...they’re 7-10 when at risk of being swept, including such wins in the 1st 2 series on this stay.
- + The Royals have been swept by the D-backs in a 3-game series only once, from June 21-23, 2011 here in Kansas City.

SERIES SPEAKING: The Royals have lost all 3 series on this homestand on the heels of a 5-series win streak, during which they went 13-3...this marks the first time they’ve lost 3 consecutive series since June 9-17 vs. Texas and Houston and at Washington...the Royals are now 17-26-4 in 47 series, including 8-7-1 in 16 sets since the All-Star break.

SEASON OF STREAKS: The Royals have lost 7 of their last 9 games on the heels of a Majors-best 13-2 stretch from Aug. 14-29...in their 15 games prior, they went 4-11 from July 28-Aug. 12, which followed a 7-3 run after the All-Star break.

- + Despite losing 7 of their last 9 games, the Royals are 15-9 (.625) in their last 24 games since Aug. 14, which matches Cleveland for the best record in the American League.
- + In the last 24 games, the Royals lead the American League in runs per game (5.0), on-base pct. (.341), slugging pct. (.437) and OPS (.779) and rank 2nd in batting avg. (.263).

LOSING RECORD: The Royals last night suffered their 82nd loss of the season, clinching a losing record for the first time since 2023 while snapping a run of back-to-back winning seasons...their 82 losses are already 2 more than they had all of last season (80), with 16 games left on this year’s schedule.

RISPY BUSINESS: The Royals are batting .224 (15-for-67) in scoring situations on this stay, including 4-for-26 (.154) through the 1st 2 games of this series and 1-for-13 last night.

- + Despite the struggles this week, the Royals are batting .284 with runners in scoring position at home this season, tied for 5th best in the Majors...but they’re hitting .199 with runners in scoring position on the road, last in the Majors.
- + The Royals are 46-30 (.605) this season when recording at least 2 hits in scoring situations and 18-52 (.257) when they have 0 or 1 hit with runners in scoring position.

FINAL THOUGHTS: The Royals are 19-27 (.413) this season in series finales, which is the 4th-worst record in the Majors, ahead of the Rockies (14-32), Giants (18-29) and A’s (18-28).

- + They’ve won 6 of their last 7 series finales, including both finales on this homestand vs. the Marlins and Blue Jays, and they’ve won 4 consecutive series finales at Kauffman Stadium since their last loss on Aug. 9 vs. the Cubs.

QUALITY TIME: The Royals have 60 quality starts this season, 2nd most in the American League and 4th most in the Majors, trailing only the Dodgers (75), Phillies (67) and Mariners (61).

- + The Royals have received a quality start in each of the last 3 games and 4 of the last 6 following a 4-game drought.
- + They’re 35-25 (.583) in quality starts, which is the 2nd-worst mark in the Majors, and their 25 losses in quality starts are the most in MLB, 3 more than any other team.

DAILY DOUBLE: The Royals hit 3 doubles last night to mark 265 on the season, 1 ahead of Boston (264) for the most in the Majors...they’re attempting to lead the Majors in doubles for just the sixth time in franchise history, following 1977 (299), 1978 (305), 1982 (295), 1990 (316) and 1992 (284).

- + They have recorded a double in 13 consecutive games since Aug. 26, which is the longest active streak in the Majors and is the Royals longest run since June 13-29 of last season, when they had a double in 15 straight games.
- + The Royals boast a Majors-most seven players who have recorded at least 20 doubles this season, led by **Bobby Witt Jr.’s** 30 doubles, which rank tied for 4th in the AL.
- + Witt Jr.’s 181 doubles since his 2022 debut season are most in the American League, ahead of **José Ramírez** (177).
- + **Carter Jensen’s** 29 doubles rank 2nd among all rookies, 1 shy of **Tristan Peters** (30)...the Royals rookie record is 36 doubles, set by **Alex Gordon** in 2007.

ROOKIE RETURNS: **Carter Jensen** was named the American League Player of the Week yesterday for the period of Aug. 31-Sept. 6, during which he slashed .421/.476/1.158 (8-for-19) in 5 games while leading the AL in slugging pct., OPS (1.634), extra-base hits (7) and total bases (22)...he was the starting catcher in all 5 games he played last week, and all 5 of those games were 97° or higher at 1st pitch.

- + Carter is tied for 1st among AL rookies with 53 extra-base hits and each of his last 8 hits have gone for extra bases, which is the longest streak by a rookie in Royals history, according to *Elías*, and is the 2nd-longest streak by a Royals catcher, trailing only **Fran Healy**, who had 10 straight hits go for extra bases while catching in 1974.
- + Among 61 American League players with at least 100 hits this season, Jensen’s pct. of hits for extra bases (49.1%) is tied for 1st with **Colson Montgomery**.
- + Jensen’s most recent leadoff homer a week ago tonight broke a tie with **Johnny Damon** (1998) and **Alex Gordon** (2011) for the single-season franchise record...Jensen’s 6 leadoff HR (all as a catcher), are the most in a season by a player at the position since 1900, according to *Elías*.
- + Jensen’s 22 HR are tied with **Carlos Beltrán** (1999) and **Bo Jackson** (1987) for the 2nd-most home runs in a season by Royals rookie, only 2 shy of **Bob Hamelin** (24) in 1994.

HOME: The Royals are 2-6 on this 9-game homestand vs. the Marlins (1-2), Blue Jays (1-2) and D-backs (0-2), already clinching their first homestand with a losing record since June 30-July 6 vs. the Rays (0-3) and Phillies (2-1)...they are now 5-4-3 on 12 stays this season, pending the final home stretch from Sept. 22-27 vs. the White Sox and Guardians.

- + The Royals are 2-6 on this homestand on the heels of a 17-4 stretch at home from July 5-Aug. 23, which included a 7-0 record on the last homestand vs. the A’s and Tigers.
- + The Royals rank among the American League leaders in many offensive categories at home, including 2nd in on-base pct. (.332) and OPS (.765), 3rd in batting average (.263), slugging pct. (.433) and runs per game (4.84).
- + Their 84 HR at home are just 4 shy of the season-single club record of 88, done in 1997, 2002, 2017 and 2023.

ON DECK: Following the finale of this 9-game stay tonight, the Royals will travel to Boston on tomorrow’s off day, before beginning a 9-game, 10-day trip Friday night vs. the Red Sox, Astros and Pirates, with an off day before the series in Houston next Monday...they’ll return to Kauffman Stadium on Sept. 22 for the final homestand of the regular season.

INTERLEAGUE INTRIGUE: The Royals are 18-26 (.409) vs. NL teams this season and they have lost 12 of their last 14 games, a stretch in which they’ve lost 5 straight series.

- + In Interleague play, the Royals lead AL teams in on-base pct. (.332) and OPS (.766) and rank T-1st in batting avg. (.259) and 2nd in slugging pct. (.433) and R/G (4.8).
- + **Salvador Perez** has 228 RBI in Interleague play, tied with **Miguel Cabrera** for 4th most all-time, trailing **Freddie Freeman** (241), **Nolan Arenado** (239) & **Albert Pujols** (238).

SNAKE BITES: The Royals are 18-24 all-time vs. the D-backs, including 8-17 in Kansas City and 10-7 in Phoenix...after losing the 1st 2 games of this series, the Royals are now 1-7-2 in 10 sets vs. the D-backs at Kauffman Stadium, though they’ve only been swept by them here once, from June 21-23, 2011.

DANIEL LYNCH IV is making his 7th start (53rd appearance) of the season and the 63rd (177th appearance) of his career tonight in the finale of this 9-game homestand and 3-game set here at Kauffman Stadium vs. the Diamondbacks...he is facing the club for the third time in his career but for the first time as a starter.

- + On Aug. 7 vs. the Cubs, Lynch IV joined the Royals rotation, filling the void of **Luinder Avila**, who was placed on the Injured List with right forearm tightness on Aug. 2 before undergoing **Tommy John** surgery...the outing marked his 1st MLB start since May 27, 2025 vs. the Reds, when he spun 2.2 innings as an opener.
- + Daniel's transition to the rotation comes after each of his 1st 46 appearances to begin the year came in relief, a role that he assumed during the 2024 season...in that stretch, he posted a 1.96 ERA (10 ER in 46.0 IP), which was the 4th lowest by a Royals left hander through their 1st 46 appearances of a campaign, behind **José Mijares** (1.72) in 2012, **Tom Burgmeier** (1.75) in 1971 and **Ron Mahay** (1.78) in 2008.
- + Per *Elías*, Lynch IV is one of three active players to have at least 50 starts and 100 relief appearances with one team, joining **Andre Pallante** with the Cardinals (194 G, 86 GS) and **Reynaldo Lopez** with the White Sox (205 G, 91 GS).

LAST TIME OUT: Lynch IV suffered his 5th loss of the season and his 3rd in 6 starts since transitioning to the rotation in last Friday night's start vs. the Blue Jays after yielding 5 runs on 7 hits and 1 walk over 5.0 innings...was tagged for 4 runs in the 1st inning on a pair of RBI singles by **Alejandro Kirk** and **Kazuma Okamoto** and a 2-run double by **Ernie Clement**...yielded another run on an RBI double by Kirk in the 2nd, but he would settle in from there, retiring 10 of his final 11 batters and each of his final 9 before exiting in favor of **Nolan Hoffman** to begin the 6th.

- + Daniel completed at least 5.0 innings for the first time since June 12, 2024 vs. the Yankees, when he recorded 6.2 innings in relief and for the first time as a starter since May 30, 2024 at Target Field in Minnesota (also 5.0 innings).

THE RUNDOWN: After being selected 34th overall in the 2018 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Virginia, Lynch IV made his Major League debut in 2021 and each of his 1st 52 MLB appearances were starts...after struggling to find consistency over his first four seasons, he transitioned to a relief role in August 2024, where in 114 appearances (2 starts as an opener), he went 12-4 with 3 saves and a 2.21 ERA (33 ER in 134.1 IP), becoming one of the game's best left-handed relievers.

- + Following the Royals loss on Aug. 6 vs. Minnesota, Manager **Matt Quatraro** told reporters that Lynch IV would make the start the following night vs. the Cubs and would get opportunities to do so moving forward, as the Royals look for ways to fill a rotation that has been decimated by injuries this season.
- + As Daniel had been initially transitioning to the rotation across his 1st 4 starts, he was working in tandem with **Mason Black**, but Lynch IV's pitch count had gradually increased from start to start before now tossing 70 pitches in back-to-back outings.

STARTER STRUGGLES: After posting a 1.96 ERA (10 ER in 46.0 IP) and a .185 opponents' batting average (31-for-168) across 46 relief appearances to begin the year, Lynch IV has since gone 0-3 with a 6.97 ERA (16 ER in 20.2 IP), while opponents are batting .268 (22-for-82) against him in 6 starts...the stark contrast in these splits are in line with what he has done throughout his career, as he owns a lifetime 5.32 ERA (172 ER in 291.0 IP) in 62 starts but a 2.47 ERA (38 ER in 138.2 IP) over 114 relief outings.

- + After leading the Royals with 38 scoreless outings—6 more than 2nd-place **John Schreiber** (32)—before joining the Royals rotation on Aug. 7, he has since yielded a run in all 6 of his starts, including a season-high 5 last Friday night vs. Toronto.

IN SINK: One of the biggest differences for Daniel since joining the Royals bullpen in August 2024 is the evolution of his sinker, a pitch that he was using just 5.6% of the time but over 119 appearances (7 starts) since, is throwing to 23.4% of hitters.

- + Lynch IV's sinker usage has jumped each season since, and this year, he's throwing it 31.4% of the time, which is up from his 18.9% rate a year ago...opponents are slashing .200/.286/.280 (15-for-75) vs. the pitch this season, but in his 6 starts, they've posted a .292/.414/.458 (7-for-24) slashline against it.
- + Since joining the Royals rotation on Aug. 7, Daniel has thrown the pitch to 34.9% of hitters, which includes a career-high 45.7% rate in his Aug. 29 start at Cleveland.

LEFTY LOOSEY: Daniel has been exceptional against left-handed hitters this season, limiting them to a .168/.222/.238 (17-for-101) slashline...among American League pitchers, his .222 OBP ranks 4th, while his .168 average ranks 7th (min. 100 BF).

- + Lynch IV has not been quite as sharp against left-handed batters since moving to the rotation on Aug. 7, as they're slashing .250/.308/.417 (6-for-24)...although a small sample size, that is in stark contrast to their .143/.195/.182 (11-for-77) slashline against him in 46 appearances as a reliever to begin the season.

OPENING REMARKS: Of the 225 runs that Daniel has allowed in his Major League career, 62 of them (27.6%) have come in the 1st inning, in which he owns an 8.37 ERA...from the 2nd inning on, his career ERA is 3.72 (152 ER in 367.1 IP).

- + After throwing a pair of scoreless 1st innings in his 1st 2 starts after moving to the rotation, Daniel has yielded a 1st-inning run in 3 of his last 4 starts, thanks to a **Tommy White** RBI single on Aug. 18, a **Kevin McGonigle** RBI double on Aug. 23 and a trio of run-scoring hits in a 4-run 1st inning last Friday night vs. Toronto.

HOME SWEET HOME: Across 90 career appearances (32 starts) here at Kauffman Stadium, Lynch IV is 12-12 with a 5.17 ERA (124 ER in 215.2 IP), which is in stark contrast to his 3.62 ERA (86 ER in 214.0 IP) in 86 road outings (30 starts)...this year, however, his home and road splits have seemingly flipped, as he has gone 1-2 with a 3.18 ERA (14 ER in 39.2 IP) across 28 home outings (4 starts), compared to a 3-3 record with a 4.00 ERA (12 ER in 27.0 IP) in 24 games (2 starts) away from The K.

- + Eleven of Daniel's 14 earned runs he has allowed at Kauffman Stadium this season have come in his 4 starts, after he posted a 1.09 ERA (3 ER in 24.2 IP) as a reliever.
- + Lynch IV's 20 scoreless appearances at Kauffman Stadium this year trail **Steven Cruz** and **John Schreiber** (23 each) for the most outings among Royals pitchers.

MANAGER MATT QUATRARO (kwuh-TRAIR-roe)

- + **Matt Quatraro** is in his fourth season as Royals Manager...in January, he agreed to an extension that runs through 2029 and includes a club option for 2030...the option would represent his eighth season, which would mark the 2nd-longest tenure in franchise history, trailing only **Ned Yost’s** 10 seasons as Manager.

+ His 288 wins are 5th most in club history, 12 shy of 300 wins and trailing only Yost 746, **Whitey Herzog** 410, **Dick Howser** 404, **Tony Muser** 317 in Royals history.

+ Quatraro led the Royals to back-to-back winning seasons in 2024-25 for the first time since 2013-15...the Royals under Q are the eighth team in the Wild Card Era, according to *Elias*, to have back-to-back winning seasons after a 100-loss campaign.
- + Quatraro led the 2024 Royals to an 86-76 record in his second season as Manager.

+ Q finished runner-up in the 2024 American League Manager of the Year voting.

+ The 2024 Royals were the sixth team in the 162-game Era (since 1961), according to Elias, to have a 30-win improvement from one season to the next (excluding shortened seasons)...they were the third team to make the postseason following a 100-loss season, following the 2017 Minnesota Twins and 2020 Miami Marlins.

+ Before joining the Royals, he spent five years on **Kevin Cash’s** staff in Tampa Bay and four seasons on **Terry Francona’s** staff in Cleveland...during his 12 full seasons on a big league staff, his teams have reached the postseason seven times.

REPLAY SPECIALIST BILL DUPLISSEA

- + **Bill Duplissea** is in his 21st season with the Royals and has served as the Replay Coordinator since Instant Replay was instituted in 2014...during that time, the Royals 65.4% success rate is 1st in the Majors, ahead of the 2nd-place Yankees (64.0%).

+ Duplissea has overturned 22 of 30 challenges this season (73.3%), which is the best rate in the Majors according to the latest update sent from MLB last Friday.

+ In 12 full seasons of Instant Replay, the Royals have finished in the top 5 in success rate eight times and have finished in the top 10 in all 12 seasons.
- + Duper started with the Royals as a Bullpen Catcher in 2006, then added advance scouting duties in 2012...in his current role, he works closely with the coaching staff in scouting upcoming opponents, in addition to his in-game replay role.

+ Prior to joining the Royals, he spent 2004-05 as an Assistant Coach at the College of San Mateo, helping lead the Bulldogs to conference titles in both seasons.

+ Duplissea was a catcher for five seasons in the Los Angeles Dodgers organization, reaching Triple-A Albuquerque in 2000.
