The Mariners and Tigers last met in the regular season from July 11-13, 2025 at Comerica Park, when the Mariners swept a 3-game series heading into the All-Star Break.

TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners play the 2nd game of a 3-game series tonight at the Detroit Tigers (0-1)... following the current series, Seattle will continue the 10-game road trip at the Baltimore Orioles (4 G, June 8-11) and at the Washington Nationals (3 G, June 12-14)...today's game against the Tigers will be televised and streamed live on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call, with **Brad Adam** serving as field reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Gary Hill Jr.** and **Shannon Drayer** on the call.

ODDS & ENDS...the Mariners dropped last night's road trip opener to the Tigers by a 7-3 final score... Seattle is 8-2 (.800) since May 25, 11-5 (.688) since May 18, and 16-11 (.593) since May 6.

- **First of All** - The Mariners (33-31) are in first place in the American League West Division, 1.5 games ahead of the second place Rangers (31-32).
- **Connect Four** - The Mariners are 24-9 (.727) when scoring 4+ runs in a game, and 9-22 (.290) when scoring 3-or-fewer runs this season.
- **Big Tex - Bryce Miller** is set to make his 5th appearance this season (4th start) in today's game...over his first 4 games in 2026, he is 1-0 with a 1.71 ERA (4 ER, 21.0 IP) with 3 walks, 20 strikeouts and a 0.86 WHIP.
- **Dominating the Zone** - The Mariners last night recorded a 10:0 strikeout-to-walk ratio, the 4th time they have recorded at least 10 strikeouts and 0 walks this season, most in the American League.
- **Hi, I'm Colt and I'm from Ohio** - Both the Mariners' **Colt Emerson** and the Tigers' **Colt Keith** were born in Zanesville, Ohio...they are the only 2 active players to go by Colt.

COLT CRUSHFEST CONTINUES...over his first 17 career games, **Colt Emerson** is batting .255 (14x55) with 8 runs, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 4 homers, 9 RBI and 5 walks, getting on base at a .328 clip, slugging .582 with an .910 OPS and 157 OPS+...the Mariners are 11-6 (.647) since Colt debuted in the big leagues...the 20-year-old top prospect has 32 total bases across 61 plate appearances...Emerson's .910 OPS ranks 2nd among MLB rookies with at least 50 PA, trailing only Munetaka Murakami-CWS (.938 OPS).

SOAR FOR FOUR...the Mariners have won 3 consecutive series, at the Athletics (3-0), vs. the Diamondbacks (3-0) and vs. the Mets (2-1)...Seattle goes for 4+ consecutive series victories for the first time since winning 6 consecutive series from Sept. 5-25 last season, when they went on a 17-1 run that catapulted them to an AL West Division title.

PLAYING GOOD BALL...during the Mariners current 8-2 stretch (5/25-c), the pitching staff holds a 3.84 ERA (29 ER, 92.0 IP)...Seattle pitchers lead the Majors in strikeout-to-walk ratio (5.06) during that time frame (91 SO, 18 BB)...the offense **leads the AL** in slugging percentage (.521) and leads MLB in home runs (23), ranking 3rd in MLB in batting average (.285), 2nd in total bases (185) and 2nd in OPS (.854).

MARINERS.COM/VOTE...All-Star voting is underway for the 2026 MLB All-Star Game on July 14 at Citizens Bank Park in Philadelphia...fans can submit up to 5 ballots per day until the conclusion of Phase 1 at 9:00 a.m. PT on June 25...Phase 2, which takes the finalists at each position, will run from June 29-July 2 before the All-Star rosters are announced on July 4 at 4:30 p.m. PT...for more information and to vote, visit Mariners.com/Vote.

RALEIGH SET TO BEGIN REHAB SUNDAY...Mariners catcher **Cal Raleigh** (right oblique strain) is scheduled to begin a Major League rehab assignment with the High-A Everett AquaSox on Sunday, June 7...from there, he's scheduled to join Triple-A Tacoma starting Tuesday, June 9...fans with a **Mariners.TV** subscription have access to **MiLB.TV** and can watch Raleigh, along with Mariners top prospects like **Kade Anderson**, **Ryan Sloan**, **Lazaro Montes**, and others from across the Mariners top-ranked farm system.

LAST TIME VS. DETROIT WAS SPECIAL...this series marks the first time the Mariners and Tigers square off since the 2025 American League Division Series, when Seattle defeated Detroit in a winner-take-all Game 5 at T-Mobile Park...the epic Game 5 went 15 innings and ended on Jorge Polanco's walk-off single off Tommy Kahnle, scoring **J.P. Crawford** in the 3-2 Mariners win...**Luis Castillo** tossed 1.1 scoreless innings in relief and was the winning pitcher in Game 5.

PENMANSHIP...the Mariners bullpen has posted a 3.07 ERA (71 ER, 208.0 IP) this season, ranking 3rd in MLB in bullpen ERA, trailing only the Red Sox (2.99) and Braves (3.05)...Seattle relievers also rank 5th in MLB in fielding independent pitching (FIP - 3.48) and 1st in the AL, 3rd in fewest walks-per-9 innings (3.16), 3rd in fewest home runs-per-9 innings (0.69) and 1st in inherited runners scored (18.5%).

MARINERS POST-GAME ALUMNI HOME RUN DERBY SET FOR AUGUST 7...the Mariners announced the club will hold its first ever Alumni Home Run Derby, with participants including Hall of Famer **Ichiro Suzuki**, Mariners legend **Mike Cameron**, broadcasters **Ryan Rowland-Smith** and **Ryon Healy**, Bullpen Coach **Austin Nola**, local radio host **Bucky Jacobsen** and former Mariner **Stefen Romero**...all fans with a ticket to the game on Friday, Aug. 7 will have access to the Alumni Home Run Derby.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Colt Emerson** is off to a slugging start to his Major League career, with 9 of his first 14 Major League hits going for extra-bases, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...he is only the 10th player in Mariners history to hit 4 home runs over his first 17 career games?...the only Mariners to hit more home runs than Emerson over his first 17 games are Alvin Davis (7 HR), Kyle Lewis (6 HR), Bucky Jacobsen (6 HR), Wladimir Balentien (5 HR) and Greg Pirkel (5 HR), and...**DID YOU ALSO KNOW?**...only 4 20-year-olds have posted a higher slugging percentage than Emerson's .582 mark through their first 17 MLB games?...he trails only Fernando Tatis Jr.-SD (.583), Andruw Jones-ATL (.590) and Juan Soto-WSH (.593).

- **1979** - Willie Horton becomes the 43rd player to reach 300 HRs when he homers off Detroit's Jack Morris at the Kingdome.
- **1988** - Mariners first base coach Jim Snyder replaced Dick Williams as interim manager of the ball club.
- **1993** - Chris Bosio, Norm Charlton, Bill Haselman and Mackey Sasser are ejected after a 20-minute brawl in Baltimore.
- **2011** - The Mariners took LHP Danny Hultzen with the No. 2 overall selection in the 2011 Draft out of the University of Virginia
- **2016** - Edwin Diaz made his Major League debut tossing 1.0 inning with 1 strikeout.
- **2016** - Robinson Canó snapped his career-best 34-game on-base streak.
- **2021** - Logan Gilbert earned first career win in 9-5 win over the Angels.
- **2025** - Cal Raleigh recorded his 7th stolen base of the season, establishing a career-high and also tying Bob Kearney (1984) and current manager Dan Wilson (1997) for most SB by a catcher in a season in franchise history.

ABOUT BRYCE MILLER...

- The 27-year-old right-handed pitcher is set to make his 5th appearance (4th start) of the season and the 79th (78th start) of his career...it marks his 4th career start against the Tigers.
- Is in his 4th season with Seattle; selected by Seattle in the 4th round (113th overall) of the 2021 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Derek Miller on July 20, 2021.
- Played 3 seasons at Texas A&M from 2019-21.
- Was born in Mount Pleasant, Texas and attended New Braunfels High School in New Braunfels, Texas.

LAST TIME OUT...ND on May 31 vs. Diamondbacks, throwing 5.0 scoreless

innings with only 1 hit allowed, 1 walk, and 6 strikeouts...threw 71 pitches and 52 strikes...marks his 4th career appearance with 1-or-fewer hits and 1-or-fewer walks over 5.0+ IP and his 2nd this season...he is 1-of-2 pitchers to have multiple such games this season, along with Paul Skenes-PIT.

DOMINATING DETROIT...over 3 starts against the Tigers, has yet to allow a

run scored...he is 1-of-17 pitchers since the start of the live-ball era (1920-c) to own a 0.00 ERA over 3 games started against a single opponent...is 1-of-10 active pitchers and is 1-of-4 active pitchers with 19.0+ IP over the 3 starts...he is pitched 7.0+ innings of shutout ball with 3-or-fewer base runners allowed in 2 of his 3 starts, both starts being at Comerica Park...faced the Tigers in the 2025 ALDS game 4 where he allowed only 2 runs on 4 hits over 4.0 innings of work.

BACK AND BETTER THAN EVER...recorded 5.0+ innings with 1-or-fewer

walks in each of his first 4 appearances this season...is the first time he has recorded 4 such outings in a row since 2023 (8/30/23-9/16/23) and is 1 game short of his career-best streak (2x last: 6/29/24-7/28/24)...his 4 game streak is tied for the 5th longest such streak this season...his 1.71 ERA (4 ER, 21.0 IP), 3 walks, and 18 base runners allowed through his first 4 outings are all best marks over a 4 game span to start the season since Miller's 2023 debut season (5/2/23-5/19/23) where he had a 1.42 ERA (4 ER, 25.1 IP) with 2 walks and 13 base runners allowed...is first pitcher in MLB to have 4-or-fewer runs, 3-or-fewer walks, 21.0+ IP and 20+ strikeouts through their first 4 games of the season since Shota Imanaga did so in 2024...is 1-of-6 MLB pitchers to do so since 2020...he is the only pitcher in Mariners history to accomplish this (2x, last: 5/2/23-5/19/23).

BRYCE BESTS ALL...is dominating lefty batters through his first 4 appear-

ances this season ranking T-13th in WHIP (0.73) and T-12th in opponent OBP (.205) against left handed hitters in MLB...also owns a 4.5 K/BB and a 7.4 K/9...historically matches up better against right handed batters...ranks T-7th, matching Luis Castillo, in WHIP (0.98), T-9th in OBP (.259) along with Castillo, and T-9th in BB% (4.6) against right handed batters among AL pitchers since 2023 (min. 100.0 IP)...has a 5.3 K/BB against RHB.

BRINGING THE HEAT...through his 4 appearances this season, he has in-

creased the average velocity of his four-seamer to 96.7 mph compared to 94.8 mph last season...on May 19, fired a 99.3 mph 4-seamer for a strike, marking the fastest pitch thrown of his career, just passing his previous career-high of 99.2 mph thrown in his first start of the season (5/13 vs. HOU)...logged 20+ pitches over 97 mph in his first 2 starts...prior to the start of this season his career-high was 10 pitches above 97 mph on Aug. 6, 2023 vs. LAA.

KEEPING THE PATHS CLEAN...owns a career 10.30 base runners per 9,

ranking 11th in MLB since 2023 (min. 400.0 IP)...his 7.71 baserunners per 9 this season is the 14th best in MLB in 2026 (min. 15.0 IP)...his 19 career games with 4-or-fewer base runners allowed over 5.0+ IP (last: 5/31 vs. ARI) since 2023 rank 7th in MLB, joining rotation-mates Logan Gilbert (T-3rd, 23 G), Bryan Woo (T-1st, 24 G), George Kirby (T-9th, 17 G), and Luis Castillo (T-9th, 17 G) in the top 10 most such games in MLB over that span.

CRACKING THE WHIP...ranks 3rd among Mariners all-time WHIP leaders

(min. 400 IP) with a 1.113 WHIP...his 108 walks are tied for the 5th fewest through a pitchers first 78 games with the Mariners (min. 400.0 IP) while his 362 hits allowed are 2nd fewest, trailing Bryan Woo's 347 hits through his first 77 games.

BEWARE THE 4-SEAM...owns a career .287 opponent OBP and a .226 opponent average on his 4-seam...his OBP on his primary pitch ranks

7th in MLB among pitchers that have thrown 2000+ 4-seam fastballs since 2023...his 463 swing and misses on his 4-seam are 7th most in the AL since 2023.

GOING THE DISTANCE...has pitched 6.0+ innings in 30 career games and 5.0+ innings in 62 of his 78 career outings...the Mariners are 38-24

when he pitches 5.0+ innings and 23-7 when he pitches 6.0+ innings compared to 11-22 when he tosses fewer than 5.0 innings...on May 25 at ATH pitched 5.0+ innings out of the pen, becoming the first Mariners pitcher to log 5.0+ innings of relief and earn the win since Tommy Milone on September 18, 2019 at Pittsburgh.
