**RAY MATTER**—The Rays have won back-to-back games to start the season for only the fourth time in 24 seasons (2012, 2010, 2002)...tonight they have a chance to match the longest winning streak to start a season in franchise history (2012, 2002)...last night the Rays recorded their first come-from-behind win of the season, after an AL-most 20 in 2020...including postseason, last night was the second time in the last 5 games the Rays won when trailing after 8 innings, along with Game 4 of the World Series on **Brett Phillips'** game-tying single and two Dodgers errors...the Rays went 1-17 in the 2020 regular season when trailing after 8, with the only win coming on July 26 vs. TOR (trailed 4-2, won 6-5 in 10 innings).

- + Last night was the first time the Rays won a road game after trailing by multiple runs through 8 innings since Sep 18, 2019 at LAD.
- + The Rays have only lost once in their last 17 regular-season series since Aug 4, 2020, going 12-1-4 in series play over that stretch.
- + Tomorrow the Rays have the second scheduled Sunday off day in franchise history...the first came on Aug 26, 2012 when Tropicana Field was being used for the Republican National Convention.

**BANNER YEAR**—Last season the Rays won the American League pennant for the second time in franchise history (2008), but lost the World Series to the Dodgers...the Rays won the AL East for the third time (2008, 2010)...after a shortened 60-game regular season, they set a major league record by playing 20 postseason games, thanks in part to the expanded playoff format...the Rays were the ninth team in major league history to play a “winner take all” game in the Division Series (won 2-1 over the Yankees) and League Championship Series (won 4-2 over the Astros) but only the third to win both, joining the 2012 Giants and 1981 Dodgers.

**TARGET ON OUR BACKS**—Since the introduction of the Wild Card in 1995, three teams have repeated as AL Champions...the Yankees won the AL pennant in four consecutive years from 1998-2001, the Rangers won it in both 2010-11 and the Royals in both 2014-15...in the Wild Card era, teams losing in the World Series have won 57.1 pct. of their games the following season, which equates to a 92-70 record over a 162-game season...64 pct. (16 of 25) of these World Series losers have won at least 90 games the next season, and 28 pct. (7 of 25) have won at least 100 games...76 pct. (19 of 25) made the playoffs the next season, including the last 11 in a row...64 pct. (16 of 25) won their division, 44 pct. (11 of 25) won a postseason series and 12 pct. (3 of 25) made it back to the World Series.

**RAYS vs. MARLINS**—The Rays have won seven straight games at loanDepot park, matching June 9, 2007-May 23, 2009 for the longest road winning streak against them in franchise history...this is one shy of tying the active streak at Fenway Park for longest winning streak at an opponent's park in club history (see chart below)...the Rays have outscored them, 30-11, over the last seven road games, with five shutouts over that stretch.

- + Overall, the Rays have won 12 of the last 13 meetings since July 22, 2018 and have outscored the Marlins, 64-38 over that stretch.
- + Last night was the fifth time in franchise history the Rays defeated the Marlins when trailing after 8 innings, first since **Daniel Robertson's** walk-off grand slam on July 22, 2018—the first and only walk-off grand slam in Rays history...the others: May 20, 2006 vs. FLA, May 19, 2006 vs. FLA and June 14, 2002 at Pro Player Stadium.
- + The Rays went 5-1 against the Marlins last season and have won the “Citrus Series” in back-to-back seasons and nine times in 13 seasons since 2008...the Rays are 68-57 (.544) all-time (34-26 at home, 34-31 on the road), including 47-23 (.671) since the start of 2008.
- + The only other series against them this year is Sep 24-26 at home.

**SEEKING SWEEP**—Tonight the Rays have a chance to sweep a season-opening series for the third time in franchise history, following April 6-8, 2012 vs. NYY (3-0) and April 2-4, 2002 vs. DET (3-0)...the Rays have never swept a season-opening road series, and the only time they have swept their first road series of a season was April 12-14, 2010 at BAL (3-0).

- + Last season the Rays swept six series overall and four series of 3

games (or more), including the final series of the regular season from Sep 25-27 vs. PHI (3-0)...the 2020 Rays swept road series of 3+ games against the Red Sox (4-0), Yankees (3-0) and Marlins (3-0).

- + The Rays are attempting to sweep the Marlins in a series of 3 games (or more) for the eighth time...they are attempting to sweep them in a road series of 3+ games for the fourth time, following Aug 28-30, 2020 (3-0), June 8-10, 2012 (3-0) and June 24-26, 2008 (3-0).

**INTERLEAGUE INTRIGUE**—The Rays have won six consecutive interleague games, their longest streak since July 27, 2016-May 2, 2017 (6)...a win tonight would give them their longest interleague winning streak since Aug 8-Oct 1, 2015 (7)...the Rays are 29-13 (.690) in interleague play since the start of the 2019 season, best in the majors over that stretch ahead of the Dodgers (26-14)...the Rays have pitched to a 2.82 ERA (380-IP, 119-ER) in interleague games since then, best in the majors ahead of the Dodgers (3.61)...the Rays are 146-106 (.579) in interleague play since 2008—3rd-best in the majors since then—and 220-210 (.512) all-time.

**PITCHING PROPERLY**—The Rays opened the season on a scoreless streak of 15 IP, passing 2000 (10 IP) for the longest to start a season in club history...the scoreless streak was snapped when the Rays bullpen allowed 3 runs in the 7th inning last night...Rays starters this season have combined for 11.2 scoreless innings, with 5 hits, 0 BB and 9 SO...in 2020, the Rays ranked 7th in the majors and 3rd in the AL in starter ERA (3.77).

- + Since the start of the 2020 season, the Rays are 29-1 when leading after 6 innings, 25-0 when leading after 7 innings and 32-0 when leading after 8 innings...combining regular season and postseason, the Rays have won 63 consecutive games since July 28, 2019 when leading after 7 innings, the longest active streak in the majors.

**LOOKING AHEAD**—On Monday the Rays open a 3-game series at Fenway Park, where they have won eight straight games—the longest winning streak at an opponent's park in franchise history...last season the Rays went 7-3 against the Red Sox (3-3 at home, 4-0 on the road)...since July 24, 2019, the Rays are 14-4 against them with a +38 run differential.

- + The Rays begin a 7-game homestand on April 9 vs. NYY, the fifth time the Rays host the Yankees in the home opener...the Rays are 4-0 in them, with wins in 2004 (8-3, game played in Tokyo), 2009 (15-5), 2012 (7-6) and 2017 (7-3)...from April 9-May 2, the Rays are at home for a stretch of 17 of 23 games...beginning with the home opener, the Rays have stretches of games on 13 straight days, 30 games in 31 days, 36 games in 38 days and 46 games in 49 days.

**ROLLING MEADOWS**—Last night **Austin Meadows** hit a solo homer in the 6th inning to break a scoreless tie, after doing the same in the 8th inning on Opening Day...he became the third player in Rays history to homer in each of the club's first 2 games of a season, joining **Evan Longoria** in 2010 and **Elijah Dukes** in 2007...no Rays player has homered in each of the club's first 3 games, and the most recent occurrences of this in the majors are MIL **Christian Yelich** in 2019, COL **Trevor Story** in 2016 and SEA **Robinson Canó** in 2016...last night was the first time he homered off a left-handed pitcher since Sep 13, 2019 at LAA (**Andrew Heaney**) and the first time in his career he homered on an 0-2 pitch (off a righty or lefty).

- + Meadows hit 33 HR in 138 games in his first full season with the Rays in 2019 but was limited to 4 HR in 36 games in the shortened 2020 season, with stints on the COVID-19 IL and 10-day IL.

**'BIG BOPPER' WENDLE**—Last night **Joey Wendle** hit a 3-run homer off **Anthony Bass** in the 9th inning to give the Rays a 5-4 lead...the Rays offense scored 4 runs within the first 12 pitches of the 9th inning to erase a 4-2 deficit...it was the second time in his career he homered with 2 runners (or more) on base, following a grand slam on Sep 17, 2017 at PHI (with OAK)...it also marked the first time the Rays hit a 9th-inning homer to turn a deficit into a lead since **Travis d'Arnaud's** 3-run shot off **Aroldis Chapman** on July 15, 2019 at NYY, his third homer of the game...d'Arnaud's shot is one of two memorable homers the Rays have hit off Chapman, most recently **Mike Brosseau** in Game 5 of the 2020 ALDS.

- + Last night was the seventh go-ahead homer of Wendle's career but the latest in a game he ever hit one...prior to last night the latest go-ahead homer of his career was his 6th-inning grand slam in 2017.
- + The Rays have scored 7 runs in 7 innings off the Marlins bullpen this series, and are batting .321 (9-for-28) off Marlins relievers.

**2020 IN REVIEW**—Opened the season in the Twins starting rotation due to the delayed season from the COVID-19 pandemic...went 2-2 with a 3.03 ERA (38.2-IP, 13-ER) in 8 starts, allowing 2 runs (or fewer) in seven of those starts...recorded a 2.38 ERA (22.2-IP, 6-ER) in his final 4 starts.

- Was on the 10-day IL from July 31-Aug 18 (left shoulder inflammation)...was his fifth straight season with a stint on the injured list.
- Started and won the Twins fifth game, pitching five scoreless innings...at 40 years, 140 days, was the oldest lefty to start and win a game for the Twins since **Terry Mulholland** (41.187) in 2004.

**vs. MIAMI**—Is 2-1 with a 4.67 ERA (17.1-IP, 9-ER) in four career apps (3 starts) against the Marlins, including a 3.86 ERA (16.1-IP, 7-ER) in 3 apps (all starts) on the road...is 2-0 with a 0.75 ERA (12-IP, 1-ER) in 2 starts at loanDepot park...also pitched against them once in 2009 when the Marlins played their home games at Sun Life Stadium...last faced them on July 16, 2017 at loanDepot park, recording the win and yielding 1 run in 5 IP...allowed 2 baserunners and held the Marlins scoreless through his first 4 IP, then allowed a RBI single to **Ichiro Suzuki** in the 5th.

**SWEET SINCE '15**—Over the last six seasons, Hill is 43-22 with a 2.92 ERA (505-IP, 164-ER) and 584 SO in 95 apps (94 starts)...min. 400 IP, ranks among major league leaders over that stretch in ERA (5th), WHIP (1.06, 9th), opp avg. (.205, 4th) and opp SLG (.339, 3rd)...in comparison, through his first 10 major league seasons, he was 24-22 with a 4.72 ERA (471-IP, 247-ER), 1.99 SO/BB ratio (451-SO, 227-BB) and .243 opp avg. (429-for-1,768).

**CRAZY CURVE**—Hill used his curveball on 42.5 pct. of his pitches last season, the highest rate in the majors (min. 500 total pitches)...he allowed a 18.2 hard-hit pct. against his curveball, 9th-best in the majors and 2nd among lefties behind LAD **Julio Urias** (15.6 pct.)...opponents hit .172 (11-for-64) in at-bats ending in his curveball, 5th in the majors (min. 50 AB).

- Was one of seven pitchers last season to throw his curveball with 100 pct. active spin...active spin is spin that contributes to movement, meaning his curveball was thrown with pure topspin.

**SENIOR LIVING**—Ended the 2020 season as baseball's oldest active pitcher...if he appears in a game for the Rays on May 24 or later, he would become the oldest player in club history...would pass **Wade Boggs**, who was 41 years, 73 days old when he played in his last game on Aug 27, 1999.

- Since turning 38 years old, he is 17-8 with a 3.25 ERA (230-IP, 83-ER)...since 2000, his 3.25 ERA is 6th among pitchers 38 years and older...among the pitchers ahead of him are Hall of Famers NYY **Mariano Rivera** (1.80, 1st) and SD **Trevor Hoffman** (3.20, 5th).

**ROAD TRIPPIN'**—Has allowed 2 runs (or fewer) in each of last eight road starts since May 17, 2019 at CIN...since 2018, is 8-2 with a 3.08 ERA (108-IP, 37-ER) in 22 road starts, including a 7-game winning streak from July 20, 2018-June 8, 2019...has only lost once in his last 17 road starts, with an unbeaten streak of 16 straight road starts snapped on Sep 18, 2020 at CHC...took the loss despite allowing 1 run on 3 hits and 2 BB in 7 IP.

- Min. 100 IP on the road since 2018, ranks among major league leaders in opp avg. (.199, 5th) and opp SLG (.333, tied for 5th).

**SPRING FLING**—In his first spring with the Rays, went 1-0 with a 6.94 ERA (11.2-IP, 9-ER) and 7 SO in four Grapefruit League starts...did not record an out and had the inning rolled over in his spring debut after allowing 4 runs (3 ER)...pitched three scoreless innings on March 13 vs. MIN, facing one over the minimum...allowed 3 runs in 2.2 IP on March 19 at BOS...made his longest start in his last outing on March 29 at BAL, recording the win and allowing 3 runs in 5 IP with a spring-high 4 SO.

**POSTSEASON**—Is 1-2 with a 3.06 ERA (53-IP, 18-ER) in 13 career postseason apps (12 starts)...was on the Twins Wild Card Series roster vs. HOU last season but did not pitch...in three career World Series starts, holds a 1.80 ERA (15-IP, 3-ER) with 19 SO, 7 BB and a .154 opp avg. (8-for-52).

- Made 4 apps (3 starts) in the 2018 postseason, recording a 2.16 ERA (16.2-IP, 4-ER)...allowed 2 runs (or fewer) in all four outings.

- + 2020: Hit .259 (48-for-185) with 8 HR and 23 RBI in 54 games.
- + Hit .319 (15-for-47) vs. LHP and .308 (12-for-39) with RISP.
- + Tied for 9th in the AL with 15 2B...his 74 SO ranked 5th in the AL.
- + Postseason: Started all 20 games at shortstop...hit .136 (8-for-59).

- + Made his first career Opening Day roster, a start in right field.
- + 2020: Hit .281 (18-for-64) with 2 2B, 7 HR and 11 RBI in 23 games.
- + Postseason: Hit .377/.442/.831 (29-for-77) with 10 HR and 14 RBI in 20 games (all starts) and set records for a single postseason in homers, hits and extra-base hits (14, tied)...the previous record was 8 HR by TEX Nelson Cruz in 2011, HOU Carlos Beltrán in 2004 and SF Barry Bonds in 2002.
- + Hit 3 HR in the ALDS, 4 HR in the ALCS and 3 HR in the World Series, tying the major league record for most career postseason series with 3+ HR.
- + Named Most Valuable Player of the ALCS, the first rookie position player to win MVP of a League Championship Series or World Series...only three other rookies (all pitchers) had been named MVP of a LCS: BAL Mike Bod-dicker (1983), FLA Liván Hernández (1997) and STL Michael Wacha (2013).
